fired, and, in each case, restarted hearts and got people into hospital to give them the best possible chance of survival.

More importantly, because we are now extending the coverage area, more units are being brought to situations where there is a chance that cardiac arrest may occur... Having a unit beside you ready to deploy if a cardiac arrest happens gives the best possible chance to someone.
Remember statistically there is a 75% chance in a real-life situation that the person will be a member of your family, or well known to you!

This last year has seen continuing support from organisations so many such as Great Aycliffe and Middridge Area Action Partnership, all seven County Councillors, Neville Residents and Community Associations, Aycliffe Village Residents, School Aycliffe Community, St Mary's Church and School. We have had very positive public support, but I would like to highlight and thank the following. Also, I would like to thank the great team at our equipment suppliers Martek - LifeCare for all of their help and assistance since the project began.

The family of Stephen Patterson, The Taylor Family and their "Kick it 4 Seonaid" appeal in memory of their daughter, two anonymous donors, one from School Aycliffe and the other from Middridge

We are continuing to expand coverage especially 24 hour units and hope with help from Livin to shortly install units at the ARK Western area and in the Simpasture area. Whilst overall coverage has grown signifyingly there are still gaps and we intend to continue working with others to try and plug these. We also need to work on a more coordinated approach to making people aware of the location of units especially ones that are not 24-hour units. Why not start a campaign for a standard sign that buildings could display. There is also a need for cooperation at centres of great footfall such as the Town Centre and other

venues. I would like to think that if you had a defibrillator or other emergency equipment in your premises you would be prepared to make it available in an emergency and let your neighbours know!

As the project progresses could any organisation or group (especially on the Business Park) who has a defibrillator that could be accessible for a public emergency and would be prepared to include on our map get in touch.

Education and Awareness Sessions.

From the original concept of the project it was obviously important that deploying Defibrillator units was only part of the project, education on their benefits and training to use was just

I am pleased to say that again the response to our free CPR and Defibrillator awareness sessions has exceeded our original targets.

At the end of December 2019 518 people had completed the sessions.

Interestingly females have responded more and outdo the males by 337 to 181. The spread of age ranges covered shows the wide response from the public, and I am particularly pleased that 155 were people aged 20 or younger. We have sessions that cater from age 10 and upwards and are very keen to target future sessions at

young people.
Thanks to the ongoing help from GAMP, and all seven County Councillor's. together with the British Heart Foundation and the Ambulance Service, more sessions are being organised

for this year.
The next free session at Woodham Village Community Centre on Saturday 18th Jan from 10am to noon. Further sessions are planned for St Mary's Church. Dates and times to follow in the next edition of Newton News. Listen in to Aycliffe Radio on Wednesday 29th January 2020 at 6pm, when we will

Sergeant's Blog NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING By Sergeant Andy Boyd

I hope everyone has had a fantastic festive period and this post finds you fit and well. We have had a mixed bag over the Christmas and New Year period, but in the main Newton Avcliffe remains a safe place to live, work and shop. follow a number of the local residents pages on Social Media and share many of the views and frustrations expressed, especially with regards to rising Anti-Social Behaviour and I'd like to take this opportunity to explain what we are trying to do in relation to Like in numerous towns and cities across the country, ASB rises during the winter months, this seems to be down to youths gathering in town centres where they feel safer, where there is cover from the elements, street lighting, and in some areas free WIFI where youths can use their phones. Again, like in every other community, there is a 'hard core' of youths who seem to take great delight in causing misery for others, this is the group that we are working hard with partners to reduce their offending whilst addressing their needs. We have tried to engage with them, we have tried to educate them, but with this element it appears that the only way forward is enforcement, they will not listen to advice! I'm sick of this type of behaviour, I know my team are sick of this behaviour, and I am fully aware that the community is growing sick and tired of this small element causing harassment, alarm and distress. This hard core have been identified, we are collating evidence on them on a daily basis, we are

working with the ASB team at Durham County Council and issuing Acceptable Behaviour Contracts, we are interviewing them for all offences identified, and we are pursuing all offences where evidence supports us in doing so. We are working with local housing providers and landlords, repeat offenders causing ASB in their community risk losing their homes. We are looking at Parenting Orders where parents Orders where parents and carers are blatantly neglecting their kids by letting them repeatedly associate with other youths in order to cause ASB for others. We are also looking at funding for increased provision for youths to divert them away from future offending.

I have to stress that most youths in Newton Aycliffe are well behaved. In fact I am a strong supporter of good kids being rewarded for community service and acts of kindness and good citizenship, we have our ACE awards, supported by the Town Council, McDonalds and ROF59, to acknowledge some great examples of this.

Everyone needs to step up in order to address this issue. We need parents and carers to take responsibility for their kids, to know where they are, who they are associating with and educate them around the implications and dangers of their actions. We need the community to give us the evidence we need to robustly deal with these repeat offenders, CCTV, video or photographic evidence would greatly assist in investigations and I'd urge you to capture this when safe to do so.

Please be assured that we are doing all we can to reduce ASB in Newton Aycliffe.

Dear Sir,

I, along with half a dozen volunteers, tidy our streets on a weekly basis supporting the council's paid workers like Ally and Danny. I collect a large sackful every 3 to 5 days.

put a leaflet out in St Mary's and Shafto ward in September asking residents to encourage their children not to drop litter on the way to school and also gave a leaflet to Vane Road school's head teacher (who said he would mention it in

assembly).
I also emailed Woodham Academy in June 2019 (asking if they would like to set up a team of helpers but they sadly did not reply). I personally got a litter collection pack from Durham

Council's Civic Pride team with hi viz vests, litter sticks and bags with hoops. 3 local residents took equipment from me to help. I get my volunteer blue bags collected via Chilton neighbourhood

wardens depot.

I have also reported fly tipping of carpets, gas bottles, fireworks, tyres, etc. via Durham Council website online form.

Recently I have noticed that somebody has vandalised the dog bin near the Central Avenue traffic lights and another dumped a tyre at the bus shelter and a concrete bollard outside Macolls on Washington Crescent (all reported). I did ask Macolls head office 2 years ago to ask staff to sweep the litter dropped in front of the store and ask the hot dog company to provide an incentive for returned cardboard wrappers and was told a regional manager would contact me in 2018 but it never happened never happened.

I regularly collect on Ross Walk whilst walking my dog and we really need a litter bin midway at Markham Place, near the hill on the field just before the playground area, as there are 3 dog bins

between Central Avenue and the Cricket Club but only litter bins half a mile apart. The worst rubbish is in the trees and bushes near the A167 lay-bys so take longer to clear as it is neither

highways or street cleaning responsibility.
The worst I have seen in the town is on the industrial estate on footpaths, grass and waste ground between factories. I would be interested to know if

environmental health fine companies, or if business park factory owners have a duty of care not to let their packaging pollute common

ground?
Please can you publish some of my photos to encourage residents to take a pride in their town as it seems a hardcore minority are happy to drop cans, plastic glass bottles and hot dog wrappers, even next to bins at bus stops but mainly on pedestrian routes to and from school, like Kemble Green, St Barbara's Walk and particularly on the path through The Burn. 


