carried out in a shoddy manner leaving them with ongoing problems. They report that it can be weeks before anyone returns to look





Newtonian Creates Capsule to be Opened in 300 Years Time

A map of the moon, a miniature music box and a collection of coins are among the artefacts contained in a time capsule that is to be locked away for 300 years. The James D Robinson Time Capsule, which has been put together by a County

Durham photographer, is to be stored at Durham County Record Office. There are only four other known capsules in the world that will remain unopened for longer than the new box - and none are to be found in the UK

James D Robinson, from Newton Aycliffe, was inspired to create the box-within-aaluminium box after reading about the Westinghouse time capsules buried at Flushing Meadows in New York. First interred in 1938, the capsules are not due to be opened until 6939. James, whose photos are included in the permanent

collections of the National Portrait Gallery and The Royal Society, said: "The capsule is intended to be opened on 21 March 2317, a day I have chosen because its symbolic association of





and the rebirth of the natural world, which equates to the new lease of life for the data within the time capsule once it is opened." Noel Bennett, also of Newton

Aycliffe, has put together a film about the project, its contents, how it was sealed and how it will be stored. There will be a special showing of the film at St Clare's Church Hall, St Cuthbert's Way, Newton Aycliffe, on Friday, 21 April at 7pm, when there will also be a question and answer session and Liz Bregazzi, county archivist at Durham County Record Office, will talk about how the time

capsule will be preserved. Liz said: "James' request to store the capsule was quite an unusual one and not something we have been

asked to do before. "It's the only time capsule we have in our stores but we are always interested in different ideas and suggestions for capturing and preserving the past." The capsule contains a large

database of text and images and a number of artefacts, individual with items including:

• A copy of Patrick Moore's moon map as originally published in the Sky at Night magazine;An early copy of an

American superhero comic featuring The Flash;

An essay on current understanding of how the universe may have originated Professor Carlos Frenk, the director of the Durham-based Institute for Computational Cosmology;

• Copies of drawings, photographs and poster designs by James D Robinson.

• More than 100 coins from around the world;

A collection of crown cap bottles tops and pin badges some of which relate to early Russian space missions; • A small collection of vintage

lighters and mechanical wrist watches. A miniature music box that

plays the song Edelweiss; • A vintage razor from 1912 and a double 'o' gauge die cast model of a motor car. James has also produced a small booklet, which has been distributed to archives around the world in an effort to ensure that the time capsule remains within the scope of human memory.

Aycliffe 102 Battalion REME Challenge Apprentices

At the beginning of April, soldiers from the Newton Aycliffe based REME Battalion Battalion (102 REME) conducted Exercise Engineering Challenge for apprentices engineering from across the North East of England.

Engineering Challenge, a four day residential course is now in its second year and proving to be very popular with the automotive and apprentice industry providers. This year teams of apprentices were provided by Nissan, Caterpillar, Komatsu and Reliance Precision and Sunderland College.

There was a new dynamic to this year's event, with the Caterpillar team comprising of four female engineering apprentices, all volunteers and all wanting to prove themselves as capable as their male counterparts. They were placed in a well matched group with apprentices from Komatsu, a rival company in so much as they both manufacture excavators and other plant!

As it turned out it was an excellent match with both sets of apprentices having similar skill sets that made them a well-rounded team. This was borne out during the Technical Challenge aspect of the course, when they were the only team to successfully lift their vehicle and alight it as per the specification!

The course was conducted entirely at Wathgill Training Camp this year and resourced almost entirely from battalion staff. However the support provided by Outreach Team North on day two must be acknowledged, loaning us their facilities and members of their team to assist with the Command Tasks and Assault Course.

The course programme was coordinated by the ROSO, Capt Dave Hamilton, while





Major Phil Cush designed and ran the technical two day phase. The week was supported by SPSIs and mentoring teams throughout the week. It would be fair to say the apprentices loved the course and that we got the balance just about right.

Two days of physical and mental challenges based around a military programme, followed by two days of technical design and manufacturing, what more could a young man or woman want from a week with the Northern Craftsmen? Oh yes, fun, so we threw in quite a bit of that too.



representatives from the companies named above watched their apprentices as they talked through the challenges they had been presented with and how they had dealt with them. There then followed a demonstration by each of the groups of their finished projects. There were a lot of crossed fingers as their models negotiated obstacles with a variety of control modules and then got into their lifting devices. Given the time constraints and unfamiliar resources all teams did extremely well, though it is unlikely that Nissan will begin production of any of the model vehicles presented or that Caterpillar or Komatsu will roll out a new winch based on the examples presented by the apprentices. Petition to Save Counselling Service

South Durham Counselling offer free non-time limited support sessions for as long as needed in Shildon.

Unfortunately they received an email out the blue from the Clinical Commissioning Group saying their funding was ending in April! The reasons being cuts and interestingly replication of service which is odd as it certainly isn't replicated elsewhere and they deemed us as a specialist service.

90% of clients are Rape sex abuse victims or people suffering severe trauma. One of their working partners (Sex abuse and rape crisis centre have a waiting list of 12 months and state they will struggle without them as we are one of the few places in the UK to take victims of both sexes.

They are going to offer clients generic counselling which means 6-8 sessions with a counsellor who is not trained in the area and will likely cause more psychological trauma. South Durham Counselling also provide student placements to trainee counsellors in their final degree year and without this they could not qualify to enter the workforce. All Counsellors give their time

for Free and two well attended community groups to try and address local social isolation They have a website www. southdurhamcounselling.org with an online petition to save the service.

air ambulance charity has warned against the dangers of laser strikes after his aircraft was targeted once more while returning from a rescue mission

The chief pilot of the region's

Captain Jay Steward, of the Great North Air Ambulance Service, was flying back from James Cook University Hospital, Middlesbrough, to the charity's base at Durham Tees Valley Airport when a green laser beam was shone into the helicopter's cabin on

Sunday evening. The aircraft was preparing to land at the time and was at about 700ft when one of the aircrew spotted the laser beam being shone from the ground. The blinding beam lit up the aircraft repeatedly, presenting a serious risk to Captain Steward, who is a vastly experienced former military pilot, and his crew. He said: "It might all seem like fun and games from the ground, but I'm telling you

it's no fun at 700ft, with a crew of dedicated medics on board, when the beam could be burning your retina and you are just trying your best to get everyone home safely." The incident happened at about 9.25pm. As the crew

were flying in darkness, Mr Steward had already briefed them about the possibilities of laser strikes, given that the crew were targeted in the area around James Cook University Hospital in November. "It's a shame we are having

to prepare our crews for laser strikes, but that's the world we are living in sadly," he said. "I can't emphasise enough how

dangerous this is. It causes temporary sight loss, which could quite feasibly cause the pilot to lose control of the aircraft. The consequences of that don't bear thinking about." It is thought the beam originated somewhere near the roundabout outside Tesco at

Eaglescliffe. Captain Steward from Newton Aycliffe added: "They are idiots and we would ask people if they see someone using a laser pen recklessly, to call the police

The incident was reported to the police and aviation authorities. On this occasion. none of the aircrew suffered any damage to their eyesight. Meanwhile, the a air
