children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) in County Durham are improving, according to government inspectors

A joint team from Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission reviewed education, health and care services provided across the

After assessing services and receiving feedback from more than 400 parents and carers, they found that organisations in the county have made progress in improving services since the inspectors' last visit in January 2018 when some concerns were raised.

The latest report highlights a number of areas where positive changes have been achieved

It found that the partnership between education, health and social care leaders is stronger than it was and that that there had been a determined focus on improving arrangements for identifying, assessing and meeting the needs of children and young people with SEND.

Durham County Council health services praised for their are commitment to involving children, young people and their families in shaping services, with this work "contributing strongly' to improvement in SEND arrangements.

report cites the Making Changes Together parent and carer forum, the Rollercoaster Support Group and eXtreme group of young people as examples of those that have been "instrumental in several significant developments since the initial inspection". area's participation strategy is praised for setting out "clear and helpful quality standards" for joint working for children and young people and their families.

The report also highlights that "children and young people with SEND and their families have increasingly strong and influential voices in the development of the area's strategic plans" and that there has been a "marked reduction" in waiting times for specialist autism assessment and speech and language therapy assessment, with times now in line with national guidance.

The inspectors felt that previous concerns about the effective use of performance data to tackle weaknesses have been addressed by

the development of new systems and strengthening of existing ones. Again, with children and young people featuring prominently in this work.

County Durham SEND Services Improving

This has resulted in the fact that "the area's selfevaluation provides a clearer and more comprehensive assessment of how well SEND arrangements are working in County

Durham". Commissioning decisions, service planning and performance monitoring are also better informed by the area's analysis of education, health and social care needs, according to the

Overall, both the council and North Durham and Durham Dales, Easington and Sedgefield Clinical Commissioning Groups are praised for their "greater collective ambition" service users.

Cllr Olwyn Gunn, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for children and young people's services, said: "Working closely with our partners across education, health and care, we've really focused on addressing the issues raised in the 2018 inspection and I am pleased that these efforts have been recognised by the inspectors.

"Our Local Offer website, for example, which provides a wealth of information for the families of children and young people with SEND and offers a first point of contact for many people has seen significant improvements over the past two years.

"Children, young people and their families have played in key role in shaping the changes that have been made and this is clearly acknowledged within the

report. Last year, we carried out a consultation asking people what they thought of our plans for SEND services and we received an excellent response. This feedback provided has been invaluable to our work and, again, I am pleased that this was very clear to the inspectors.

"Going forward, it is crucial that the needs and views of service users and their families continue to be embedded at the heart of SEND provision in County Durham and I would very much like to reassure them that this will be the case.

Nicola Bailey, chief officer NHS North Durham and NHS Durham Dales Easington and Sedgefield commissioning groups, said: "An enormous amount of work has taken place since the original inspection to address the areas identified for improvement in 2018.

was pleasing the inspectors noted the progress that had been made in our strategic leadership. use of performance data, co-production and joint commissioning to improve our offer for children and young people with SEND. "We will continue to

work in close partnership Durham County Council to build on these improvements to ensure that all children and young people with SEND are supported to meet their potential."

While the inspectors'

report highlights the range of improvements that have been made since their last visit, it also identifies areas

where work is still needed. It states the council and CCGs have not yet fully achieved their objective of improving understanding and awareness of SEND at every level. The inspectors found that children and young people and their families continue to have very different experiences at schools and with individual health and social care services, with the quality of health advice remaining too variable and the quality of education, health and care assessments suffering from a lack of participation of

some health professionals. report that there are commissioned support following assessment but recognises that leaders from all organisations that provision needs to be strengthened.


SEND Strategic Partnership is now considering the report and is is working on a new action plan to address the areas of further improvement identified in the inspection findings and from feedback from families.

WHEELS **TO WORK SCHEME**

The Wheels to Work is currently being delivered in Newton Aycliffe to help people get established in their first six months of employment by providing them with much-needed transport to get to work. The project is currently supported through being Area Budget Funding from the Great Aycliffe and Middridge Partnership.

The Wheels to Work scheme is aimed at ensuring that travelling is not a barrier for those starting in a new job role or training.
Anyone aged 16 years or

over, who has a provisional licence, will be able to hire one of 30 mopeds, when needed. Individuals will have the option to loan either a 50cc moped for £25 a week, or a 125cc for £30 a week.

cost will cover Compulsory Basic Training (CBT), protective clothing, a duty lock, insurance, breakdown cover, servicing and maintenance of the moped. At the end of the loan period individuals may be offered the opportunity to purchase the moped, working with the project lead to ensure this is an affordable option.

Since joining the Wheels Work scheme there have been a number of applications made in the GAMP area, with several of these currently being processed.

Susan Matthews, Wheels to Work Project officer, said: "If you are in the Great Aycliffe and Middridge area then I would encourage you to get in touch to see if this scheme can be of benefit. The referral process can also look at other possible transport solutions such as car sharing as well as scooter loan. We are looking forward to offering residents in the GAMP area the chance to take up work or training opportunities where lack of transport has up to now been a barrier."

The campaign to provide all residents of Newton Aycliffe with 24 hour access to potential lifesaving equipment within a 500 yard radius of their homes moves on, thanks again to widespread support.

Having these units available is crucial to supporting our emergency services in the chain of survival in the event of a cardiac arrest.

Statistically 75% of cardiac arrests occur either with a member of your own family, or someone you know very well. Using CPR only may only provide less than 5% survival rates, with a defibrillator on hand survival rates could be increased to 70%. Dial 999 and you will be directed to your nearest unit which you can then take to wherever it is needed. We have just completed a thorough revamp with the Ambulance Service and now have a robust system in place to achieve this.

Firstly, pictured with the latest defibrillator unit, to be installed on 27th March, is David Sutton-Lloyd and Simon Day of Junction7 outside 7 Šilverdale Place. Livin have supported this installation purchase, and will maintain going forward

Secondly, pictured David Sutton-Lloyd is Mr Paul Smith, Aycliffe Town Centre Manager, representing the Landlords Freshwater. After discussing our campaign plans and general first aid provision in the Town Centre the Landlords are keen to be involved. They have made a generous donation towards purchasing and installing a 24 hour defibrillator unit in the middle of the Town Centre. Once installed, they will then take over the responsibility for its future upkeep.

They are also providing the free use of a shop unit to run events to help raise donations and run free CPR and Defibrillator awareness sessions. These are aimed at giving people confidence and skills to use CPR and a defibrillator.

After these two units we still have some gaps to fill in the area to provide total coverage of Newton Aycliffe. With the continued help already shown by our community, I know we can achieve this.

To fill these first two gaps, we now need to fundraise, and I estimate we require another £2,400. A small amount when you consider the number of people that they would provide cover

We already have commitment from several sources, and others wish to join, including the Taylor family (Rachael, Trevor, Calum and Andrea) who set up "Kick it for Seonaid" a charity helping provide defibrillators in memory of their daughter.

Manufacturer Fabricates a Year of Rapid Major Growth

County Durham is manufacturer is going from strength to strength following a 20 per cent increase in turnover last vear.

Facades and Fabrications, which is based in Newton Aycliffe and manufactures metal rainscreen and fabrications the construction industry, will end the financial year with turnover of £8.5 million - a rise of £1.6 million.

The financial results mark a period of major growth for the firm, with the appointment of a technical manager, investment in a range of new equipment and a £50,000 grant.

BTS managing director Phil Atkinson said: "We recently appointed Mark Wiper as technical manager and his first objective will be to review and retest all our systems - over the past three years, we've very much focused on automation and sales, and our existing systems have taken a back seat.

"There are a improvements we can make. value engineering will be done, so Mark will initially be focused on system testing, certification and legislative compliance. It's a perfect fit for our overall growth strategy, growth strategy, as we want our technical offering to be aligned to our other strategies, such as automation."

Mark, who has three years of experience in a similar



in the industry years, added: "I have an extensive background in product and system testing and certification in the construction industry, and I'm looking forward to putting this into practice at BTS.

"It's exciting to be working with a new team, and BTS is a dynamic business, with significant scope for growth in a competitive market.

are also team investing heavily in the future in terms of assets and hardware as well as personnel, which clearly demonstrates it's a company with a long-term and has worked future, not only for myself,

but for the wider region." Over the past two years, BTS has invested in five new pieces of machinery, including a new panel bender and a new press, to make its manufacturing processes more streamlined

and efficient.
Phil added: "Our strategy for automated equipment is paying off; we have the best automation in the industry, and we always research extensively into the best available machines and software.

"All of this helps our sales team go after those bigger contracts, backed by the confidence that we have the facility to service our evergrowing client base.

We've also been awarded £50,000 from the County Durham Growth Fund, which we will use to invest in further new machinery to improve efficiencies.

"In the past five years, the BTS team has grown from 34 to 55, and we're not standing still. We are continually trying to improve the business and invest in more efficient machines and processes, and our goals for the next five years are more of the same; more automation, more training, more people and more growth."

£50,000 of capital grant funding was secured from the County Durham Growth Fund, to support their latest investment of over £155k. The fund was set up by Business Durham, the economic development arm of Durham County Council, along with their delivery partner UMi, to help stimulate and enable businesses to grow by providing funding towards capital investment projects.

Crack Down on Pavement Parking

safer for parents and disabled people thanks to proposals to crack down on pavement parking

Consultation will look at options including how a national pavement parking ban could work, taking account necessary exceptions, and extended enforcement for powers local authorities

 Latest in a series of improvements by Secretary Transport accelerate pace of change for a more accessible transport network

New proposals to tackle pavement parking and make streets safer for parents and disabled people were set by Transport Secretary Grant Shapps.

The Government is set to consult on proposals the summer designed to improve the lives of people with mobility or sight impairments, as well as parents with prams who may be forced into the road to get around parked cars. The 12 week con

week consultation will include options such as allowing local authorities civil parking powers to enforcement crack down on unnecessary obstruction of the pavement. Currently, outside London, only police have this power.

parking enforced by local authorities might work. allowing for any necessary exceptions or designated spots for pavement parking where needed, and how a tailored approach may be required in rural suburban areas which face very different challenges.

2019 the Department Transport concluded a review which looked at the problems caused by pavement parking, effectiveness of legislation, and the case for reform.

It found that pavement parking was problematic for 95 per cent of respondents who are visually impaired and 98 per cent of wheelchair users.

Transport Select Committee also recently into the is-sue, with the commitment to consult on proposals forming a key part of the Government's response to its findings.

The Department is also looking at possible options to streamline and digitise the process used to create restrictions such temporary road closures for road-works, special events or permanent changes to speed limits and parking restrictions, known as 'Traffic Regulation Orders'. Landlords Warned over Energy Efficiency Rules

Move could see reduction in properties to rent

Local landlords are being urged by Crook estate agency Vickers & Barrass to prepare for new energy efficiency rules, which come into effect from April. The news follows Energy Performance Certificates (EPC) introduced to make buyers and tenants more aware of the energy cost and environmental associated with a building. Usually containing letter and a number together with a list of possible improvements (Recommendations), the rating scale runs from A to G (A is the most energy efficient). Under the Government's Minimum Energy Efficiency Standards (MEES), residential let property must achieve an E EPC rating as a minimum.

Now, with effect from the 1 April 2020, the regulations will apply to all existing tenancies as well as new agreements and landlords are being urged to be ready to ensure their rental properties comply. Changes to EPC regulations

are part of a government led initiative targeting energy inefficient housing in England and Wales in a wider strategy to tackle climate change.

It is estimated that around 7% of properties in the rented private sector currently hold the lowest EPC ratings according to the Energy Saving Trust.

While welcoming an initiative designed raise standards, Vickers & Barrass fears that many local landlords may decide not to implement the required improvements and instead sell their properties, reducing further the options for hard pressed tenants searching for accommodation.

Edd Forster, sales manager at Vickers & Barrass, said: "New regulations are always a question of balance for landlords, who have faced continued change and increasing costs over the last few years.
"We could see more

landlords exit the market in the months ahead, leading to a lack of suitable rental accommodation at a time when there is a desperate shortage of stock to let.

'They may look to evict tenants where the property falls below the minimum requirement of an E, so they can implement improvements or make the decision to sell."

Historic Norman Cornish

Mural Moved to New Home

iconic commissioned by Durham County Council to mark the opening of County Hall in 1963, has been successfully moved to its new home in Bishop Auckland.

The painting by Norman Cornish, one of the most respected and much-loved artists to emerge from the North East, depicts the arrival of the banners at Durham Miners' Gala.

It had been on display at County Hall since it opened and is fitting that its first move in almost 60 years is during Cornish's centenary vear.

The mural has been relocated to its new home of Bishop Auckland Town Hall ahead of its re-opening in April.

Norman Cornish was born in Spennymoor in 1919 and worked as a coal miner before becoming a professional artist.

After being commissioned by the council, Cornish was granted 12 months unpaid leave from Mainsforth in Ferryhill to complete the painting, with most of the work being completed during the coldest winter in 40 years

Although it arrived at County Hall in 1963 rolled up in the back of a carpet van, the mural's removal was an incredibly intricate process, involving several experts. Gillian Kirkbride, Durham

County Council's heritage museums and collections manager, who has overseen the project, said: "It has been a very delicate process to move such a significant part of Durham's history to its new home and we are relieved to see it safely installed in Bishop Auckland Town Hall.

"A number of specialists were involved in the planning and relocation to ensure that the painting was safely transported."

The mural is now on display at Bishop Auckland Town Hall, along with pieces from the Norman Cornish archive. The public will be able to view the mural and exhibition from April, when the town hall is due to re-open following its refurbishment.

Cllr Joy Allen, the council's Cabinet member transformation, culture and tourism, said: "We are delighted to welcome the Norman Cornish mural to the town hall, particularly














The Wheelers Celebrate 50 Years

Citizens Advice Information if you are Unable to Work

If you cannot work due to coronavirus and are eligible for Statutory Sick Pay you will get it from day one, rather than from the fourth day of your illness. Statutory Sick Pay will be payable if you are staying at home on Government advice, not just if you are infected by coronavirus. This will apply from 13 March 2020.

If you need to provide evidence to your employer that you need to stay at home due to coronavirus, you will soon be able to get it from NHS 111 Online instead of having to get a Fit Note from your doctor, however, this is currently under development and should be available soon. If you are not eligible to receive sick pay you can apply for Universal Credit and/or apply for New Style Employment and Support Allowance.

If you're already claiming benefits - Special arrangements will be in Special place for people in receipt of benefits who cannot attend health reassessments or jobcentre appointments because they are required to stay at home or are infected

by coronavirus.
If you're already claiming
Universal Credit and think you may have been affected by coronavirus, please contact your work coach as soon as possible. You can do this by using your online journal, or by calling the Universal Credit helpline on 0800 328 5644. If you are disabled or sick and

cannot attend a reassessment for Personal Independence Payment (PIP), Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) or Universal Credit, you will continue to receive your payments whilst your new assessment is rearranged.

You must tell DWP in good time that you are staying at home on Government advice have been diagnosed with coronavirus, otherwise you may be sanctioned. If you have a Claimant Commitment, it should be reviewed to make sure it is still reasonable and your mandatory work search


Horndale **Community Association Cancel Meetings**

Does Phone Use While Driving Drive you Round the Bend?

Despite the obvious dangers and potential for prosecution, we are STILL seeing drivers flouting the law and using their phones at the wheel, which is why we're cracking down on it as part of a week of national week of action next week.

The campaign will be carried out by officers from the Cleveland and Durham Specialist Operations Unit (CDSOU) to educate drivers and enforce the law

where appropriate. The use of mobile phones whilst driving has been recognised for some time as a contributory factor in collisions and one of the Fatal 4.

However, the growth in the use of smart phones is being highlighted as a possible reason for the increased use of the phone in the car.

Drivers are now not only



make tempted answer calls but also to answer and send emails as well as respond to social network site alerts.

This has increased the likelihood of drivers being distracted and therefore the risk of being involved in a serious collision is increasing.

It's illegal to hold a phone

or sat nav while driving vou must have hands-free access, like a windscreen mount or built-in sat nav - and it cannot block your view of the road.

You must also be in full control of your vehicle at all times. You can be stopped by police and prosecuted if they think you're not in control and are distracted. The law applies even when you're stopped at traffic ights or queuing in traffic. If caught using a hand-held phone, you could kill someone. That is why drivers face six penalty points and a £200 fine.

Chief Inspector, Graham Milne, from CDSOU, said: "We cannot stress enough how serious an offence this

"It only takes seconds of being distracted at the wheel to cause a serious collision which can cause catastrophic effects.

"Last year across Cleveland and Durham we saw 36 fatal collisions, many of them with contributing factors such as drivers using their mobile phones. "Be in no doubt, you can kill someone. Our message is simple – put the phone away while driving!"#StandingUpFor HangingUp

The Importance of **Talking to Children About Coronavirus**

The British Psychological Society says it is vital to talk openly children and reassure them about changes they seeing around them due to

Some of the changes, like people wearing face masks or empty supermarket shelves, can be scary for children and they are likely to need to talk to someone they trust about some of the imaginative misinformation they might have heard from friends at school.

The advice stresses that it is important to be truthful, but remember your child's age. An honest and accurate approach is best, giving them factual information, but adjusting the amount and detail to fit their age. For example, you might say don't yet have a vaccination for Coronavirus, but doctors are working very hard on it' or 'a lot of people might get sick, but for most people it is like a cold or flu and they get

better'.
Other advice from the BPS's

- Division of Educational and Child Psychology includes:

 Younger children might understand a cartoon or picture better than an explanation. We also recommend that adults watch news programmes and then filter this information to their child in a way that's right for their development.
- Allow children to ask questions: It is natural questions: It is natural that children will have questions and worries about Coronavirus. Giving them the space to ask these questions and have answers is a good

way to alleviate anxiety. It is ok to say you don't know
- at the moment, there are questions we don't have answers to about Coronavirus. You can explain this to your child and add in information about what people are doing to try to answer these questions. Maybe your child has an idea too – let them tell you or draw them.

- Try to manage your own worries: Uncertainty can make all of us feel anxious or worried. Identify other adults you can talk to about your own worries and questions. What things usually help to make you feel a bit calmer? If you are at home, music, breathing and relaxation techniques, distraction (such as watching something funny), and time with family members or pets can all help. Talk to your children when you feel calm
- to reassure them.

 Give practical guidance: Remind your child of the most important things they can do to stay healthy – washing their hands and the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' advice for coughs and sneezes. Help your child practise and increase their motivation for keeping going (maybe thinking of a song they want to sing while washing their hands).
 The BPS will continue to


U.T.C. Students Complete Kilimanjaro Stair Climb Challenge

This does not include complaints to livin or the police, nor cases where an experienced or senior councillor might bypass the system and go straight to the officers.

Nevertheless, it is a proxy indicator of how hard a local councillor is working to look after their patch.

Mycliffe North & Middridge Ward has three councillors, one Labour (Cllr John D Clare) and two Conservatives (Cllrs Scott Durham and Paul Howell). As you may have seen, during the recent election it was claimed that Labour has been neglecting Aycliffe North & Middridge Ward. When we saw this we immediately submitted a Freedom of Information request to DCC to supply the number of cases logged on

the CRM system.
THE TABLE SHOWS
THE RESULTS

In the 34 months May 2017 to February 2020, Cllr Durham reported 4 CRM cases, Cllr Howell 16, and Labour Cllr John D Clare 463.

When we spoke to Cllr Clare about this he reminded us that there is much more to his councillor's role than reporting things like potholes and fly-tipping. However, the information totally refutes the claim that Labour is neglecting Aycliffe North & Middridge Ward

In the 2017 local elections, the people of Aycliffe North & Middridge Ward rejected two of the experienced Labour candidates, and voted instead for two unknown Conservative councillors from Darlington. We presume people believed that they would do a better job than Labour. What actually happened, it seems, was that they left Labour Councillor John D Clare to do it all.

The UK's Chief Medical Officer and actor Mark Strong will feature in Strong new TV adverts as part of the government's public awareness campaign to delay the spread of COVID-19 and keep people safe.

The adverts, which can be viewed here https://we.tl/tykE0xtA1pb, hit screens this week and help explain new guidance to stay at home for 14 days if someone in your household has symptoms.

The guidance sets out that individuals will still be asked to self-isolate for seven days from the onset of symptoms, but any individuals in the household will now be asked to selfisolate for 14 days from that moment as well.

If other members your household develop symptoms, however mild, at any time during the 14 days they must not leave the home for 7 days from when symptoms started.

The new phase of the campaign will build on the existing radio, online, digital and billboard adverts

New TV adverts featuring currently visible all over the country. These reinforce the importance of washing your hands more often for 20 seconds and ask people to self-isolate for days if they develop a high temperature or a new continuous cough - however mild.

The government's public awareness campaign offers clear, practical advice so people can play their part in preventing and slowing the spread of the virus.

The awareness campaign also reiterates importance of seeking help online by visiting NHS. uk/coronavirus to check your symptoms and follow the medical advice, rather than visiting your GP. It also urges people with any symptoms to avoid contact with older and more vulnerable people.

rather than calling.

Work to encourage dog owners to be more responsible has seen a welcome fall in the number of complaints about dog fouling and stray dogs in County Durham. Durham County Council

launched a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) efforts on these. 2017 to tackle issues such as dog fouling and stray dogs, making it an offence to allow a dog to stray, failing to keep a pet on a lead, or allowing dogs into designated play areas. Since then, reported cases dog fouling have fallen by 45

As well as a welcome fall in those reports, the order has had a positive effect on the

number of stray dogs found across the county.
Since 2015/6, the number of strays reported has fallen by more than a third and the number of strays taken to kennels in the last year was

658, a 44 per cent reduction. The PSPO is one of several measures introduced to tackle these issues. The civic pride team regularly visit schools in the county to talk about the importance of being a responsible dog owner.

walkers are encouraged to sign up to the council's green dog walker scheme, pledging to always clean up after their pet and carry extra dog bags for other walkers who might not have one to hand.

St. Teresa's Need Help as **Fundraising is Curtailed**

A much loved hospice has urged the community 'not to wash its hands of us' as the crisis caused by coronavirus threatens to stifle fundraising efforts.

St Teresa's Hospice needs to raise £3 million a year to provide free day, in-patient and community care for people living with life-limiting illnesses and their families in Darlington, South Durham and North Yorkshire. But the pandemic is threatening its life-blood by limiting events and its ability to attract vital donations.

Emergency measures already been put in place to protect the health of patients, volunteers and staff and keep open the hospice's string of charity shops, which are so critical to continued income

generation. St Teresa's Hospice Chief Executive Jane Bradshaw said: "This crisis is unprecedented and we fully appreciate the worry and disruption the virus is causing worldwide. But we pray, that in the melee, the community we have served for more than 30 years doesn't wash its hands of us and helps us get through this turbulent period, so we can pay our essential workforce.

"We rely on the public's support and fear that many of the events, such as running and sponsored cycle rides, may be postponed or



"High profile events, such as the Great North Run and London Marathon, have been major sources of income for the hospice as our lovely family of supporters go to extraordinary lengths help us continue our work. Unfortunately these might not take place or may be postponed which will severely affect our fundraising efforts." The hospice's own annual fundraisers are also under constant review as the health crisis deepens.

The hospice has reviewed all of its services to boost levels of infection control even higher. The day services have been transferred to telephone only, while in-patient visitors must phone in advance, with numbers being limited to two


per patient. Vital community services, including home and rapid


