massive £9m by her cousin Margery Freeman after she passed away at the age of 100. Spending only £150 on herself to buy a wedding hat and a rhubarb forcer, Jane wanted to invest in people. The Tots in the Park and our preschoolers joined together to do a 'onesie walk' to raise awareness for autism.


A great big well done to everyone who took part.






