

East mining artist Bob Olley is being celebrated with a special exhibition at a County Durham gallery. Backshift: Bob Olley at 80 will open at the Mining Art Gallery, Bishop Auckland, on Saturday, 15 February and runs until Sunday 10 May.

It will feature more than 30 of Bob's works, offering a window into his perspective on the heart, humour and quirky reality of the mining world and community life surrounding it in the North East of England.

On display are some of his earliest drawings from the 1960s, when he dreamt of a career as a magazine illustrator before fate sent him to follow in his father's footsteps, into the local colliery.

Bob's style captures iconic scenes and figures of the North East, from the Blaydon Races to the devastating miners' strikes of the 1980s. Oil paintings, sculpture and preparatory sketches of his most-loved works are brought together as Bob looks back on over five decades of his artistic career, where life above and below ground is chronicled in his distinctive, graphic style.

His artwork shines the warm glow of a miner's lamp on the camaraderie of miners hewing and hauling coal in dangerous and inhospitable conditions. And the pieces on show at the Mining Art Gallery span the gradual decline of the mining industry.

One of the paintings featured, High Speed Drifters, illustrates Bob's very last job at Whitburn Colliery and captures the constantly wet and noisy environment in which miners spent their working hours.

Other pieces on display turn the spotlight on daily life in the tight-knit North East communities of the 1960s and 70s. This includes what is arguably his most famous work, The Westoe Netty, a humorous depiction of a public urinal. Though globally recognised now. artwork sparked controversy at its first showing, nearly closing the entire exhibition on the grounds of indecency.

Bob, who lives and works in South Shields, said: "I have always expressed myself best through art. When I first went down the mines I found it hard to articulate how I felt about the blinding dark, the noise and the constant movement - the only way to describe my life underground was to draw it.

"It was the camaraderie, friendships and laughter

Born into a mining family, Bob was just 17 when he became a miner in 1957, embarking on an 11-year career at the coastal pit in

But his life-long love for art saw him leave the mines in 1969 and begin exhibiting artwork, before becoming a full-time artist in 1974.

As well as paintings and drawings, Bob has been commissioned to create a wealth of public art across the North East. This includes the lifesized sculpture of Stan Laurel, which stands at Theatre Corner in Bishop Auckland, and a mural of the town's history at Bishop Auckland Railway Station. Angela Thomas.

Exhibitions Curator at the Mining Art Gallery, said: "Bob is one of the most instantly recognisable artists in the North East. His unique graphic style brings to life the world of the miner and the solidarity of the communities that still exist.

"It has been such an honour for us to work with Bob on this exhibition. It seems fitting to have so many of his works, pride of place, in the Mining Art Gallery." Backshift: Bob Olley at 80 will be on show in a new,

larger exhibition space in the Mining Art Gallery from Saturday, 15 February to Sunday 10 May 2020. It follows another exhibition in tribute to a great mining artist, Norman Cornish, which was part of a County-wide celebration of the artist's centenary year. And art-lovers can meet Bob in person at a special event, In Conversation with Bob Olley on Thursday, 23 April 2020. The event, from 6.30 - 8pm, will see the artist discuss the new exhibition with Bob

Some of the works are on loan from South Shields Museum & Art Gallery, Bob Olley donated all 23 oil paintings from the museum's 2018 exhibition King Coal: the life and legacy of South Tyneside's mining communities to the gallery for future generations and other people in the region to enjoy. A new permanent space in the museum will be dedicated to Bob Olley's work from summer 2020.

The Mining Art Gallery, Bishop Auckland Market Place is part of the Auckland Project. It is open from Wednesday to Sunday, 10am to 4pm. Admission is priced at £5 for adults, £4 for concessions and £1 for under-16s. Entry to the Mining Art

Gallery is also included within The Auckland Pass, which also permits entry to Auckland Castle, Trevor Gallery Bishop and Auckland Tower. It is priced at £12.50 per adult and is valid for multiple visits until January 2021. Ambitious plans for the Locomotion Shildon have been celebrating announced, Shildon's railway heritage ahead of the Stockton and Darlington Railway's bicentenary in 2025.

A £4.5m plan will see the construction of a new, 4,000m2 'Building Two', close to the existing visitor centre which will almost double the amount of covered space available to the public. The building will house up to 40 vehicles from the national collection, bringing the total number of rail vehicles at Locomotion to more than 100.

Construction work is set commence in October 2021 and the building is due to open to the public in September 2022.

further recognise Shildon's role as the birthplace of the modern passenger railway, historic steam engine Locomotion No.1 - the first to haul a scheduled passenger train will also go on display at the redeveloped museum.

The locomotive is part of the national collection, cared for by the Science Museum Group, and is currently on

loan at the Head of Steam Museum in Darlington. When the existing loan period ends in 2021, the vehicle will travel the short distance to its new home in Shildon, where it will be displayed as the focal point of Locomotion's redevelopment.

Sarah Price. Head of Locomotion said:

"On 27 September 1825, Stephenson's George Locomotion No. 1 set off from outside the Mason's Arms public house in Shildon - just a short distance from where the museum is now This pioneering locomotive hauled the first train to Stockton, cementing Shildon's place as the 'Cradle of the Railways' - the world's first, true railway town.

"Our ambitious plans will see significant investment in the existing site's historic buildings, the construction of Building Two to showcase our collection and the display of Locomotion No.1 - one of the world's most significant engines."

"We will continue to work with Head of Steam and other organisations across the region, and the country, to ensure that celebrations for the Bicentenary of the Stockton and Darlington Railway in 2025, bring the world's attention to the North East's role in the global railway revolution."

The development will also see the repair and rejuvenation Locomotion's historic buildings. The museum is home to a collection of unique Grade II listed buildings including the former home of Timothy Hackworth, the first locomotive superintendent of the Stockton and Darlington Railway, as well as sheds and worker's cottages.

The £1.6m repair project started on site in January 2020 and all historic buildings are due to be repaired by the end of the year.

Locomotion celebrated its 15th birthday with a gala event - drawing in excess of 3,500 people on a single day. Since opening, the museum has hosted many high-profile locomotives and exhibitions, including Flying Scotsman and Tim Peake's Sovuz capsule which was seen by more than 46,000 people.

Locomotion was first opened by then Prime Minister, Tony Blair in 2004, as a partnership between Sedgefield Borough



They are all bad for our prickly pals but mealworms are a definite no because they deplete their calcium causing metabolic bone disease for which there is no cure, euthanasia is the only outcome. Mothers can also pass this on to their hoglets, if mum doesn't have calcium neither will the hoglet and it will soon be baby season.

January is a month when most hedgehogs should be hibernating, what is causing concern is the very small ones, like Tara's, that are still coming into rescue centres, I hope that this settles down now but the weather is proving to be a little confusing, spring flowers are breaking the surface a bit





# **FUNDING AVAILABLE!**

Holiday Activities with Healthy Food – Easter 2020

Following recommendation by the Poverty Action Steering Group, Durham County has allocated £10,000 to each Area Action Partnership for 2020. This money is to ensure that as many children and young people as possible have access to food, alongside enriching activities, considering particular those children and young people who would normally receive a Free School Meal during Term Time.

In Phase One (Easter 2020), funding of £3,000 has been made available for the Great Aycliffe & Middridge Partnership (GAMP) area for a Holiday Activities with Healthy Food grants scheme. This fund will provide the opportunity for groups and organisations to apply for a small grant to help them deliver projects locally.

#### Aim of the Scheme

The scheme aims to support local community groups and organisations based in the GAMP area to deliver Holiday Activities with Healthy Food during the Easter 2020 school holidays. How much can you apply for?

Applicants can apply for amounts between £250 £999 and are limited to one per organisation.

Projects who are looking to apply for between £500 and £999 would be expected to deliver activities at multiple locations within the area and/or over several days during the holiday period.

Leave it now. Yours sincerely "Tired of it all!"





# IMPROVING OUR FUTURE HOMES | A.A.P. SEEKS NEW

It is idiocy that we are continuing to build energy-inefficient homes ... NEW houses which we know before they are built will have to be retrofitted in a few years' time. Why is every new home not required to be built with solar panels/tiles and a battery system? Not only would this help mitigate Climate Change, it would make homes more energyaffordable.

As part of its ambition to become carbon-neutral by 2050, the government last year pledged to toughen building regs for new-build housing from 2025 and consequently, in October, it published a 'Future Homes . Standard consultation:

bit.ly/FHSC20. This is aimed mainly at planners, developers and suppliers there are 69 questions in all, many highly technical but there are some key questions which are matters of principle, where we as ordinary members of the public have a right to be heard:

#### 1: THE HOMES QUESTION FUTURE STANDARD

Question 1 proposes that houses built to the Future Homes Standard after 2025 should produce 75-80% less CO2 emissions than those we are building now, and asks whether we agree. By 2050, of course, we want everybody to be living in carbon neutral

homes, but is this a suitable interim target for 2025?

# QUESTION 6: ENERGY UPLIFT OPTIONS

Question 6 accepts that developers and suppliers will need time to prepare for the new regulations in 2025, and suggests interim requirements to be imposed immediately. On this it offers two options

• (A) an uplift of 20%, based on much better materials e.g. triple glazing – (adding £2,500 to the build-cost of a new home but saving households £59 a year on energy); this is the

recommended option.
• (B) an uplift of 31%, based less on improvements to the fabric and more on adding

renewable energy such as solar panels (adding £4,800 to the build-cost but saving £257 a year on energy bills). [This is a difficult decision Option (A) is a lower uplift, but it will be easier later on to add extras such as solar panels than it will be to retrofit the fabric of the house. And which is better for the climate – reducing the energy needed, or supplying extra energy to an inefficient

#### system through PV?] QUESTIONS 9 & 10: THE HEATING SYSTEMS OF 2025

The consultation suggests that HEAT PUMPS and HEAT NETWORKS will typically deliver the low carbon heating of the Future Homes Standard. This derives from its intention to phase out gas boilers after 2025, connected to its fear that builders will simply put in wasteful electric radiators and leave the home-owners to carry the cost. Therefore:

 Ouestion 9 asks if we need to set a target to ensure that homes' energy is affordable,

· Question 10 asks if the best way to do this is to via a minimum energy efficiency
