WHAT'S HAPPENING IN PREFAB AREA ASKS **PRIVATE RESIDENTS**

Fred and Margaret Jackson of Clarence Chare have lived there for 30 years, buying their Prefab Bungalow, brick cladding and modernising it to

suit their requirements. Most of the other bungalows which were built after the war, and used mainly for people with disabilities, are now owned and rented out by Livin. Fred and Margaret are concerned their how neighbourhood has deteriorated over recent years with nine of the properties empty - waiting, they are told, for re-cladding improvements by the landlords.

The outside of the bungalows have also been neglected with hedges uncropped and growing to great height. Last year the couple had a rat infestation and they are worried this problem may reoccur.

They have lived in the area for nearly 65 years and love where they live, but the state of properties surrounding them is disheartening and they would like to know what the future holds.

Fred said it was hard to believe these bungalows are still empty when there is such a demand. "Why are the landlords letting the condition of their properties worsen when they could be earning good rental value" asked Fred. We contacted Livin and they told us there were no plans in the immediate future to bring the bungalows back into use as other areas of property development have

priority.
They did think initially there was a need to reclad the exterior of the prefabs to bring the insulation up to standard. but investigations show this is

unnecessary. Eventually the bungalows will be brought back into the rental market and probably used as temporary housing while other properties are refurbished.

Air Ambulance Plan New Operational Centre

The region's air ambulance charity has submitted plans for its new operational base and Medical Centre of Excellence, which it claims will lead to more lives being saved across the North.

The Great North Air Ambulance Service (GNAAS) hopes to build the facility at Urlay Nook, near Stockton-on-Tees, on the former Elementis chromium works site.

GNAAS has agreed a deal in principle for the site but the sale is dependent on a number of factors including the success of the planning application, which will be discussed at a forthcoming meeting of Stockton Borough Council's planning committee.

The entire project, including the purchase of the land, the buildings, and the construction of the new facilities, is forecast to cost £3.9M. This is being financed through a combination of fundraising, reserves, additional borrowing, and grants from the Government through the LIBOR banking fine fund.

Last year, at his autumn statement, Chancellor Philip Hammond announced £1m from the fund would be allocated to the project.
This was £900,000 short of

what GNAAS had applied for, but Grahame Pickering MBE, the charity's chief executive, today confirmed the project would still go ahead, albeit over a longer timescale than previously proposed.

proposed.
The plans will incorporate an existing office building, which would house the Medical Centre of Excellence alongside the charity's operational and support staff including fundraising, lottery and admin teams.

The 1,500sqm hangar also featured in the plans include space for three aircraft as well as dormitories and parking for the charity's 24-7 trauma car service.

"The renovation and

"The renovation and repurposing of the existing facilities could potentially start in the new year," Mr Pickering said. "But the construction of the hangar could be delayed slightly to preserve the financial stability of the charity.


"If the application is successful, we will be asking supporters to give whatever they can to support the project. I cannot stress enough how vital this is for the future of the charity and for the future of pre-hospital care in the region.

"The benefits to the charity and the wider public are many. Fundamentally though, it will save the charity tens of thousands of pounds which can be spent on frontline healthcare, it gives us a stable home for the first time, and through the Medical Centre of Excellence, we will have the facility to research clinical innovations that will save even more lives."

Mr Pickering said the GNAAS board of trustees had given the green light to the project, having scrutinised the plans alongside the financial proposals. An environmental survey has been carried out, taking into consideration the site's former use as a chemical works, and found there to be no risk to workers or visitors to the site.

If the proposals go ahead, the charity would leave its base at Durham Tees Valley Airport, as well as offices in Darlington town centre. Its bases at Newcastle International Airport and Langwathby, near Penrith, continue to be integral to its future plans.


Greenfield **Students** Host **Residents Party**

Services for Children & Young People Improve

Improvements are being made in services for children and young people in County

County Council Durham identified ways to improve its services for children and young people and its Cabinet will next week hear that the majority of the action points are either completed or on

Following last year's Ofsted of children's actions were inspection of services, were identified under four themes: strengthening and staffing management capacity; strengthening political and management oversi improving the quality oversight; practice; and compliance with regulations.

The meeting will next week hear how good progress is being made.

In terms of strengthening management and staffing capacity, there is more stability in the workforce with reductions in turnover and vacancy rates, as well as in sickness absence.

The council has also implemented a number of initiatives to recruit, develop and retain social workers and managers. A Social Work Academy has been set up to support 12 newly qualified social workers while a further 24 newly qualified social workers have also been employed. A management training programme has also been established alongside a course for aspiring managers. The council also plans to host four students who want

to become social workers part of the Frontline programme and is developing a social work apprenticeship programme.

terms of strengthening political and management oversight, the council is in the process of introducing a new system for children's services social care records with staff having visited local authorities with leading children's IT systems to help identify the most suitable model

In relation to improving the quality of practice, the council has revised standards for assessment and planning, developed a key reference tool for evaluating casework activity for practitioners and managers, and delivered training and support through workshops on how to carry out assessments.

In recent months, the focus on quality of practice has brought national recognition for the council. West Rainton Children's Home won the public sector children's team award at the Local Government Children and Young People Now 2016 Awards while the council's Supporting Young People with a Cancer Caring Role was highly commended in the young carers award category. The action plan was produced in response to the findings last February's Ofsted inspection which made 14 recommendations.

Cllr Ossie Johnson, portfolio holder for children and young people's services, said:

"Significant progress has been made in the last year to the point where we are recruiting more and more social workers and where our focus on quality of practice has seen us afforded national recognition. "However we recognise there is still room for improvement and we will continue to work

steadfastly to improve the lives of our children and young people.

The council's Cabinet, which meets on 18 January, is being recommended to agree to receive further updates in relation to children and young people's services on a six monthly basis.



LABOUR WANTS TO TAKE **BRITAIN INTO BRIGHT BREXIT**

Is Labour trying to undermine the referendum result? Nothing could be further from the truth.

The Tories have told us NOTHING about what 'Brexit' will look like – apart from the fact that it will be 'red, white and blue'. By contrast, Labour's Brexit shadow secretary Keir Starmer has been presenting a very clear and positive idea of how we should respond to the referendum.

BREMOANERS AND BREXSH*TERS

Labour are not 'Bremoaners' trying to subvert the result of the referendum – Starmer has made it clear that he regards the 23 June vote as a binding 'mandate', and that Labour will not prevent the government triggering Article 50 in March. But neither are they 'Brexsh*ters' trying to pretend that we can simply walk away without any plans and all will magically be well. In Starmer's terms: there is a 'mandate' on our leaving but there is no mandate on the terms of our leaving, which MUST be debated and agreed.

I get angry at those people who use every setback to claim that Brexit is failing. Equally, I disagree with those who take every bit of economic success to suggest that Brexit is working. Brexit hasn't happened yet! So all these 'analyses' are pure guesswork, and we will only know if Brexit was a

good or bad idea in half-a-century's time.

And whatever happens, there will "always be an England", with an economy and trade and a place in the world. We have such already within the EU of course, but Brexit will take all our political and economic circumstances and utterly reshape them. So our future success depends, not just on leaving the EU, nor even on the deal the government negotiates, but on how well we adapt to our new circumstances

BREXIT AS AN OPPORTUNITY

There is a saying: "there are no problems, only opportunities". Brexit can be seen similarly. Of course there are dangers – but successful businesses will avoid the pitfalls, and the government needs to aspire to create a climate for success

whatever shape 'Brexit' it negotiates.
I'll give you a concrete example. Here in the North-East we face a skills shortage, especially as many of our skilled workers prepare to retire. If we had stayed in the EU, firms

Aycliffe, our County Council GAMP committee has set up a fund to help people-in-work upskill themselves to progress their careers. So, given the time and the money, I have no fear that we in the North-East could produce the skilled workers to fill any skills gap left by Brexit.

But this kind of preparation needs the government to have a clear, costed plan of how it intends things to develop in the future ... and that is not happening.

WE NEED TO LISTEN TO LABOUR

Labour has always fought for the North-East. And now only Labour sees clearly how to head into the future in a way which accepts the mandate of the referendum, yet empowers the people of the North-East to seize Brexit's opportunities And that is why Labour is demanding that this incompetent government should develop a plan and give us at local level the resources to achieve that plan. That is not "working against Brexit – it is trying make sure that Brexit works for us. John D. Clare



County Town's Masterplans Updated

Durham County Council's Cabinet will hear the second half of an update on recent successes and future plans for towns across County Durham when it meets on 18th January. Councillors will be asked to approve updates of masterplans for Peterlee, Seaham, Spennymoor, Shildon, Barnard Castle and Bishop Auckland.

Masterplans are the council's regeneration frameworks for each major town in the county. Updates for Consett, Crook, Newton Aycliffe, Durham City, Chester-le-Street and Stanley were approved at December's Cabinet meeting.

Cabinet meeting.
Working closely with the council's Area Action Partnerships, the updated plans profile each of the towns, detailing investment and work across the county as well as plans for the future. In addition to highlighting the range of activities undertaken by the council – including improvements to town centres, highways, education and health provision – they also identify the development of new businesses, housing and community facilities.

If approved by Cabinet the adopted masterplans will continue to evolve, with the Area Action Partnerships continuing to play a key role in shaping them to ensure that they reflect the priorities of local residents.

Cllr Neil Foster, Cabinet member for economic regeneration, said: "The updated masterplans are key documents, setting a clear way forward to bring even further investment and improvements to towns throughout the county.

"The masterplans show how the council has invested millions of pounds, right across County Durham, and encouraged even more investment from the private sector; boosting business, safeguarding and creating thousands of new jobs across the county, improving education and transport and creating new housing and community facilities.

"The future is just as bright with a range of plans and new investment for the county. The £1.7 million Coastal Communities Fund backed project to further improve Seaham Marina will continue as well as the new activity centre set to offer water and land sports in the area. In Peterlee we'll be looking to move forward with our plans for a new railway station at Horden and we'll continue to invest in our roads and schools as well as targeting support for businesses and high streets countywide to improve the local economy.

"All of which is before Kynren returns to Bishop Auckland in the summer and, alongside the council, the Auckland Castle Trust move forward with their range of extremely exciting plans in the town."

Among a range of other success stories and future will hear how Peterlee has benefited from a £25 million investment by Bristol Laboratories to set up a new major manufacturing base for generic drugs, employing 347 staff. The new Horden Sea View railway station continues to be a priority for the council which, by making the town more accessible, it is hoped will boost both the town and surrounding areas as well as the employment prospects of the people living there. Seaham continues to enjoy a boom in employment with Business Durham, the council's business gateway. working to attract 1,200 jobs to the area with ResQ setting up a new call centre at Spectrum Business Park Business Durham has also been working closely with another resident of the park, Great Annual Savings, as they now look to double their workforce to 300 over the

Seaham Marina can also look forward to further improvements with the continuation of the works as part of a £1.7 million Coastal Communities Fund award. This will see the boatyard facilities extended and the creation of 19 more berths.

In Spennymoor the town centre has seen £300,000 worth of improvements since 2009 targeted towards improving the retail environment with 25 individual businesses supported. DurhamGate is set for further expansion after the owners acquired the former Wellsprings site meaning a development of a further 12,000 sqm of business and office space as well as a potential car showroom, crèche and café.

Shildon has seen £9 million worth of private sector investment at the Future Durham Business Park from the CreateCity Group. Fittingly for the home of Locomotion, the National Railway Museum at Shildon – which attracted over 435,000 visitors in 2015 – the visit of the Flying Scotsman in 2016 saw a £100,000 project to regenerate the town centre area in time to welcome it. Following requests from the public, local residents also voted for the council to keep the three decorative arches across the town which will now be repaired and maintained.

Barnard Castle is another area in the county that has benefited from major private sector investment with GlaxoSmithKline recently announcing a new £92 million facility to expand and safeguard the future of it operations in the town. Working alongside the Digital Durham project, residents and businesses are also set to benefit from an improvement to the quality and speed of broadband services through the rollout of the fibre service.

Major changes continue in Bishop Auckland with the council working closely with the Eleven Arches and Auckland Castle Trusts on a range of exciting plans. The council is currently carrying out a £2 million refurbishment project in the town centre, improving the links between the castle and the market place, where an award winning, multimillion pound refurbishment was carried out in 2011. The works will see the highway realigned, events and market spaces created as well as new parking.

As well as Kynren returning in the summer, the town can also look forward to the progress of the Walled Garden, Welcome Tower and Scottish Wing developments at Auckland Castle among many others.

Cabinet will hear about the work carried out so far and be asked to approve the updated masterplans when it meets on 18th January.

Like millions of people, I post Christmas lunch with the family. It was great to tune into the BBC's Call the Midwife at 8pm and see a popular programme cover the horrors of a Polio epidemic in a realistic, contemporary and sensitive way. It was a welcome reminder of the Polio eradication programme that continues abroad and of the 120,000 people in Britain still living with Post Polio Syndrome (PPS) today. At home and abroad, 2017

is going to be pivotal in the ongoing battle to beat Polio and PPS. With Polio endemic in just two countries, the End Polio Now campaign can count on our ongoing backing but the British Polio Fellowship continues to focus on members of the public living with PPS and in need of

our support.
Call the Midwife rightly depicts the Polio epidemics of the 50's; the Dickensian conditions of post war Britain and the Christmas special set in 1962 South Africa accurately portrays the extension of the Polio eradication programme. Sadly, many children unfortunate enough to contract Polio then face the perils of PPS today, and like

the ghost of Christmas Past, PPS has established itself as the unwelcome footnote of Polio UK.

While there is no cure for PPS, there is much we can do to alleviate the symptoms if properly managed and the British Polio Fellowship continues to raise awareness and offer support to those who continue to be affected by it. 
