

Police are urging car owners to take extra care when de-icing cars following the theft of a van recently. Drivers are being warned not

van from Tow Law which was later recovered from Bishop Auckland and two men aged 24 and 25 were arrested. A spokesperson from Durham Constabulary said: "We would encourage owners not to leave keys in their vehicles, whether it is in order to save a couple of minutes de-icing vehicles or otherwise. The temptation is for motorists

to leave their cars unattended with the engines running, making them vulnerable to opportunist thieves.

'It takes two minutes to deice your car, but it can take two seconds for a thief to steal it. We are urging the public to take extra care and not give criminals an early Christmas present. This may also affect any subsequent insurance claim."




