Aycliffe's Charity Fundraiser Passes £25,000 for Bloodwise

A dedicated fundraiser has vowed to continue to raise money and awareness for cancer charity group Bloodwise, after seeing recent contributions under his #NotOneInch banner exceed £25,000.

Paul McGeary from Newton Aycliffe was 33 when he was struck with Acute Promyelocytic Leukaemia just over two years ago, and despite beating the disease in 2015, he suffered a relapse in July 2016. Throughout the whole ordeal, McGeary busied himself raising funds, and with the help and encouragement of family, friends and strangers alike, efforts in the 24-month period accumulated £24,112.38 prior to Christmas.

McGeary was buoyed just days into 2017 when he received a phone call from Sedgfield Community College – the school where he works as a Maths teacher – to say that staff and pupils had raised almost £1500, meaning the £25k mark was eclipsed, bringing the current total raised to a £25,582.23.

"I was aware the school were

raising monies, but I had no idea contributions would reach anywhere near £1500. I almost fell over when I was told of the amount," said Paul.

"I couldn't have been much prouder of the efforts of the students and my work colleagues, and it gives me the motivation to not only continue

to raise further funds and awareness, but to also beat this disease a second time and lead a normal life again, including a return to work."

A spokesperson added, "The School supports many nominated charities, but when student representatives were asked who they wished to raise funds for via their annual non-uniform day and Christmas celebrations, they unanimously agreed it should be for Mr McGeary's #NotOneInch campaign.

"Students have followed his story from day one, buying into the message of raising vital funds and awareness for Bloodwise. It is testament to them that their efforts have helped take donations beyond the £25k milestone, and they should be really proud, as we are of them."

As well as raising funds and awareness to support Bloodwise, Paul has recently launched a campaign to get more people signed up to the bone marrow registry, as he himself seeks a donor to further improve his chances of beating Leukaemia. CRIME-FIGHTING PUPPIES JOIN POLICE

Meet the new brother and sister crime fighting team, Jackson and Becky! The two Labrador puppies have become the latest recruits to a north east police dog unit. The tri-force dog section, which includes Durham Constabulary, Cleveland Police and North Yorkshire Police, welcomed brother and sister Jackson and Becky to join their elite unit of

canine crime fighters. Bred by a serving Durham officer and donated to the unit, the pups were born only ten weeks ago. They are currently being looked after by foster families until they are old enough to begin their formal training. They will join the unit as specialist search dogs sniffing out drugs or explosives. PC Ian Squire, from the tri-force dog unit, commented: "Becky and Jackson are currently with their respective families and have already started informal training. They will be taught basic obedience, socialisation skills and exposed to different environments before being paired with a police dog handler and formally trained." "They are lively little puppies who are enjoying their days exploring their

Dogs Microchipped Free by #BeLikeChip



More than 1,700 dogs have been microchipped free of charge thanks to a campaign led by Durham County Council. As of April last year, all dogs should be microchipped by the time they are eight weeks old. The chips allow details of the animals' owners to be registered on a database, making it easier for people to be reunited with their pets thereby reducing numbers of strays.

Ahead of the legislation coming into force, Durham County Council launched the #BeLikeChip campaign which provided free microchipping and raised awareness of the need for all dogs to be microchipped.

#BeLikeChip saw the council working in partnership with national dog charity Dogs Trust, local charity Stray Aid, Durham Constabulary, Dale and Valley Homes and East Durham Homes, with 1,769 dogs being microchipped. Owners of dogs that already had been microchipped were able to get the chip checked to ensure that their details were up to date in compliance with the new law.

Ian Hoults, Durham County Council's neighbourhood protection manager, said: "More than 1,700 dogs were microchipped free of charge through #BeLikeChip following its launch last March and we'd like to

thank all our partners in the campaign for helping make it such a success.

"We'd also like to remind dog owners that they must have their pets microchipped and their details registered and

#BeLikeChip was backed by County Durham Crafts winners, Devon and her owner Marie Burns. Pet owners who do not get their animals microchipped can be

fined £500. Free microchipping is still available from Stray Aid subject to terms and conditions. Appointments should be made at least a day in advance on 0300 999 4247. Vets also carry out microchipping but may charge.

Sam Hauxwell Review: "The blistering set takes in AC/DC, Saxon, Black Sabbath, Iron Maiden, Ozzy, Scorpions, Metallica, Rainbow, Guns 'n' Roses etc. Not always the usual choices but a mixed bag of METAL mayhem! What makes Revenant stand out from the rest is the years of experience and musicianship put into play during their live performances. Arguably one of the greatest local bands I've ever seen, they never disappoint their audience which is full of bikers and a loyal following. Revenant have a fantastic set-list, which is even enjoyed by those that wouldn't consider themselves metal fans, I personally wouldn't have ever thought of myself as a metal fan but coming from the Frigate on Saturday night, I found myself singing their set-list long after they'd finished their mind blowing performance. Students Invited to "Sparkies" Event

An exciting educational after school session is due to take place at Woodham Academy for primary school students. The school is inviting Year 5 and Year 6 students to take part in the Sparkies Science Club on the 25th January. The sessions, which will run every half term, are designed to educate students in a fun and informal way about all things science. The Woodham Sparkies Science Club, which has been running for a number of years now, engages youngsters in a world of experiments and explosions



as well as exploring topics such as atoms, patterns, volcanoes and astronomy. The first session of the year will look at microbiology. Students will discover how a

reaction to heat causes yeast to rise and make bread.

All primary school students are welcome to attend the sessions. Parents are asked to sign their child in at reception and are welcome to stay for the duration or come back at the end.

GAMP Board Meeting Report

(1) URGENT CARE UPDATE

DDES has produced a leaflet giving advice/help on Urgent Care – copies are available at GP Practices. The back page gives clear advice about the kinds of situations where people should call 999, but the rest of the leaflet gives options for less urgent situations.

The 111 operators can also signpost you to a range of NHS services.

(2) CRIME PRESENTATION

Insp. Sarah Honeyman delivered a presentation about how people such as plumbers are being trained to look out for signs of Child Sexual Exploitation, Human Trafficking and Stolen Goods when they visit a house. I shared how DCC are delivering a similar (MECC) scheme which encourages home-visitors to look out for health problems (livin has trained 50+ of their workers). The need for information sharing was emphasised.

(3) NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING

Anti-social behaviour is down significantly on last year. Insp. Honeyman reported how police have addressed the PACT Priorities – off-road bikes, speeding, parking outside schools, and hate crime. Work on the recent spate of burglaries – the 2-in-1 burglaries (house and car) and the ‘liquid burglaries’ (where the criminals poured bleach all over) – has shown that they are linked, and a regional issue. It is particularly pleasing how the community has united to watch out for and report people behaving suspiciously.

PACT meeting dates: Horndale (6pm, 1st Feb), West (6pm, 2nd Feb), Woodham (10:30am, 21st Feb), Neville (6:30pm, 21st Feb), Aycliffe Village (11am, 25th Feb).

(4) PRIORITY VOTING RESULTS

The vote had placed ‘Young People’, ‘Employment’, and ‘Older People’ as the three PACT priorities – as in fact has been the case all over the County! GAMP attracted more votes (768) than any other AAP. The £100,000 GAMP budget will be split equally between the three priorities, with the option to vary if necessary. At least a quarter of the budget must be sent on capital projects. There will be a ‘callout’ process seeking applications (£5,000-£20,000) within the three priority areas; some time was spent finalising the details of this process.

(5) DEFIBRILLATOR PROJECT

The Board voted to approve David Sutton-Lloyd’s Defibrillator Project. The £20,000 total funding (including public donations of £6,000 and £2600 from the County Councillors) will be used towards the purchase of 6 Defibrillator Units to be sited at Woodham Community Centre, Pioneering Care Centre, Greenfield Community College and the Bay Horse Middridge. In addition, a Portable Unit will be located at Greenfield Convenience Store and available during shop opening hours, and a sixth will be held at Woodham Community Centre as a back-up unit. A dedicated training unit will also be purchased to be used as part of the proposed cardiac arrest awareness and training programme.

(6) SIMPASTURE PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

The Board also approved a £1,000 proposal by Cllrs. Kate Hopper and Eddy Adam to locate a number of bollards at Simpasture shops to stop cars parking on the pavement.

(7) OTHER MATTERS

Due to completion of term of office and a resignation, there is a need for FOUR new ‘public reps’.

Next year’s Chairman will be selected from the AAP’s Partners, and a nominee was requested. The Budget is now fully spent. Date of next meeting, Tuesday 14th March, 6-8pm, at Woodham Academy. **By John Clare**

Aycliffe Company Celebrate Another Record Year

A family-run grounds and landscaping company has seen another increase in workforce and turnover during 2016. Beaumont Grounds Maintenance of Aycliffe has seen sales grow year-on-year for the last five years.

Managing Director Alexander Lineton said: “This year we’re looking to continue the growth path that we’re on while maintaining the family values that we offer. Our fantastic team has been essential in the growing success of Beaumont and I would like to thank them for their continued efforts.”

“We expect to have completed full accreditation for an ISO integrated management system, including ISO 9001, ISO 14001 and ISO 18001, and we will be fully accredited by the end of January 2017 enabling us to win new large-scale tenders to support our ambitious growth plan.

Beaumont was established in 1965 by Steven Lineton, who ran the new business alongside his garden centre based on Beaumont Hill in Darlington. In 1991 Beaumont moved premises to larger premises on Aycliffe Business Park and has since pushed more into the commercial maintenance sector.

It’s now headed up by the third generation of the Lineton family, with Alexander M.D. and his sister Sophie as accounts manager, while their parents – finance director Mark and company secretary Sally – continue to play crucial roles. In 2016 the company was named Service Business of the Year at the annual Aycliffe Business Park “Make Your Mark” awards.

£17m Project to Help Young People into Work

More than 2,000 young people have now signed up to a £17 million project designed to develop their skills, increase opportunities and help them into work.

The DurhamWorks programme is aiming to improve the prospects of County Durham's 16 to 24-year-olds who are not in education, employment or training.

And just six months into the more than two year project it is well on course to put almost 6,000 people on the path to employment by summer 2018.

Cllr Ossie Johnson, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for children and young people's services

said: "In only a few months DurhamWorks has successfully signed up over 2,000 County Durham 16 to 24-year-olds who were not in employment, education, or training.

"Unfortunately due to issues including the late introduction of increased requirements by the Department of Work and Pensions, and a delay in the payment of funding from the Government, we have had to request that our original target for sign ups in 2016 be reduced.

"Yet the overall target of involving 5,830 people in the DurhamWorks programme by July 2018 remains

unchanged and, having now introduced a system to gather and verify eligibility, we expect the numbers of participants to increase significantly in the coming weeks.

"We are working with employers and Business Durham to make sure there are jobs and apprenticeships for people to progress into, and we remain confident that the project will be a success." Already more than 300 small firms are working with the project to help create new job opportunities for the county's young people, with businesses saying they appreciate the support they are receiving to help them recruit the most appropriate people.

And more businesses are being encouraged to find out about working with the project, to help find the young staff they need.

Responding to Poverty

Councillors will hear about the continuing work to respond to tackling poverty across County Durham when they meet next week. Members of Durham County

Council's Cabinet will hear about the work of the authority and its partners to help those affected through changes made as a result of the Government's welfare reform programme and the challenges of continuing austerity.

More work is planned through an in-depth study into child poverty to further develop understanding of the issue in County Durham.

Councillors will be asked to give the go-ahead for the research to help develop further approaches to tackling poverty when they meet at the Glebe Centre, Murton, on Wednesday, 18 January.

Cllr Lucy Hovvels, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for adult and health services, said: "Poverty can affect every area of a child's development – social, educational and personal.

"Living in a poor household can reduce children's expectations of their own lives and lead to a cycle where poverty is repeated from generation to generation.

"If we want to give children the best start in life, we need to target everything from health, education and employment to behaviour, finance, family and personal relationships.

"In order to do this, we need to carry out detailed analysis of the issue and come to a better understanding of how it affects the lives of families in County Durham."

If it goes ahead, the research would include mapping service provision across the county in order to identify where new approaches and interventions are needed.

Furthermore, it is proposed that the council will continue its work as a member of the North East Child Poverty and also take up the opportunity to work with the North East Child Poverty Commission. The report also highlights the pressure within the Discretionary Housing Payments budget in 2016/17 due to increasing demand for support from residents struggling with housing payment demands.

STRAY AID NEED TO RAISE £250K FOR KENNELS

Stray Aid in Coxhoe have been conducting an unusual event raising money to purchase their site, expand and improve their current kennels. The long time goal is to raise £250,000 to make sure stray aid are here for the long run.

Supporting Hate Crime Victims

VICTIMS of hate crime will have unique access to a ground-breaking service launching last year. The first of its kind in the country, the new Hate Crime Advocacy Service will support victims that experience crimes motivated by prejudice. The service, put in place by Ron Hogg, Durham Police Commissioner, is made up of a trio of organisations that will provide advocacy support across County Durham and Darlington. It will support victims to ensure their rights are safeguarded and they are empowered to make informed choices and decisions about their recovery. Ron said: "A crime that is motivated by hostility or prejudice towards the victim is particularly destructive and can have devastating consequences for that victim, those closest to them and the wider community. "This is a unique service, whereby three different organisations are collaborating as one, to meet the specific needs of victims affected by the different strands of hate crime."

Show Racism the Red Card, Darlington Association on Disability and Gay Advice Darlington and Durham will work together to support anyone suffering from hate crime, or possible hate crime, right throughout the criminal justice process. This includes harassment and bullying, as well as financial, physical or other forms of abuse or criminal activity.

Lauren Robinson Chief Executive Officer at Darlington Association on Disability (DAD) said: "We have been working to raise the issues that affect victims of disability hate crime and crimes against vulnerable people for several years. We are very pleased that the Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner, Ron Hogg, has recognised that disabled people need additional support as victims of hate crime.

"This new project will help disabled people recognise when they have been a victim of hate crime and feel confident in reporting it. They will be able to access Advocacy Support throughout the Criminal Justice System. "DAD is looking forward to working in this unique partnership with GADD and Show Racism the Red Card on this ground breaking project." Emma Roebuck, Chief Executive Officer at Gay Advice Darlington and Durham commented that GADD is proud to be part of this innovative new project. She said: "By working as partners with Ron, Show

Racism the Red Card and Darlington Association on Disability, we can work together with communities and build positive outcomes for those who feel lost or ignored by the criminal justice system. "All strands of hate crime will be brought under the umbrella of one partnership, and advocates will work together for the first time on all the key components of hate and bigotry. It will be a mechanism to create cohesive communities in County Durham & Darlington." Laura Pidcock, North East Education Team Manager at Show Racism the Red Card said: "Show Racism the Red Card is acutely aware that in some places there exists a hostile environment for Black, Asian and other Minority communities.

"The climate post-Brexit has brought to the surface anti-immigrant sentiment, anti-Muslim prejudice and other discriminatory behaviours, meaning that the profile of hate crime has risen. Worryingly we know that hate crime is vastly under-reported. There are many pressures on those who are targeted, and they may fear things getting worse. Some people are also fearful of the repercussions if they report what happened.

"Having a Hate Crime Advocate for Race and Faith related hate crime is an extremely positive step in ensuring that victims of hate crime have equal access to justice."

Residents Have Their Say on Police Funding

Durham's Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner Ron Hogg is seeking views from members of the community as part of his annual public consultation on the police budget.

To help address further cuts to police funding, Ron intends to increase the amount of Council Tax which goes to the police service, known as the precept, by 1.98%. This equates to just £2.20 over the year, or 4p a week, for a property in Council Tax Band A.

Ron Hogg said: "In the 2015 Comprehensive Spending Review (CSR), the Government stated that they will protect the overall policing budget. Ministers have chosen to allocate some of this money to national priorities like counter-terrorism, but they have also cut the money available for local policing in order to fund organisations like the Independent Police Complaints Commission. Furthermore, they have increased the amount of police money which we can only get back if we bid for it. "This means that the amount of funding coming to local policing from Government is still reducing year on year. In 2017-18 I will receive £1.1m less to fund your local police force than I did in 2016-17." Ron added: "I am therefore consulting residents on

a proposal to increase their contribution to local policing, which for most people will mean paying 4 to 6 pence more a week. Despite the reductions in officer numbers since 2010, I remain fully committed to maintaining neighbourhood policing and keeping Durham Constabulary as the best police force in the country. The increase I am proposing would raise enough money to keep approximately 11 police officers on our streets, compared to freezing the precept at its current level. "We know that the Government is considering making changes to the way police forces are funded, and are concerned our budgets may reduce further in the future. If I do not ask local people to make an additional contribution, the force will be less resilient to future budget reductions. "Your views are important, so please take a few minutes to complete the survey before it closes later in January." The public consultation is open until Sunday 29th January. Businesses Support Students

Three alumni, ex Sunnysdale Students, returned to school recently to work with students. After nearly 10 years without an engineering facility at Greenfield Community College, Sunnysdale Campus, local businesses have joined with the school to create a much needed facility at its heart.

The aim is to develop awareness of 'Work Skills in Growth Sectors' in careers lessons and to inform students of future employment prospects and learn essential hand skills. There is a lack of workforce in particular industries and a rising level of students aged 16-18 in the Newton Aycliffe and Shildon area who are not in education, employment or training which this development aims to address. Inspiring and exciting our young people to make



informed choices in strong career pathways is the main objective, to encourage and support them to be successful in growth sectors and work towards sustainable careers in the future.

The idea originated from Yvonne Scott, Careers teacher at Greenfield Community College, who believes working closer with local businesses will give students the incentive to strive for real life opportunities and bridge the gap between employer's expectations and the abilities of the students.

The main objective and vision is clear 'to give young people a meaningful education around the 'Work Skills' needed in today's growth sectors' said Yvonne Scott. Work began in June this year to refurbish a room in the school to create a Work Skills facility.

Supported, by Dave Spensley, Managing Director of Go Ahead Training and Lee Childs the CEO of SWDT, both who are past students of Sunnysdale school, a clear

strategy has been created calling on many years of engineering experience from both organisations.

The Work Skills facility focuses on developing soft hand skills and the understanding of why and how they can be applied to future employment sectors. Their aim is to give students life skills and a good sound knowledge of how they can be used in the future.

The project has recently acquired the support of

Thorn Lighting to enrich the work the students are able to do by further developing STEM, (science, technology, engineering and maths) related activities in electrical engineering.

This has strengthened the learning opportunities for our young people and enriched their experiences by teaching them about 'What is light?' and 'How is light made?'

Experts from all three businesses and the careers teacher will be working during the Spring term with the students in years 8, 9 and selected year 11's to create personalised lamps, a large wall relief in metal and free standing sculptures with lighting features.

Throughout, the project will be logged in learning journals so students at Greenfield Community College can see the relevance of their learning to future employment opportunities and careers.

Next week (16-22 January) – along with many other Councillors, managers and decision-makers within Durham County Council - I shall be doing the Durham Children-in-Care Council's



'Care Leavers Challenge'.

This means living on a budget of £57.90 for the week – which is what an 18 to 21-year-old has on Job Seeker's Allowance. Basically, after deducting a recommended amount for unavoidable costs such as heating, the Challenge leaves me approx. £15 for the week for food, clothes, cleaning, personal hygiene, travel, saving, leisure and everything else that living involves.

I am aware that I will never really be able to appreciate the difficulties facing our county's Care Leavers. I have almost half-a-century's experience of looking after myself (including a time when we were very poor), with a comfortable home and supportive family. Care Leavers have few family contacts, and a young life which has been disrupted, sometimes disastrously. Almost two-thirds of the County's looked-after children have special educational needs.

THE AIM
Durham County Council is a 'corporate parent' to its looked-after children, and we as a Council and a community have a duty of care to the children for whom we have assumed parental responsibility.

That includes making sure that we have properly prepared them, and that we properly support them, when they leave care and start to build an independent life.

Did you know what you wanted to do after school when you were 13 years old? Many students haven't got a clue, while others know exactly where they want to go and what they want to do.

The prospect of planning your career and making choices for your future can be daunting at any age. The national programme aims to inspire the next generation and open young eyes to the variety of careers available within an integral industry.

Further career events include Specialist Days. Woodham Academy host Specialist Day three times during the academic year. The normal school timetable is suspended for the day whilst all year groups working on a variety of current themes including apprenticeships, and preparing their CVs. During the day, external partners come in to school to deliver workshops with each year group.

Last week, Year 8 students took part in the final of the Apprenticeship Awareness Challenge. During Specialist Day local businesses Palram, Lucite, Thorn Lighting, livin, South West Durham Training

and Ebac came in to school to work with the Year 8 students. The groups discussed their industry and explored career opportunities and what type of apprenticeships are available in that industry. Students also visited each workplace to spend time speaking to employees and touring the facilities. Their projects came to an end on Wednesday as parents were invited in to school to watch the teams deliver presentations of their findings from working with each company.

Parents of Year 11 students were recently welcomed in to school to discuss their child's progress, what to expect from the year ahead and to speak to college advisers for the Year 11 Examination Preparation Evening. The evening was an opportunity for parents to ask any questions related to their child's final year at school and to understand the importance of working hard in the coming months.

Head of Careers and PCC at Woodham Academy, Dave Walker, said: 'As a school we want to provide our students with as many opportunities as possible to get a taste of life after school and to prepare them for the world of work. We want to inspire our students and help them to discover the vast range of career options available to them.'

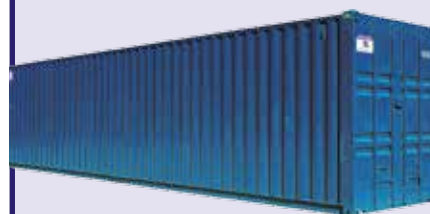
