OUR LOCAL HOSPITAL INVESTING IN THE FUTURE

Work is nearing completion on a £20 million investment in state of the art operating theatres at Darlington Memorial Hospital. An official launch event for the scheme, which includes 6 new theatres as well as upgraded mortuary facilities and a bereavement suite, will take place later this month. The investment follows a £27m upgrade to the infrastructure of the hospital building over the past few years, 'a commitment to the future of the hospital', says the NHS organisation which runs the hospital. County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust (CDDFT) is the largest provider of

integrated care – hospital and community services – in the North East and last year had over two million patient contacts. Sue Jacques, Chief Executive of CDDFT said: "We serve a population of 650,000 people delivering services from our main hospital sites in Darlington, Durham and Bishop Auckland as well as our community hospitals, a range of other community settings and within patients' homes. It is a responsibility we take extremely seriously and we have a dedicated workforce of over 8,000 colleagues striving to provide the highest quality care. "This is reflected in our performance last year.



Every year we must produce an annual report – a look back on the previous year and how we have performed both operationally and financially. We've just finalised our report for 2016/17 which will be formally presented at our annual general meeting in September. "I hope many local residents will join us at this meeting to hear our highlights from the year. These include the organisation performing well against national targets, we successfully met national performance targets including 92% of patients receiving treatment within 18 weeks of referral, despite unprecedented demand on our A&E services we delivered a strong performance and achieved the target we had agreed with NHS Improvement, and we again performed well on cancer targets. We also delivered on our financial plans to end the year with a surplus and therefore generating the cash necessary for us to continue to invest in the future for our patients. "Further examples of this investment include the expansion last year of our centre of excellence for orthopaedic surgery at Bishop Auckland Hospital and we also opened a new state of the art simulation training facility at Bishop Auckland which is placing us at the forefront of education and training across the region. "Our success is the result of such a dedicated and passionate workforce, they are our greatest asset and of course, the continued support we receive from our patients and local communities – thank you." The Trust has also invested in mobile technology which means community teams can spend more time with patients in their homes rather than having to travel to and from an office base to complete their notes. On the hospital

wards new technology is also supporting staff to record patient information electronically which means key data is available at a glance. Professor Paul Keane OBE, Chairman of County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust said: "It has been a challenging year but I am pleased that we have achieved the majority of our targets and in some instances exceeded expectation. These outcomes could not have been realised without the dedication, commitment and hard work of all of our 8000 staff. I continually visit our service delivery teams and the enthusiasm, innovation and compassion by staff is so very evident to see and this helps us continue to enhance the quality of care for our patients and communities, which is our absolute priority."

Confusion Over Use of Recycling Bin

Dear Sir, I subscribe to the DCC brown garden waste bin system and pay £25 per year to have it emptied once a fortnight during the season. I do record all my phone calls so DCC can't say they didn't say to use the recycle bin for garden

Great Aycliffe Community Aid Partnership - June Meeting

The first meeting following the AGM saw 24 people in attendance and Chairman Ron Mitchie set the path straight for the coming year in circulating a Code of Conduct.

Prior to the meeting, the Secretary had sent an "Officers Report" electronically, but outlined the progress made at their meetings as follows:

- 1) Producing a leaflet for partners to circulate to others, raising the profile of GACAP.
- 2) The website to be reinstated as would the domain name.
- 3) Raising the profile via Facebook and Twitter would be increased too.
- 4) There will be a Special Meeting at 3.45pm on 3rd July to adopt a new Constitution which had been circulated for comments.
- 5) To invite up to four partners to join the officers as part of GACAP Management Committee. Each meeting would in future have at least one speaker either from a GACAP partner or an outside organisation with

similar aims as GACAP. The speaker for this meeting was Chris Cowley from DISC who worked on the Reaching out Across Durham (ROAD) project. The ROAD Project was funded by the Big Lottery. DISC and 20 other partners were working together on the project to make a difference to the lives of people over 25 years of age who live in Co Durham who have barriers in their life. He told those present that

any GACAP partner could refer a person requiring assistance. Intensive support is given to each person from a range of health and finance specialists as well as accessing a range of training courses to enable them to make positive choices. The initial criteria once referred, was a birth certificate and ROAD were happy to help track one down if that was necessary. Each referral has one to one personal assistance for tat all times.

After referral, eligibility followed, then an assessment followed by developing a plan, a review, completion of the project and course celebration. Support could last for a period of three years.

Partners were encouraged by the possibility of premises being obtained, located in the town centre for a GACAP HQ. The Town Centre manager was helpfully liaising with the president and the Town Centre Owners.

Large Dog off Lead Savages Small Jack Russell Terrier

On Wednesday 7th June my Mum was walking her two whippets and my Jack Russell Terrier 'Poppy' along the old railway lines in Newton Aycliffe around 1.30pm, when a large German Shepherd dog approached them. This dog was off the lead and the owner had no control whatsoever, and was frantically shouting at the dog by name, but it wouldn't listen and proceeded to chase her young whippet who was so scared she ran all the way home to Rowan Place

(over a busy road near the train station). The German Shepherd then chased the other whippet all the way home. My poor Mum didn't know where her dogs were, if they had been mauled, ran over/or killed!

The big dog returned snarling and growling, and my Mum was terrified it was going to attack her. She shouted it off and tried to ward it off using her dog lead. - it then grabbed my little Jack Russell (still on her lead) by the neck. The man shouted at my Mum

and threatened to set his other German Shepherd dog on her.

My dog needed surgery to her neck and due to the nature of the injury has a very high risk of infection requiring further surgery.

We are all really upset and my Mum's dogs are terrified to go outside. The impact was devastating on my son who is sitting GCSE Exams and couldn't sleep the night of the attack.

The Police are currently dealing with the incident and even though this is a "first reported" attack we are hopeful of bringing this man to justice as three separate crimes have been committed. I would ask readers that should anything happen to you or your dogs where you feel that they, or you are in danger of being attacked, please report it to the police on 101.

Even if there is no injuries the police will keep a record and I have had several people message me who have said similar things have happened. Had these incidents been reported to the police then that would have meant that this wasn't a first offence and would have been easier for me to get justice for our dogs and family.

Summary of Great Aycliffe Plan & Why You Should Vote 'Yes' Please Use Your Vote - It is important!

On Thursday 22nd June, people in Newton Aycliffe are being asked to go to the polls again - this time to vote 'yes' or 'no' to the proposed Great Aycliffe Neighbourhood Plan (GANP).

At the moment, the government's National Planning Policy Framework has "a presumption in favour" of development unless the harm caused by that development "demonstrably and significantly" outweighs the benefits. In practice, this makes it very hard for the Planners or Planning Committees to say no to ANY planning application.

This is why it is so important that residents approve the GANP, which - if agreed - will set certain standards to which new developments must conform. The GANP is Great Aycliffe's protection against rogue developments.

THE PLAN

You can read the whole plan at bit.ly/GANPlan but here is my best effort at a summary of the main points:

OBJECTIVES (pp1-2)

1. To protect and retain the traditional green areas, open spaces and environment for the community.
2. To alleviate parking problems
3. To protect the green and leafy character of our area.
4. To protect Aycliffe Village
5. To ensure that housing is sufficiently high-quality and affordable, of the necessary size, with adequate parking, garaging and open spaces, and includes suitable accommodation for older people
6. To help improve retail provision.
7. To encourage local jobs.
8. To ensure that developers contribute to local infrastructure.

PLANNING POLICIES (pp36-61)

CHARACTER AND HERITAGE

- CH1 - Developments must maintain hedgerows and woodlands, provide tree-lined avenues and ensure green open space is provided.
- CH2 - New development that would change the character of accessible local green space will only be permitted if the applicant can demonstrate that very special circumstances exist that would justify such an exception.
- CH3 - Existing open spaces, sports and recreational buildings and land, including playing fields and amenity open space, should not be built on except in certain circumstances.
- CH4 - Heritage Assets must be protected.

ENVIRONMENT

- E1 - Development must continue and enhance interlinked green corridors.
- E2 - There must be 'areas of separation' to the north and south of Aycliffe Village to prevent coalescence with the rest of Newton Aycliffe.
- E3 - Aycliffe Village is a Conservation Area and any development must take account of the village's historic character, architectural

details and building materials.

- E4 and E5 - New developments should not remove trees unless there is a compensatory mitigation proposal.

- EE1, 2 and 3 - New developments for energy efficiency and/or energy production from renewable and low carbon sources will be supported in certain circumstances.

HOUSING

- H1 - Small infill developments (less than 30 houses) must be proportionate and well-contained, and must relate to, and respect the character and form of, the established settlement.

- H3 and H5 - Set minimum off-road car and bike parking spaces for new houses (from 1 space for a 1-bed flat to 4 spaces for a 5-bed house).

- H4 - Garages must be big enough to take a modern vehicle (viz. 3m wide for a single and 5.5m for a double).

- H6 - Developments should be designed to achieve the highest possible energy efficiency standards.

- H7 - 10% of new dwellings on sites of 10 or more dwellings must meet the needs of older people, including bungalows (especially on the land adjacent to Woodham School).

- H8 - Proposals for 11 or more dwellings must provide an element of affordable housing.

- H9 - Developments must include adequate facilities - improved drainage, parks, play areas, footpaths etc.

RETAIL

- R2 - Seeks to protect the local retail centres at Simpashire, Neville Parade, Woodham and Cobbler's Hall.

- R3 - Supports developments which create employment opportunities, particularly high quality jobs, for Great Aycliffe residents.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC

- T1 - Restricts developments which will increase on-street parking, and requires adequate provision on-site for parking and access for deliveries, service vehicles, tradesmen working on-site, workers, social visitors and residents.

- T2 - Requires off-street parking in visually sensitive areas to be of permeable design material, which will allow grass to be the dominant final finish. It also requires consideration to be given to flood risk as a result of increased parking provision.

- T3 - Major developments must include cycle routes and footpaths connecting to local shops and the countryside.

INFRASTRUCTURE

- CIL1 - All new development must provide a contribution towards necessary facilities and/or infrastructure by means of planning conditions, a Section 106 agreement or a Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) - particularly provision of off-street parking, footpaths and cycleways etc.

Being a concerned citizen I then contacted Darlington Borough Council who 'surprise, surprise' also denied liability showing extreme apathy by suggesting I contact the police by telephoning 101.

It appears the council 'jobsworths' live in their own little protected world and don't understand or appreciate that every time a heavy goods vehicle causes damage then there are financial implications in that somebody has to pay for the



repairs (normally the council taxpayer) along with the inconvenience to bona-fide motorists who have to endure any associated road works and hold ups.

Perhaps it will take a severe accident involving an HGV before anybody in authority sees fit to take action.

'Super Shed' Appeal at PCP for Wheelchair Gardeners

Disabled volunteers with a keen interest in gardening could soon be honing their skills in a ground-breaking, custom-built 'super shed' at the Pioneering Care Partnership Centre in Newton Aycliffe. The bespoke timber building has been specially designed to enable people in wheelchairs to access space where they can learn the finer points of preparing seeds, potting and planting under the watchful eye of a green-fingered tutor. But, everything now hinges on the kindness of well-wishers donating the estimated £1000 still needed for the build as well as

materials and equipment so that work can start on the foundations. Members of the local Greenfield Men's Cree group have already offered to build the new shed which, say Centre staff, will make 'a tremendous difference' for would-be gardeners in wheelchairs. Gardening horticulture tutor Howard Leslie (pictured in the PCP greenhouse with volunteer David Cockburn) said this week: "We already have a small but very dilapidated shed in the gardens at the Centre but there is no way in which anyone in a wheelchair can get into it. The new shed will make

an enormous difference to the volunteers - especially those currently restricted in the work they can do in the garden. It will also enable them to keep gardening in all weathers." The PCP Centre already boasts a well-developed and sizable garden with raised beds and a greenhouse where volunteers of all ages and abilities grow flowers, fruit, herbs and vegetables - some of which are subsequently sold to the public. 
