In Memory of Syd Howarth

On Saturday 2nd November. one year after the passing of Syd Howarth MBE, two ceremonies took place commemorate community minded person who lived and breathed Newton Aycliffe.

At 1.00pm Sydney House was officially opened by Mrs Sue Snowdon, Her Majesty's Lord Lieutenant of County Durham.

Sydney House is the new name for the old Newton Press building, which has been refurbished into smaller executive units available for rent for offices or shop units.

Mrs Sue Snowdon then gave a moving speech from her experiences with Syd over the last 20+ years that she has known him, she then unveiled the plaque.

The audience were then invited on a tour of the building to view the rooms available.

Those in attendance then moved round to the Blue Bridge at 2.00pm, where the Rotary Newton Aycliffe had planted an Acer Griseum tree in memory of Syd.

This species of tree was chosen because of its better known name of, "Paper Bark Maple." At present, without leaves, this young tree may appear a little insignificant, but in time it will flourish and the bark will peel, giving the impression of paper.

Rotary President, Jean Thompson, welcomed the congregation and dedicated the tree in memory of Syd Howarth. Rotarian Mike Dixon recited a prayer and Don Walker spoke on behalf of the Howarth family.

Everyone then retired to the Big Člub for refreshments. All the members of the Howarth family are grateful to the Rotary Newton Aycliffe for this wonderful commemoration, they would also like to thank all those who attended the Opening and Dedication ceremonies on Saturday 2nd November,

LOCAL CANCER CHARITY

A Newton Aycliffe cancer survivor is preparing to celebrate her second Christmas in remission with a freshly decorated kitchen, provided by S Nicholson and Sons and the Solan Connor Fawcett Family Trust (Team Solan). Dee Donoghue, 38, was

with diagnosed Acute Mveloid Leukaemia (AML) in January 2017. Following chemotherapy she relapsed 2018. She treatment. in January 2018. She required a different form of chemotherapy, radiotherapy and a stem cell transplant in April 2018, and is currently 'defying the odds,' according to consultants, in her remission.
The former teacher now

volunteers on a regular basis for Team Solan in its charity shop, working closely with founder Mark Solan.

Team Solan was created to help improve the quality of life of those affected by cancer in County Durham. It can help with small grants to purchase equipment, pay for daytrips, or fund visits to spas or beauticians.

Dee said: "It's been incredibly rewarding to work with Mark and his team to help support other people who have been through the same experience as me and to give something back to the community.

"I mentioned to Mark that my kitchen could use a bit of care and attention – I'm the mum of two little girls and two dogs, so it's a nightmare for paw and finger prints - and he put me in touch with Stephen Nicholson, who donates a lot of his time to help improve the lives of cancer survivors by redecorating for them."

S Nicholson and Sons is based in Bishop Auckland and specialises in the renovation of listed and heritage buildings, however he also provides services as part of Team Solan's pledge to improve the lives of people in County Durham. Nicholson. Stephen

managing director of Nicholson and Sons, said: "I got involved with Team Solan a few years ago when my dad was receiving treatment for cancer, and I was blown away by the incredible work it does.



The Pioneering Care Centre has recently opened its doors to a new Memory Garden activity for those suffering with memory problems and Dementia. Maintaining physical activity and social interaction really benefits people living with dementia to help them remain stimulated, feel valued and helpful.

The community garden at PCP is easily accessible and is ran by a large group of workers and volunteers who benefit greatly from plotting, planning, digging and much more. However, the Memory Garden group offers a range of indoor and chair based activities for those less able, to make the sessions easy and fun for all. The fruit and vegetable produce from the garden is used in the centre's Garden Kitchen coffee shop, to make delicious lunchtime specials through the week.

I wont meet anyone or so I thought, So off I go, no phone, no money, no teeth. Put my prescription for the docs in my pocket With my keys and that's the lot.





SOFIA'S STOR

Sofia was born on 27th June 2019 via cesarean. It was noticed, while in the recovery room, that Sofia was jerking her leg. After being checked over, we were told it was just a side effect of low blood sugars.

We stayed in hospital on the transitional ward for 3 nights. During this time, midwives raised their concerns over Sofia's eye rolling. Again, after being checked over by three different pediatricians, we were told she was fine.

few During our first few days at home in Newton Aycliffe, our community midwife also became concerned about Sofia's eye movement. She was also still occasionally jerking her leg so I decided to take Sofia to the hospital to get her checked over. She had a blood test and we were told to video any jerkiness and eye rolling and come back in 4 days.

I managed to capture her jerking, this time it was both of her arms.

We presented the video the Doctors at the Hospital and were told Sofia had Benign Infantile Myoclonus. This is a non serious spasming of the limbs when tired. We were told she would grow out of it in six months time and to keep an eye on it.

Two weeks later, when Sofia was two months old, we noticed that the innocent looking jerks had



turned into something more aggressive. Her entire body would stiffen and her eves would roll at the same time. These appeared in clusters. We took her straight to A&E where she was diagnosed with Epilepsy instead of Benign Infantile Myoclonus

We stayed in hospital and had an MMR and an EEG and were sent home with anti seizure medication.

After another three hospital admissions over the course of five weeks we were eventually transferred to a Children's Hospital to be under the care of a pediatrician neurologist. We stayed here for three weeks.

After more tests including another EEG, ECG, blood

test and a Lumbar Puncture. it was discovered that Sofia actually had an extremely rare disease called Non-Ketotic Hyperglycinemia (NKH for short).

life-NKH is a rare, limiting inherited disease characterised by accumulation of excess glycine in the body.

Affected infants suffer epilepsy and profound delay in development and NKH is often fatal in early childhood. Approximately 1:76000 children get NKH. There is believed to be around 500 children worldwide currently with the condition.

Myself and a team of family and friends are starting our fundraising journey by taking part in the Boxing Day Dip. We will be braving the freezing temperatures of the North Sea to raise money for a charity called Josephs Goal.

This charity raises vital funds for Prof. Nicolas Greene and his team at UCL for their NKH research studies.

More than 1,000 people joined in a day of celebrations at Auckland Castle on Saturday, 2nd November 2019, as the historic site opened its doors for the first time in three years. The 900-year-old Castle, once home to the powerful Prince Bishops of Durham, has reopened following extensive conservation work, led by regeneration charity and visitor

destination, The Auckland Project.

Castle Re-Opening
To commemorate the landmark moment, a sell-out crowd of residents from Bishop Auckland and its surrounding towns and villages enjoyed live music and entertainment at a Googgion themed community collaboration.

a Georgian themed community celebration. A ceremony was also held, with speeches from Jonathan Ruffer, Founder of The Auckland Project and Tiffany Hunt MBE, Chair of the Committee for the North of England at The National Lottery Heritage Fund. Mrs Sue Snowdon, Her Majesty's Lord-Lieutenant of County Durham, also spoke before cutting the ribbon to officially declare the Castle re-

Speaking at the opening, Mr Ruffer said: "The visitor destination is the first visible sign of what we're doing, but our purpose here is to see Bishop Auckland back in the style and the confidence that it had 100 years ago

"The real pleasure is not looking at the bricks and mortar but looking at the marvellous turn out today, what that tells us is that here we are looking at the future of Bishop Auckland and it's a bright one.'

The conservation of Auckland Castle has been supported by a number of organisations and individuals, including a £12.4m grant from The National Lottery Heritage Fund.

Sir Peter Luff, Chair of The National Lottery Heritage Fund, said: "We are delighted that, thanks to National Lottery players, this significant site has undergone conservation. The Castle's transformation into an arts and cultural centre will connect people with their heritage and act as a major catalyst for the regeneration of Bishop Auckland.

We hope Auckland Castle will be an inspiration for heritage organisations across the country, encouraging even more of them to work to boost their local economy and ensuring the UK is an ever more attractive place to live, work and visit."

A Day of Celebration


Reflecting the rich history of Auckland Castle and its grand Georgian State Rooms, visitors at the opening event enjoyed a host of history-themed entertainment with appearances from characters from the 18th century, such as Bishop Shute Barrington, as well as sword fighting demonstrations and live music from the era.

Attendees of all ages also had fun stepping into Georgian-themed fancy-dress, taking part in craft activities and trying their hand at fencing and archery.

Throughout the day, people were invited to record their personal history and links to Auckland Castle on a special Memory Tree and the Bishop's Kitchen café, inside the Castle, was open for the first time, offering a selection of snacks, sandwiches and treats all created by The Auckland Project's Catering Team.

1,000 ticket holders were given the opportunity to be among the first to step back through the Castle doors to see the newly conserved building and explore the untold stories of power and faith that lie behind its walls. Visitors were able to walk through centuries of the Castle's

history, from 300-year-old St Peter's Chapel, through the carefully conserved grandeur of the Georgian Gothic State Rooms to the bishops' private apartments, which have been





opened up for the first time.

Clare Baron, Head of Interpretation and Exhibitions at The Auckland Project, said: "After three years of hard work and careful conservation it's so exciting to see the Castle doors re-opened and visitors welcomed back inside.

e story of Auckland Castle and the Prince Bishops of Durham spans more than 1,000 years but for various reasons has remained relatively untold. Now, thanks to extensive conservation work and research, visitors are able to walk in the footsteps of the men who helped shaped the country we

Following its official launch, Auckland Castle is now open Wednesday to Sunday, 10am to 4pm, last entry 3pm. Entry is priced at £10 for adults, £8 for concessions and £3 for under-16s. Tickets can be pre-booked until March 2020.

Entry includes admission to the Bishop Trevor Gallery, which houses a programme of special exhibitions of fine art, with a focus on European painting from the medieval period to the present day. Currently, the gallery is home to the National Gallery Masterpiece Tour 2019, sponsored by Christie's, which sees Nicolas Poussin's The Triumph of Pan displayed alongside other works.

Visitors can also purchase an Auckland Pass, starting at £12.50 per adult, which offers entry to Auckland Castle and Bishop Trevor Gallery as well as The Auckland Project's Mining Art Gallery and Auckland Tower visitor centre until January 2021.

Ready for Winter



With temperatures set to drop, preparations for winter 2019 are well underway in County Durham.

Durham County Council is ready to keep the region moving this winter with a 76 strong fleet of gritters and snowblowers ready and waiting for the colder weather.

There are 42,000 tonnes of salt ready to tackle the ice and any snow, with over 2,380 salt bins located in key positions around the county to assist residents and businesses.

During normal with conditions 1,700km winter priority one roads, normally A or B roads, will be treated. covering 45 per cent of the road network. More minor routes, or priority two roads, will be treated in times of prolonged severe winter weather when the resources are available.

Mark Readman, Durham County Council's highways services manager, said: "With the weather now turning cold, it's important that we are ready for icy conditions on roads and footpaths.

"Preparations for colder have weather underway for some time, but our winter maintenance programme for 2019/20 is now fully up and running." All 40 power gritters are fitted with 360-degree cameras to help improve safety and information on weather conditions.

To see a list of priority gritting routes, track gritters as they are out and about, see roadside weather cameras.



Aldi Store to Trial Reusable Bags for Loose Fruit and Veg

The Aldi store in Newton Aycliffe is trialing reusable bags for loose fruit and vegetables in an effort to cut single-use plastics.

From the end of November. more than 60 stores across the North East will offer the bags as a more sustainable alternative to single-use plastic.

The drawstring bags are made from recycled plastic bottles and will be sold for 25p each. This is the supermarket's step reduce unnecessary plastic as it works towards reducing plastic packaging by 25% by the end of 2023.

If introduced nationally, the circulation.'

initiative will remove the equivalent of 113 tonnes of single-use plastic from circulation each year.

Fritz Walleczek, Managing Director of Corporate Responsibility at Aldi, said: "We are committed to cutting the amount of plastic that Aldi and our customers use, particularly excess or singleuse plastic like produce bags. "We are hopeful that our customers in Newton will embrace these new reusable bags whenever they're buying loose fruit and veg and, together, we will be able to take more than 100 tonnes of plastic a year out of

Earlier this year, launched paper compostable carrier bags across stores in the North East. scrapped plastic packaging on our four-pack toilet rolls and removed plastic wrapping on tinned tuna multipacks.

Aldi is on track to have all own-label packaging recyclable, reusable or compostable by 2022. Since 2018, it has removed more than 550 tonnes of plastic and replaced almost 3,000 tonnes of unrecyclable material with recyclable alternatives.

Of our team of 16, three members of staff have done full apprenticeships, while a further four are working their way through the programme at the moment." Looking ahead to the next ten years, Stuart hopes to keep up the momentum, planning more recruitment and an expansion of the branch network.

branch network. He said: "We believe in the personal approach and having a network of smaller offices, as opposed to one larger base, fits in with that. "Our growth to date has all been due to word of mouth, and we believe our personal approach, and investment in local talent, stands us in good stead for the future." 
