A passionate young team who are spearheading the recently relaunched Huntsman Pub and Kitchen Woodham Village, Newton Aycliffe, are doing all they can to extend a warm welcome, good food and even a 'Golden Ticket' surprise this Christmas.



Owner Elliot McKee (24) and Head Chef Nathanial Tomlinson (29) supported by Front of House Supervisor Nadia Abed-Ali are pulling out all the stops to get the Restaurant / Pub on the local culinary map. After years of being avoided or overlooked by

local residents, the team took over the pub in the summer following a facelift of the building, its gardens and the establishing of a new professional kitchen. Since then they have been steadily wowing customers by delivering a blend of exceptional home cooked food combined with a vibrant modern decor and fantastic hospitality which has seen the business go from strength to strength. Elliot said: "We get people coming in who say they haven't been here for 10 years or more, and even a couple who said that they didn't dare venture in before. The response of everyone is overwhelmingly positive." Certainly, the first months

have seen the team breaking down the barriers that once stopped the local residents wanting to use the Huntsman and have created a loyal group of customers coming back week after week. Building on the teams plans to grow their customer experience is a novel promotion this Christmas. Elliot explains: "All guests dining with us over the Christmas period are given a 'Golden Envelope', which when presented unopened at a booking in January will award them with a discount of 25, 50 or 100% off the

meal price." Elliot is following in the family tradition of owning and managing pubs/hotels. Originally started by his father, his sister and brother who also own pubs in the region. But Elliot is no stranger to the trade, started helping his father, who then owned the Croft Hotel near Darlington, when he was only 13. He said: "I started at the bottom working in the kitchen first as a pot washer then progressing through to chef and then

front-of-house hospitality." In a similar vein, son of Shildon Vicar David Tomlinson, Nathanial is equally experienced having been a chef at Bannatyne Hotel in Darlington and later head chef at the Honest Lawyer in Durham. He said: "I'm all about using the best ingredients, sourced locally presenting people

with good food and decent portions.

I have worked in rosette kitchens, but here we are more interested in good honest food, at a good price, designed to wow our customers and keep them coming back for more. One customer loved our Christmas menu so much he asked if we could prepare the Spicy Parsnip Soup for his home Christmas Dinner and another asked if we could do their Turkey; we are happy to oblige."

Front of house Supervisor Nadia, who previously worked at Woodham Golf and Country Club, said: "We just want people to come and give us a try, we know they won't be disappointed.'

most schools and colleges break-up this week it's important for students to use this time wisely if they still haven't applied to university - the deadline is 15th January for starting in 2019.

Studying a degree is a significant commitment and it's a big decision, make sure you get as much information as possible over this Christmas break to help you make the right decision. Applying to university can be daunting, and if you've put it off and put it off you're really going to have to get your skates-on – so what can you realistically do during this Christmas

break? We asked Dr Lisette Johnston, Head of School at ScreenSpace, part of the MetFilm school to give us

some top tips...

1. Research your subject. Who provides the course that will best suit you? For example, there is a difference between Film Studies and a Film Production, so you need to do your homework. league tables give some idea, but also look at uni websites Most courses give a module overview to give a sense of what topics you'll cover across the degree. Are there similarities or differences in the courses you like?

2. Research your university. Just because a university offers your degree subject and ranks well doesn't mean it's a 'shoo in'. Reach out to current students via social media and forums
– ask them about their experience at the university, try TheStudentRoom. com, groups on Facebook also check-out the university's Instagram account – get a feel for what people are responding to.

If you haven't already, as soon as you can book on an Open Day – you're probably going to have to apply whether you've visited the uni or not at this late stage, but before you accept an offer, try to get to the campus remember you will spend three or four years there, and may have to move from home, so you want to make sure you will be happy.

· Checkout what the student union is like.

- · Do they have clubs and societies you are interested
- How easy is it to get to
- Are you on a campus or in a city?

Knowing these things will make it easier to make a decision when the offers start coming in.

- course options with year in industry?
- · Also look at employability rates for the university as a whole and your field of study. At my institution, 87% of our students are working within the creative industries within six months of graduating. This is very different to saying a high





I love being with people at me give vou some examples. I have always loved a school

nativity or carol event; there tends to be such delight and pride in performing touched vith real recognition that the birth of this baby, so long ago, is truly special for us all. Each year I try and get to at one community lunch to celebrate the season with people of all ages. These are always enormous fun; the joy of being with others, enjoying food and drink, wearing party hats and enjoying a good sing all make them incredibly worthwhile. Then every Christmas morning I join the residents of Durham Prison for their Christmas morning worship. Prison is not where anyone really wants to be on Christmas Day but this service offers time to be together, and to think for a short while just what Christmas is all about at its heart. The singing is always robust, if not always deeply tuneful. I simply love being with people at Christmas. Then there is the particular love of being with family. This becomes ever more complex as they grow up, marry and have to join with different bits of family but somehow we always manage to be with each other for some time; it is a delight. We all know that this is not the case for everyone; many people find themselves alone, not with anyone, on Christmas Day, and often other days around it. The TV and the radio become important companions many; radio phone ins offer companionship and comfort. Churches (and other community organisations) arrange Christmas Day arrange Christmas Day lunches to offer people the chance not to be alone at least for a few hours at this festive season. There is a genuine desire around that for all who want to be with others opportunities to do so are und. I applaud and salute all who work hard to make such events happen - and go with such great joy.

This remains the wonder of Christmas for me. This is not simply a delightful story to retell in imaginative ways every year in a Nativity play. This is not simply a festival in which to enjoy lots of good food and drink in the company of others. This is the time to remember that God is with us. So often we do not recognise God's loving presence in our lives. God gives us breath and life. God is alongside us in our loneliness as the friend above all other friends. God is with us in our deepest sorrows and troubles, through the kindness of others; through the inner strength

discover. God is with us. This Christmas, however we celebrate it, may we all have others to be with at least for some while. Let us be good friends, neighbours, community members and family members to and for one another. Let us be with one another. As we do so may we all rejoice that in Jesus God is with us - not just at Christmas but every day of the year.

in a café off the motorway. somewhere near Sheffield, Jane, her husband Ken and her son James had a long journey and the baby had had enough of his car chair. James was ten months, plump and pink and cute, noisy and loved to make friends. They got some food, but James more interested in making friends, as babies do. To Jane's horror James was shouting and waving at an elderly gentleman of the road, shall we say. His coat was held together by threads, he hadn't seen a bath in a long, long time, he was grimy and smelly. But that didn't bother James! Peek a boo! Nursery rhymes, handclapping all from the elderly man all served to cement the friendship between little James and his friend. Jane and Ken were horrified and decided to leave as soon as possible. Ken went to pay while Jane made a quick get away from this smellv intruder of their nice family trip. Some people came in with a pushchair, her way was blocked, she had to pass by the elderly man. Arms held a loft in a "Pick me up" gesture James launched himself at the elderly man as the mans eyes met Jane's with a plea of "is it alright?" A very old man and a young baby cemented their love of one another in the warmest closest hug. James laid his little head upon the man's ragged shoulder. He closed his eyes and Jane saw tears hover beneath his lower lashes. His aged hands, full of grime and pain cradled the baby's bottom and gently stroked his back.

A friend of mine, Jane, was The old man rocked, then firmly peeled James away from him and giving Jane eye contact handed him back with the words. 'You look after this baby. When you look at the manger this Christmas, don't see a cooing baby there, but a love determined to be satisfied, a baby passionate about being with us and in relationship with us - and that is why we celebrate Christmas.


