Communities Working Together For a Safer Town



The end of one year and the start of a new year is always a good time to take stock of what has been achieved, and what more needs to be done. A project started 18 months ago at Woodham Community Centre saw the very first 24 hour public access Defibrillator installed in Newton Aycliffe. Local County Councillors via Great Aycliffe and Middridge Area Action Partnership funds have, with other partners, and very generous public support, enabled us to successfully extend this project. Public response to awareness of what, why and how vital

these units can be, has been tremendous. Local Companies have helped with the donation of portable units to groups, and installations. The chain of 24 hour public access units has recently been increased to 8 with units fitted in the Navy Club, and Neville Community Centre in the last few days. We are organising an official opening on Friday 11th Jan to thank all those involved, County Councillor's, GAMP, Navy Club staff and members, including Dorothy Bowman's ladies' group. Neville Community Residents and Committee, but especially the Taylor family of Rachel, Trevor, son Calum and his partner Andrea. They are raising and have donated substantial funds in memory of their daughter Seonaid Taylor-Hill. Future fundraising via "Kick it for Seonaid" events are being planned. A program of free CPR and defibrillator awareness training, originally planning to train 250 people, has now reached 300 with Eddy Young from the Navy Club being the latest. Last year, together with Newton News, we produced a map of the location of all units both 24 hour and limited access. We have updated this and would ask

any groups or organisations who are not shown and who would like to be included in future updates to contact us. **Special thanks to Newton News who have reproduced the map in this weeks edition, centre pages, for residents to keep as a record.** Looking forward the Taylors and myself want to encourage other areas and groups to continue expanding the potential life saving coverage of more units especially 24 hour public access. We have already committed to working with St Mary's Church and school with substantial support already agreed from "The Friends of St Mary's". The aim would be 24 hour public access defibrillators within a 500 metre radius of all residents of the Town, Aycliffe Village, and School Aycliffe. Some preliminary talks have taken place and we would like to progress these further. Please contact if interested in learning more (see below). Further free CPR and defibrillator awareness training is being arranged by GAMP support from all 7 of our County Councillor's which we hope to have confirmed shortly. POLICE VOLUNTEERS CRACKDOWN ON ROAD SAFETY

Magnificent Seven Hours



50 vehicles were stopped and checked by volunteer police officers during a day of action.

The operation – the second outing of ‘Operation Basingstoke’ – resulted in multiple vehicles being taken off the roads, and drivers reported for various offences. Throughout the day, two roadside checkpoints were operated on the A689, manned by officers from Durham and Cleveland Special Constabularies. Assisted by Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras, officers targeted untaxed, uninsured and unregistered vehicles, as well as suspected drink and drug drivers and non-roadworthy vehicles.

3 vehicles were seized, as well as 11 VDRS issued for vehicle defects, 5 fixed penalty notices issued and 1 driver reported for multiple offences. 3 drivers were also issued FPN for not wearing a seatbelt.

Special Chief Inspector Ruddock of Cleveland Police, who led the operation, said: “This kind of work is key to improving safety for everyone that uses our busy road network.

“It provides an opportunity for volunteers to work together to enforce laws, educate motorists and support our regular colleagues.”

AS/Sgt Tweddell, of Cleveland & Durham Specialist Operations Unit, said: “The A689 is often used by travelling criminals, so these checkpoints allow us to intercept suspects moving between force areas.

“In particular, we’ve focussed on the ‘fatal four’ offences, which are the leading causes of death and injury on UK roads.” The ‘fatal four’ are speeding, drink/driving, not wearing seatbelts, and distracted driving (e.g. mobile phones, loud music).

One notable offence was a dangerously worn set of tyres, fitted to an uninsured and untaxed vehicle carrying two unsecured children.

Reminder for Parents to Apply for Primary School Places

Parents in County Durham are being reminded they are running out of time to apply for primary school places for their children.

The deadline for applications for the next academic year, which starts in September 2019, is Tuesday 15 January 2019.

In order for a child to be eligible to start school in September 2019, the child's birthday must fall between 1 September 2014 and 31 August 2015.

Cllr Olwyn Gunn, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for children and young people's services, said: “In our county we benefit from many schools with superb facilities and dedicated staff, and we hope that, through our admissions arrangements, parents can express their preferences and see their children enjoy a happy and successful education.

“We know that the decision of where to send your child

is a major one, and can be difficult, but we would urge parents to make sure they apply by the deadline.

“A late application greatly reduces your chances of getting into your preferred school.”

Applications can be made online at www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions or by post. If posting, the forms should be sent back using signed for or special delivery services.

Application forms can also be requested by phoning 03000 265896 or by writing to the school places and admissions team at Durham County Council, County Hall, Durham, DH1 5UJ.

Offers of places will be made to parents on 16 April 2019. For applications completed online, offers will be received by email. For applications sent by post, offers will be received by letter. These should arrive by no later than Thursday 18th April 2019.

PCP EMBARKS ON A YEAR OF WELLBEING EVENTS FOR ALL

Speaking about the year ahead, Carol Gaskarth, Chief Exec said. "We plan to raise the funds by creating lots of events that encourage people to take part and by doing so improve their own wellbeing, health and fitness. We have so much planned that we have created a calendar of events for all ages and abilities, and, all have health and wellbeing at their core, some events will have the opportunity to raise sponsorship, others will

simply request a donation, everyone is welcome to get involved".

County Outperforms in Primary School Performance Tables

Primary schools in County Durham are performing above the national average in almost all areas.

The Government's annual primary school performance tables, published recently, show 68 per cent of primary pupils in County Durham are meeting the expected standard, compared to 64 per cent across England as a whole.

County Durham children are also outperforming when it comes to their progress in reading, writing and maths, with their average reading and maths scores either meeting or surpassing the national figure.

The percentage of primary school pupils achieving at a higher standard is 11 per cent, which is also higher than the national average of ten per cent.

Cllr Olwyn Gunn, Cabinet member for children and young people's services, said: "In County Durham, we are committed to providing our children with the very best education and start in life."

Praise for 'Proactive' Finley Structures

Newton Aycliffe steel firm Finley Structures has won praise from a main contractor as it continues to work on a high-profile North-East sports development.

Construction firm Galliford Try awarded family-run Finley Structures a contract

to fabricate and erect 640 tonnes of steel for Durham University's expansion of its sports facilities.

Work started earlier this year on the £31m development at Maiden Castle, on the outskirts of Durham city.

The facility, once completed, will include an indoor cricket hall, a 12 court multi-use sports hall, suitable for international and national competitions, a martial arts dojo, fitness suite, purpose-built recovery facilities and high-performance weights rooms.

Once the new facility is ready in August 2019, the existing centre will be refurbished, increasing the facilities for fitness classes and building a specialist sports laboratory.

A ground-breaking ceremony was held in August as Finley Structures started work on fabricating the steel, which has now been erected on site.

Galliford Try senior projects manager Paul Mares said: "Finley Structures have been involved with the Maiden Castle project from our initial bid, assisting the erection sequence and value engineering,

ensuring both Galliford Try and our client have a robust price and programme. Throughout the design stage both Finley Structures and their design team have been proactive in managing the process to ensure they arrived on site as planned.

Once on site the team have been a pleasure to work with, the frame and metal decking packages have been erected safely, to programme by a team who have identified any potential issues in advance and

worked with the wider team to resolve ensuring no delays have been incurred. This has not only been noticed by Galliford Try, but also our client who has commented on the speed of erection. I look forward to working with the team again."

The Maiden Castle development is the second major project to be awarded from Galliford Try this year, with Finley Structures also currently working on a 930-tonne contract at the CTAR Building in Leeds.



BISHOP OF JARROW DESIGNATE - ANNOUNCED

The new Bishop of Jarrow Designate was announced recently. The announcement made by Downing Street this morning confirms that the next Bishop of Jarrow Designate is The Venerable Canon Sarah Clark.

Currently Archdeacon of Nottingham, in the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham. Sarah (53) was licensed to her current post in October 2014, having previously held several appointments in the Diocese since her ordination at Southwell Minister in 1998.

Prior to training for ordination, Sarah was a career Civil Servant in the Department for Employment having been through their graduate training program in the West Midlands where she went on to hold a range of management roles. She gained an MBA in 1994 and her MA in Theology in 1997. Sarah is from an ex-mining community in the South Wales Valleys, something that she hopes gives her a great affinity for the people and places in the Diocese of Durham. She commented: "I grew up in South Wales in the '70s and early '80s, and I was the first generation to go to university, which is why I left. My grandfathers were miners and so was my father in his 20's until he went to work for ICI. My parents still live in the same house I grew up in, in the same community that my father went on to represent as a local Councillor.

"I was taught the importance



of giving to your community and looking out for those who were struggling long before I came to faith in Jesus Christ. When I was growing up, open cast mining had been finished for some years, but as usual the slag heaps, or the waste as we called it, remained. It's all grown over now with its own beauty and I was strongly reminded of home (except for the sea!) when I recently visited Easington pit top."

Talking of the further parallels between her current role and the challenges she will face here in the Diocese of Durham, Sarah said: "In my current role, I have had responsibility for the development of 25 of our larger local churches across the whole Diocese to be resourcing churches who grow with the aim of giving themselves away through planting new worshipping communities and helping to resource the renewal of existing churches. All this we do as we seek to serve our

communities and welcome new disciples of Jesus into our Christian family.

"I am very much looking forward to using those experiences in my new role and in helping the Diocese of Durham in its vision to 'Bless our communities in Jesus' name for the transformation of us all. That resonates so strongly with me and I will work and be witness to that vision in all I am and all I do as Bishop of Jarrow.

Commenting on the announcement, The Rt Revd Paul Butler, Bishop of Durham said: "I am delighted that the Queen has confirmed the appointment of Sarah as the next Bishop of Jarrow Designate.

"I had the pleasure of working with Sarah whilst I was Bishop of Southwell and Nottingham and I know that she will be a great advocate for the communities of our diocese, bringing with her a tremendous set of skills and experiences that will help a

colleague in Durham who

advised me that if I wasn't coming to join in fanning the flames of hope and life in the Diocese not to bother coming at all!

"Jesus Christ's resurrection means that new life and new hope are always possible for every person and every community. I have experienced this in my own life and in communities I have served in. Being a Christian has changed my life and knowing that what I do can make a lasting difference in our communities is central to my ministry."

The Archbishop of York, Dr John Sentamu said: "I am most grateful to Her Majesty The Queen for her approval of the Venerable Sarah Clark as the new Bishop of Jarrow. We warmly welcome Sarah to the North East. Sarah is deeply committed to serving local communities, serving local people and will be sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with all whom she encounters".

Sarah added: "I am most looking forward to getting to know the different communities and churches across such a diverse Diocese full of character and with such a rich spiritual heritage. I walked Cuthberts Way as a pilgrim for my sabbatical in 2014 and deeply appreciate that heritage as a vital part of the renewal of faith in the North East."

Sarah says she is delighted to be part of the continuing renewal of the ministry of the Diocese of Durham and joining those that are strong advocates of the North East. Adding: "As part of my preparation for being interviewed I spoke with a

colleague in Durham who advised me that if I wasn't coming to join in fanning the flames of hope and life in the Diocese not to bother coming at all!

"Jesus Christ's resurrection means that new life and new hope are always possible for every person and every community. I have experienced this in my own life and in communities I have served in. Durham Town Hall to Open to the Public

An historic building which has been at the heart of life in Durham City for more than six centuries is opening its doors to the public.

Durham Town Hall is now offering people the chance to discover its rich and fascinating history every Saturday with no admission charge.

Audio guides, interactive information points and short films have been introduced to help visitors find out more about the stunning building situated in the city's Market Place.

Cllr Ossie Johnson, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for tourism, culture, leisure and rural issues, said: "The town hall is one of County Durham's oldest and most historic buildings. It's a very beautiful building both inside and out and it also has some thoroughly fascinating stories to tell.

"Visitors will not only get the chance to take a look around but, thanks to new facilities such as interpretation panels and audio guides, they can find out more about the history not just of the town hall but also the city of Durham.

"I'm sure many people pass the building on a daily basis but have never taken a look inside but now they have the opportunity to do just that." Visitors will learn about the powerful Prince Bishops who ruled the county from the

11th century, the evolution of local government and how the town hall developed from the first timber structure of 1356 to the building it is today.

They will also find out about the role of the Mayor and the Mayor's Bodyguard, who have been based at the site since 1602, and the ancient trade guilds and freemen of the city, who for centuries held political and economic power in the city and who continue to meet in the building's Guildhall.

New displays also tell the story of colourful local characters such as Joseph Boruwlaski, a 3ft 3in tall 18th Century celebrity known as the Little Count. Born in Poland in 1739, Boruwlaski spent his life performing at the Grandest Royal Courts of Europe, before retiring to Durham where he eventually passed away at the age of 98.

There are also two specially made short films. One details the town hall's history as a courtroom and the often grizzly nature of crime and punishment in the 1800s. The other is a short documentary by local amateur filmmakers Hill Valley Creative and featuring the music of the local band the Whisky Priests.

Future of School Funding in County Durham

Councillors are considering the funding available for County Durham's schools as they decide how the government's new national funding formula will be implemented.

Following consultation, Durham County Council's Cabinet is being asked next week to consider the options for implementing the national funding formula for schools in the county, as part of the government's planned roll out of a national approach to determining school funding.

Cabinet is being recommended to continue to transition to the new formula - with full implementation from 2021/22 when it meets on Wednesday, 12 December.

Councillors will hear of a significant shortfall in government funding for pupils' with special educational needs at a time when demand for special needs provision has increased massively, resulting in a projected deficit in 2019/20 of over £5 million in high needs funding.

After listening to schools and the significant pressure they are under, proposals are being considered to meet the shortfall, on a one-off basis, from the council's own reserves for 2019/20, together with an application to the Secretary of State for Education for a 0.5 per cent top-slice from general

schools funding.

Cllr Olwyn Gunn, Cabinet member for children and young people's services, said: "Our schools and the local authority really are between a rock and a hard place. We have a government that is taking away our ability to meet local needs by forcing us to move to a national funding formula whilst at the same time starving our schools of the funding they need."

"If our schools had received increases in funding in line with inflation, they would have received over £40 million more funding than they have at present. Just imagine what could have been done with those much needed resources."

"The position with the high needs budget is simply not sustainable and has to be addressed by government. I have written to the minister to raise the issue and can only hope they do the right thing and provide much needed funding to support pupils with special educational needs."

"We absolutely understand the pressure our schools are under which is why we have agreed to use some of the council's reserves in 2019/20 on a one-off basis to lessen the impact on them whilst we consider our options going forward."

Cllr Alan Napier, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for finance, said: "Funding for our schools

continues to be cut in real terms by this government. The pressures in high needs are huge and are being experienced by local authorities up and down the country.

"Government must recognise that if they do not provide more high needs funding we are simply storing up problems for the future which will cost more to resolve in the long run. Using council reserves to fund education spending is not a sustainable position and whilst we are looking to agree this one off support for 2019/20, we need a longer term solution from government."

SLOW TO 20 SUCCESS



Councillors received an update on a successful scheme to reduce speed limits outside of schools recently.

Durham County Council received funding from Public Health to introduce 66 20mph limit zones near schools across the county. The Slow to 20 for Safer Streets project is now in its final year and when the council's Cabinet met on Wednesday, 14 November, members heard that 52 of the schemes have been completed.

By the time this part of the project comes to an end, 74 schools will have benefited, as some schools share sites or are in close proximity to each other.

This is in addition to 30 schemes that have been completed thanks to funding from local members' neighbourhood budgets and individual schools. A further eight schemes are now in development and more could follow if funding is secured from councillors' neighbourhood budgets, Area Action Partnerships, town and parish councils or schools.

The information on 20mph zones is part of an updated Speed Management Strategy, which the council has developed in partnership with Durham Constabulary. The strategy provides a framework for setting appropriate speed limits and addressing speeding problems across County Durham. It is based on current Government

legislation, guidance and best practice, and considers a range of issues and approaches to ensuring County Durham's road are safe for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians.

This includes a comprehensive education and awareness programme delivered through the County Durham and Darlington Road Safety Partnership and Durham Constabulary's Community Speed Watch initiative.

Councillors will be asked to note the updated strategy and approve plans for a six week-public consultation on the document.

Councillor Brian Stephens, Cabinet member for neighbourhoods and local partnerships, said: "It is fantastic to see 20mph limits being introduced outside of the schools where they are needed most.

"This not only improves road safety but it encourages people to walk and cycle, which has wider health and environmental benefits.

"The Speed Management Strategy demonstrates our commitment to working with the police to improve road safety across the whole of the county.

"Education is a key part of this. If we can make drivers understand the potentially lethal consequences of speeding they are far more likely to slow down."

Partnership Secures Radiology Service



Patients requiring x-rays and other scans are set to benefit from a new agreement between County Durham & Darlington NHS Foundation Trust and technology company, Philips.

The contract which came into effect in October, means Philips will be responsible for ensuring radiology equipment across all of the Trust's hospital sites is well-maintained and replaced regularly so that patients benefit from some of the latest technology in the region.

Commenting, Rob Goddard, associate director of governance, clinical specialist services care group, said, "Radiology equipment is increasingly used to diagnose and help determine treatment plans for a wide range of conditions. Our contract with Philips covers x-ray, CT, ultrasound, mammography and nuclear medicine which uses small amounts of radioactive material to diagnose and determine the severity of conditions including cancer and heart disease. The contract will also cover the specialist radiology equipment used in cardiology.

"Modern diagnostics can replace the need for invasive procedures, for example, there are occasions when a CT scan can replace a colonoscopy. We're providing an additional CT scanner at University Hospital of North Durham to ensure a prompt diagnosis for patients attending as emergencies, with a suspected stroke or in other potentially life-threatening situations. "Radiology plays an increasingly essential role

in ensuring our patients are diagnosed and treated quickly, with minimal intervention. As a result, much of our equipment is used up to 12 hours a day, six days a week, which increases the risk of wear and tear. This contract includes a dedicated engineer based in the Trust who will address any issues immediately, minimising the chances of disruption for our patients. An on-site operations manager will oversee the renewal programme covering over 120 items of equipment, all of which will be replaced at least once during the 14 year contract, with some items planned to be updated twice or even three times.

"This coordinated approach to both purchase and maintenance will be very cost-effective avoiding, for example, the need to go through procurement processes each time a piece of equipment is replaced. "We're finding that the opportunity to work with this very modern equipment is also attracting highly qualified and talented radiology staff and we anticipate this will continue as we replace other equipment." Newly appointed operations manager, John Carmichael, said, "This is an exciting opportunity for Philips to work as part of the Trust's team to ensure they have the most appropriate equipment, regardless of whether Philips is the manufacturer. We're also working with the Trust, re-designing some changing facilities and other patient areas, within our radiology departments, to provide the best possible patient experience and maintain their privacy and dignity."
