Council Set To Deliver First Phase Of 'Game-Changing' Business Park

A new private sector business park capable of attracting up to 6,000 new jobs, worth £400 million to the county's economy looks set to move into its first phase of development. The unique site on Aykley Heads, set in mature parkland and with outstanding views over the World Heritage site, offers a once in a generation opportunity to transform Durham's economic fortunes. Already home to Atom Bank, the North East England Chamber and Salvus House – Aykley

Aykley Heads, Durham Strategic Employment Site



Heads is just a few minutes' walk from both the city centre and the main line rail station.

Now Durham County Council's Cabinet will be asked to agree a report which would trigger the development of phase one of the exciting project on the northern zone of the site, bringing forward 21,000 square feet of new business space next year. Expert led research has been completed to inform the best way to maximise the site's potential and if agreed by members next week (12 September) the building design will be flexible to accommodate multiple tenancies or expansion requirements for businesses locating onto the site.

With the relationship between Phil and myself, and also knowing Luke's Mam (Jane) and grandparents (Peter and Anne), I jumped at the chance." Luke's family are very proud of his achievements so far and none more so than his Grandad, Peter, and his Uncle Philip who are both life long supporters of Sunderland AFC.

That approach will maximise potential demand and minimise the council's financial risk. The report recommends the council itself brings forward this first phase of the development.

Cllr Simon Henig, leader of the council, said: "Aykley Heads presents us with a game-changing opportunity to create a distinctive business location for the North East, providing high quality modern office space in a stunning setting. A place that offers fantastic opportunities for our residents and with a unique work and lifestyle offering. "Sites of this calibre are rarely available and there is currently nothing that matches it within the region. We should not underestimate the potential of this location and it's important that we take the lead in helping to bring it forward."

The site has the potential to attract over 700,000 square feet of development supporting approximately 6,000 new jobs.

The council's key objectives for the site are:

- Maximising the economic impact for the whole county;
 - New job creation in Durham City;
 - Generating income for the council;
 - Delivering a business location of the highest quality;
 - Creating an environment where people want to work.
- Phase two of the development involves the council vacating its current headquarters on site and relocating to the city's waterside, where it would sit alongside other key public sector employers. The new headquarters would be just a third of the size of the current building and deliver savings in running costs. Members will consider the Aykley Heads delivery report when they meet at County Hall next week. Criminal Justice Victim Liaison Officer, Nicola Stavers.

She will work in partnership with relevant criminal justice agencies to help ensure that a victim's voice is heard, that they feel safe, and that they are kept informed about the progress of their case.

Speaking about the new role, Ron Hogg said:

"Nicola will work with victims throughout the system, acting as a continuous point of contact to ensure they receive the support and information they need to allow them to cope and recover from the impact of their crime and to navigate through this intimidating system. This role is being piloted for twelve months initially to enable us to further understand the needs of victims and ensure they have access to the right services, when they need them. I look forward to the positive outcomes."

VCAS have already provided support to over 920 victims of crime across County Durham and Darlington in 2018. Nicola will be able to draw on the wider support they offer to victims, whilst providing personalised, accessible support as a continuous point of contact for victims of crime following a charging decision.

Kieran Maxwell Legacy

'You Only Have One Life So Live It'

On 29th October 2010 at just 12 years of age Kieran was diagnosed with Ewing's Sarcoma, . On 31st March 2011 he had his left leg amputated through the knee.

3rd October 2011 Kieran was considered cancer free.

Kieran's cancer returned 10th May 2013, but he delayed treatment to participate as a gymnast in the NDP National Acrobatic Championship, where he won Gold with his partner with the 3rd highest score of the day. He underwent chemo and a bone marrow transplant and was considered cancer free November 2013.

Life returned to normal and nearly 3 years after finishing treatment we learnt through a routine chest x-ray Kieran was going to die. His cancer had returned to his heart and he was now terminal. Kieran in these interceding years had become a promising T42 sprinter. He represented his country at the Paralympic School Games in Brazil where

he won gold in November 2015. He was working hard towards a place in the team for Tokyo 2020, a dream he never got to fulfil.

Cruelly, Kieran was taken on 23rd June 2017 at only 18 years of age.

Kieran decided that while there was no hope for him he wanted to create a legacy to fund research that could one day bring a positive outcome to other families.

We want to keep this legacy alive in honour of brave Kieran and on Thursday 1st November 2018 we are holding the first Kieran Maxwell Legacy dinner at Ramside Hall in Durham.

Heart Team Pledge To Raise £30,000 For Medical Mission To Ghana



Andrew Turley from School Aycliffe is one of twelve volunteers from cardiac surgery teams on Teesside who are set to fly out to Ghana to perform a series of life-saving heart operations.

Surgeons, cardiologists, intensive care practitioners, anaesthetists and a heart bypass technician are among those who have pledged to spend a week at the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital (KATH) in Kumasi, Ghana's second city, in February 2019. Their mission has received

overwhelming support from colleagues at South Tees Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust and North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust – even those who are not going on the trip are gearing up to help raise £30,000 to fund equipment and medical supplies.

Enoch Akowuah, clinical director and cardiothoracic surgeon at South Tees, was born in Ghana and has been instrumental in launching the initiative alongside fellow cardiothoracic surgeon Joel Dunning.

He said: "The hospital has just appointed a cardiac surgeon but they have no kit and there are lots of patients who need operations."

"We hope to complete at least five open heart procedures and implant 10 pacemakers while we are out there."

Mr Dunning said: "Ghana has only one functioning cardiothoracic centre in Accra in the far south of the country. In central and northern Ghana, where we are heading, there is no access to cardiac surgery for the 15 million people who live there."

"Acute rheumatic fever is very high in Ghana and there are a lot of young adults - average age 29 - with heart valve problems who cannot afford treatment."

"We hope to fund all the equipment we need including artificial heart valves and cardiopulmonary bypass circuits so that those patients who are most in need can be treated for free."

Ghanaian intensive care staff will also receive training from James Cook's critical care practitioners on how to provide post-operative care.

Mr Akowuah added: "Being able to offer this opportunity to young adults who would otherwise not have access to life-saving heart surgery is a real privilege for all of us."

"I've been blown away by the enthusiasm of the whole unit to help pull this mission together. Everyone wants to

HAVE YOUR SAY ON ADULT SOCIAL CARE SERVICES

Residents and community groups are invited to share their views about adult social care as part of a major national consultation.

The Local Government Association (LGA) consultation, titled 'The lives we want to lead', asks how best to pay for social care and support for older people, adults with mental or physical disabilities and unpaid carers.

The LGA hopes that the responses will start a debate about changing the emphasis of the care and health system to focus more on preventative, community-based personalised care, changes which would help to maximise people's health, wellbeing and independence and alleviate pressure on the NHS.

The LGA estimates that

nationally, adult social care services face an annual funding gap of £3.5 billion by 2025.

Cllr Lucy Hovvels MBE, Cabinet member for adult and health services and chair of the health and wellbeing board, said: "County Durham's population is changing significantly and the number of people aged over 65 will increase from almost one in five people to over one in four by 2030. The question of how we pay for adult social care in the long-term is therefore getting even more urgent.

"The consultation is open to all members of the public, regardless of whether they receive adult social care and support, and I would like to stress what an important opportunity this consultation is for people

in County Durham to have their say."

Findings from the consultation will be used to help influence the Government's spending plans and its own green paper, due for release this autumn.

Flu Vaccination Changes

Dr Christopher Stephenson, GP Partner at Bewick Crescent Surgery explains the changes to flu vaccinations and delivery schedules this year.

This flu season the Surgery will be giving two different types of flu vaccination as NHS England have authorised the use of an adjuvanted trivalent flu vaccination called Flud for anyone aged 65 and over. 'Adjuvanted' means that the vaccination has an added ingredient (squalene) which helps the vaccination get into the immune system faster. As we age our immune system becomes less efficient so it is felt that this vaccine offers better protection for this group of patients.

Patients under 65 will get



the usual quadrivalent vaccine. Both vaccines do the same job and offer the same protection against flu, but one just works faster. Although the over 65 flu programme is a universal programme (ie anyone can have it) people under 65 only qualify if they have a chronic condition such as asthma, COPD, diabetes, or are pregnant or a carer. If you are unsure whether you can have the vaccine for free please ask any of our staff or have a look at our website; www.bewickcrescentsurgery.nhs.net

As the number of NHS patients across the UK who are entitled to a free flu vaccination runs into the hundreds of thousands, NHS England restrict the number of vaccines available to individual surgeries. This year Bewick Crescent receive their first small supply of Flud in mid-September but will not get the first batch of quadrivalent vaccines until the end of September. This means that different patients will be offered the vaccine at different times. As well as controlling the supply of vaccines NHS England have very strict rules about which vaccines surgeries are allowed to give to which patients so, for example, we are not allowed to give a Flud vaccine to an under 65 year old even though we do get that stock earlier. For anyone who is concerned

about this remember that flu does not generally circulate until well into the winter (the 'flu season' officially starts in December) so waiting until October for your flu vaccination does not put you at increased risk.

Despite the extra controls on supplies this year we still intend to hold our usual Saturday walk-in clinics, but because of our delivery schedule have added an extra date. The first walk-in on Saturday 22 September 2018 will be for over 65s only. Unfortunately, if anyone else turns up we will not be able to give a vaccine as we won't have had our quadrivalent delivery by then. The following two walk-ins on Saturday 27 September and Saturday 06 October 2018 will be for anyone who is eligible for the flu vaccination.

For our Heighington patients we will be arranging walk-in clinics at the branch surgery after we have had our second delivery of both types of vaccine, and expect these to happen in early October. Any patients from Heighington who would like to have their vaccination earlier are invited to come along to one of our Saturday clinics at Bewick Crescent. Remember flu can be a debilitating and even life-threatening infection so although arrangements are a bit more complicated this year, please do still come and get your flu vaccination.
