 The Plan also allocates significant new areas for business at Newton Aycliffe – at Aycliffe Business Park and Forrest Park (totalling 85ha) – which it describes as "sites that will contribute significantly to the economy of the county".  
 Other new 'employment land' is identified at Jade Park (Murton); Project Genesis (Consett); Meadowfield; Integra61 (Bowburn); South Church and NETPark (Sedgefield) – totalling together about a further 122ha. – along with which the Plan protects 1,500ha. of existing business land.  
 On existing employment sites that are struggling, redevelopment for other uses will be permitted.

**VISITOR ECONOMY**  
 Policies 8 and 9 allow

visitor attractions and accommodation.  
**TOWN CENTRES**  
 The CDP cannot force shops to come to County Durham, but Policy 10 seeks to "protect and enhance" retailing by allowing town centre developments, resisting the loss of essential shops and services, and requiring retail businesses which wish to build outside the town centre to pass a 'sequential test' which proves they can only locate there.  
**THE RURAL ECONOMY**  
 In the rural areas of the County, whilst development will not normally be permitted, both Policies 11 and 12 make exceptions for rural businesses.  
**ENVIRONMENT**  
 Meanwhile, the CDP seeks to protect and enhance the county's "renowned and high-quality natural and historic environment". You may wish to look at the following policies to see if you think they provide sufficient protection for our wildlife networks and historic assets:  
 28: Green Infrastructure  
 41: Landscape Character  
 42: Trees, Woodlands and Hedges  
 43: Biodiversity and Geodiversity  
 46: Historic Environment  
 There are also policies specifically to protect the Heritage Coast (39); the North Pennines AONB (40); Durham Cathedral & Castle (47); and the Stockton & Darlington Railway (48).

It is worth noting the difference between 'Green Belt' (a government designation only applying around Durham city), 'Green Wedge' (a designation in the Sedgefield Local Plan designed to prevent the coalescence of Newton Aycliffe with its surrounding settlements – see map – which is not replicated in the CDP), and 'green space' (which the Great Aycliffe Neighbourhood Plan seeks to protect).

## GREENFIELD EXCEL AT MATHS CHALLENGE



Students at Greenfield Community College achieved great results as they were awarded 3 silvers and 13 bronzes in this year's UKMT Junior Maths Challenge.

The UK Mathematics Trust organises national mathematics competitions for UK Secondary students. "The Maths challenges provide material to provoke students' mathematical thinking and test their problem-solving skills in an accessible

## Support for Rapid Response Team



Hospice supporters are rallying to the cause to protect a lifeline provision for palliative care patients after the service was hit by a shortfall in funding.

Supporters of St Teresa's Hospice have passed the halfway point of a £30,000 appeal for the Darlington Community Rapid Response Team, ensuring terminally ill patients receive the right care, in the right place, at the right time.

The 24/7 provision, which operates 365 days a year, responds to patients in the community within an hour of their call providing palliative nursing care, symptom management, crisis management and pain relief, as well as a hand to hold and a give listening ear.

St Teresa's Hospice chief executive Jane Bradshaw said: "We are an independent charity and we rely on donations and the support of our communities to provide all of our services free of charge.

"We receive some funding towards our work, including the Rapid Response Team, but we must negotiate for this and it cannot always be guaranteed. Our pioneering Rapid Response service was developed by and is run by the hospice. It is part-commissioned by the Darlington Clinical Commissioning Group (NHS) which provides funding for 50 per cent of this facility. Unfortunately,

a separate charitable grant to the hospice ceased to be available from April this year. "There was no immediate risk to the Rapid Response Team, or patients currently accessing the service, and plans to raise the £30,000 needed to cover the shortfall are currently in place via our funding appeal."

To date St Teresa's has received £17,250 in one-off donations from just 211 donors, and with other funding expects to raise over £25,000 before the end of the year.

All funds raised by the appeal will go directly towards the Rapid Response Team.

# NEWTON AYCLIFFE FC STAR AT DAFT EXHIBITION


Durham Amateur Football Trust (DAFT) opened an exhibition at Newton Aycliffe Library on Friday 6th July highlighting the town's footballing heritage.


# Greenfield Future Business Magnates

# Report Rural Crime TACKLING YOUTH OFFENDING

Phil Wilson, the MP for Sedgefield has pledged to support the "Rural Crime Reporting Line" a new service for farmers and the public to give information about rural crime which can have a devastating impact on farmers and rural communities.

Launched by the National Farmers Union, in partnership with Crimestoppers, farmers, rural business and the public can ring 0800 783 0137 or visit www.ruralcrimereportingline.uk to anonymously provide information about crimes relating to large-scale industrial fly-tipping, hare coursing, machinery and livestock theft. Rural crimes is a serious issue for farmers, and MP Phil Wilson, knows the significant impact they can have on farms and other rural businesses. Mr Wilson said "Rural crime can be devastating for those

in rural communities and it is an important issue for many of my constituents living in those areas. I fully support this new initiative by the NFU and commend their ongoing work to tackle serious issues and I am fully committed to working alongside the NFU to try tackle rural crime." NFU Deputy President Guy Smith said "The NFU has teamed up with the charity Crimestoppers to provide a service for farmers and the public to give information anonymously about these crimes. With relevant information being passed on to the police, this service could help to provide key leads in the pursuit of these criminals. I want to encourage anyone who has experienced, witnessed or has any information about these rural crimes to come forward and call the line - your information could be extremely valuable."

Fewer young people from County Durham are entering the youth justice system than ever before. The latest data shows that 119 young people from the county entered the youth justice system between April 2017 and March 2018, the lowest number ever achieved.

The figures are included in the latest update to the Youth Justice Plan submitted by the County Durham Youth Offending Service (CDYOS) which is being presented at a meeting of Durham County Council's Cabinet next Wednesday.

Other achievements highlighted in the plan include a reduction in both re-offending and the number of custodial sentences for young people.

This year has also seen the introduction of the Skill Mill, a community interest company which provides employment and training for young people under the supervision of CDYOS.

The first cohort of four young people completed their six month contract, with three progressing into long-term employment and none committing further offences. Cllr Olwyn Gunn, Cabinet member for Children and Young People, said: "Over the last year we have worked hard to identify the factors that make it more likely for young people to re-offend and put many interventions in place to tackle these issues."

"We will continue to focus on reducing first time entrants to the Youth Justice System and provide opportunities for education, employment and training which make a significant impact in preventing further offending."

"Restorative justice remains at the heart of our work and we are pleased that over the last year we have engaged 192 victims of youth crime in restorative approaches."
