Young People Launched

The Philomena Protocol, named after the patron saint of babies, infants and vouths is the first of its kind in the country being introduced by Durham Constabulary.
Building on the success

and learning from the Herbert Protocol (an initiative to support adults who are at risk of going missing), the Philomena Protocol will roll out into 48 children's homes across the force area by later this

year.
Working alongside partners in the council, it encourages carers, staff, families friends to compile useful information which could be used in the event of a young person going missing from care.

The streamlined joint approach is a step towards protecting some of the most vulnerable, young adults in County Durham and Darlington. Any child who is at risk of wandering or going missing for any reason is encompassed within this protocol.

Durham Constabulary's Crime and Harm Reduction Inspector Rachel Stockdale said: "It is important we have in place a sensible, joined up approach to prevent young people from going missing in the first place, and ensures that the procedures for when people do go missing are robust and effective."

The scheme protects the young and vulnerable whilst respecting and understanding their need for independence Deputy Chief Constable,

Jo Farrell said: "There is nothing more distressing than when a young person goes missing and does not return home when expected.

'The Philomena Protocol will help adults to locate the young person and return them to safety as quickly as possible."

If used effectively, the protocol will develop links between residents, families, care providers and our local police teams which will ensure there are established relationships within all sections of the

communities served by Durham Constabulary.

The scheme will save time and resources but most importantly it has potential to save lives of our vulnerable people, by working with children's homes to establish patterns of behaviour, places they frequently visit, keeping an up-to-date photograph and medication list on hand and if they do go missing completing a standardised form which will make the emergency

enquiry more efficient. Ron Hogg, Durham Police, Crime & Victims Commissioner said: "This new protocol is a fabulous idea, and will help to further enhance the excellent partnership

services response to the



Health And Wellbeing

Successful work to improve the health and wellbeing people in Durham will be outlined to councillors next week.

Durham County Council's Cabinet will consider the latest annual report from the Health and Wellbeing Board (HWB) when it meets on Wednesday, 12 September. The report gives an overview of work the board has carried out over the last 12 months, along with projects earmarked for the future.

achievements also outlined, including the creation of the County Durham Integrated Care Board to lead on work towards the Government's target of creating a fully integrated health and social care service by 2020.

Around Patients (TAPs) are already operational across Durham, Dales, Easington Sedgefield (DDES) and Durham North (ND) Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) areas. These multi-agency teams work to reduce avoidable hospital admissions and permanent admissions to care homes, reduce delays in the transfer of care, and improve the health and wellbeing of older people and those with long term conditions.

Working Together To Improve | Woodham Playing it by the Book

with a novel way to promote reading over the summer. at Woodham Students Academy were invited to join a Reading Club, which granted them the opportunity to win a Kindle electronic reading book, books and book vouchers, if they agreed to keep a reading log over the six-week break. The school – whose reading efforts were singled-out for praise by Ofsted recently is keen to endorse reading as a life-time activity, rather than just something which is done during school time. To do this they have installed a reading area, a library and employed specialist staff; diligent readers can also find themselves in receipt of one of the school's annual reading awards, or can take part in their annual Book Exchange.

According to statistics from the Department for Education, one in five children in England cannot read effectively by the age of 11; and 16 - 24 year-olds have lower levels of literacy than almost anywhere else in the developed world. This is not surprising, perhaps, given that only 26% of 10 year olds in Britain profess to 'like' reading, and only 37% of children in England read for pleasure on a daily basis. Woodham Academy is seeking to re-address this imbalance by rewarding those who continue to read for pleasure after their transition to secondary school, and by highlighting the importance of reading in achieving good exam grades and in being able to go on



to the college, or the job, of their choice. The school's first priority was to ensure sustain their pupils reading levels over the long summer break, rather than regress by the three months the government estimates, if they do not continue to read regularly.

Upon returning to school, Reading Club members will have continued to

have their reading progress monitored and granted privileged access to the Reading Rooms during breaks and some evenings. to ensure they keep up their good habits. In addition, a number of older students have agreed to Reading Ambassadors – to ensure the readers have everything they need to succeed.

Just to think from that initial thought in someone's mind that someone is inferior, that hate can grow to the extent of the horrors that were seen in this terrible place. People need to come here so that this type of thing doesn't happen

The trip also included a





river cruise along the River Vistula seeing the stunning Wawel castle on the banks of the Vistula, which was the HQ for the Nazi Governor of southern Poland in World War Two, and earlier the seat of the Polish Kings. They also visited the Jewish

learned about the efforts of Oskar Schindler's metal manufacturing factory where he managed to save the lives of so many of his Jewish workers ('Schindler's List'). The overall experience was rewarding and reminded students of the resilience that was shown by individuals when faced with such adversity and the impact of this period in history.

This was just one of the valuable opportunities that have been available to students at Greenfield Community College, during the summer students were given the opportunity to visit France to learn more about history and the WW1 Battlefields. The defibrillator has been positioned in the main school Junior reception area and during term time the wider community have access to it should the need arise



This includes the Local Council Tax Reduction Scheme, which offers eligible residents a discount of up to 100 per cent on council tax; exemption from paying council tax for care leavers up to the age of 25; and an initiative which is currently supporting more than 450 small and medium-sized businesses which faced the steepest increase in charges following the government's revaluation of their properties in April
