APPEAL FOR 430 NEW HOUSES AT WOODHAM BRIDGE DISMISSED

The Appeal Hearing held recently for the Woodham Bridge site, at which Willmott

Partnership Homes sought to overturn a DCC decision to refuse planning permission for 430 houses on the site, has been quashed.

After a long hearing over a few days the Inspector dismissed the appeal and the site will NOT be used for housing development and it will be very difficult for anyone to come back and make a case to build houses there in the future.

The site is saved from development, and will remain as a separator between Newton Aycliffe and Woodham, as an open green corridor for wildlife in the Woodham Burn corridor. It never seemed right to create an island estate in that area with no access roads to Woodham and the town. People living there would

have to use the A167 to get to any facilities they required in Newton Aycliffe.

The Inspector concluded that: "The proposal would result in serious landscape harm that would adversely affect the area's character and appearance. The proposal would not contribute to protecting and enhancing our natural environment. It would also have a significant adverse effect on the function of the Green Wedge".

ANCIENT SKULL FOUND IN DARLINGTON

POLICE investigating the discovery a human skull in the garden of a property in Darlington believe the remains to be ancient. On Monday (May 14), officers were called to a property in Springwell Terrace after workmen working on an extension discovered what they believed to be a human skull. Police have now confirmed the skull to be that of a human, and that the remains are believed to be ancient. As a result, they are not linking the discovery to any live investigations at this time. Further bones have also been recovered from the site. Detective Chief

Superintendent Adrian Green, from Durham Constabulary, said: "There is indication of a full skeleton at the site and all accessible bones have been recovered. "DNA testing and carbon dating is being carried out on the remains and may take some time. However, it is likely to be the body of a man and early indications suggest that it is not suspicious. "We believe the skeleton to be ancient. Therefore, at this time, based on the information available to us, police are not linking it to any live investigations." A cordon, which was put in place while officers worked at the property, has since been lifted.

Can Aycliffe Produce a Workplace Choir?

Businesses are being urged to make their staff happier through song, by signing up for the North East's first Workplace Choir of the Year contest.

Durham Music Service is offering to help companies set up and run singing groups, who will go on to perform Christmas carols at Ushaw College and compete at Durham Cathedral.

Cllr Olwyn Gunn, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for Children and Young People's Services, said: "Singing triggers all four happiness hormones – dopamine, serotonin, endorphins and oxytocin – and being in a choir is a great way of bringing colleagues together, be they from the boardroom or the shop floor.

"When you sing together

each voice is as important as the next. It's an extremely unifying experience and the ultimate team building activity."

Durham Music Service will work with firms that sign up to the scheme to create a bespoke choir programme, to maximise the benefits for both staff and businesses.

That will include fun taster sessions to recruit staff into a choir; generally almost four months of weekly hour long rehearsals with one of the service's talented conductors; a set list tailored to the abilities of the singers – which could cover anything from Abba to Handel; as well as everything needed for the performances at Christmas and as part of Durham Vocal Festival 2019.

Michael Summers, who manages the service, which

MORE CHILDREN BENEFIT FROM FREE CHILDCARE

Efforts to raise awareness of free childcare for two-year-olds in County Durham are paying off, with the number of families taking up the offer now significantly above the national average.

Most recent figures show that 87 per cent of eligible families are accessing the provision compared to 70 per cent nationally.

The figure also represents an increase of almost 20 per cent over a 12-month period, with only 68 per cent of families taking advantage of the offer in 2015.

The figures are included in a report which provides an update to Durham County Council's Cabinet on health and wellbeing rates for children, pregnant women and new mothers in the area. It also reveals that there has been a sustained downward trend in teenage pregnancies in recent years, with a drop of more than 60 per cent in under 18 conception rates between 1998 and 2016.

This reduction follows the development of a teenage pregnancy strategy and action plan by the council and its partners.

The authority is working with a number of agencies including Durham, Darlington, Easington and Sedgefield and North Durham Clinical Commissioning Groups and Tees, Esk and

Wear Valley NHS Trust, to address inequalities in child health across the county.

Cllr Olwyn Gunn, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for children and young people's services, said: "Getting a good start in life and getting maximum benefit from education are important markers for good health and wellbeing throughout life so preparing children so they are ready to learn at the age of two and ready for school at the age of five is incredibly important.

"Parents have the biggest role to play in this but we can also do much to support the process, particularly when we work closely and collaboratively with our partners."

The report, which will be discussed by councillors on Wednesday, 16 May, also looks at how a review of the council's children's centres in 2015 has impacted on the number of families who now access services.

There has been an overall improvement in the number of children registered with a children's centre in recent years and a significant improvement in the number of families from the most deprived areas of the county who are registered with a centre.

The percentage of children under the age of five who

live in the county's top 30 per cent most deprived wards who are registered is 91 per cent, up from 66 per cent in 2010.

Staff are also reaching out to more families, with 85 per cent of children under the age of five who live in the top 30 per cent most deprived wards having been contacted by a children's centre. This compares to 43 per cent in 2010.

Furthermore, 97 per cent of the county's teenage mothers have had at least some contact with support services.

Cllr Olwyn Gunn added: "Since reviewing our children's centres in 2015, we have made a concerted effort to target services at the most vulnerable children and families in order to give us the best possible chance of reducing inequalities.

"This work is clearly paying off as we are seeing a significant increase in the number of families from deprived areas who are in contact with our children's centres.

"We have also been working to identify eligible families who are not taking up the offer of free nursery places for two-year-olds and have seen some fantastic results in this area, with many more children now benefitting from the initiative."



Digital Careers Fair Fuels Recruitment Drive

Businesses looking to recruit young people in digital and IT have instantly benefited from a successful careers fair held in Durham city. Atom Bank and Tombola are just two of several businesses who have already lined up interviews with potential new employees following the Digital Careers Fair. Tech firm RAW Digital Training teamed up with DurhamWorks, a County Durham Youth Employment Initiative funded by the European Social Fund, to host the event in the Rivergreen Centre at Aykley Heads in Durham.

Almost 200 young people got to find out more information about digital and IT career opportunities from around 20 exhibitors during the four-hour event, which also included a series of presentations from experienced professionals in the digital sector.

At least 100 jobs were available from the companies in attendance which included Sunderland-based Tombola and Durham-based Atom Bank, as well as Media Works, Baltic Training, Virtual College, QA Apprenticeships and Sunderland and Teesside Universities among others. Neil Guy, head of international operations at Tombola, which is expanding with a new HQ in Sunderland, said: "Businesses are screaming out for IT and digital staff."

"We're now looking to recruit degree apprentices, taking young people from school and college and hopefully keep them for 10 years or more, because of the skills shortage. "It's such a big growth area with lots of opportunities, so events like this are really valuable. It has given us an opportunity to get in front of young people who are interested in a career in IT."

Jayne Parsley, head of communications at Newcastle-based national marketing agency Media Works, said: "We've had lots of interest from the people attending, and received lots of CVs, so it's very much been a worthwhile exercise for us. "We're passionate about keeping local talent within the local community. Luckily we have five amazing universities here in the North-East, and it would be such a shame to see that talent leave our region. We want the passion and expertise from young people to stay here."

Two aspiring IT professionals who attended the careers fair, Kayleigh Lowdon and Nicolai Frampton, both lined up interviews with Atom Bank, the UK's first digital-only bank, during the careers fair. Kayleigh said: "I'm interested in pursuing a career in digital marketing and social media, and maybe graphic design, but it was surprising to learn how many different avenues there are within the digital and IT sector."

"There are a lot of opportunities and it was a great chance to get to speak to businesses face to face, with at least one interview straight away which is fantastic." Joanna Wake, managing director of the event organisers RAW Digital, said: "We've brought together businesses looking to recruit people in IT, and young people looking for a career in that sector, so it's been a fantastic event which everyone involved has benefited from."

"We've seen an energy and buzz from the providers but,



more importantly, we'll see young people ending up with the type of jobs they've been looking for but maybe couldn't find, which will ultimately give us all a buzz."

Joint-organisers DurhamWorks, a partnership project led by Durham County Council and part funded by the European Social Fund and Youth Employment Initiative, has now supported more than 4,000 people between the ages of 16 to 24 to become 'work ready'.

The programme works with a range of partners to help unemployed young people develop their existing skills, identify new ones and help them into a range of training, job and education opportunities.

Danielle Simmons, from DurhamWorks, said: "The digital sector is one of our main growing industries in this region - it's increased by 26% in the last 2 years - but the opportunities out there aren't reaching our young people. So it's a vitally important sector within our programme of works and this

event was about reaching out to those people and making them understand the full spectrum of career paths that are available to them."

Mars and Future Space Travel Lecture

The journey to Mars and the future of space travel were the subjects of the latest public science event hosted by Woodham Academy.

The public lecture delivered by Laura Thomas was organised in partnership with the Institute of Physics (IOP). Titled, 'The Moon: our next step in the journey to Mars', the talk explored space agency plans for a return to the moon, and compared this with imaginings of the early sci-fi authors such as Jules Verne, H.G. Wells and John Wyndham.

The visit is the latest in a series of lectures and activities – many in partnership with the IOP – arranged by Woodham Academy's science department, which is currently planning further inspiring events.

Andrew Jenkins, Head of Science at Woodham Academy, said: "We are determined to provide our students with every experience we can to develop their interest in science, raise their aspirations, and broaden their horizons.

"We are very pleased to welcome the public into school for our events, so they benefit the wider community as well as inspiring our

students. Woodham Academy has developed an excellent relationship with the Institute of Physics and we are very grateful for all their support." Recent science activities have included talks from TV scientists Susie Imber and Ian Johnston, a virtual reality space travel experience, experiments conducted by Science Museum staff, and a trip to see Tim Peake's Soyuz space capsule.

Mental Health Awareness

Week commencing 14th May was Mental Health Awareness Week and as such, The Hub of Wishes our Newton Aycliffe mental health charity is focusing on STRESS. Many people are suffering from some form of stress in their lives, often unaware that their physical symptoms stem from stress. Some stress is necessary and often constructive at a level where it improves your performance, however prolonged stress becomes destructive.

Definition of stress: Stress is difficult to define because it means different things to different people. Stress is the imbalance between the everyday demands of life and the ability to cope. Stress can mimic signs of physical illness - failure to relax and break the cycle can lead to more severe symptoms.

- Signs of stress are: feelings of suffocating pressure, panic attacks, loss of memory at crucial moments, irritability, tiredness, sleep and digestive problems.

- Physical signs of stress are: cardiovascular problems, hypertension, migraines, stomach ulcers, PMS

- Further signs to watch for: exhaustion, insomnia, dizziness, cramps, anger, unable to cope with simple decisions

COUNTERACTING THE EFFECTS OF STRESS:

- **Relaxation:** relaxation calms the mind and body, it may not come naturally to some people but with time and practice it will be of benefit. Some relaxation techniques include breathing exercises, guided visualisation, meditation, listening to online relaxation videos or CDs.

- **Exercise:** exercise releases the body's feel good hormones and actually increases energy levels. Even moderate exercise is of benefit. Walking, swimming, biking, some form of dance, going to the gym – all are

beneficial.

- **Balanced diet:** studies have shown there is a connection between mental health and nutrition i.e. blood sugar imbalance, food allergies, and histamine levels can all affect the mind/body and cause some of the symptoms listed above. Often when we are stressed we eat and drink the very things which negatively affect our nutrition, (i.e. alcohol, fast food, chocolate).

- **Talking about our problems:** Being able to express our feelings to family, friends, or a counsellor will all help alleviate stress. Having a good support network is important to offload our feelings; however there are times when professional counselling may be required. To access help for ourselves in this way is about respecting and caring for ourselves. Very often people are nervous about speaking face to face to anyone about their problems and ringing a helpline may be a first step.

The Hub of Wishes based at Silverdale House promotes good mental health, supports, encourages and provides a social outlet for those who may be suffering emotional distress, difficult times or have mental health issues. Our service is confidential.

Various activities at the centre promote wellbeing and relieve stress including health walks, exercise classes, arts and crafts, learning new skills via training by professionals or supervised by staff; our singing group, film shows and regular outings and day trips. We are open from 10.00 am to 4.00pm Monday – Friday.

And whilst there is more and more support becoming available for mums, there is still a huge



gap in support for dads, and this is something we would like to change" Stephanie Addison, Raindrops to Rainbows.

Stolen Purse Returned with Sentimental Photos



Audrey Chapman's purse contained precious photographs of her late husband and daughter when it was taken from her handbag while she was shopping in Aldi, Newton Aycliffe, in October last year.

The 84-year-old's late husband Siril, whom she was married to for 34 years, passed away in 2009 and Audrey's daughter Ondra died a year later. Audrey said: "When I realised that I would probably never get the photos back, I was absolutely devastated."

Now, the purse has been handed into Bishop Auckland police station and returned to her. Audrey said: "I was gobsmacked and just so happy. It was like a miracle. My faith has been restored and I feel like I have closure now. "I want to say thank you to the anonymous person who handed it in."

PC Sarah Thompson of Durham Constabulary, said: "Throughout the investigation, Audrey's focus has always been on the return of her photos as opposed to catching the offenders.

"If this had happened to my Gran then I'd want the police to do absolutely everything they could to help. We searched high and low for her purse, in bins and around the local area to see if it had been discarded by the criminals but to no avail. "I was over the moon to be able to give it back to her."

Earlier this year, Audrey nominated PC Thompson for a customer service award stating that she did not expect the police to put so much effort into the investigation. The nomination read: "I would like to say that I was very impressed with the level of care shown by Sarah following the incident. I personally felt that she went over and above in trying to identify the offenders. Thank you." Speaking of the 'Wow! Award', PC Thompson said: "It was lovely to be nominated by Audrey and I am just so pleased to close this chapter for her. She is a wonderful lady."

Livin's Bid Exposed

Does Our MP Not Understand Leave?

Dear Sir,
It was reported in the Northern Echo on the 10th of May that Phil Wilson MP is calling for 'People's vote' on the final Brexit deal. It is a second referendum on leaving the European Union that he is calling for. Over 58% of people in this constituency voted to Leave the EU. Therefore, seeing the sitting MP for Sedgefield calling for a second referendum is a clear betrayal of his constituents wishes.

During the referendum campaign, both sides made it clear that a vote to Leave the EU was to leave it in all its entirety including leaving the single market, customs union to take back control of our borders, money and laws.

In the General Election 2017 Phil Wilson campaigned on a manifesto to respect the referendum result however it has become clear Labour have changed their position on Brexit many times before and will do so again before the next General Election.

What of Mr Wilson's concerns? Mexico has a free trade agreement with the EU without having to be in the Single Market and Customs Union and without agreeing to free movement of people. The Isle of Man, which is not a member of the EU, trades tariff free and has a work permit system. Of course, no one would expect the transition to be totally

smooth after membership of the EU for over 40 years but the regaining of our independence and our ability to strike our own trade deals throughout the world would more than compensate for that. There would be a period of transition with some not benefitting initially but this is a decision for the

long term and ultimately would be of benefit to all.

Why does Mr Wilson want the UK to be shackled to the corpse of the EU even though it is a diminishing export market in percentage terms for our country having dropped 14% in 14 years. On a global scale, the EU's share of the world's GDP

has dropped from 31.6% in 1980 to 22% in 2016. Many of those of us who voted for independence see the EU as a failing project.

Police Crackdown on Off Road Bikers

Durham Constabulary has teamed up with petrol stations across County Durham and Darlington in a crackdown against off-road bikers who are causing a nuisance in their community. The force receives about 3,000 reports of anti-social behaviour caused by nuisance off-road motorbikes and quad bikes every year and now it is working with petrol stations to educate the public that it is illegal to sell petrol to people under the age of 16. 'Operation Endurance' was launched in August last year in a bid to tackle nuisance off-road bikers. Since then, 16 bikes have been seized and a further 54 warnings have been issued. Inspector Jon Curtis from the Cleveland and Durham Specialist Operations Unit who is heading up the operation,

said: "If young people are able to access petrol, then they may be able to perpetuate anti-social behaviour by fuelling mini motorbikes. This is why our partnership with service stations is so crucial. "Anti-social behaviour can have a huge impact on the quality of life for the communities in which it occurs. "We sought the support of all service stations in the County Durham and Darlington area to ensure that all aspects of the Petroleum Act in relation to the sale of fuel to persons under 16 years of age are being strictly adhered to and enforced. The simple fact is that many of the off-road vehicles require petrol to run and any activity that minimises an offender's access to fuel or makes the process of fuelling harder is likely to have an impact on their ability to continue causing anti-social

behaviour." Durham County Council petroleum enforcement officer, Chris Matthews, said: "Petrol is a hazardous substance and we must ensure that it is not being sold illegally to or obtained for unsupervised use by children. Adults and petrol retailers must all abide by the legislation." Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner, Ron Hogg, said "This topic is frequently raised by residents in the communities in I represent. People's safety is our top priority and I am pleased that the police are working with local people because these vehicles are causing a great deal of nuisance in our communities." £700,000 Grant to Develop Railway Heritage Ready for Bicentenary 4,000+ Young People Ready for Work

Plans have been revealed for the Stockton and Darlington Railway Heritage Action Zone, which will see the 26-mile route of the railway boosted by an injection of funds and the collaborative efforts of a number of organisations. Historic England is providing an estimated £700,000 in grant aid as part of the five-year scheme, which will focus on developing the railway as a heritage attraction, working towards its 2025 bicentenary. New research will be carried out to help identify areas for repair and restoration, while other projects will help people to develop skills and training, encourage tourism, recreational activities and housing regeneration. The Stockton and Darlington

Railway opened in 1825. It was the birthplace of the modern railway system, changing the shape of the world's communications, travel and economy. Some of the historic railway remains in use today. Though the railway was at the forefront of the Industrial Revolution in the early 1800's, over the years it has become overlooked and neglected. Restoring the track as a heritage destination aims to give a much needed boost to the local area and economy. The scheme is being led by a partnership which includes Darlington Borough Council, Durham County Council, Stockton Borough Council, Tees Valley Combined Authority, Historic England, A1 Steam Locomotive Trust,

Bishop Line Community Rail Partnership, Hitachi, Friends of Stockton and Darlington Railway, Network Rail, Northern Rail, Science Museum Group (Locomotion) and Virgin Trains. Catherine Dewar, Planning Director for Historic England in the North East, said: "We're very proud to have three of the country's 18 Heritage Action Zones here in our region and the Stockton and Darlington Railway is an incredibly exciting one. The 26 mile stretch of historic railway is coming up to its 2025 bicentenary and we're thrilled to be working with a wide range of partners to develop the fantastic heritage along the route. 2025 may seem like a long way away but time will fly and we want

to work with our partners to make the most of the railway heritage in this area with a view to recognising and celebrating the legacy of the Stockton and Darlington Railway." Councillor Nick Wallis, Darlington Borough Council's Cabinet Member for Leisure and Local Environment said on behalf of the three local authorities: "Darlington Borough Council, Durham County Council and Stockton Borough Council are delighted that our Heritage Action Zone plans are now taking shape and we're incredibly excited to get started. Plans to rejuvenate and revive the heritage along the Stockton and Darlington Railway route will benefit local residents and businesses, as well as attract visitors to the area. Through the Heritage Action Zone, we want to help the line achieve world-class status as a visitor attraction."

Ben Houchen, Tees Valley Mayor said: "Celebrating the birthplace of the modern railway is a critical part of the Tees Valley's and County Durham's heritage and we see developing and interpreting this internationally significant asset as a critical element of our economic development strategy for the Tees Valley. Through preserving our heritage and celebrating it through events such as the bi-centenary in 2025 and the City of Culture bid, we celebrate the legacy of our region as one at the forefront of innovation and technology in the past, the present and the future."

Trish Pemberton, Chair of the Friends of the Stockton and Darlington Railway, said: "The Friends have been working to raise the profile of the Railway for many years, and save its important heritage. We are so pleased that this Partnership will help us achieve this, and more importantly, make sure that the economic regeneration it can stimulate is maximised - and that new generations know about it and value it." There are now 18 Heritage Action Zones in villages, towns and cities across England identified by Historic England as places in need and where the historic environment can create economic growth and improve quality of life for people.

A programme which helps young people into employment is celebrating after reaching a significant milestone.

DurhamWorks, a partnership project led by Durham County Council and part funded by the European Social Fund and Youth Employment Initiative, has now supported more than 4,000 people between the ages of 16 to 24 to become 'work ready'.

The programme works with a range of partners to help unemployed young people develop their existing skills, identify new ones and help them into a range of training, job and education opportunities.

One of the many who have been supported by DurhamWorks is single mum Catherine Kime, who is now

studying accountancy and feeling positive about her future.

"I wasn't very confident about my career prospects before being introduced to DurhamWorks but thanks to them I now have an idea of what I want to do. Their staff gave me the practical and moral support I needed to apply for college courses, which I wouldn't have been able to do on my own." DurhamWorks works with a number of partners to help young people not in employment, education or training, including offering one-to-one support with a dedicated member of the team and providing help with benefits, housing and care arrangements.

Cllr Olwyn Gunn, Cabinet member for children and young people, said: "We are delighted that so many young people have benefited from this project and been supported into employment, training and further education. "This is an achievement we are extremely proud of and we would encourage any other businesses interested in taking on young people to get in touch and find out more about the help we can offer." Newtonian Luke's Debut Playing for Sunderland


