Bid to Change Name of New Constituency Boundary

AYCLIFFE SHOULD FIGURE PROMINENTLY

The Boundary Commission is currently reviewing Constituency Boundaries. The law as it stands requires them to produce 600 Constituencies from the present 650 in England this means that in the North East 29 seats will be reduced to 25 seats in Parliament. The review is required to reduce the number of seats and try to make them around equal size.

Cllr Arun Chandran Secretary, on behalf of Great Aycliffe Residents' Association (GARA), is suggesting that if the changes go through the name of the new constituency should be changed.

At present we are in the Sedgfield Constituency but the Boundary Commission have redrawn the political map and want to call the new one **Billingham and Sedgfield**.

In a statement Arun said "That in the event of the new Boundary Commission proposals for Parliamentary Constituencies for 2017 being approved by Parliament, we would want the name of the Constituency changed from Billingham and Sedgfield, to **Aycliffe and Billingham**. This would more adequately reflect on the importance of Aycliffe in the new constituency, politically, industrially as the biggest Business Park in the region and geographically."

"Demographically and historically Aycliffe has more importance than Sedgfield in the Constituency name." GARA has submitted this to the Commission and Cllr Arun Chandran will be asking Great Aycliffe Town Council to write to the Boundary Commission to request this be changed now and in any future change.

Newton News asked the views of our MP Phil Wilson who said: "I believe it should be called Aycliffe & Billingham and will put in a submission in the consultation to that effect."

Care Home Wins Garden Award **BIN COLLECTION FARCE!**

The residents and staff at Rose Lodge Care Home have been blooming with pride after receiving a Community Enhancement Award for their front garden display.



The Community Enhancement Awards, organised by Great Aycliffe Town Council, sees certificates of merit awarded to individual front gardens, floral displays or streets that enhance the overall visual appearance of the area. Along with their award Rose Lodge received a trophy, £50 of gift vouchers and a box of biscuits.

The award-winning entrance garden display at the home, which provides residential care for the elderly and people living with dementia care, features a variety of beautiful bedding flowers and potted plants as well as 'flowerpot people' centrepieces, eco-friendly decorations handmade by residents and staff at the home.

Ken Pratt, the husband of a resident at Rose Lodge, also kindly volunteered his time and gardening skills to help transform the look of the home's entrance by adding colourful floral borders and planters.

It was double celebrations for the home which was also recently named as the runner up in a national horticultural competition which encourages care homes to get creative when decorating their gardens. The annual gardening competition, known as 'The

Doorstep Challenge', is held by UK Care providers The Maria Mallaband Care Group and Countrywide Care Homes with their 80 residential and nursing homes across the UK, Scotland and Northern Ireland participating. The aim of the challenge is for each home to make the entrance to their home look bright and colourful, creating a 'wow factor'.

Nicola Wheatley, Care Manager at Rose Lodge Care Home, said: "We are absolutely delighted. We were all so proud of how our grounds look and to have the hard work of the staff, residents and family members who volunteered their time formally recognised is wonderful. We'd like to say a special thank you to Ken for all the time and effort he has dedicated. Our entrance has been attracting a lot of attention from passers by and we've had some lovely comments from visitors to the home about how beautiful our gardens look."

Dears Sir, Cllr. J.D Clare considered the bin collection debacle a, "drama". I consider it a FARCE! Further, in almost 17 inches of column print he FAILS to apologise on behalf of himself, the Cabinet, the Council, or the local controlling Labour Group. The residents and taxpayers affected by the debacle deserve better (than they have come to expect)! On the assumption that the operatives involved got paid for any additional hours worked, I think that local taxpayers have thanked them enough! Again, it is us who have to pay for the ruling Labour Group's incompetence.

In World War I the soldiers at the front were described as, "Lions led by Donkeys". Given the way that they responded to this farce, the Collection Operatives are the lions in this matter. Enough said! For the record, I was advised in the Newton News to expect a letter if my bin collection dates were to change. That is, no letter, no change. Since most of the bins in Aycliffe Village were put out on the old, 'wrong date', I can only assume that most of the residents, like me, did not get a letter.

I resent the implication in Cllr. Clare's letter that we all got a letter, but, we are illiterate! He admits having got a letter and having not read it properly! This is easier than doing the proper thing and saying, "the Council I sit on is not fit for purpose and as I can do

nothing about it, I resign". This current farce is only the first in a long line of expensive farces overseen by the Unitary Authority (DCC) established by a Labour Government and constituted with a Cabinet System.

1) DCC found that, due to their incompetence it cost them about three times as much to run a care home than it did the profit making private sector. They shut the Council Care Homes.
2) They have installed inadequate 'Tony Blair street lighting' (Nice but dim) making a bus stop in Aycliffe Village probably the most dangerous place in the county to board a bus. Access to the bus being via. rough stone steps that are now completely

unlit!
3) The Teaching Assistants 'Over-payments' farce. By way of apology for the current bin fiasco perhaps Cllr. Clare could tell the tax paying electorate how much DCC's 'over-paying' teaching assistants has cost the public purse, including over-paid

salaries, NI contributions and index linked pension contributions. This, instead of blaming Government cutbacks for all of the DCC failures the taxpayer has endured under this Labour run Unitary Authority.

Hitachi Trains Enter Service on Great Western Route



Great Western Railway's brand new Intercity Express Train carried passengers for the first time recently, marking the start of the biggest fleet upgrade on the Great Western route in almost 40 years.

A Hitachi Rail Europe spokesman said: "Having already completed 5,000 miles of fault-free running, the first British-built Hitachi train from Paddington to Bristol departed on time at 07.00. It arrived at its destination smoothly and promptly, offering passengers more seats, space and fast wifi. More new trains will follow until the full fleet of 57 are in service next year."

"The Bristol to London service experienced a few technical challenges, for which we apologise to passengers for any inconvenience caused. We are of course disappointed with an issue with this train's air conditioning and water ingress in one of the carriages. We are investigating this as a matter of priority and will restore the train back into passenger service once fully rectified."

Karen Boswell, Managing Director, Hitachi Rail Europe, who was on-board the first service, said: "We, at Hitachi Rail, are really proud to have built trains in the UK, designed

using Japanese bullet train technology, that are improving passengers' journeys on the Great Western route.

"Nine years of hard work has gone into making this vital fleet upgrade happen, including creating a brand new factory, workforce, and establishing modern maintenance facilities from Swansea to London. We've delivered pioneering 21st century trains for passengers to enjoy and sparked a manufacturing renaissance in the North East." Hitachi is building 57 Intercity Express trains (IET) for Great Western Railways at their UK train factory. The first seven trains were supplied with a phased introduction of the rest until the end of 2018.

Hitachi also has orders for the same trains from Virgin Trains East Coast (65 starting end of 2018), Transpennine Express (19 starting 2019) and Hull Trains (5 starting 2019)

The new trains that entered service today were all built at Hitachi's £82m factory in Newton Aycliffe, County Durham. Newton Aycliffe employs over 1,000 people and is purpose-built train manufacturing facility opened in September 2015 in the area where Britain's first steam

trains were built. Hitachi will now maintain the new trains for GWR for 27.5 years as part of the Intercity Express Programme contract. To do this they have invested £160m in building modern maintenance facilities along the length of the Great Western railway, including Swansea, Bristol and West London which will employ 500 people.

Gestamp Scrap Metal Debris Cause Punctures

Sir,
It is disappointing that Gestamp and Gescrap has become so desperate as to blame each other for the state of Howden Road and Groat Avenue. I refer to the spillage of scrap metal on what is supposedly a public highway. Take a walk and it is unbelievable the amount of scrap that can be found on those two streets. On two occasions, the first, leaving my wife stranded in Bishop Auckland and the second in Aycliffe, where a piece of metal was removed by a local tyre firm, who after greeting me with the words "back again", proudly handed me the distinctive metal scrap. On four occasions I reported the second incident. Firstly to the security guard at Gestamp's gatehouse, taking the metal from me he took my details and said someone will get back in touch. A week later I approached Gestamp's gatehouse and enquired about progress. "It is not Gestamp but Gescrap, you need to speak to", was the reply from the security guard I had spoken to the week previously

whilst giving me the phone number of Gescrap.

I called Gescrap the following day who informed me, I need to speak to Gestamp's HR Department. I enquired and found the location of Gescrap, visited their portacabin and together we phoned Gestamp who took my details and said they would get back to me.

A week later, I approached Gescrap again as no one had got back in touch with me. We contacted HR who were in meetings and was informed to call back on the Monday. The following Tuesday I spoke to HR, who again took my details and informed me someone will get back in touch.

A week further on and here I am, I do not envisage being refunded by either of these companies, Gescrap - whose name speak for itself, and Gestamp - whose website is a contradiction to their actions.

There have been numerous punctures suffered by vehicles using these roads, my attention is now drawn to the Coaches, buses and HGV vehicles that access these roads and a pending catastrophe.

Union Call 3M Aycliffe "Scrooge Employers"

3M mask manufacturer in Newton Aycliffe is early contender for Scrooge boss of the year Unite, the UK's largest union, has accused 3M of being a Scrooge employer after the company's management decided workers will have to work between Xmas and New Year for the first time in decades. The management at 3M, which makes respirators and dust masks, this week, informed Unite representatives that the workforce would now be expected to work for the three days between Christmas and New Year. The change of policy was a direct response to the workers rejecting a proposed 1.5 per cent pay increase.

Members rejected the latest pay offer, which is just half the current rate of inflation and would mean a real terms pay cut, after having experienced below inflation rate pay rises for several years.

Unite regional officer Mark Sanderson said: "Even before Halloween and Bonfire Night we have a clear contender for Scrooge boss of the year. It is outrageous that for the first time in decades 3M management are insisting that the workforce will have to work between Christmas and New Year.

"This is simply an attempt by management to bully, blackmail and intimidate the workforce to accept a pay offer which is once again a real terms pay cut.

"The company's bullying is set to rebound, as the workforce rather than being cowed into submission, are now even more determined to secure a decent pay rise.

"If the management want to prevent this dispute from escalating they need to reverse the decision to cancel the annual Christmas shutdown and dramatically improve the pay offer, to meet the needs and expectations of the workforce."

TIM PEAKE'S SPACECRAFT TO LAND IN SHILDON

The spacecraft which transported Tim Peake, the UK's first European Space Agency (ESA) astronaut, to and from the International Space Station, will be landing at Locomotion, the National Railway Museum at Shildon on Tuesday 22 November 2017.

A landmark partnership between Samsung and the Science Museum Group, to create a national tour of Tim Peake's spacecraft means the Soyuz TMA-19M capsule, complete with equipped interior and re-entry char marks on its outer body, will be on public display for two months along with its 25m diameter parachute.

The display of the iconic craft will be accompanied by an inspiring and immersive range of activities, including the Space Descent VR virtual reality experience, narrated by Tim Peake himself. This places the visitor inside the Soyuz TMA-19M to witness first-hand the incredible 250-mile journey back to earth from the International Space Station (ISS).

The VR imagery has been created for the Science Museum Group, and is supported by Samsung with the provision of the latest Samsung Gear VR headsets



and a bespoke VR lounge inside the museum.

Locomotion Museum Manager, Gary Campbell, said: "It's hard to express how excited we are to be bringing the Soyuz capsule to Shildon. The capsule represents one of history's most incredible technological feats, and this is an unmissable opportunity for visitors young and old from across the North East to see the craft that took Tim Peake all the way to the Space Station and back.

"We hope our local residents and future visitors enjoy this unique experience and pay Soyuz TMA-19M carried



Membership renewal is due in December/January for existing members. If you would like to become a member the first year is £5.50, then £4.50 per annum thereafter.





Overcoming the Water Wobbles

If you've just got back from your family summer holiday with a tired and frustrated toddler, you're not the only one. Keeping them entertained every day, whilst still trying to fit in your own rest and relaxation is no mean feat. If your little one is a happy and confident swimmer, then you most probably spent 98% of your break trying to lure them out of the pool, but what do you do if your child is afraid of the water?

Watching your tiny little baby in such distress is just heart breaking, but I was adamant she was going to learn to swim. It was hard work. It took months of perseverance and patience for her to relax in the pool and with the support of our wonderful teacher, Emma, we've come out of the Water Wobbles phase - in fact, Caoimhe now loves swimming more than any other child I know!"

If you can relate to Karla's struggle with Caoimhe's confidence in the water, follow these handy tips from Caoimhe's Water Babies teacher, Emma, on how to overcome the Water Wobbles! What are the Water Wobbles? "Some children can develop an aversion to water when they reach about 8-months old. This is a common developmental phase and can see children becoming overly dependent on their parents and seeming to fear activities they once loved - including swimming! This phase is sometimes known as the junior toddler phase. You might your child demonstrating conflicting behaviours - off exploring and

causing mischief one minute and clinging to you for dear life the next.


Sports Club in Form

Town Teenager Honoured with British Citizen Youth Award

Jake's mum Allison said: "He had never done any open water swimming so it was a bit of a challenge but on the day, he was just amazing. He was on his own, just 13 years old and went into the water and I didn't see him again until he got out on the other side. For a 13-year-old that was just amazing and I'm extremely proud of him."

Medallist Jake received his BCyA medal from Ashley Banjo, creative director and lead dancer of Diversity, whose dance troupe won the third series of Britain's Got Talent.

Ashley says: 'I am honoured to be able to play a part of the British Citizen Youth Awards in October at the Palace of Westminster. What

a fantastic way to recognise these young people that have made a difference to their communities up and down the UK. These inspirational young people are making a difference and encouraging other young people to do the same.'


