welcoming and well equipped environment for readers of all ages, we hope it will offer a convenient venue from which other community services can operate.



## **POLICE WARNING ON PHONE** Aycliffe Commercial Expert SCAMMERS AFTER £3,000 FRAUD

Durham Constabulary are asking the public to warn their elderly relatives and friends about an iTunes gift card fraud after a couple from Consett were scammed out of £3,000. The couple who are 87 years old and live in Delves Lane, were contacted by a male saying he was from the Inland Revenue (HMRC) and a debt of £3000 needed to be settled, the victim was repeatedly contacted and convinced that payment needed to be made or court proceedings would be started

supermarket and purchased hundreds of pounds of iTune cards, as instructed, believing this was an acceptable means of payment, the card voucher numbers were passed to the fraudster over the telephone transferring the value, a family member realised what was happening and prevented further loss.

in this case is heartbroken and blaming himself for being taken in by a persuasive and forceful caller, he didn't understand iTunes and thought it was a modern method of payment, this may be one of the reasons criminals are targeting the older generation.

"I would urge people reading this to make sure their grandparents and elderly relatives are aware of this and make sure they don't become victims themselves."

DS Tony Murray from Durham's fraud team added: from "Although the elderly and vulnerable are being targeted, anyone can be a victim of this type of crime as the criminals are sophisticated and well scripted, they socially engineer and manipulate victims and sometimes know personal details about the victim, this is dangerous as it enables them to sound and look genuine and will pretend to be HMRC, Banks, Police or any business

# **EIGHT IN COURT FOR DROPPING LITTER**

Eight people have been ordered to pay hundreds of pounds between them after being taken to court for dropping litter. Six women and two men from County Durham were each handed fines having been prosecuted by Durham County Council for littering.

The eight had dropped litter at locations throughout the county, including Bishop Auckland town centre and Beveridge Way in Newton Aycliffe, from August 2016.

Five of the defendants were found guilty in their absence at Darlington Magistrates Court on Monday, and fined £80 with £130 costs and £30 victim surcharge.

Two defendants pleaded guilty by post and were given  $\pounds 60$  fines,  $\pounds 30$  victim surcharges and  $\pounds 60$  costs each. One defendant attended court and pleaded guilty

Another was fined £80 and ordered to pay a £30 victim surcharge and £60 in costs.

Ian Hoult, Durham County Council's neighbourhood protection manager, said: "While the vast majority of people use bins or take their litter home with them, there are a small number who think it is acceptable to drop rubbish. 



# **Smart Devices for Smarter** & More Efficient Cops

FRONT-LINE officers are taking advantage of handtechnology, as the first held phase of a mobile data project comes to an end. The roll-out of electronic tablets aims to cut down on the amount of paperwork incurred by frontline officers, enabling them to be more mobile and visible in the community.

Around 500 devices have now been distributed to Durham Constabulary officers, with the next phase of the project due to start early in the new year. Ron Hogg, Durham's Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner, monitors productivity and value for money within the force, in his role of holding the Chief Constable to account.

Ron said: "In a time of austerity and the long-term impact affecting police budgets, it is important that all forces work in innovative ways to meet the demands on our services.



"The use of mobile devices has already seen a number of benefits which have improved performance across the force area. Crimes can be logged more quickly so that officers can spend less time doing paperwork. Ultimately this means that officers can provide a better quality of service, spend extra time with the victim and use their time

more efficiently by serving the public. Durham Constabulary was the only force in the country to be graded as Outstanding in all three areas of the Efficiency inspection, by Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary

in October this year. Inspector Mick Button, who lead on the project from the outset, said: "This initial phase has seen a number of benefits including less duplication, and an improved use of mobile working right at the heart of the community, without the ongoing need for officers to travel back to stations to write

up their reports. "An evaluation report will be completed early in the new year. This will shape how the next phase of the project will be rolled-out over the coming months.

Ron recently launched his Police, Crime and Victims' Plan 2016-21 in November. The Plan sets the direction for the Chief Constable over the next four years, and is underpinned by a number


