





Sessions at Greenfield Entrepreneur Take **Big Step Forward**



Process (CPI) Innovation has supported an entrepreneur's vision to help runners find the most appropriate type of footwear.

CPI worked with Craig Downs on mymo, a wearable sock which uses artificial intelligence to gauge an athlete's gait. By embedding electronics into the sock, Mr Downs' company, company, Shoes2Run, can measure how feet perform during a short walk, jog or run. Data gathered from the product is then sent to a smartphone app, via the Internet of app, via the Internet of Things, with the information used to direct athletes to the most suitable footwear on the market, minimising their risk of injury. The information can also be shared with physiotherapists

CPI supported Mr Downs by designing and implementing electronics to log sensor measurements, as well as adding wireless integration into a smartphone app and offline tool for algorithm development. The project builds on CPI's strong track record in artificial intelligence through printed electronics and represents another example of its work across the Internet of Things, which connects devices via the web and allows them to send and receive data.

I has created rolls thin, flexible inlays CPI of containing multiple electronic components. These can be converted into labels or embedded into smart products, such as pharmaceutical packaging capable of monitoring a drug's condition. This drug's condition.

Mr Downs, whose company is based in Washington, Wearside, received further support from the North-East Business and Innovation Centre's (BIC) SME Innovation Programme, with Northumbria University working on an artificial intelligence algorithm for his product. Work Begins to Transform Historic Building in Heritage Action Zone

one of County Durham's oldest buildings into a new, learning space.

The West Mural Tower, in the grounds of Auckland Castle, Bishop Auckland, dates back to at least the 15th century and was built as a defensive gatehouse guarding the original, main entrance to the Castle when it was home to the Prince Bishops of Durham. Now, the Grade I listed

building is being rescued from decades of deterioration and decay as part of The Auckland Project visitor destination, with support from Historic England's local Heritage Action Zone (HAZ) scheme.

David Ronn, Manager at The Auckland Project, said: "The West Mural Tower has been through many incarnations in its 500 year history, including as a gatehouse for access to Auckland Castle and a cottage for those taking care of the Deer Park.

"It has fallen into disrepair over the last century but we've been working hard with Historic England and



County in the past year to make the building safe. We are now forward to giving looking it a totally new lease of life and making it functional for

people to use and enjoy."
The transformation of West Mural Tower is being funded primarily by The Auckland Project, with a £50,000 grant from Historic England as part of the Bishop Auckland Heritage Action Zone scheme and £5,000 from the Architectural Heritage Fund. Bishop Auckland is one of 18 locations across the UK to have been granted Heritage Action Zone Heritage status and will benefit from

a five-year programme designed to reinvigorate its historic Market Place, high streets and other parts of the conservation area. It is being delivered by Bishop Auckland Heritage Action partnership with Durham County Council and the Brighter Bishop Auckland Regeneration

Partnership.
Work to bring the West Mural Tower back into use will include stabilising the existing building, removing and then rebuilding some of the walls using original stone, and reinstating the medieval roof using green oak and other traditional materials. The original first with the installation of windows and basic services as heating electricity to make it fit for the present day.

Auckland Project has appointed experienced, family-run, Tyne Valley company, Heritage Consolidation Ltd, to carry out the work, with designs by Hexham-based Doonan Architects, which specialises in working with historic buildings and conservation projects.

It is expected to take around six months to complete, with the room in use from spring/ summer 2019.

Three volunteers have also been recruited to follow the progress of West Mural Tower and get hands on with the work wherever possible, assisting with activities such as pointing and galleting using smaller pieces of stone or slate to help block up large gaps between building

The new space will be used by The Auckland Project's Engagement provide a variety of learning opportunities for small groups and families.

Durham County Council's Cabinet Member regeneration, economic said: "Our young people are the business people of tomorrow so it's great that this competition gets them thinking about enterprise.

We hope they take a lot from the experience of working with big names from the private sector and we're really looking forward to seeing the fruits of their creativity."

Over the next eight months, around 180 pupils will attend a series of specially designed workshops and work with their mentors to develop a business idea, create a prototype and understand how to market and finance their product or service.

Pupils will present their finished concept to the iudges and winners will be announced at an awards ceremony in June next year. FBM has helped develop the business acumen and creative flair of hundreds of secondary school children since it was first established in 2005.

The winner of last year's competition was St John's School and Sixth Form College, in Bishop Auckland, who created Generation Jigsaw, a product aimed at connecting generations and encouraging conversations in a world saturated by technology. Following the competition, the team is continuing to further develop their product with a view to taking it to market.

firm's family-run vehicles each cover around 95,000 miles a year, totalling 4.3 million miles covering the length and breadth of the UK. To maintain efficiency, as well as safety for drivers, Stiller's latest trucks are powered by second-generation Euro 6 engines and come fully-equipped with the latest safety features, including radar emergency stop-assist which senses oncoming traffic and automatically brakes.

All vehicles also have a recording accident camera set-up fitted along with fixed vehicle phones and GPS trackers, while specially-made full-width vehicle 'catwalks' have also been

installed, which provide a safer working environment for the drivers when they're hitching up their trailers.
