COUNTY CELEBRATES HEALTH BHF - The Big Stitch RECYCLING AND WELLBEING SUCCESS

number of significant achievements have been made by the County Durham Health and Wellbeing Board in its fourth year of operation. meeting of the board has heard.

Presenting its annual report for 2016/17, the County Durham Health and Wellbeing Board outlined the work it has carried out in the last twelve months and the projects earmarked for

include Examples agreement of an Oral Health Strategy to address concerns over variations in oral health across the county.

This will aim to reduce the prevalence of dental disease in young children and the aging population and reduce inequalities in dental disease after statistics showed over 60 per cent of children had experience of tooth decay in Woodhouse Close, Bishop Auckland compared to six per cent in Chester-le-Street.

Other highlights include the establishment of the Healthy Child Programme Board, a sub-group providing a specific focus on health issues affecting children, young people and families to reduce health inequalities and deliver improved outcomes.

In 2016, the Health and Wellbeing Board was also one of only 14 boards in the country to achieve a six out of six rating by National Energy Action for the innovative work it is doing on tackling fuel poverty/cold-related ill health. Other work includes: The Better Care Fund is being

used to reduce inappropriate demand on A&E and Urgent Care services, with work including greater access and use of telecare by people in their homes and co-ordinated support to enable people to return home following a stay in hospital.

A more targeted approach has been made in relation to identifying people most at risk of cardiovascular disease and developing Type 2 diabetes to offer them interventions designed to lower their risk.

The board is continuing to support measures aimed at improving dementia diagnosis rates such as by providing regular information and guidance for GP's and increasing the number of dementia friendly activities, such as dementia friendly swimming, in a number of our pools.

An Integration Board has been established as a sub group to lead the integration services. This includes 'Teams Around Patients' being established to offer a range of coordinated services centred around groupings of GP practices.

Over the coming months, members of the Health and Wellbeing Board will review the Board's priorities to ensure it is addressing the issues that make the biggest difference to the health and wellbeing of County Durham residents.

Cllr Lucy Hovvels, Portfolio Holder for Adult and Health Services, said: "We have made some excellent progress towards improving health

and reducing inequalities in 2016/17 and this has been recognised nationally.

"It is important we identify the board's achievements in order to build on this success in our future work. Health and wellbeing impacts all areas of our residents' lives and the Health and Wellbeing Board will continue to work towards improving the lives of the people of County Durham."
Vice Chair of the board Dr Stewart Findlay, Chief Clinical Officer at DDES CCG, said: "The report highlights the commitment of partners to the joint work that it takes to bring about improvements in health with and on behalf of our local residents.

"We will continue to work closely together to improve the health of all people across County Durham by focusing on an integrated approach with emphasis on early intervention, prevention and

romoting independence."

Kieran Maxwell Dies and "Gains His Wings"

Kieran Maxwell's Facebook page, his mum Nicola announced on Friday 23rd June her son had "gained his wings" after he passed away peacefully in his sleep. Kieran, 18, from Heighington, suffered with Ewing's Sarcoma for six years and lost part of his left leg. In October 2016, the inspirational young man was told his cancer was terminal.

He set up the Kieran Maxwell Legacy charity in the hope of funding research into his rare form of bone cancer. Famously he carried the Olympic Torch through Bishop Auckland and he touched the heart of everyone when he stumbled. His courage knew no bounds as he tackled gymnastics and athletics winning a gold medal in the 100 metres sprint at the Brazilian School Paralympics. Heighington Village were so



Residents in Great Aycliffe have voted overwhelmingly in favour of introducing new planning policies specifically for their area.

More than 91 per cent of people who took part in a referendum said they would like Durham County Council to use a neighbourhood plan created by Great Aycliffe Town Council when making

planning decisions.

A total of 2,789 people took part in the ballot, which forms one of the final steps in the preparation of a neighbourhood plan hafore the county county. before the county council decides to formally adopt it to supplement its own local planning policies for the area up to 2036.

This will be considered at the next full meeting of the council, which takes place on Wednesday, 19 July. The Great

Aycliffe Neighbourhood Plan the first such plan in the county to reach this stage of preparation since the government introduced them through the Localism Act

Great Avcliffe Town Council began preparing the plan in 2012, with support from the

county council.
The plan includes a number policies that aim to protect the character of the neighbourhood and open spaces. It also aims to secure a high standard of development and ensure that an adequate amount of affordable housing is provided as well as properties for older people.



It is the duty of any responsible newspaper editor to reflect the views of the community he/she serves whether those views offend the powers-that-be or individuals who believe they know better than anyone else. An editor does not have to agree or disagree with opinions voiced by readers of his/her publication – merely to operate within the laws of the land and, morally, to offer a right of reply to individuals or groups who feel that any published criticism is unfair. It would be a very sad day for the people of this country if newspaper editors were prevented from publishing material which might offend the great and the good.

Yes, a good journalist should check the facts - but that does not mean the opinions of readers or allegations by individuals or groups should be published only when they are officially confirmed. Should editors have refrained from reporting the oft-expressed safety fears of the tenants of the Grenfell Tower or from questioning why the building burned so rapidly? Definitely not!

It's essential that a free press, a cornerstone of our democracy, gives a voice to those who do not have the clout available to individuals, companies, groups and governments who would prefer not to be seen in a poor light even when the issues involve matters as seemingly trivial as a supermarket parking 'ticket'.

To the people concerned, they are important matters and should be treated as such - not least by their local newspaper.



Keep HGV's Away from Residential Areas

I read the letters from Derreck Pinkney and John Clare regarding the use of School Aycliffe Lane by HGV's plus the comment that people in Middridge experience similar problems.
It would appear these vehicles

Star Attraction at Loco Steam Gala



The Locomotion: Railway Museum at Shildon is pleased to confirm that steam locomotive BR Standard Class 2MT No. 78018 will be attending the museum's Autumn Steam Gala event on Saturday September 16 & Sunday September 17, 2017. Built at Darlington North Road Works in 1953, 78018 entered

traffic on March 3 1954 at West Auckland Shed. This was soon followed by a move to Kirkby Stephen, working trains from Tebay to Barnard Castle on the Stainmore Railway.

It was while on this line that

78018 became famous by getting stuck in a snow drift during February 1955. Its subsequent rescue was recorded in the Dirich Transport Eiler in the British Transport Film "Snowdrift at Bleath Gill", which can be viewed in the museum's Collection Building. The locomotive was withdrawn on November 12 1966, before spending 11 years at Barry scrapyard.

The locomotive is now owned by the Darlington Railway Preservation Society (DRPS), who spent more than 30 years restoring as much of the engine as they could, whilst importantly at the same time collecting together the vast majority of the brass fittings

for the engine, which had been removed from the engine before they took ownership.

Loughborough Standards Locomotive Group (LSLG) had Standards already restored sister engine 78019, and following agreement with the DRPS, 78018 moved to the Great Central Railway, home of LSLG, for completion. 78018 returned to traffic in Autumn 2016. Visitors to the Autumn Steam

Gala at Locomotion: The National Railway Museum at Shildon will have the opportunity to see 78018 in light steam on the events apron and enjoy cab access to this famous locomotive.

The event will feature additional locomotives on outdoor display, plus steam train rides behind Furness Railway No. 20, the oldest standard gauge locomotive still working in the

N.E. Contractors Appointed for Auckland Castle Restoration

A North East construction company has been awarded the contract to restore a 900-year-old County Durham castle. Meldrum Construction Services Ltd, based in Gateshead, will be returning Auckland Castle, to its original Georgian Gothic opulence on behalf of regional charity, Auckland Castle Trust (ACT).
The multi-million pound project, supported thanks to National Lottery players by a grant of £11.4million from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), will be managed by Da construction Darlington-founded management consultancy, Turner & Townsend and internationally acclaimed architects, Purcell. Project Manager, Geoff Brown, said: "The restoration of Auckland Castle is a significant project for project ourselves, incorporating both a wide range of repairs, incorporating replacements and redecoration to the existing castle, and the construction of an extension to create contemporary gallery

space.
"We will be working closely with Meldrum, Purcell and Auckland Castle Trust's Curatorial Team to ensure this is all carried out in-keeping with the historic nature of the building, as well as modern regulations."

Around half of Meldrum's employees, time-served current 190 including carpenters, welder/fabricators, bricklayers. ground workers, plant operators and electricians, will be involved in the project, with a minimum of 60 expected to be on site at any one time.

M.D. Dave Meldrum, Meldrum said: "We are absolutely thrilled to have won such a prestigious contract and are now looking at ways in which we can involve the local community and maximise the opportunities we can offer them while working in Bishop Auckland."

Purcell, which has 15 offices across the UK, as well as sites in Asia Pacific and Australia, has already worked on a number of similar projects, including the restoration of Durham Cathedral, Kensington Palace, Tower Bridge and the National Maritime Museum.

Holton, Alexander Dr. Alexander Holton, Associate, Purcell, said: "Purcell are immensely proud to be part of one of the most ambitious and exciting heritage projects that has taken place in the North East for decades.

"Through the vision of the Auckland Castle Trust, and its Chairman, Jonathan Ruffer, the site will be transformed into a world-class visitor destination that will continue to act as a platform for social and economic regeneration throughout County Durham

and beyond."
The restoration of Auckland Castle, which is due for completion in Spring 2018, is being supported by the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), Sir James Knott Trust, The Charles Hayward Foundation,

The Headley Trust, The Linbury Trust, The Rothschild Foundation, Garfield Weston Foundation, J Paul Getty Jnr Charitable Trust and the Overstone Fund.

It forms part of a wider £70m programme by Auckland Castle Trust, designed to revitalise Bishop Auckland, create Bishop Auckland, create opportunities for training and skills development and boost the local economy. Within the Castle complex, where Purcell is the overall lead architect, this also includes an extension to Auckland Castle's Scotland Wing, which will house a new museum exploring the history of faith in the British Isles.

The Faith Museum, designed by award-wining Niall McLaughlin architects, is also being constructed by Meldrum in partnership with Turner & Townsend and is supported by the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) and Jerusalem Trust. It is due to open in 2019.
