St. Mary's New Catholic Priest



Recently arrived priest at St Mary's RC Church, Central Avenue, is Father Anthony Cornforth. He has worked in places as far afield as Florida, Zambia and even Liverpool.

He is no stranger to Aycliffe as he was born in Darlington, had an uncle who lived in Shafto Way in the early sixties and travelled on the Darlington to Durham bus route frequently in the seventies.

He has had a varied career, having worked as a teacher of Classics (Latin and Greek) in Liverpool, where his love affair with Florida began. "We used to have two months holiday in the summer and every year I went to work in a parish in Clearwater, Florida, where the work was not onerous, students were far away and the sun shone all the time, except during thunderstorms and hurricanes!"

After the school that he taught in closed he qualified as a physiotherapist then moved to Hartlepool (adventurous for someone from Darlington!) and on to South Shields. "It was in South Shields that my life changed when I spent three months in Zambia, helping handicapped children to walk and overcome some ailments that had been left untreated."

On returning to parish work in South Shields he continued his involvement with Zambia and in 1997 adopted a 14-year-old Zambian boy who went to school and college in South Tyneside for three years before returning home.

"When Andrew came it was a big change in my life and I will forever be grateful for it. He now has a family of his own although sadly one of his daughters died at the age of two in 2015, something all too common in Zambia."

Six years in the West End of Newcastle and four years in Washington then brought him back to his roots in Durham. "It really was like coming home. All of my family still live in Darlington and it is great to find myself in familiar territory for once, after moving."

As well as looking after the parish of St Mary in Aycliffe he is also parish priest of St Thomas' Shildon and currently is overseeing churches in Ferryhill, Coundon and Chilton. "When the railway workshops in Darlington closed in the sixties, work was transferred to Shildon but my father lost his job with British Rail as a result, but I am growing to forgive Shildon and have always had a soft spot for Aycliffe!"

Living Requested to Involve People More Fully

Dear Sir,

I wish to write and complain about the great assumptions which Living seem to be making, in respect of how tenants feel concerning the proposed West Ward Regeneration proposals. Many tenants are NOT in favour of Option 3, we don't want to leave our homes. Personally I moved here over two years ago to retire, I am now 72 and my wife 70 just the thought of moving again fills us with dread.

The physical thing of packing and loading into vans, then unpacking and fitting new carpets etc. the thought of it is awful. Two years ago we found it very stressful and exhausting, now the thought of doing it all again is not something my wife and I can contemplate. Most people feel that not enough time and thought has been given to the alternatives, and there ARE real alternatives.

1. The Option 3 proposal, which Living seem to be favouring, is a waste of resources. Houses which were only built in 1967-68 should not be demolished at the whim of planners and those who do not live in the area, unaware of the good points as well as the not so good. These are perfectly good houses that are comfortable and easy to heat. If they are carefully maintained and updated there is at least another 50 years left in them.

2. As for the layout of the estate, much of what Living is planning in option 3 could be accomplished as the estate currently stands. Eg. The section of Williamfield Way that, under option 3, is to be passable by buses and emergency vehicles only; this could be accomplished in front of the Lindsfarne Care Home with the layout as it is now, with little reorganisation of systems.

3. The parking issue could also be addressed as the estate is currently, by marking out parking bays for those people without garages and identifying them for a particular house (as is already done in Hawkshead Place). Extra parking could be made available by extending the parking laybys at present in use in Kirkstone Place and Honister Place. The problem with vehicle access to a few properties is difficult but not insurmountable eg: Extending the 'hammerhead' in Honister place could provide vehicle access to the front of 40-44 Kirkstone Place.

4. The final point I wish to make is that there needs to be more, MUCH MORE, consultation before final decisions are made. It is not enough to knock on a few doors, leafleting the estate and then, as was the case a number of weeks ago, inviting people to call in and see the proposals drawn up with a take it or leave it attitude.

People need to be involved in the decision making process and not be faced with a situation where a decision has already been made by Living saying, "Options 1 & 2 won't work", who says they won't work? Who made that decision?

Living must realise that this is the lives of people in 572 households we are talking about; it's not just an exercise in town planning. Why have we not had public meetings with Living decision makers, explaining to tenants and owners what is proposed? Why have the people living in the area not had a say in which of the three options was to go ahead? Why won't Living answer the questions put forward by GARA representatives? It is not good enough to say Living won't be in attendance at this meeting or that, WHY won't Living be in attendance?

I am concerned that I, along with every other resident in this area, are being ridden roughshod over by people who haven't stopped to think about the full implications of their decisions on the lives of residents. If these plans go ahead residents could end up living on a building site for many years and for me, that could mean the rest of my life.

Please consider your proposals again, involve people more fully and think laterally about what it is you really need to accomplish.

Dear Sir,
Many homeowners and tenants are worried about Livin's plans for the Western Area, ie demolishing existing housing and building a new estate with fewer homes to rent, and executive housing

in Whinlatter Place. Livin is being very cagey about the details, and won't attend meetings of the Residents' Association or the Town Council, or even have information printed in the Newton News.

What they are doing? By all accounts, they are meeting tenants on an individual basis, thus avoiding public scrutiny. It seems they are suggesting that there may be a very attractive deal available to tenants. Just remember that anything sounding too good to be true might not be as good as it sounds.

Ask what guarantee they can give you now that you will be eligible for any scheme they talk about and ask them to spell out any new responsibilities you will need to take on, e.g. a contribution to housing repairs or safety checks.

"Lower Drink Drive Limit" say Safety Campaigners

As the latest provisional figures from the Department for Transport reveal that fatalities from drink driving have increased in the UK, safety campaigners are once again urging the Government to reconsider the drink drive limit in England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

The Department for Transport's report, which was released in February, estimates that 9,050 people were killed or injured in 2016 when at least one driver was over the drink-drive limit – a significant rise from 2015's figure of 8,470 and the highest figure recorded since 2012.

The drink drive limit in England, Wales and Northern Ireland is currently one of the highest in Europe at 80mg in every 100ml of blood. Safety campaigners want this figure to fall to 50mg to be in line with Scotland's drink drive limit, which was lowered in December 2014. Following its introduction, Police Scotland reported that drink driving offences in Scotland fell by 12.5% in the following nine months compared with the year before.

Despite debates on the subject in the House of Lords in 2016, the Government announced later that year it had no plans to lower the drink drive limit in England and Wales, stating that their approach to tackling drink driving was through rigorous enforcement, tough penalties and awareness campaigns.

Suzannah Robin is an alcohol safety expert at AlcoDigital. She works with corporate and governmental organisations and has helped dozens of local authorities and councils to implement their alcohol testing policies for staff. She said:

"It makes no sense whatsoever to keep the drink drive limit in England, Wales and Northern Ireland at its current level. Given the recent report, it is ludicrous to think that this isn't even a consideration for the Department for Transport when all the statistical data available from Scotland and Europe clearly show that lives could be saved if the drink drive limit was lower.

"Scotland has already lowered the limit with great success and it is now time England, Wales and Northern Ireland followed its lead. The latest figures from the Department for Transport only go towards reinforcing this."

Suzannah added: "One of the arguments against lowering the drink drive limit is the view that most accidents are caused by people who would flout the rules regardless of the law. This attitude simply doesn't stack up. A lower limit sends a powerful message that drink driving is dangerous.

Law enforcement and raising awareness of the impact of drink driving has helped to improve road safety over the last decade, however, more can still be done.

Statistics show that even after just one drink you are three times more likely to be involved in a collision. This also applies to the morning after, when many people who think they are safe to drive will still in fact have alcohol in their system. I sincerely believe that lowering the limit will help to prevent more senseless deaths and injuries." Don't Be That Someone, an award-winning anti drink-driving campaign, which seeks to raise awareness amongst young people about the deadly impact alcohol can have on drivers, has partnered with AlcoDigital to lobby for a reduction in the limit. Its founder, Mike McAdam, said: "The issue here is fear of change and what a lower limit could mean to the alcohol economy or the drivers who are acting responsibly. But what about the families who are having to suffer the terrible consequences of losing a loved one?"

"No one is suggesting you can't go out, drink and have a good time. You can still do that and arrange for a taxi to take you home afterwards. What we are asking for is that the law is aligned with the rest of Europe where a lower drink drive limit is already in place and has helped to decrease drink drive related injuries and deaths. How can that be a bad thing?"

The official figures from the Department of Transport will be released later this year.

COUNCIL ANNOUNCE FUNDING FOR POTHOLE & ROAD REPAIRS

An extra £700,000 of council funding will be invested in improving the condition of roads around County Durham over the coming year, it has been revealed today.

Cllr Simon Henig, Leader of Durham County Council, announced the additional funding at a meeting of the authority's full council in Durham.

The cash will enable additional resurfacing works to be carried out, repairing damage caused by the recent bad weather, especially in relation to potholes.

The funding is in addition to the £1.3 million recently announced by the government for pothole repairs in County Durham in 2018/19 and brings the council's funding to £5.7 million for this financial year.

Taking into account the £10.2 million already confirmed by the government, it means the council has a total budget for highways repairs in 2018/19 of £17.2 million.

Cllr Henig said: "We are well aware that maintaining the condition of the county's roads is a priority for many of our residents. That's why,

year after year, we have worked to protect our budget for this area and provide significant investment from the council in addition to the grant received from government.

"However, while we welcome the additional funding from the Government, we rely on the Department of Transport for the majority of funding for road repairs and this money is simply not enough to cover what has become a major backlog.

"The problem has been exacerbated by the long and particularly cold weather and, while the additional resources we are announcing today will go some way to help, as a council, we are simply not able to fill the funding gap.

"We would ask the Government to look again at the funding they provide to local councils for road repairs and look to provide more appropriate levels of support."

Between January and March this year, the authority repaired more than 15,500 potholes compared to less than 9,500 during the same period last year, an increase of 39 per cent.

KEEP DOGS ON LEADS IN THE COUNTRYSIDE



POLICE are warning dog owners to keep their pets on leads after two lambs were killed and 10 seriously injured in an attack.

The advice comes following an incident at Woodland House Farm, Bishop Auckland, on Tuesday (April 10) where two lambs were killed by a brown speckled lurcher.

David Holliday, who has lived on the farm all of his life, said: "It is very distressing. We have tended to the injured lambs and given them penicillin. They sustained puncture wounds from teeth marks. We are not sure if one of the injured is going to survive."

This is not the first time that an attack has happened on the farm. Last year, seven lambs were killed. Speaking of the incident, Mr Holliday said: "It was like nothing I'd ever seen before. They were ripped to shreds. You spend your time looking after them, up all night, and then this happens." Livestock worrying is a criminal offence under the Protection of Livestock Act 1953 and does not require an animal to be injured. The penalty for livestock worrying can be six months' imprisonment and/or a fine of up to £1,000.

PC Sarah Thompson, of Durham Constabulary, said: "We would urge dog owners to keep their pets on leads when they are near any livestock, no matter how much you trust them. Dogs who may ordinarily be calm can become distracted and behave differently when in a rural environment where their sense of smell and chase instinct are stimulated."

"We want everyone to enjoy the great outdoors but farmers should not suffer the consequences of irresponsible dog owners. Please remember that the countryside is a farmers' workplace which requires respect. It is an offence to allow your dog to worry livestock and landowners have legal rights, under certain conditions, to shoot the dog if they feel their livestock is in danger. Anyone identified letting their dog off the lead resulting in an attack or worrying incident will be dealt with by police."

If members of the public have any information or concerns in regards to dogs not under control near livestock, they too should contact police. Anyone with information can also contact Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111 if they wish to remain anonymous.

Obituary - Vera Stobbs

We regret to announce the death of one of our "Aycliffe Angels" Vera Stobbs (nee Catterson).

Vera was born on 4th April 1924 in Leasingthorne and as a child lived there with her parents and older brother. Aged only 8 years, she saved her best friend Betty Palmer's life after Betty had fallen into a well and was saved from drowning by Vera.

Vera received a bible, a certificate of bravery and a letter of praise from the local MP, Mr Charlton Curry. Betty's two sons were still regular visitors to Vera.

She contracted rheumatic fever aged 12 and lost months of schooling.

Her mother died when Vera was only 17 years old which restricted her teenage years as she then took on the role of looking after her father and elder brother.

Aged 18 years, she began work as an inspector of Royal Navy Ordnance at ROF59, where she worked until the end of the war.

Vera married Joe Stobbs in 1949 and lived in Coundon, where they went on to raise three daughters. The family moved to Nottinghamshire in the early 1960's, where Joe worked as a miner, but moved back to Newton Aycliffe in 1968.

Vera was always proud of her family, which at the time of her death consisted of three married daughters,



six grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Vera was also very proud to be called an Aycliffe Angel, and was invited to the opening of the ROF59 leisure facility in August 2015, which attracted TV news and press.

In July 2017 Vera gave a talk at a charity event at Simpature Court for the blind and partially sighted

on her experiences at ROF59 Ammunitions Factory. In January 2018 Vera met with an ex-BBC presenter/journalist and shared her ROF59 experiences for a book he was writing on Royal Ordnance Factories in the UK.


She thoroughly enjoyed speaking at all these events and assisted in any way she could.

Costly to Mess with Dog Fouling Law

A dog owner who did not pick up after her pet has been left more than £200 worse off and with a criminal conviction.

Carly Lamb, has been successfully prosecuted by Durham County Council through its new dog control Public Space Protection Order (PSPO).

A neighbourhood warden from the council who was on patrol in the area observed the dog fouling on the pavement and the defendant failing to pick up the mess.

Lamb was served with a fixed penalty notice under the council's PSPO, introduced last June, under which it is an offence to allow a dog to foul without picking it up.

The notice was for £100 and would have been reduced to £60 if paid within working ten days. However Lamb failed to pay it and so was prosecuted by the council.

She pleaded guilty by letter to contravening the PSPO by failing to pick up after her dog. At Newton Aycliffe Magistrates Court on Wednesday, the letter was read out detailing how she was very sorry for her actions. Lamb normally carries bags to pick up after her pet but did not have one on the occasion in question.

Magistrates fined her £100, ordered her to pay legal costs of £130 and a victim surcharge of £30.

Ian Hoults, the council's neighbourhood protection manager, said: "Dog fouling is an unpleasant stain on the environment and poses a health hazard, particularly in relation to children and areas where they play.

"It is so easy to take bags out when walking your dog so you can pick up after it. While the overwhelming majority of people do, some as in this case do not and we will continue to take action through our PSPO to send out the message that we will not tolerate irresponsible dog ownership.

"This case should also serve as a lesson of what will happen if you get a fixed penalty notice and don't pay it." Under the PSPO, it is also an offence to allow a dog to stray, fail to put a dog on a lead when asked to do so by an authorised person and allow a dog in a designated fenced off fixed play area.

The £100 fixed penalty notices are issued for all breaches with courts able to issue fines of up to £1,000 to those who do not pay.

Bear Performing at Russian Match

Animal Defenders International (ADI) has condemned the appearance of a circus bear at a football match in Russia, the host nation of the World Cup in June.

A video shows the bear, known as Tim, being forced to stand on his hind legs, hold a football and 'clap' repeatedly before the game between Mashuk-KMV and Angushta in Pyatigorsk. ADI President Jan Creamer said: "The sight of this poor bear, forced to perform tricks for the crowd, should shame us all. An incredible, intelligent and inquisitive wild animal reduced to a figure of fun.

All that we learn from using animals in entertainment are the reasons why it must stop. Avoid these sickening shows and support the efforts of ADI and others to stop circus suffering." Last year a bear called Tim, from a travelling circus run by the Polar Wolves bike club, was filmed riding in a motorcycle sidecar in Arkhangelsk. Studies of the use of wild animals in traveling circuses show that circuses cannot meet the physical or behavioural needs of wild animals. Animals are confined in



small spaces, deprived of physical and social needs, spending excessive amounts of time shut in transporters. These animals are often seen behaving abnormally; rocking, swaying and pacing, all indicating that they are in distress and not coping with their environment. Durham Receives £650,000 for Government Pilot Project

Durham County Council is to receive almost £650,000 as it leads the way in how local authorities receive funding to support families. The national Troubled Families Programme aims to provide stability and practical support for people to overcome complicated issues including worklessness, uncontrolled debt and truancy. Now, as the scheme helps more than ever before, 11 local authorities across the country have been selected to receive money allowing them to invest in ambitious plans to ensure positive outcomes for families.

member for Children and Young People's Services, said: "We are the only authority in the North East to have been given the new Earned Autonomy status, which recognises the strong case we made, with our partners, for that upfront investment.

"We hope this funding will help us achieve our ambitious aims, spurring faster transformation of the services we offer and ensuing high quality support for families in need."

The new Earned Autonomy scheme builds on the existing Payments by Results system, in which local authorities are paid for each family who either achieves "significant

and sustained progress" or moves into continuous employment.

Durham will use the money it receives in three areas of the county where there is a high demand for family support; to invest in the development of a new IT system through which agencies can share information and better work together; and to train staff, partners and voluntary sector workers to ensure they have the knowledge and skills to address complex needs.

That will include parenting programmes to help support families affected by domestic abuse, and the further development of a "relational, child centred approach" to family working to ensure children's needs are accounted for.

Local Government Minister Rishi Sunak welcomed the progress made by the Troubled Families Programme over the past year, which was revealed in the government's second Troubled Families annual report.

He said: "Adults who were once far from the job market are now moving into work. Children are getting the right support they need and local leaders are encouraging and challenging all services working with children and their families to act early and offer whole family support, to stop their problems becoming worse."



The Council on 13/04/18 made an Order under Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, as amended, to close to all vehicular traffic a 600 mtr length of Whinbank Road between its junctions with Whitworth Avenue & Station Road, Aycliffe Ind. Estate, Newton Aycliffe, and including a 150 mtr length of Preston Rd, and a 45 mtr length of Hollin Way by reason of carriageway resurfacing works to be undertaken. More Shoplifters Caught with New System

A GROUNDBREAKING system which has seen solved rates for shoplifting soar during an 18-month pilot programme is being extended across County Durham.

Supermarket giant Morrisons has signed up to use the SentrySIS digital justice system in all of its stores across the county, following the

incredible success of a trial in Darlington where solved rates for shoplifting rose by 21 per cent.

The agreement between Durham Constabulary and Morrisons is the first step in extending the system to retailers across County Durham. SentrySIS allows businesses to report shoplifting offences

to the police electronically, saving police and retail staff an enormous amount of time.

Retailers can upload CCTV footage and digital witness statements direct to the police, without an officer having to travel to the store to conduct an initial investigation and retrieve the footage, which takes an average of two-and-a-

half hours for each offence.

This frees up retail staff to prevent and deter further offending and frees up officers to apprehend the offender and ultimately prosecute or divert them away from further offending.

Since the trial was launched with Darlington's 80 Shopwatch stores, SentrySIS is estimated to have saved the force 822 hours.

Sgt Adam Norris, Durham Constabulary's operational lead for the project, said: "Even we have been surprised at just how successful it has been.

"Once upon a time we would hand over mugshots to Shopwatch volunteers and ask them to have a look out for them.

"Now this system allows us to update retailers with images of suspects in real time. It is much better: it gives the police an extra set of eyes and ears by allowing us to share intelligence with the retailers on who is wanted and who is active".

After a successful trial at its Darlington store, Morrisons has now agreed to expand the programme to its supermarkets in Consett, Chester-le-Street, Bishop Auckland and Barnard Castle, saving an estimated 500 hours of officer time each year. Police hope that other retailers across County Durham will also join the expanded scheme in the coming months.

Detective superintendent Kevin Weir, force lead for the project, added: "We are working with a number of national retailers to get this system in place and expand across County Durham".

Terrorism - Stay Vigilant

A national counter-terrorism campaign is being backed by the Safe Durham Partnership.

The 'Action Counter Terrorism' campaign is urging residents across the UK to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity that could be terrorism-related.

Although there is no specific threat in County Durham, the Safe Durham Partnership, of which Durham County Council is a partner, is reminding County Durham residents that any piece of information could be important to law enforcement and that it is better to be safe and to report anything suspicious; no matter how seemingly insignificant.

A one minute video accompanies the national campaign and provides the message that terrorists often buy and store materials in full view of the public, and vigilant residents could make a difference in stopping potential threats.

CLLr Joy Allen, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for transformation, and a National Prevent Champion, said: "It is vitally important for everyone, everywhere, to know that if they see something suspicious and have concerns to trust their instincts and report it to the police.

"Before people plan to carry out a terrorist act they have often been subject to radicalisation.

"Our elected members and staff have undergone training to recognise when someone might be vulnerable to radicalisation so that we can intervene early and prevent people being drawn into terrorism.

"Councillors are often the first people residents go to for advice and guidance. Their experience in engaging with their communities

and keeping them safe makes us ideally placed to protect those vulnerable to extremism.

"Our members have the awareness to deal with concerns in the appropriate manner and act as a real community champions in their area."

In an emergency, or if urgent police assistance is needed,

residents are asked to dial 999.

A Durham Constabulary spokesperson said: "It's more important than ever that everyone plays their role in tackling terrorism, any information could be important. We urge the public to report anything suspicious by calling 0800 789 321. Visit: act.campaign.gov.uk

The Health and Social Care Plan aims to tackle issues like duplication, maximise skills and knowledge and put a greater focus on benefits to communities.



Extended School Activities



At Stephenson Way Academy and Nursery School, the extended school activities outside of school hours are helping to meet the needs of children, their families. Most employment or courses of study do not fall exactly within the core school hours and so to help parents to work, school provides out-of-hours childcare (wraparound care) in the form of both a breakfast and after-school club.

As well as providing children with a tasty, nutritious breakfast or tea-time snack, the clubs offer the perfect opportunity for pupils to socialise and play a range of games with their peers. In addition to this, children who attend after-school club are encouraged to read and complete homework tasks with the qualified school staff who lead the sessions. Karl, a busy working parent, whose son attends the after-school provision explains, "It's great to know that once I've collected my son from school we can enjoy spending quality time together before bedtime knowing that his reading and homework

have already been done." Mum of two, Hannah, adds, "If it weren't for the wraparound care that school provides, I wouldn't be able to attend my university course. My boys were new to the school and it has really helped them to settle in and make friends more easily. Knowing they are in good hands leaves me with one less thing to worry about."

As well as giving working parents access to the childcare they need, the club often proves invaluable to parents who need extra childcare to fit in with medical appointments or those unforeseen circumstances that can crop up at short notice.

Although there is a small charge for pupils attending the wraparound care, any profits made are reinvested into the services so children are continually able to benefit from additional resources and new activities.
