Having the library and Leisure Centre under one roof will be a massive benefit to the public and the improved facilities will, no doubt, prove a real boost for the town."

The relocation of the library is part of a £1 million scheme being carried out by Durham County Council to help regenerate the town centre. The authority has been working alongside Freshwater, the owners of Aycliffe Town Centre, and Great Aycliffe Town Council to ensure residents and businesses have access to much improved facilities.

The new look town centre has attracted major new retailers including Aldi, Wilko and Select.

The creation of the new library has involved refurbishing a number of shop units adjoining the leisure centre and creating a shared entrance for the library and leisure centre. Facilities include separate sections for teenagers and children, a study area and updated computer equipment.

Couple's Generous Donation to MRI Scanner Appeal

When Bert and Muriel Terry heard that Darlington Memorial Hospital is raising money to buy a state of the art MRI scanner, they knew they had to help and immediately wrote a cheque for £1,000.

Bert, 87, explains, "I was brought up on a farm in Wesleydale and one of my earliest memories is of an accident I had when I was about three or four. Being a curious little boy, I managed to slice the top off a finger by inserting it in a haymaker. I had to spend quite some time in Darlington Memorial Hospital and remember being very well looked after. There was a real chance I would lose my hand but they managed to save it and most of my finger.

All these years later, I'm getting more great care at Darlington where I receive fortnightly blood transfusions. While the treatments, technology and lots of other things have changed beyond recognition since my childhood, the staff have the same attitude all these years later. They're kind, helpful, cheerful, and give me



exceptional care, treating my wife and I like family.

Muriel adds, "In making this donation, we're getting the satisfaction of giving something back to the hospital that has given my husband great care in both his early and later years. We hope the new scanner will help do the same for future generations."

County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust aims to

raise £2.5m to bring the latest MRI scanning technology to both Darlington Memorial and Bishop Auckland Hospitals.

Dr. Elizabeth Loney, Clinical Director for Radiology, explains, "We're so grateful to Mr and Mrs Terry for their very generous donation which gives a real boost to our appeal. MRI scans are particularly good at looking at soft tissues and tremendous advances in technology over recent years mean they can be enormously helpful in diagnosing cancer, heart conditions, strokes and many other health issues. Scans can also give doctors information that previously required the

patient to undergo surgery or another invasive procedure as part of the investigation of their symptoms. Crucially, MRI scanners don't use radiation, unlike x-rays.

"MRI scans are so useful we're doing more of them each year. In the last year alone the number of MRI scans has increased by 11%.

"In the past, some patients have been unable to tolerate the noise or have felt claustrophobic during the scan which can result in it being abandoned. An MRI scan can take between 30 minutes and an hour - much longer than people may realise, so comfort is really important. Modern scanners have a choice of music the patient can listen to - they can even bring their own!

"We're re-developing the whole MRI suite at Darlington. Changing and waiting areas will provide greater privacy. Anaesthetic facilities will be improved which will particularly benefit children who can't lie still in the scanner.

"An MRI scanner is one of the most expensive pieces of equipment a hospital will ever purchase and we'd love the

whole community, including individuals, companies, schools, sports clubs etc, to support us by holding events such as coffee mornings, cake sales and sponsored activities in aid of the Scanner Appeal. Every pound counts. After all, you never know when you or a loved one might need a scan."





Great Aycliffe Town Council will be building on past activities and organising a series of free public events for local residents to promote and encourage the positive use of our local environment in the coming year.

“Town Council to limit the Council Tax increase to 1.99% next year, despite facing funding cuts and unavoidable increases in costs”

The Town Council has agreed its Revenue and Capital Budget and set the Precept and Council Tax increase for the 2017/18 financial year.

Whilst in the short term, the Council’s finances remain in a healthy position, with savings continuing to be achieved and healthy levels of balances and reserves, the Council is facing an increasingly challenging future, and must ensure that it plans ahead for the difficulties that lie ahead.

The Council is facing year on year cuts to the Council Tax Support Grant funding on which it is reliant, while it faces a number of significant spending pressures including pay awards and increases to the National Living Wage, pension contribution increases, and inflation on running costs.

In order to maintain the many important services provided by the Town Council, and absorb the cuts to funding and increases in costs faced over the longer term, the Council needs to consider making a small increase in the Town Council Tax next year.

This decision has not been taken lightly, particularly in light of the on-going ‘cost of living’ difficulties we know are being faced by local residents, and following on from the four year freeze in council tax that the Town Council was proud to deliver between 2010 and 2013.

However, by agreeing, in principle, to limit the proposed rise to 1.99% next year, the increase in the Town Council Tax Bill at Valuation Band A would be limited to less than £3 per year or 5p per week.

This increase will ensure that all of the important services provided by the Town Council to the community of Great Aycliffe can be protected and maintained for at least another year, whilst maintaining some contingency funds to help the Council to offset some of the budget pressures faced in the longer term.

1. The Council has achieved a clean bill of health from the external auditors every year on both its accounts and its arrangements for securing value for money.
2. The Council has not made any cuts to front line services despite losing more than £160,000 in grant funding over the 4 years and dealing with a number of unavoidable increases in costs.

This year, residents will be able to choose from Northumberland, Scarborough, Edinburgh, Blackpool, Lake District, South Shields or Barnard Castle with a guided tour of Bowes Museum. Please note that places are limited and given out on a ‘first come, first served’ basis.

Our ‘trippers’ have the choice of venue for the day with a three course meal and tea or coffee (afternoon tea at Bowes Museum) provided in a good quality establishment

usually with disabled facilities. Most of the excursions also call in for a comfort stop with refreshments provided on the way to or from the main destination.

The coaches provided are 49-53 seater executive coaches with toilet facilities. There is also a 53 seater executive coach with a wheelchair hoist to each destination. This ensures that even people with severe mobility problems can enjoy a day out. The hoist can be used for loading wheelchairs for those residents who need to travel in their wheelchair, or for use by people who cannot manage the steps on the coach. Each person who qualifies is entitled to one ‘trip’. To qualify you must be aged 60 or over and must have lived in the electoral parish by 31st March in the year of travel.


