



Railway Museum, the move became possible. Senior Curator of Rail Transport & Technology at Locomotion, Anthony Coulls, said: "We thank the APT-E Support Group for their kind donation of this seminal vehicle. The research was part of the development



of modern rolling stock and we look forward to placing it on display at Locomotion alongside the APT-E, two of the most significant vehicles of late 20th Century railway development."


