PCP CEO Raises £800 Sleeping Rough

Carol Gaskarth, PCP Chief Executive, braved the frost on Monday night in a bid to raise awareness of the issue of homelessness and rough sleeping in County Durham.

The evening started with a welcome from the Dean of Durham Cathedral and inspiring talks from CEO Sleepout who organised the event and Changing Lives, a national charity based in the North East that has been supporting vulnerable people for over 45 years, before bedding down outside the Cloisters as temperatures plummeted to 2°C. Having raised over £800 already, Carol is pleased that so many people recognise the worthwhile cause whilst



reflecting that in 2018 no one should be without a place to call home. Carol explained, "We heard a very moving

story from a young lady who had been homeless for eight weeks after family breakdown and financial difficulties left her with no choice but to take to the streets. Having experienced the discomfort and cold for only one night, I cannot even begin to imagine what that must be like, let alone not knowing if you're going to be moved on or where your next meal might come from. I was freezing, the floor was uncomfortable and as silly as it sounds I was surprised how dirty I felt off the floor - I hadn't appreciated how dusty the pavements are! I couldn't wait to get a hot shower, wash my hair and jump into my own bed; a luxury that I now won't take for granted."

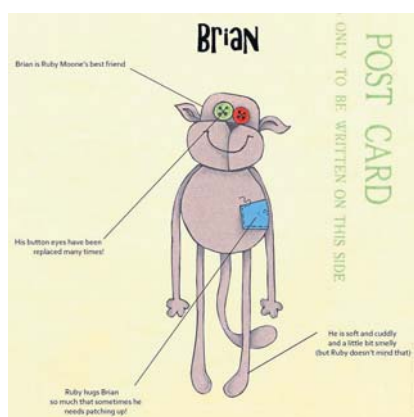
Members of Cancer Research UK will be attending so please dig deep and let's try and raise what we can to make a difference.

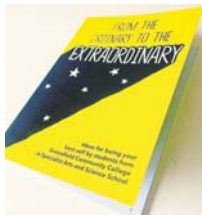

Greenfield Book Shared with Other Schools

Through the work developed by Arts organisation Greenfield Arts, Greenfield Community College have been extending the campaign 'The Power of Words' to raise aspirations and develop their skills through creative learning. 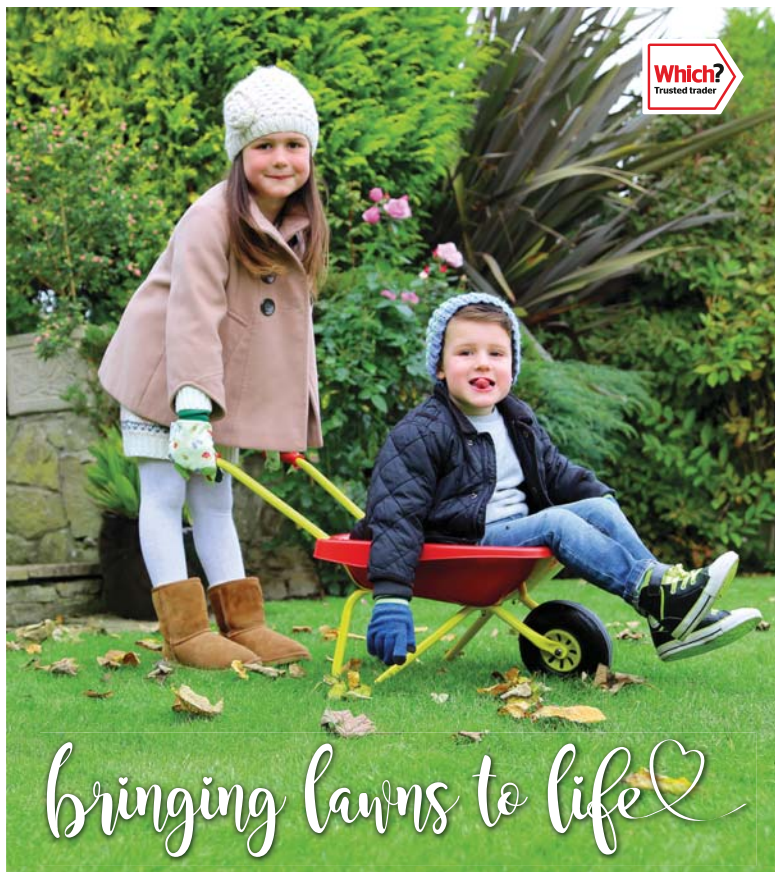

Council Seek Final Location



An art installation which has been touring the county has arrived in the last of its temporary locations before being given a permanent home.

Ps in a Pod was created by artist Louise Plant and has spent four months each in Seaham, Wharton Park and Bishop Auckland before arriving in Hamsterley Forest. The piece was commissioned by Durham County Council as part of a new approach to visual arts which sees work sited in community locations rather than in conventional gallery spaces.

A family day will take place on Friday, 1 June from 10am until 4pm, where visitors can

make their own sculpture alongside local artists.

The council is now considering a final location for the Ps to be sited, with the public invited to make suggestions for its new home.

Cllr Ossie Johnson, Cabinet member for tourism, culture, leisure and rural issues, said: "It has been great to see the Ps on their year-long journey, showcasing the very different landscapes our county has to offer."

"The various activity sessions that have been delivered alongside the sculptures have been a great success and we are pleased so many people have been able to interact with art in a way they might not

normally get the chance to."

A photography competition has also been running alongside the Ps exhibition, with people being encouraged to take photos of the sculptures at each location and upload them to social media with the hashtag #psinapod.

Mick Harle, from Durham, won first place for his photo of the Ps set against the night sky in Seaham, while David Johnson from Spennymoor wowed with his picture of the sculptures amongst the autumn leaves in Wharton Park.

Both were awarded a special 'mini p' created by the artist and presented by Cllr Bill Kellett, Chairman of Durham County Council.

The Secretary of State has replied to Great Aycliffe Residents' Association:

"Compulsory purchase interferes with human the rights of affected parties and, as such, should only be used as a last resort where negotiations to buy land by agreement have failed. There must always be a compelling case in the public interest to justify interfering with the rights of those whose land is taken." Also in its Estate Regeneration Resident Engagement and Protection National Strategy the Government states "Successful estate regeneration schemes need to have support of a majority of residents."

Living are hoping that Tenants will outvote homeowners to force their scheme through offering tenant £6,100 each.

Living's arguments are dissected piece by piece in a Planning Inspectors report "CPO Report to the Secretary of State 29.1.2016 on the Aylesbury Estate" - 83 pages long it blocked Compulsory Purchase (CPO) and showed that the Council down there, like Living here, made statements and promises to residents, but once permissions were given, then withdrew nearly all the offers and promises it made to residents. The CPO was called to a Public Enquiry and stopped dead. Do not sign any agreement with Living, do not sign any confidentiality agreement with Living. We can

Leaving tools in vans overnight, although convenient, is not advisable.

"Perpetrators are often opportunistic, and our advice is not to make things easy for them. If you see somebody trying car doors or otherwise acting suspiciously, please don't hesitate to contact us

on 101." To ensure the safety of your vehicle, follow these helpful tips:

Never leave keys in the ignition or in your car unattended, even for a short time.

Park with care, if possible in a busy, well-lit area.

If you have a garage, use it. If you park on a driveway, close and lock any gates.

Close windows, sunroof, lock doors and activate security alarms when leaving the vehicle.

Take valuables (cash, credit cards, mobile phones, satellite navigation systems) with you when you leave your car. Remove any suction cup

marks from your windows.

If you have no other choice, make sure valuables are locked in the boot, taking care nobody is watching you put them there.

Keep your driving and vehicle documents safe and not in the car.

Postcode your valuables with a UV pen.

Make sure your keys are secure when at home and at work.

We knew community spirit was strong but we also knew the estate was experiencing problems including; high levels of anti-social behaviour, low demand for homes, high levels of deprivation, low property values and poor, run down play areas and public spaces.

Our vision is therefore to work with residents to make Western a great place to live now and for generations to come.

Option three is our preference as it fundamentally addresses the estate layout and the problems this has created. However, this does not mean decisions have been made. The community will decide what it wants in Western, not Livin. Then only if support is gained will we work with residents to secure the millions of pounds of much needed investment for the area.

But remember, it's early days and if regeneration does go ahead it could take up to ten years to deliver.



Homes: Together we could design new homes suitable for families and older people with specialist accommodation and bungalows that are modern, energy efficient and meet local demand with their own driveways and private gardens.



Green spaces and play areas: Together we could provide children with safe, clean play areas and central green spaces all residents can enjoy.

Imagine A vibrant new Western



Safe streets: Together we could design areas where pedestrians and cyclists are given clear priority over vehicles and design streets that reduce car speeds significantly making your estate a safer place to be.



Traffic free routes: Together we could design walkways and traffic free routes to schools and the town centre.

Option 2 - This option would involve:

- Some landscaping improvements
- Building some new homes on existing open spaces (subject to obtaining planning permission)

Due to restrictions of the current estate layout, this option will not enable:

- Private gardens to all homes
- Driveways and parking to all homes
- Areas that attract anti-social behaviour to be designed out
- Any significant funding from Government
- A consistent visual appearance of the estate as there will be a combination of old and new homes

Therefore, whilst Livin could improve its properties, private owners and landlords would need to find their own funding to improve their homes.

Option 3 - This option would involve:

A full estate redesign (this will require full demolition and rebuild)

- Private gardens
- Driveways
- A better mix of homes including bungalows and specialist accommodation for elderly residents
- New play areas
- New community facilities
- New open green spaces

This option is not guaranteed as it requires:

- Resident support
- A Residents' Charter
- An agreed masterplan
- Planning permission
- Millions of pounds of external funding
- Time – this option will take a number of years to deliver. The earliest it would start is 2020.

BRASS Is Back



County Durham's loudest festival is back - with brilliant bands and musicians heading to the region for a ten-day celebration of all things brass. BRASS 2018 takes place from Friday 13 to Sunday 22 July and this year sees a special focus on female performers, starting with Women and Brass on the festival's opening night.

Led by 74-year-old drummer Crissy Lee - a member of the pioneering all-girl Ivy Benson Band popular during the Second World War - the concert will feature a big band of leading female jazz musicians including Swedish internet sensation Gunhild Carling.

Cllr Ossie Johnson, Cabinet member for tourism, culture, leisure and rural issues at Durham County Council, which commissions the festival, said: "BRASS is a fantastic event for the county, attracting tens of thousands of music fans to the area and bringing hundreds of thousands of pounds into the local economy."

"It has a well-deserved reputation and I'm looking forward to seeing this year's festival once again raise the bar and build on the success of previous years, bringing together an absolutely cracking line-up of big names and local talent and showcasing the very best music from around the world." Festival artistic director Paul Gudgin said: "The 2018 festival provides us a great opportunity to celebrate the increasing prominence of female musicians in all forms of brass music."

"It is a real privilege for us to showcase many of the leading female musicians from the classical, jazz and the brass band world and we are confident BRASS 2018 will be another fantastic event." The 12th annual festival boasts a true international flavour, with Australian

trumpeter James Morrison, New Orleans' all-female jazz band Shake 'Em Up and street bands from France, Serbia and Spain.

The ever popular streets of brass will return to Durham City, while parks across the county will host this year's Big Brass Bash events where revellers can enjoy a real party atmosphere with the ever-popular street bands.

The festival will conclude with a large free concert in Wharton Park where the Reg Vardy Band will be joined by a big choir to perform Carl Orff's instantly recognisable Carmina Burana - better known as the X Factor judges' music.

Other events new for this year include a competition for brass musicians to create a composition using a live looping phone app and a new commission inspired by Quentin Blake's BFG exhibition, which will be on display at Bowes Museum during the festival.

A Street Ceilidh led by a Scottish street band promises to have people up on their feet and dancing, while the Scottish Swing Orchestra will join with a local chorus for swing versions of Hollywood musical tunes from films including The Sound of Music, Chicago and Hairpray.

West End star Liza Pulman will also join with the Brighthouse and Rastick Band, the UK's number one championship band, in a unique collaboration celebrating the songs of Barbara Streisand. And once again the festival will see bands head out into schools across the county, with special performances for over 15,000 children, and pupils given the chance to have a go at playing brass instruments for themselves. Cutting Edge Electronics Company Opens In Aycliffe

The Centre for Process Innovation (CPI) has opened a state-of-the-art facility in Aycliffe to help companies exploit opportunities using the Internet of Things.

The printable electronics centre is expected to support a number of developments, including self-monitoring packaging capable of tracking sensitive medicines in the healthcare sector.

Expected to be worth up to £10.8 trillion a year by 2025, the Internet of Things connects devices via the internet, allowing them to send and receive data, and is seen as an integral platform in helping electronics companies develop new business models. Based in Newton Aycliffe, the CPI facility, which supports 20 jobs across new and existing roles, will create rolls of thin, flexible inlays containing multiple electronic components that can be converted into labels or embedded into smart products or wearable goods.

Providing open access facilities, including incubation areas for closer collaboration between companies and CPI, the site will help companies develop products to pilot production volumes, with potential market opportunities including packaging capable of tracking and tracing goods and monitoring contents conditions.

Such functions are already being used in the distribution of temperature sensitive medicines.

The Aycliffe printable electronics base is an extension of CPI's National Printable Electronics Centre at NETPark, in Sedgefield, and John Cocker, platform director, said it will deliver significant benefits.

Thanks to these new

resources, CPI is now uniquely placed to provide clients with thin, flexible electronics at an unparalleled scale on an open access basis' he said.

With the Internet of Things developing fast, CPI is now even better prepared, with this investment in design and manufacturing capability, to meet future technological needs. Josephine Charnley, co-founder of Quantum Technology Supersensors, which received support from CPI to launch a new sensor, said the help has been invaluable.

She added: Our 'environmentally-friendly' printable inks, which can create smart pressure sensing surfaces and 3D Force Touch without costing the earth, have had an incredible launch with CPI's assistance. Its first-class facilities have enabled us to develop our new products, which have just won two awards in Europe".

Phil Wilson, MP for Sedgefield, unveiled a plaque to mark the centre's official opening. He said: "I want to see companies and organisations that offer cutting-edge work and are creating jobs have a place to flourish. CPI has a good track-

record of doing that and I want to see Aycliffe Business Park go from strength-to-strength". Alan Welby, innovation director at the North-East Local Enterprise Partnership, added: "Printed electronics are at the cutting-edge of advanced manufacturing, Industry 4.0 and Internet of Things, and the facilities here are world-class. The centre will give a real competitive advantage for local companies to test out their ideas".

CPI's centre expansion was funded with £2.6m from the European Regional Development Fund. Further funding was contributed by CPI via the Catapult programme and the SCOPE project: a collaborative project involving industry and co-funded by the Advanced Manufacturing Supply Chain Initiative.

Support is available for SMEs via the Emerging Electronics Manufacturing Centre project. To be eligible entrepreneurs, start-up companies or SME's must be primarily located in County Durham to benefit and their projects and ideas should be linked to flexible electronics and to the Internet of Things, and also use internet and wireless connectivity.

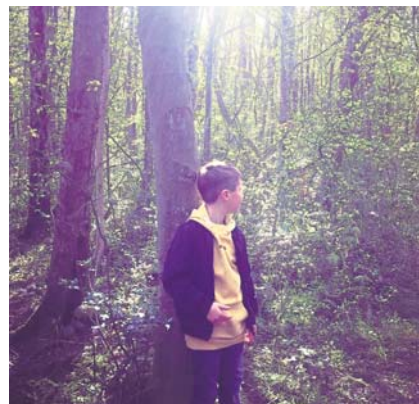

Freight Vehicle Donated to Shildon Locomotion Museum

The National Railway Museum has announced that the nationally significant High-Speed Freight Vehicle 1 (HSFV1) has been donated to Locomotion in Shildon, by the APT-E-Support Group. The HSFV1 made international high-speed travel and freight carrying possible and represents a historic and ground-breaking landmark for rail travel.

It was developed by the Railway Technical Centre in Derby in the late 1960s under Professor Alan Wickens. The outcome of this was the development of new trains to run consistently at high speed across the existing network.

The vehicle was purchased in 2010 by The APT-E-Support Group and displayed in Coventry's Electric Railway Museum, but follows its recent closure, a new home was needed and with the help of Shane Wilton and Graeme Gleaves from the Electric Railway Museum, the move became possible.

Senior Curator of Rail Transport & Technology at Locomotion, Anthony Coulls, said: "We thank the APT-E Support Group for their kind donation of this seminal vehicle. The research was part of the development



of modern rolling stock and we look forward to placing it on display at Locomotion alongside the APT-E, two of the most significant vehicles of late 20th Century railway development."

Kit Spackman and Paul Leadley of the APT-E Support Group, said: "HSFV1 is as important to modern high-speed rail travel worldwide as Stephenson's Rocket was the development of railway travel originally. It's very pleasing that at long last it's been given a proper recognition and a showcase in the Museum's collection."

Locomotion, which officially became part of the Science Museum Group portfolio in December last year, will also be the new home to the

British Rail class 306 no. 306107, later this year. This electrical multiple unit was introduced in 1949 and used on the electrified suburban lines between Shenfield and London Liverpool Street.

The Class 306 electric multiple unit has previously housed at the East Anglian Railway Museum in Essex, where it has been on loan from the National Railway Museum. The unit will return to Locomotion in Shildon for conservation and for public display.

Locomotion houses over 60 historically and significant locomotives and rail vehicles and will give visitors from the North-East and across the country, access to railway history within the collection.
