We are all aware that this site has a long planning history & can understand that some local residents might welcome the Council's decision I believe that the reasons given for refusal are questionable.

Many years ago when development of the site was proposed a major issue was access off the A167. Now, it is clear that the Highway Authority has no problem with a signalised junction being installed on the A167. presumably traffic

growth has increased in the intervening period it would suggest that the original objections were unfounded. Furthermore, the report makes clear that Rushyford is already ity regardless roundabout capacity of this and other proposed developments. This is not news to those who use it regularly. The developer would have contributed to the cost of upgrading this busy junction so what plans do DCC have to upgrade Rushyford roundabout?

With the A167 access issue dead in the water the planners have had to think up an alternative reason to refuse permission. The notice published on the DCC website says that there would be "significant adverse landscape harm" if the development were to go ahead. Is this a convincing argument? According to the applicant's statement in the planning report: " ... 8 weeks into the determination period a response was received in October 2016 advising that officers had changed their position and considered the site to represent a "valued landscape". The applicant landscape". was advised that the planning application was no longer supported by officers." This appears to be because the: "parcel of land that provides a strategic separation between the wider development of

Ayeliffe Woodham" and It must come as a surprise to anyone travelling along

Woodham Way that there is considered to be a separation between Woodham and Newton Aycliffe. There isn't even a road sign! Perhaps someone should have thought of that when Woodham was first developed. It seems that DCC are giving mixed developers. messages to They are relying on the 1996 Sedgefield Local Plan which is out of date, having been due to expire in 2006 but failing to come up with coherent plans to address government requirements on housing supply.

In all of this the landowner,

Mr Porter, has been dignified in what must be a frustrating process. He has received countless knock-backs while the authorities rely on outdated plans. DCC say that they "sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive manner". I don't think it's helpful for them to change their position during a consultation. I think it is now incumbent on DCC to work with the developer to work out precisely what would be acceptable. This issue needs resolving, assuming the Planning Inspectors don't simply impose a solution as has happened elsewhere. R.Tarling, Biscop Crescent



# Labour / Momentum **Buying** Votes?

Nationally, the three 'main' Political Parties have been fined by the Electoral Commission for overspending in the general election and by-elections. The amount of money that can be spent on campaigns at constituency level is strictly limited. However, County Durham Labour Group appear to be intent upon financing their election campaigns using local taxpayer's monies.

Durham County grant Council each Councillor elected 'Neighbourhood Budget' [currently £20,000 pa; soon to be reduced to £18.000?]. This money is disbursed to local worthy causes by GAMP and the Councillors against funding applications by local charities / worthy causes to benefit the local community. This, I consider, is a laudable use of taxpayer's money and indeed, I am not aware of any local dissatisfaction with, or abuse of, the system.

However, recent 'electioneering' letters published in the Newton News and in Labour Party election leaflets, it is not made clear that this money is taxpayer's money and that, should a non-Labour candidate be elected, he or she would also receive a 'Neighbourhood Budget'.

I would therefore suggest that all candidates standing for election to Durham County Council in the May elections, should set out in their manifesto how they intend to disburse their 'Neighbourhood Budget'. This would create a level playing field and stop Labour being left open to the allegation of 'buying votes' with public funds.

There is another problem looming for the DCC electorate; the majority voted for Brexit and I'm only aware of one Labour Town Councillor who out publicly for Brexit. Since the General Election extreme left wing Momentum group have hijacked the Labour Party and they are, to a man. If you vote Labour will you be voting for an 'Old labour', 'New Labour', or, 'Momentum Labour' candidate?

Personally, I think the electorate are entitled to know the politics of their Councillors. If a candidate is a Momentum supporter then they should not stand under the Labour banner. In Aycliffe East the current Labour Town Mayor, Cllr. Jed Hillary, is not standing for re-election. Rumour has it he has been de-selected by Momentum infiltrators! 



1 in 8 women and 1 in 870 men

will be diagnosed with breast cancer during their lifetime. There were 54,800 new cases of breast cancer in the UK in

The NHS Breast Screening Programme invites all women aged between 50 and 70 for screening every 3 years. You need to be registered with a GP to receive the invitations. If you are older than 70, you can still have screening every 3 years but you won't automatically be invited. To make an appointment, talk to your GP or your local breast screening unit.

It is important to know your body and get checked out if anything changes that is not normal for you. 15,500 breast cancers are diagnosed through screening in the UK each year. Vicki Moffat, Wellbeing Coordinator said 'The number Wellbeing of women attending their breast screening appointments has fallen since 2011. Breast Cancer is not just a lump. Going for breast screening can find abnormalities which you wouldn't necessarily be able to feel or see, so it is really important that you keep your screening appointments.

Breast screening saves around ,500 lives every year in the UK. Screening aims to find breast cancers early. Very early breast cancers are usually easier to treat, may need less treatment, and are more likely to be cured It is important to go for your breast screening whenever you are invited.

The average fine issued to dog owners was £340, with the maximum penalty recorded as £500. It's estimated that fines will total around £73,000 over the next five
