Once again we are in the hands of Mother Nature – at the time of writing the weather for Saturday looks uncertain with Sunday brightening up slightly ... so best bring your umbrella, just in case (poncho's available to buy)!

This weekend Aycliffe Radio presents a 'Two Day Open Air Live Music Festival' in Newton Aycliffe Town Centre mall. The event is free to attend thanks to grants from Aycliffe Town Centre Management and Great Aycliffe Town Council and will include a selection of local performers all giving their time to entertain.

Local artistes who are giving their time include Becky Sawyer, Darren Kent, Whiskey Haze, Harris Tweed Mystery Machine, Amy Stevens, Hollywood Boredom, Anthony Fish, Call of the Wild, Copper Beach, Four Letter Word, Chris Mardula; as well as Dua Lipa and Shania Twain tributes. Impact of Development on a Historic, Rural Village

Dear Sir,

If anyone wants to see the devastating impact of 'development', in my opinion they need look no further than Heighington Village, previously voted Britains perfect village by the BBC in 2006, and a location that one would assume is subject to appropriate planning protections.

The village is feeling the impact of two – currently, massive residential developments, on previous farmland lined by hedgerows, trees and woodland; One on Beech Crescent and one on Walworth Road that are making the location, whilst still charming, at its heart, feel more small town like by the day.

The developers, I refer to Esh in this article on Beech Crescent, appear to have adopted an approach of nibbling away at the remaining trees, until at present just a few large beech trunks remain, largely stripped of their branches and roots and looking like giant drinking staws. The priority for the developer, clearly being to display the surprisingly densely packed houses for sale to the passing cars with a token acknowledgement of what was once a rural setting.

What remains of the hedgerow will, I imagine, be easy to maintain by the local authority with their policy of liberal herbicide use in the village.

The impact on the wildlife is still visible if you look. A few tattered feathers that



mark what was once an owl, another a blackbird. The kestrels nesting near the corner are long gone. The small remnants of a hare, feather and moss nest, is tangled into some building insulation in the verge. Adjacent to the development on Heighington Lane, a field that was one of the

precious few, previously open for recreational use is ominously fenced off with wire fencing and displays a private property keep out sign, forcing walkers to attempt a crossing of the dangerously busy A6072 on a bend.

Conservation feels very out of fashion at the moment, but does no one have any regard for the loss of the greenery and amenity space which is essential for our well being and ultimately the survival not only of our native plants and animals but also people who need to breath clean air and eat uncontaminated food. Playground in the Eade Close Neighbourhood

Dear Sir,

In reply to Mr R Liddle's letter in the Newton News on the 24th May, I would like to make the following points:

- The playground was designed as an integral part of the area design and development.

- The maintenance of the playground was initially undertaken by Sedgfield District Council and later transferred to Durham County Council in 2009.

- Since 2009, the playground became run down and was littered with broken glass and rubbish. The apparatus was unsafe and needed to be removed.

- Local Town and County Councillors requested the Town Council to engage in a joint funding operation to restore the playground and make it into an attractive area for children to play.

- The Town Council agreed to the proposal and the playground has recently been refurbished to a high standard, at a total cost of £150,000.

- The Town Council is proud to provide 9 parks and 4 further large play areas. The equipment is of high quality and maintained

regularly. Our Park Patrol Operatives tour the parks and play areas and liaise with the police in order to reduce anti-social behaviour.

I have waited until now before replying to Mr Liddle's letter as he urged other residents in the area to object to the development in writing to the Town Council. To date, we have only received one letter and definitely no complaint from the Rose Lodge Care Home.

Finally, before I am accused of the playground not being close to my home, I must confess that I enjoy the sound of children playing. For a number of years I lived in Fenhall Green. This was an end of terrace house with a gable end. Next to the gable end was a children's play area and the gable end had a goalpost and cricket wickets chalked on it. Yes, the children could be heard enjoying themselves and there was some banging on the walls, but my late wife and I never complained.

As I write, the Town Council has no plans to remove or relocate the playground. Cllr Bob Fleming

Pupils Visit Hartlepool Power Station

Woodham Academy year 10 engineering students recently paid a visit to Hartlepool Nuclear Power Station. Students participated in this trip to discover where the energy in our homes comes from and the impact that making energy has upon our environment. As part of the visit students learnt about how nuclear energy is created and got to see the turbines in action creating electricity for our homes and finding out about the strict safety procedures that are in place for sites to keep all workers safe.

Students also got to see the challenges both male and female engineers have to face working in a nuclear power station, for example working as part of the site fire crew and servicing the stand by generators powered by Rolls Royce jet engines.

Site visits are an integral part of Woodham Academy's engineering course. Not only do they allow students to see how theory is put into practice, they also let students see first-hand, the range of employment opportunities available to them in the future.

Games which are being held in the town.

Maureen Kesteven, NGS regional chairperson, commented: "This project comes from the strong links that have been forged between, and in fact the friendships developed in, the North East of England and West Sweden. It could not have happened without the costs being covered by our sponsors, both local and Swedish businesses. We hope it will prove to be an attraction for tourists to the North East; a place for Swedes and others to bring their families and friends; raise the profile of the National Garden Scheme; as well as being an asset for the local community."

Terry Burke, VP & CFO Husqvarna Division, added: "Being a Swedish company and with our connection to gardens, Husqvarna is proud to be supporting this initiative which will give back to the local community of Gateshead and celebrate the link between Western Sweden and the North East. The signs at the town centre car park state "6 week closure", but it must be over 6 months by now?

What many of us don't understand is why the staircases and ramps are also closed off since we don't always need to use the lifts?

On many occasions no work has been undertaken, although the signs remain, so it's not surprising that the footfall has reduced and people have now gone elsewhere to shop without the problem of non-access to shops from a car park.

Response from Town Centre Management:

Due to ongoing failures on the roof areas, simply because of age, above the lift tower and associated properties it was agreed last year we would address these using best practice to provide suitable replacements.

This was always going to be a lengthy process and, where we could, this has been mitigated to ensure ease of access as best we can provide.

All car parks remained open for use and we still provided 6 entry points mostly level or easily accessible into the centre without requirement of the lifts.

Please note we did not start these works until late January 2019 and most were completed by end of April 2019 with level access to the Town Centre available in May 2019.

To add, we do have a specified Disabled Car Park on Greenwell Road with both stepped and ramped access leading to the Town Centre via Beveridge Arcade leading to the Library and Beveridge Way. Also all of our outlying car parks have disabled spaces on level access direct to the centre.

Kate writes: "Richmond is a 7 year old boy who lives in northern Philippines with his mother and father, and 3 siblings. They are a poor family living in a rural



area with few employment opportunities for his parents. He developed Juvenile Rheumatoid Arthritis at the age of 2 and has battled to access his live-giving treatment ever since. This rare progressive disease damages joints and can also attack internal organs. The drug Richmond needs is a monthly infusion called Actemra (Tocilizumab) which costs around £400, a shocking amount for such a vulnerable family. So far, kind regular donations from friends and family have meant that Richmond has been able to have an infusion every few months - but sporadic treatments have minimal clinical effect. We are trying to raise £1000 to enable his mother Corazon to start her own rice selling business - something that is straightforward and profitable in her town. Corazon's dream is to be able to support some of his medical fees herself and hopefully, together with the monthly donations, we can achieve this. Your support would mean the world to Richmond and his family!" Thank you!

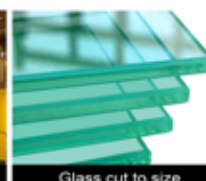

The Salvin family came to Croxdale by the marriage in 1402 of Gerard Salvin from Yorkshire, to Agnes de Rissaby, heiress of Croxdale and the family have remained in the area ever since, with their descendants still living in Croxdale Hall to this day.

In May, Durham County Record Office hosted a lecture by local historian and Honorary Durham University Fellow, Dr Margaret Harvey, on 'Recusancy and Conformity: The Salvins of Croxdale, c.1500-1663.'

Her talk, which explored the history of the family, will now be repeated on Thursday 27 June, 6pm to 7pm at the Record Office in County Hall to allow more people to discover how the Salvins preserved their estate near Sunderland Bridge and what methods they used to survive when many other similar families did not.

Dawn Layland, education and outreach archivist, said: "The session was extremely popular. We don't want anyone to miss out on what was a really fascinating talk, so we are pleased to announce that Dr Harvey will be returning to repeat her lecture this month."

The event is free to attend but donations are welcome on the day.

Proposed Full Dualling of A66 Welcomed

Proposals to fully dual the A66 are being supported by Durham County Council. Highways England is developing plans to dual the remaining single carriageway sections of the road – some 18 miles of the 50 mile route which passes through County Durham.

Included in the £1 billion proposals announced by transport secretary Chris Grayling are improving the road's junction with the A67 at Bowes.

Consultation on the plans is underway with events taking place at Barnard Castle later this month. Cllr Carl Marshall, the council's Cabinet member for economic regeneration, who represents the North East Combined Authority on the Transport for the North board, said: "Good transport links are essential for economic growth as they make regions far more attractive to potential investors."

"Fully dualling the A66 would also improve journeys for residents and open up the county to even more visitors. "While supporting the scheme, we will continue to work with Highways England to ensure the views of residents along the route are heard, particularly with a view to ensuring that the construction of the new carriageway and junction would not unduly impact on our communities."

"The consultation is a great opportunity for people to find out more about what is being proposed and have their say and we would encourage everyone to take part." The A66 links Penrith in Cumbria with Scotch Corner in North Yorkshire.



The plans proposed re-designing and improving the road's junction with the A67 at Bowes to allow full westbound and eastbound entry and exit to and from a 1.9 mile section of newly dualled carriageway. Consultation events are held at The Witham from Wednesday 12 to Saturday 15 June to give people the chance to view the proposals and have their say. These sessions will be open from 11am to 7pm with the exception of 15 June which runs from 10am to 2pm. People can also view and comment on the plans by visiting the Highways England website at <https://highwaysengland.co.uk/projects/a66-northern-trans-pennine/>

We Must All Keep Fighting for Equality

Dear Sir,
I was very saddened and disappointed reading last week's letters page, to see the level of ignorance that still exists around the rights of LGBT+ community.

Although some seem to think the rights of our LGBT+ community currently have materialized out of nowhere, they were in fact, hard won and continue to be fought hard for across the world.

Help us fight against growing in-equality, prejudice and poverty.
