Aycliffe couple, Mike and Marie Holton talked about the possibility of fostering for a long time, but once they made the decision they sat down with their children to discuss it with them and then the family as a whole. Fostering 100% needs to be a whole family decision as it will affect them all.

They made initial enquiries and met with several IFA's (independent fostering organisation) and the Local Authority before choosing the Children's Family Trust to pursue their dream of fostering. The company ethos was fantastic, and as a not for profit charity they knew that their focus is about the children and Mike and Marie receive 24/7 support, 365 days per year.

They also obtain ongoing specific training to the needs of the children they are caring for, and participation events where the children and carers get together to enjoy activities as well as the opportunity for carers to talk about their experiences and any issues they may be

facing. This support is invaluable for any carer, and the Trust even help with swimming lesson costs, driving lessons and rewards for great exam results which shows the children are truly at the heart of everything.

Sadly, Jeff's Mam still died, but not before I shared God's love with her too, so I grieved, but not as someone who has no hope. Jeff and I went onto have another three children, we have three daughters and two sons, we are so very proud of them! We returned to Hartlepool and soon I realised God



History Society Cement Friendship with Hitachi Rail



presentation of an historical railway picture was presented to Hitachi Rail at Aycliffe by Aycliffe History Village Local Society. before the new Long


