It's been some time since submitted my last report so here I am, back again. There's been quite a lot of changes to the make-up of the Neighbourhood Policing Team since I last put finger to keypad with a number of Aycliffe's finest having left for pastures new and several 'newbies' joining our ranks. There's a number of issues that have been affecting the town of late which the Team has been tackling along with our partners and the community. Over the last couple of months we have seen a surge in the number of reported fires caused by persons engaging in anti-social behaviour. Such behaviour has seen

youths setting fires to rubbish – the Industrial Estate has been where a large percentage of these incidents has occurred. My Team have been working closely with County Durham and Darlington Fire and Rescue Service and we have identified a number of local youths responsible. A number of interventions consisting of education and enforcement will follow - our colleagues in Fire and Rescue deliver some particularly hard hitting fire awareness sessions. I would respectfully request that local businesses do their utmost to

keep rubbish to a minimum to prevent future instances.

All motorcycles, including quad bikes, scooters, mini motos etc have been classified as mechanically propelled vehicles meaning that if used on a highway they must comply with many of the same laws that

apply to cars including MOT, insurance, excise duty, head wear etc. If used on private land the landowner must have given prior permission. These

rules apply to all. The NPT have received a lot of stock recently as part of our community engagement initiative funded via GAMP - look out for many freebies over the coming months as we approach summer which will be distributed across a number of the community events that we will be in attendance at. 

Protecting Hedgehogs **£620 for SWAN Charity** Dementia Awareness

Two hedgehog lovers have turned their homes into sanctuaries for their favourite animals. Sandra (Darlington) and Dawn (Newton Aycliffe) both take in sick and injured hedgehogs.

They are registered with the British Hedgehog Preservation Society and have set up Hedgehog Helpers Darlington and Aycliffe Facebook so members of the public, when they find sick or abandoned hedgehogs, can ring for advice. All the rehabilitated hedgehogs are in the process of being released into the wild so it's a busy time!

Some of their patients such as Conker who was found squealing with eyes full of fly eggs and Strimmer Jim had an accident with a strimmer. Frosty was found in a live capture trap and Holly was so tangled in netting she had to be knocked out before it was removed. These are just a few of what they deal with on a weekly basis.

Hedgehog Awareness Week runs from 30th April to 6th May which aims to highlight the problems hedgehogs face and how you can help them. Sandra and Dawn explain that this year the campaign is focusing on garden strimmers, reminding people to check the area before using these. Here are some

ways to help hedgehogs:-• *Ensure you have a small hole* in your fence to allow easy access to hedgehogs.

• Move piles of rubbish to another site before burning and check compost heaps or hav before digging forks in. • Ensure netting is kept at a

safe height. • Try to stop using pesticides such as slug pellets.

• Cover drains/holes. · Ensure easy access out of *ponds/pools.Watch dogs at night when in*

your garden. Many people wonder what to



WOMAN COUNTING THE **COST OF FLY-TIPPING**

A County Durham woman has been left hundreds of pounds worse off and with a criminal record after being caught fly-

tipping. Amy Wall, 25, who lives in blond dumped Bishop Auckland, dumped household waste from the back of a car at Shildon. Council Durham County CCTV captured footage of the fly-tip while Wall also left her address in the dumped waste.

Wall was taken to court by the council as part of its awardwinning Operation Stop It fly-tipping campaign and now conviction and more than £600 to pay. Newton Aycliffe magistrates heard how a neighbourhood council

warden called at Brusselton Lane, an area where the council has fitted cameras in response to persistent fly-tipping, on 14 January last year.

The warden discovered a pile of household waste which had been dumped at the scene. Among the waste was an envelope addressed to Wall, of

High Lands, Cockfield. The warden checked the footage from the CCTV which showed a Silver Vauxhall Corsa pull up. A man and woman can then

be seen getting out, taking rubbish out of the boot and dumping it before driving off. The warden carried out checks of the car's registration and found it to be registered to Wall.

£616. Ian Hoult, the council's neighbourhood protection manager, said: "The vast majority of people get rid of their waste legally: be that

"There really is never any excuse for blighting our beautiful county by fly-tipping. "Miss Wall was caught by one of the cameras we've deployed as part of Operation Stop It and we hope the financial penalty imposed on her will deter anyone else from committing environmental crime.

"Anyone tempted to commit such offences should also be warned that a criminal record can mean you're not allowed in to some foreign countries.




