500+ People Set for 'Bigger and Better' Music Festival

More than 500 people are expected to attend a growing music festival which is now in its third year. The ROF 59 activity centre on Aycliffe Business Park, Newton Aycliffe, will welcome a string of local bands to a specially-built stage and marquee area at their premises this weekend. Around 500 people gathered for the event's first two years, in 2016 and 2017, and organisers are expecting an even bigger turn-out for the family-friendly event along Durham Way South this



Saturday (September 29). Bands including Dust Town Dogs, The Weller Connection, One Eyed Jack, Green Haze, Black Nevada, King Kobalt, Ginger and the Rogers, Sky Shaded, Lee Maddison and Avenue are expected to perform at the event, which starts at 1pm. There will also be acoustic sessions in ROF 59's events room, while the restaurant facilities will be open as usual. And ROF 59 are offering a 50% discount on their zip wire, drop zone, virtual reality and laser combat between 1pm and 6pm, £5 per child for Trampoline & Adventure wall 3pm - 9pm plus there'll be outdoor inflatable's. Event organiser Kim Fryer said: "The music festival has become a firm event in the local community calendar and we're looking forward to what

promises to be another great day for all the family. "Parents can enjoy some really talented and well-known local artists while their children enjoy the facilities, there's lots to do for everyone so you're guaranteed an entertaining day all-round. "Everyone who has attended previous music festivals here have had a thoroughly great time and we're pulling out all the stops to make it even bigger and better. "Anyone interested in attending should get in quick and buy their tickets before Saturday as the admission price on the day goes up." Several businesses have sponsored Saturday's event, including Aycliffe firms SCH Site Services, Raico, Workshop Supplies, Locky Site Services, John Wade Group, Stiller Warehousing and Distribution, Roman and Aycliffe Dairies. Tickets for the music festival are priced: Adults £12 in advance or £16 on the day, children (6-15) £7 in advance or £11, and a family ticket costs £30 advance or £40 on the day. Gig-Pit review: "Popped along to watch 'The Hybrids' in Gosforth on Friday night, what a great band. This trio sound full and powerful with some nice tight playing from the drums and bass. Guitar and vocals were spot on and some great tunes from a wide range of bands such as Led Zeppelin, Manic Street Preachers, Foo Fighters, Dire Straits, Paul Weller. All songs were handled by the band without problem and the vocals adapted to all the tracks effortlessly. I did notice that the vocalist did put his own slant on some of the tracks, rather than mimic the artist, which I liked. Musically some tracks were also played slightly differently, which again, I personally prefer when watching a cover band, I feel it shows the bands own identity. These guys are very competent musicians, and boy do they play a set? The second set was a long one, but the punters loved it and they played to a packed house all night. Ten year old Newton Aycliffe girl Katelyn Stacy needs your help. Katelyn was born prematurely at 32 weeks, which resulted in her being diagnosed with cerebral palsy by the age of one. Cerebral palsy is the name for a group of lifelong conditions that affect movement and co-ordination. Symptoms

include stiff and weak muscles, tremors and poor co-ordination. In Katelyn's case it has meant that she is unable to stand and is permanently confined to a wheelchair. Over the past couple of weeks Katelyn has been in and out of hospital with seizures and has now been diagnosed with epilepsy.

Katelyn is a very fun loving young lady who wishes to live her life to the fullest. Her biggest dream has been to be able to ride a bike. Katelyn's parents both work hard but with two other children to look after and with funding going towards much needed medical equipment, Katelyn's dream of a bike has never been fulfilled. A bike for Katelyn would have to be specially made for her requirements, allowing her legs and body to be secured in the correct position and allow her to sit upright. The bike would have to be pushed which will allow her legs to move and therefore maintain and strengthen her leg muscles.

Katelyn would love nothing more than to receive a trike off Santa Claus this year. She has even opened her own beauty salon painting nails for 50p, and she so far has made £24, with the bike costing around £1700 she may have a long time to wait. So far we have had a fantastic response from people via facebook. People's kindness and generosity is overwhelming, but we are still in need of more donations.

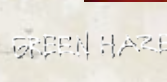
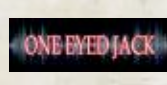

Record Art Results at Woodham Academy



Woodham Academy Art Department have built on the success of last year's high results by gaining record results in 2018. Woodham's Art results were amongst the highest in the county and were 12% above the national average in the subject.

Not only were the results amazing, but the standard of the work was of the highest quality. The end of year Art exhibition attracted a large crowd who were all amazed by the standard of the work. The work showed skill in many different mediums and many pieces of the work sold, earning the students a decent income to see them through the school holidays.

The exceptionally high grades of the students, five of who gained a grade 9 (4.3% above national average) was down to both the dedication and hard work of both staff and students who worked diligently throughout the two year course during lessons, at home and during after school enrichment sessions.

RECIPE BOOK FOR OLDER PEOPLE LAUNCHED

A recipe book has been launched by a County Durham charity with menus specifically designed for older people.

Called 'Eat Well, Feel Great', the book has been published by Age UK County Durham in response to calls from older people to inspire and motivate them to try new dishes and make meals more interesting and varied.

Ideas for the recipes came from members of the charity's Big Lottery-funded project 'Come Eat Together' and Bishop Auckland College catering lecturer Graham Kennedy, working with Newcastle University's LiveWell research programme.

'Come Eat Together' offers help with shopping and runs lunch clubs in various venues across the county, including a monthly event at the college where a two course meal is prepared and served by students, followed by choice of activities.

The recipe book features traditional favourite dishes which have been given a modern and healthy twist, inspired by Mediterranean cuisine. It also has a wide range of fresh new recipes which introduce people to delicious snacks and meal ideas that are quick and easy to make.

More than half of the recipes



are suitable for vegetarians, and there are suggestions for the use of alternative ingredients to ensure that dishes can be interesting and varied. All are suitable for one or two people.

The recipes include:

- smoked mackerel paté
- baked fish and chips
- Sardinian stew
- tuna Niçoise salad
- roasted vegetable tagine with couscous
- chicken, spinach and potato frittata
- spice roasted fruits with honey and orange sauce.

The book is spiral bound so it can be laid flat, and has large colour photos of each recipe and easy to read text.

The project has been praised by North East celebrity chef and 'Hairy Biker' Si King, who said: "Come Eat Together is an absolutely

brilliant project bringing older people together to enjoy good food and good craic.

"Sometimes it's hard to get motivated to cook different tasty meals when you live on your own, this recipe book has loads of tasty creative healthy food to get your taste buds going!!

The drop-ins offer the opportunity for people to meet and speak to carers about their experiences and to ask the fostering team any questions, or raise any doubts or worries they may have.

Florence Coulter, the council's fostering team manager, said: "Fostering is like no other job and whilst at times it can be challenging and frustrating the difference that foster carers can make is truly life-changing."

"The children and young people in our care come from very different backgrounds and situations so we need people of all ages and backgrounds to provide them with a stable and loving family home. We want to recruit a diverse range of foster carers to increase the likelihood of finding



a match for each child or young person. Those people can be the reason brothers and sisters stay together or the reason children are not placed far from their home. Be The Reason is all about us reaching out to potential carers and letting them know how to get started, explaining how the fostering process works and how we can help them."

RAF Charity Seeks to Tackle Loneliness



The Royal Air Forces Association is encouraging members of the RAF family in the Durham area to get in touch if they're feeling isolated or lonely and their life could be brightened by visits from a volunteer befriender. The charity provides welfare support to serving and ex-RAF personnel and their dependants. Their befriending service has teams of dedicated and specially-trained bidders, who work across the UK to support people in need of a friendly face. They are reaching out to people in the Durham area who could benefit from their support. The bidders pay regular visits to their bidders, giving them someone to talk to and look forward to seeing. Time is often spent reminiscing about life in the RAF and conquering loneliness. The Association understands that loneliness, which can often occur as the result of losing a loved one or moving into a new home, can quickly lead to feelings of isolation and even depression, particularly among older people. Volunteers are able to provide support to bidders in re-establishing old connections or forming new ones with people in their local area, helping to establish a wider group of friends. In 2017 alone, the Association responded to hundreds of

appeals for befriending support, and the charity's Director of Welfare and Policy, Rory O'Connor, hopes the Durham area will see local people benefitting from the scheme. He said: "We know, from Office for National Statistics data, that five per cent of adults in England last year reported feeling lonely 'often' or 'always'. Single or widowed people are at particular risk of experiencing loneliness more often, and we know that elderly people with reduced mobility can be hard-hit. "Feelings of loneliness and isolation can be a serious issue for people who served in the RAF because, when they retire, they suddenly lose the camaraderie of being part of a close-knit community of colleagues. "Our experience shows that our befriending scheme benefits everyone involved - our volunteers who take time out of their days love doing it, and bidders benefit hugely from the visits. It's an extremely positive and far reaching scheme which we hope will help people to live a healthier and happier life." 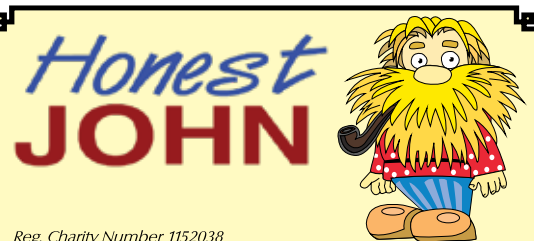

There is a group at St. Mary's who meet on a Wednesday 1-3pm (Knit and Natter Group). This group are actively knitting woollen poppies. Anyone is welcome to attend and join in or drop off balls of wool. Contact Margaret Lee on 01325 316963. Crafters Companion also hold a Wednesday knitting group 2-4pm.

An appeal is now published for donations of red wool to help with the construction of the poppies at the Knit and Natter Groups. Red wool and black buttons are requested and can be left at St. Mary's on a Wednesday between 1-3pm, Newton Press offices or Crafters Companion.

KNITTED POPPY PATTERN

(Large Poppy) - 3.5/3.75mm (UK 9), DK Yarn, Black Button
Cast on 120 stitches.
Rows 1 to 4 Knit.
Row 5 Knit 3 stitches together across the row - 40 stitches.
Row 6 to 9 Knit.
Row 10 Knit 2 stitches together across the row - 20 stitches.
Row 11 to 14 Knit.
Row 15 Knit 2 stitches together across the row - 10 stitches.
Break off yarn with long tail and thread back through remaining stitches and pull tight.
Join edges with mattress stitch.
Use a black button to sew to centre of the poppy.
