Back from Oz to Visit Family & Run Workshops

Ex Newtonian Joseph Douglas has lived in Perth, Australia for 20 years. He was a mechanic/fitter in the Air Force first then the railway works in Wolverton, where he became a charge hand and foreman. He had a young family of 4, aged 1, 3, 5 and 7; and Perth seemed a good option, great climate and the prospect of a new start. Unfortunately his marriage failed within a year, but he was determined to stick it out. At times he was tempted to come home, being in a new country with 4 kids, working full time. He later remarried and moved to a house big enough for a family of 7. His wife got him started on personal growth and he took many different courses and workshops. In 2007 he went to University as a mature entrant, studied psychology and education, but couldn't face life as a teacher or a

psychologist so began running his own workshops. He is a graduate of the Hakomi method of psychotherapy and has a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Psychology.

"I have run 36 'New Leaf' workshops over 4 years with between 6 and 12 people on the course. I am a skilful, compassionate and pragmatic psychotherapist with a singular vision for helping people build the capacity to live and love by taking responsibility for their own lives" said Joseph. His approach is dedicated to equipping you with the awareness and tools you need to remove the obstacles preventing you from being the person you wish to be. "In simple terms I seek to wake people up to the truth that whilst we all may sometimes feel broken or believe we are suffering from disease or disorders these are usually the adverse effects of becoming disconnected from our true selves", said Joseph. He has extensive experience in helping people deal with anxieties and issues in areas such as addiction, anger, trauma, anxiety, relationships - including couple counselling and parenting. He will run workshops at the Agnew Community Centre, Friday 7pm to 10pm, and Sat and Sun 9am to 5pm, on the 6th, 7th and 8th January.

"I'm keen on all types of personal growth and taking personal responsibility for emotions and behaviours and as I used to live in Aycliffe I thought it would be a good place to do one of my New Leaf Workshops. I have a few friends still there, one of them found the venue for me. Joseph told Newton News: "I have fond memories of Aycliffe. I used to play badminton for the Recreation Centre when I was 15 and 16. My Nan lived with us in Lowery Road and died when I was 15. We lived in Burdon



Close, Priestman Road, and Whinlatter Place. I attended St Joseph's, St Mary's then St John's in Bishop Auckland" "I seem to be getting more nostalgic as I get older and may end up moving back to Aycliffe one day as I can feel the pull. I miss the smell of English woods and the sound of seagulls and the bracing North Sea air. I loved sledging down the hill at the Burn - my daughter is really keen to see some snow too. I also miss being around folk that sound like I do, or like I used to sound". Joseph's Dad, in Shiney Row, isn't very well, so he is bringing his 9 year old daughter to see her Gran and Grandad.

Teaching Assistants Dispute - Update

Durham County Council's corporate director of resources, John Hewitt, said: "I am pleased to say that positive and productive talks are continuing and as a result Unison has called off industrial action by its teaching assistants planned for this week. In return, to allow this to take place, we last week agreed to suspend the dismissal and re-engage process and undertake a review of the teaching assistants' role. "We remain clear that an equal pay risk exists, and that needs to be addressed, but it is also important to properly examine aspects of the employment of teaching assistants which merit further review given some of the information which has come to light recently. "The review, which will look at function, job description and activities, to establish whether current job descriptions adequately describe the role, will be completed by 1 September 2017. This will not however re-open the single status agreement currently in place. "This is a very complex situation and it has also resulted in us having further discussions with other recognised trade unions. "We look forward to working with these trade unions and are grateful for Unison's announcement today."

Newton Aycliffe Library will temporarily close later this month in preparation for a move to a new location.

The library is set to reopen in refurbished premises within the town's leisure centre in late December.

In the meantime, the existing library building, on Central Avenue, will be closed to the public from 12.30pm on Saturday, 10 December. The last day for revenue and benefits appointments at the current site will be Tuesday, 6 December.

The library move is part of a £1million scheme, being carried out by Durham County Council to help regenerate the

town centre.

The initiative will see the transformation of a number of shop units adjoining the leisure centre, in Beveridge Way, and the creation of a new shared entrance and reception for the centre and library.

Cllr Maria Plews, Cabinet member for leisure, libraries and lifelong learning, said: "This is a very exciting time for current and future library users in Newton Aycliffe."

"We are working to keep the transition period between the closure of the current library and the opening of the new location to a minimum."

MINI MOTO MENACE

Dear Sir,
the collision between a mini motorbike and a pedal cycle was inevitable due to the total disregard for the public shown by riders of these machines.

The western area has been plagued in recent years with noise and dangerous riding of these vehicles which may or may not be insured or taxed. Using footpaths as race tracks both the public and animals are at risk.

Failure to stop after an accident which injured a young child coming home from school illustrates just how dangerous these vehicles are.

As far as I am aware the police have been taking a light touch regarding the riders of these vehicles with a warning being issued as an interim reaction followed by the seizing of the bike.

With these bikes changing hands for less than £100 and so easily replaced it is no wonder our police are frustrated.

I am suggesting that anyone who has a neighbour who owns one of these should make a note of licence plate or distinguishing marks and colours and log them with the police.

As an example, the rider of the bike which knocked the child off the bike is described as around 5 foot 9" wearing a black tee shirt and a black bikers helmet. The bike is described as green and black in colour with black numbers on the side.

'Battling Budget Cuts' Talk by NHS Trust Chief

Some of the 'huge' challenges currently facing the NHS at large, including County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust, and the determined efforts to find answers to them were outlined to members of Newton Aycliffe Rotary Club last week by Trust Chairman Professor Paul Keane OBE who lives in Woodham.

In a no-punches-pulled presentation, he detailed some of the initiatives taken to offset the effects of cuts which have required an efficiency of £37 million from the Trust's £500 million annual budget and described efforts to lessen the impact of fewer resources on patients and services at the 83 sites for which the Trust is responsible.

He praised the dedication, compassion and commitment of the Trust's 8000 staff.

Finance, said Prof. Keane, was a 'huge, huge problem' when there was increasing demand to meet the needs of the elderly, support those with dementia, provide services to keep children active and mobile, tackle child obesity and ease pressure on Accident and Emergency departments at a time when there was a shortage of 250

qualified nurses and medical staff.

Planning for the future, said Prof. Keane, had already seen the provision of a simulation centre to help train doctors and the introduction of new technology on wards to help nursing staff reduce the amount of time spent on administration.

Plans were also in hand to create a centre of excellence for orthopaedic surgery at Bishop Auckland, new

theatres at Darlington, a new Accident and Emergency department at Durham and the implementation of mobile technology for community staff.

"There has to be change. We cannot continue as we are", said Prof. Keane. "Resources are limited and we need to work together with all our partners in health and social care so that collectively we can continue to enhance our services for the public."

Know Your Rights Buying Christmas Presents

Citizens Advice County Durham is reminding residents to go back to retailers if they are sold faulty electrical goods this Christmas. The call comes as part of National Consumer Week which focuses on what people should do if something goes wrong with electrical goods such as laptops, TVs and mobile phones.

Research from the national charity released today reveals that two thirds (66%) of people had a problem with a faulty electrical item in the last two years.

However, 1 in 4 (28%) people were initially turned away by retailers when they tried to get a repair, replacement or refund, despite the retailer having a responsibility to offer a solution.

The survey also showed that persistence paid off, with 61% of those who were turned away eventually getting some form of solution from the retailer. Every year, Citizens Advice County Durham helps in excess of 1000 people with queries around consumer rights.

The survey findings suggest that both shoppers and retailers may not be aware of their rights and responsibilities around faulty electrical goods. As Christmas shopping gets underway, the charity is sharing top tips to help shoppers to get "switched on" to their consumer rights, so they can get problems with electrical goods solved.

Dawn Kirsopp, Deputy Chief Executive of Citizens Advice County Durham said: "This Christmas people don't need to be stuck with electrical goods that don't work. Knowing your rights means that if something goes wrong, you can approach the retailer for a repair, refund or replacement confident in the knowledge that they should help you find a solution. "We would encourage shoppers to have a quick read of our top tips so they know where they stand, or contact us if they need further advice."

ELECTRICAL GOODS - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Don't put up with broken electrical goods - if an item breaks and it's not your fault, you have a right to a free repair, replacement or refund depending when

and where you bought it.

Use the Citizens Advice faulty goods tool to work out what you're entitled to.

What to do when an item is faulty

- Don't attempt to fix it yourself - this could stop you getting redress because it will make it harder to prove you did not cause the fault. You may also risk injuring yourself.

- Return it to the retailer - It's the responsibility of the retailer to help you resolve the problem, not the manufacturer. They should cover the costs of returning the item - contact them first to check the best way to do this and to negotiate an option that's most convenient for you.

GETTING A REPAIR, REPLACEMENT OR REFUND

- Bought within the last 30 days - you can get a refund on a faulty product.

- Bought within the last 6 months - you are entitled to have it repaired or replaced once. If the item still doesn't work you should get a full refund.

- Bought more than 6 months ago - you may still get a repair or replacement but you will only get a partial refund to reflect the use you've got out of the item. You'll need to prove you didn't cause the fault which may make it harder to get redress.

- Repair doesn't work? If you have one repair and it doesn't succeed, you can ask for a full or partial refunding, depending on when the purchase was made.

- Replaced with something different? The retailer should try to replace the item like-for-like. This may not always be possible, so if you're offered something you don't want you can ask for a refund.

What to do when an item is unsafe

- Stop using it - and unplug it if applicable.
- Inform Trading Standards - report it via the Citizens Advice consumer service on 03454 04 05 06, or 03454 04 05 05 for Welsh speakers.

- If it gets recalled, follow the manufacturer's guidance - this could include not leaving the item unattended when in use. For peace of mind you may want to stop using it altogether.

Citizens Advice Darlington is offering Pension Wise appointments across the County. The team also offers Pension Wise appointments at Macmillan Cancer Information and Support centres across County Durham, including Bishop Auckland, Peterlee and Durham, which are run by County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation

Trust. Neeraj Sharma, chief executive of Citizens Advice Darlington, said: "Hopefully Pension Wise will help enlighten people about their options. Professional guidance will be crucial to ensure people understand what is available to them and to help them make the right decision for their personal circumstances."

Pension Wise guidance specialists are impartial. They do not recommend any products or companies and will not tell you how to invest your money.

Clients in the Darlington area can now access the Pension Wise website to book appointments. The website gives people the option to select their preferred time and location, and the Pension Wise team later confirm the appointment with them. This means that Pension Wise appointments can be booked easily online at any time.

P.C.'s INITIATIVE CUTS BIKE THEFTS

PC Dave Williamson and former partnerships liaison officer Ian Martin have been honoured for their work promoting a scheme which has slashed the number of bicycle thefts in County Durham and Darlington. Both have been awarded Chief Superintendent's commendations for their roles with 'Operation Spoke', an initiative developed three years ago as a response to the soaring number of bike thefts. Ian, who recently retired and Dave, who is based at Barnard Castle have dedicated many hours to ensure the Durham Constabulary initiative has become a shining example nationally of 'best practice'. They also received a national award recently at the 2016

'Cycle Crime' conference, for the development of a bespoke bike register frame and component marking kit. There are now over 10,000 bikes registered through the Durham Constabulary scheme. The kit comprises a UV etch kit, microdots, tamper proof label and warning sticker. The UV etch has the advantage of being difficult for a thief to see and remove, and is not too obtrusive to affect the look of a valuable bike. The microdots help protect the bicycle further and the component parts. The tamper evident label and warning stickers offer a visible deterrent to the would-be thief. Using the kit has helped bring about a 25% reduction in bicycle crime in the last 24 months.

ENTERPRISE AGENCY SCOOPS NATIONAL AWARD

Local agency, South Durham Enterprise Agency has been awarded the National Enterprise Network, Community Stakeholder of the Year award at the organisation's national conference, taking place at the RBS headquarters in London. Awarded for SDEA's local community engagement and the promotion of enterprise and economic development with a number of local organisations and communities, including local Area Action Partnerships, the Auckland Castle Trust, Town and County Councils and many others the Agency scooped the award in amongst strong national opposition.

Winning a special commendation in the Future of Enterprise Support category in addition was a proud moment for SDEA Chief Executive, Steven Robson who commented:

"We're really proud to be part of the National Enterprise Network and to bring a national award home with us from this year's conference is testament to the hard work everyone here at the agency puts into their job every day. Hitachi Workforce to Reach 900

News from Hitachi indicates they will be increasing their workforce up to 900 employees by next Easter. The Aycliffe train builder has been very active bidding for new contracts and their success is reflected in their expansion on the site and now going well over their projected employment figures.

Public Backs Council Budget

Almost two thirds of people who took part in a consultation agreed with Durham County Council's approach to making budget savings for 2017/18. The authority asked residents to help set its spending priorities at a series of meetings and roadshow events during September and October. Officers and councillors spoke to more than 3,000 people across County Durham, with 1,919 of them completing a questionnaire giving their feedback. Of those who returned a

questionnaire, 63 per cent said they believed the council's approach to making future savings was a reasonable way to go forward for 2017/18. And almost half (49.7 per cent) said they had not noticed any change to council services during the last five years. The figures are included in an update on 2017/18 budget planning to be discussed by Durham County Council's Cabinet when they meet next week. The Medium Term Financial Plan paper also reflects on the content of the Chancellor's Autumn Statement. It recommends that savings of £39.8 million are now required for 2017/18. This would require £20.7 million of savings to be made, with £19.1 million to be taken from reserves set aside as part of the council's medium term approach to balancing the budget. These figures would take overall savings for the period 2011/12 to 2019/20 to £251 million. Cllr Simon Henig, Leader of Durham County Council said: "Times are still tough for us financially but we continue to work hard to provide the highest levels of service across the county. There is still much for us to be

proud of in County Durham. "It is also reassuring to know that most residents agree with our approach to the way we are making savings. We really appreciate the public being involved in the budget process. "It is extremely important that we understand where the public's priorities lie when it comes to funding as everyone's opinions matter and even more so with the financial challenges ahead of us." Cllr Alan Napier, Deputy Leader of Durham County Council and Cabinet member for Finance, said: "Since the start of austerity the council has faced unprecedented savings targets. It's a testament to the hard work of everyone involved that nearly half of those taking part in the consultation agree that we've managed to meet these so far without noticeably reducing services. "We await the budget settlement later this month and urge the Chancellor to acknowledge the urgent requirement to recognise the national social care funding crisis that is unfolding across the country." Cabinet meets at County Hall on Wednesday, 14 December.

CHARITY SINGLE FOR LOCAL HOSPICE





NEW RESEARCH SHOWS NUISANCE CALLS IN DURHAM AS BAD AS EVER

New research has revealed that nuisance and scam calls are still a problem for people in Durham with two out of three people who have signed up to the Telephone Preference Service, a service aimed at taking members of the public off nuisance caller registers, still receiving nuisance calls. The research by BBC One's Watchdog suggests that nuisance and scam calls pose as big a threat as ever to people in Durham as it revealed that 58 per cent of people who have signed up to the service said it doesn't work for them. Of those 58 per cent just 12 per cent have had call blocker systems installed in their homes, despite 83 per cent of those with call blockers saying the device had worked to eradicate unwanted calls. County Durham Plan Paused

The process which will result in a plan for development across County Durham has been paused to consider what are expected to be fundamental changes from a new Government White Paper. After the Issues and Options consultation on the County Durham Plan earlier in the year, Durham County Council was aiming to seek Cabinet approval to consult in the New Year on a preferred option. With the Government set to announce full details of a White Paper in January - which could fundamentally change the number of houses that councils are required to plan for - the council have taken the decision to pause the process. This will ensure that residents are not consulted on a plan which may quickly become out of date and subject to further changes. Indications from the Government are that the White

Paper will change how local plans - such as the County Durham Plan - calculate the number and type of houses needed as well as how they are then delivered.

As the new legislation could require the council to make significant changes to the work on the plan so far, the process will now be paused until there is clarity on the proposals in the White Paper so that these can be taken into account before further consultation is carried out.

CLlr Neil Foster, Cabinet member for economic regeneration, said: "While we're obviously incredibly disappointed that we cannot proceed with the plan in line with our original timescales, the decision to pause the process now is the only one we could make given the fundamental changes that may be included in the White Paper. It is important that people

have the most up to date and robust information so that the consultation is meaningful in planning for the future of their county."

"Publishing a plan without understanding the impact of the White Paper would be a risk which could leave the council being required to revisit parts of the process causing delay. Instead we will reflect on the changes the Government is looking to bring forward and take the extra time we now have to ensure that the County Durham Plan is the right plan for the people who live, work and visit the county."

The County Durham Plan will shape the county up to the year 2033, guiding the amount of new development needed for housing, potential job creation and future retail spaces as well as what infrastructure is needed to support these, such as transport, schools and green spaces.

More People Talking About Immigration

Dear Sir,
In last week's Newton News, two Northern Labour MEPs insinuated that the democratic vote to Leave the EU has spawned public hatred against immigrants. It has not! Strong on Soundbites, Bankrupt on Solutions

MISLEADING

Biggest lie of all? The front of the leaflet has the words 'WORKERS' RIGHTS' boldly prominent. But the manifesto does not once mention the word 'rights'. (Right-wing parties don't much care about your 'rights'.)

What the manifesto does say is that UKIP will not raise the minimum wage, but will raise the tax threshold instead.

This fails to appreciate that the highest earners keep 40% of any increase in the threshold, in contrast to the poorest people, who do not thereby get any increase in income at all.

And that about sums up the whole ill-informed, sleight-of-hand claptrap which MAKES NOT ONE 'PROMISE'. What UKIP touted last week as a comprehensive 'vision' is simply a blatant attempt to rebrand the 'Party-which-rejects-foreigners' as a 'Party-which-cares-about-your-jobs'. It is a manifesto perfectly matched to yet another of their 'say-anything-to-get-votes' campaigns.



More Foster Carers Needed in Co. Durham

A number of foster carers in County Durham are needed to help provide a loving home for children. Councillors will next week hear how the County Council's fostering service has seen an increase in the number of potential foster placements - but that the number of children in care continues to outstrip that supply.

A report to Cabinet, on December 14, will set out four main priorities for the service over the next year, including recruiting more foster carers to ensure that children remain in County Durham communities; and developing its Foster Xtra scheme that supports children with some of the most complex needs.

Margaret Whellans, the council's corporate director of children and young people's services, said: "The majority of our looked after children are placed within our fostering service, but it is increasingly challenging to manage the growing demand for placements.

"Our foster carers tell us that nothing gives the same feeling of love and warmth as fostering and by working with us you could make an enormous difference to a child's life.

"We know that there are many myths that surround fostering and so we would encourage people to find out the facts before they rule themselves out.

"You don't need any special qualifications - just a genuine interest in caring for young people, patience, understanding and a sense of humour - and we can offer you training and specialised support along the way."
