The club have decided, with the families permission, that this money will go towards funding a portable defibrillator which could potentially save the lives of others. Woodham Academy have



kindly allowed the club the use of their own defibrillator, which is located inside the school, however a portable one would allow managers to have one pitch side. As some of the pitches are outside the main school grounds having a defibrillator pitch side could significantly increase the chances of

recovery. Studies show that every minute without CPR and defibrillation reduces someone's chance of survival by 10 per cent. On behalf of the club we would like to thank the Kipling family for their very kind donation which will be a lasting and very fitting tribute to such a lovely man.

Sergeant's Blog NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING

Do you have a burning question for your local police officers? Need advice on an issue and don't know who to turn to? Want some help or assistance with a community initiative? Police officers in Newton Aycliffe are joining forces with a number of partner agencies to provide drop-in advice and support sessions for local residents in the run up to Christmas.

From this Friday (November 30) until Friday, December 21, officers will be taking over an empty shop on Beveridge Way where residents can come and discuss any issues they may have. They will be joined by different agencies on selected days, with Santa and his elves also making a special appearance. Sergeant Andy Boyd, from Newton Aycliffe Neighbourhood Police Team, said "This is a fantastic opportunity to seek advice, help and assistance from a variety of agencies covering a wide range of issues. We are working closely with them to promote the amazing work that they are doing in the community, as well as providing a presence in the town centre in an effort to reduce shoplifting and Anti-Social Behaviour. So please, come down and see us, the kettle is on!"

The drop-in sessions will take place at 37 Beveridge Way (opposite Savers). The agencies that are taking part are:

Street Triage Team - The Street Triage Team (STT) work in partnership with Durham Constabulary providing timely support, advice and guidance to the Police when they are dealing with people experiencing mental health issues and distress.

AARMS - Set up to help those who struggle to control their alcohol consumption to attain a safe pathway to recovery.

Changing Lives - Changing Lives helps more than 17,500 people change their lives for the better each year. We are a national charity dedicated to supporting people with the most complex needs to make meaningful and lasting improvements to their lives.

YourCountryYourMoney - Money saving and money management tips aimed at benefiting you and the county.

Hub of Wishes - At the Hub of Wishes, you can become part of a vital and rewarding community, where you are supported and given access to a range of facilities tailored to your 'wishes'. Offering support/advice to people suffering from a number of issues.

Junction 7 - Junction 7 is supported by County Durham Tees Valley Rescue Mission. They offer an emergency food service, a school uniform project and one to one advice and sign posting.

Living - Their mission is 'providing great homes, sustaining strong communities and building a successful business.' They recognise that to make communities vibrant places to live, they must do more than just letting and repairing homes.

Durham County Council's private landlords department - DCC's private sector housing team can offer a wide range of advice and guidance; in particular around helping residents access private rented accommodation, advice on: tenancy sustainment; disrepair and landlord/tenant disputes; as well as any issues around empty properties.

County Durham and Darlington Fire and Rescue Service - They will be providing home fire safety advice.

Bloodwise - A charity fundraiser topped up his totaliser this week thanks to a Christmas wine draw which brought in £800.

Newtonian Paul McGeary has spearheaded a campaign which has so far seen over £35,000 raised since he was initially diagnosed with Leukaemia in 2014. Paul's mother, Mary Warke, along with her friends Marie and Dave Nicholson have gathered charitable donations and turned them into Christmas hampers, with a grand draw taking place on Thursday evening. In total, 18 prizes were drawn, with the £800 taking the #NotOneInch total to a staggering £36,500.

Next week marks the four-year anniversary of Paul's diagnosis, and although his condition has been in remission for 18 months since a relapse in 2016, the relentless fundraising push has shown no signs of slowing down. Mary said, "I'd like to thank everyone for their donations, interest, purchasing tickets and support throughout the past few weeks. Hopefully the prizes will add to a nice Christmas for everyone."

Paul added, "Thanks to my mother and her friends for their hard work and dedication to this leg of fundraising. £800 is a phenomenal effort at this time of year, and is testament to the support we have had throughout." 
