

## Scanner Appeal Fund Raising



## **Let Silence Help People Affected by MND**



Linda West, employed at the PCP, this week held a sponsored silence at work in aid of Motor Neurone Disease (MND).

"I did the Silence because my Mother was diagnosed Motor with Neurone Disease a month ago, after losing her ability to swallow and speak. She has had a feeding tube inserted straight into her stomach at James Cook Hospital in Middlesbrough and we are very grateful for their outstanding care.

Her ability to process information has also been affected but she would adamantly disagree with this. MND has no cure and is a progressive debilitating disease. My sister and I feel like there is nothing we can do, other than support her



Stacey has lived in Newton Aycliffe her whole life and attended Woodham Comprehensive School. She has been writing as a hobby for years, but it has only been in the last few years that she has started to write for an audience. She went back to university as a mature student and studied a BA (hons) in English Literature and then went on to study an MA in Creative Writing which she has received a predicted grade of distinction. 

### W.I. STALWART | COHERENT RESPONSE **VISITS ROTARY**



Lyn Swift, pictured with Senior Vice-President, Jean Thompson, came along to our meeting on Tuesday evening to tell Rotarians about her journey with the W.I. and how persuasion from friend, Sheila MacMillan, and an advert in the Newton News led to Lyn attending a gathering convened to form a W.I. in Newton Aycliffe. She left the meeting as their first president! That was in the year 2000 and on 1st May 2014, Lyn was

elected as Federation Chair. a post which lasted three years during which she and other members enjoyed visits to the Albert Hall, a Royal Garden Party and celebrations on Empire Day. A proud day for her, was receiving the Durham County Council Chairman's Medal from then chairman, John Robinson. Lyn is a worthy recipient and the joy she gets from attending W.I. events and meetings was obvious to all our members.

Readers can rest assured I do not intend to answer each of Mr Welsh's points in his "A Vote on the Brexit Outcome?" letter. His letter is so long-winded and his arguments are not always presented coherently, so such a response would be of no use.

What might be useful would be to dispel some of the myths put out about the EU and its institutions. If anyone is interested in a more complete and objective description of how the EU works than the simplistic and one-sided views and one-sided views normally put out, I would recommend "The European Union: Citizen's Guide" by Chris Bickerton, lecturer in Politics at Cambridge University. This short book makes it clear that, far from the EU imposing rules on any member state, each country is fully involved in decisions made. As a democratic process, I am sure it can be improved upon and made less bureaucratic, but that goes for any democratic process, including our own. Democracy may not be perfect, but I can't think of a better form of government. In response to Mr Haylett of Haylettons and the second of the seco Heighington, I did vote in the

1975 referendum. Perhaps I am one of the few over-60s to have voted remain again this time around, mostly because of the because benefits available to young people. Over recent decades, Germany has worked extremely hard to atone for its wrongdoings in the 20th Century. The fact that it has a very successful economy is down to them having a long term industrial strategy and should be lauded, not despised. Belonging to the EU did not hinder Germany, because each member state is able to make its own decisions, so another myth - that the EU hinders national governments - can be dispelled. Since the referendum, I have

been on the look out for explanations from those who promote Brexit as to how, in practice, the UK will benefit. Apart from the unenlightening "taking back control" etc, I've found very little. What is apparent is that the likes of Davis, Fox, Johnson and Rees-Mogg are rich enough not to ever have to suffer from job losses which might result from Brexit. ### Cannabis for **Medicinal Purposes**

– but there is further to go

People with serious medical conditions will be able to have access to cannabisbased medicines, following the success of campaigns to legalise the drug for medicinal purposes.

Welcoming the news,

Welcoming the news, the Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner for County Durham and Darlington, Ron Hogg, said "I am delighted that the Government has finally seen sense and agreed to allow cannabis to be used to treat conditions such as epilepsy. The stories of children suffering, when cannabis-based medicines would have helped them. will have touched the hearts of many."

For the first time in the UK. expert doctors have been given the option to issue prescriptions legally for cannabis-based medicines, when they agree that their patients could benefit from this treatment. The change was confirmed recently and comes into effect on 1st November.

Ron Hogg added "I think the public mood towards drug policy reform is changing. The medical benefits of cannabis have been accepted. Now is the time for health to become the focus of wider Government policies towards drugs. If people are able to go to their GP for help with an addiction without fear of being criminalised, they would be much more likely to receive the medical support they need."








### Web Firm Ahead of the Game as Sales Set to Top £1m
