reforms in the last few years with some significant changes to the A-Level system. Students now sit A-Level exams at the end of two years

of study rather than taking modular exams throughout the course, making yearly performance comparisons with previous cohorts more difficult.

Early indications suggest our academic and vocational outcomes are above the national average and many of our schools have reported an increase in the numbers of

"Although the full national attainment and progress statistics are not yet available, it is likely that County Durham will be placed above the national average and these

### **STUDENTS CHECK** FUTURE STEPS

Woodham Academy students visited Darlington College and Queen Elizabeth Sixth Form College

Year 10 students at Woodham Academy were recently given the opportunity to visit Queen Elizabeth Sixth Form College and Darlington College as part of the school's enrichment programme. This aims to give students an insight into life after leaving school and the various options they have available.

On both trips students were allowed to choose which 'courses' they would like to sample in a morning and afternoon session. At Queen Elizabeth options included A-Level Law, English Language, Computing, Psychology, and Film & Media, Whilst at Darlington College options included Beauty Therapy, Childcare, Game Design & Development, Motor Vehicle, and Uniformed Public Services. By giving students lots of opportunities to sample different Further Education establishments Woodham Academy hopes that students will make a well-rounded decision about what they would like to do after they have completed their GCSEs. The visits are proving very popular with students who are impressed at the range of courses on offer.

The Roman Army will march on County Durham this month as it prepares to reinforce the garrison at an historic fort.

Members of the Roma Antiqua re-enactment group will welcome visitors to Binchester Roman Fort on Bank Holiday Monday (28th August).

The group will be offering an insight into life in the Roman Army with displays of arms, armour and equipment.

There will also be the chance to see some of the items in action, including bows and arrows, sling-staffs and a full scale replica of a ballista catapult.

Younger visitors mav even find themselves being recruited and given the chance to defeat the barbarians themselves. The site's well-preserved Roman ruins will also be open to the public

Dr. David Mason, Durham County Council's principal archaeologist, said: "A visit to Binchester is always a fantastic day out but our Bank Holiday events really are not to be missed.

"Visitors will once again be able to take a look at our commanding officer's house and the adjacent bath building.

"However, this year, they will also have the opportunity to view part of the even more impressive bath building situated outside the fort." Events and activities start at 11.00am, with the full programme repeated from 2.00pm

Admission is £5 for adults, £4 for concessions and £3 for children. Visitors are asked





to note that the museum is currently only able to take cash payments.

## **Nuisance Off-Road** Brighten up Aycliffe Station Bikers Targeted by Police

crackdown is being launched against off-road bikers who are causing a nuisance in their community. Durham Constabulary are warning those who ride bikes and quads illegally that they face arrest and having their vehicles seized if they flout laws.

The crackdown, coined Operation Éndurance. involves officers from the police's motorcycle section and neighbourhood teams working with the community to rid the streets of illegal bikers.

Inspector Jon Curtis, who is heading the operation, said: "People's safety is our top priority and we know these bikes are causing a great nuisance in our communities, especially in Darlington and Peterlee.

"We want to highlight the risks of people using vehicles that are potentially dangerous to themselves and others, in circumstances that are unsafe and illegal. such as those who are either underage, have no licence, no insurance, are untaxed, are causing damage or are creating anti-social behaviour.'

The multi-agency operation which involves the police, Durham County Council, Darlington Borough Council, the Woodland Trust and National Trust met at

Spennymoor Fire Station this month to tackle the issue. Durham Constabulary

will target offenders with warnings, seizure notices and behaviour contracts, as well as utilising specialist equipment such as the police drone.

Insp Curtis said: "We will work with the community and in partnership with local agencies to identify offenders, gather intelligence, take action to seize vehicles, reduce offending and divert young people away from this type of dangerous and irresponsible activity. Where necessary, we will hold parents and guardians to account.

"There are lawful off-roaders who enjoy riding on proper off-road tracks in the area, but there are others who flout the law.

"There are lots of clubs, organisations and locations where people can ride legally and safely and this is what we want to encourage them to do."

Durham Constabulary also plan to work with social landlords across County Durham and Darlington to help mitigate the problem. Insp. Curtis said: "People

committing anti-social behaviour may face action for a breach of their tenancy agreements.

"We are seeking the support of the community to tell us who the offenders are and where they are keeping their bikes and quads. We want them to know that if we get this information. we will act upon it. We can offer confidential reporting through Crimestoppers.' Police, Crime and



Victims' Commissioner, Ron Hogg, said: "This is a topic which is frequently raised by the community and I have shared these concerns with the police. I am delighted with the Force's response to the problem and to see that action is being taken."





The next phase of a development which is set to bring more than 3,000 jobs and an economic boost of nearly half a billion pounds begins this week. Durham County Council is to

start the next phase of work to expand Aycliffe Business Park – already the largest site of its kind in the region - onto the 52 hectare Forrest Park site in

Newton Avcliffe. The site, for which the Local Enterprise Partnership has provided £13m funding, will it is hoped be the subject of a £140m private sector development including a potential rail freight interchange

It is estimated the site could see the creation of 3,200 jobs and deliver a Gross Value Added (GVA) boost of £495 million over the next twenty years. Preparatory groundworks began last year. The enabling works are now set to continue with the creation of a new traffic light controlled junction on the A167 for better access to both the new site and the business park.





This company runs a pharmacy in Leeds which is a "mail order" pharmacy.

In recent years, they have targeted areas of the country where GP's are beginning to send their prescriptions electronically – they can see this because the NHS publishes an interactive nap showing where GP sites are going live. In Aycliffe, Pease Way was a pilot site for the area and so we have had EPS for some five years or more. They send out mail shots

which are confusing to patients as they seem to suggest that the letters have come from either the NHS (they carry the NHS logo) or from the practice. Several GP patients have signed up to this service who were clearly not aware of what they were signing up for until they have presented at a pharmacy looking for their prescription when Pharmacy2U has nominated by been them. Not only is this confusing for patients who have otherwise been perfectly happy with the local service but it is generating waste and workload for the GP practices and the NHS as a whole.

### SPEEDING TARGETED **ACROSS TWO COUNTIES**

Speeding drivers are being targeted as part of a week-long campaign across Cleveland and Durham.

The initiative. aimed at getting motorists to reduce their speed, will see officers joint the Forces' from operations unit working in both marked and unmarked cars to target law-flouting

coordinated by the European Traffic Police Network (TISPOL), will begin today (Monday, August 21) and police will be carrying out additional education and enforcement activity across both force areas.

Chief Inspector Graham Milne, from the Cleveland and Durham Specialist Operations Unit (CDSOU), said: "Driving at 35mph as opposed to 30mph can mean that a vehicle can take a further six metres to come to

a stop. "Speed limits are put in place for a reason and travelling at even just a few miles over the limit can be deadly."

In the last 12 months, a total of 20,823 speeding offences were detected in Cleveland and Durham.

C/Insp Milne continued: "That is thousands of lives potentially put at risk because of inconsiderate drivers. "It is heart-breaking to see the devastation caused when our officers have to deliver the news to someone that their loved one has been killed or

seriously injured as a result of a collision. "It is our job to reduce the risk of people being fatally or seriously injured on our roads, and that is why these campaigns are so crucial."

This operation follows on from the earlier TISPOL speed campaign in April this year, when in just seven days, 557 drivers were found to be

breaking the speed limits across the two force areas. The total consisted of 257 recorded by officers out on patrol and 300 caught on equipment used by the unit's safety camera vans.

C/Insp Milne said: "As we're the summer holidays, in children will be out playing which makes it even more pertinent that people keep a close eye on their speed and stick to the limits.

'The faster you are travelling, the less time you have to react to the unexpected.

"Around two thirds of these collisions take place on roads with a speed limit of 30mph or less, which are often residential areas where children live.

Speeding currently carries minimum penalty of £100 fine and three penalty points added to your licence. Drivers face disgualification should they build up 12 or more penalty points within a three-year period.

"Improving road safety is one of the objectives in my Police, Crime and Victims Plan. By working together with local communities and partners on initiatives such as Community Speed-watch, we can make our roads a safer place."

Cleveland Police and Crime Commissioner, Barry Coppinger, said: "It is vital those motorists who flout tha the law are educated about the serious risks of speeding and the devastation that can be caused to families as a result. "Speeding is one of the major causes of fatal or serious collisions on our roads and I support all campaigns, such as this one, which aims to save lives."


