Scouts Enjoy Adventures with GAMP Activity Packs

Scouts may not have been able to attend their weekly meetings in recent months, but youngsters in the Newton Aycliffe area have certainly been keeping busy.

Thanks to funding from Great Aycliffe and Middridge Area Action Partnership (AAP), Acle Scout Group has created 'at-home' activity packs for their members during the coronavirus pandemic.

The group's beaver, cub and scout sections usually meet in Aycliffe Village Hall every week and enjoy a variety of trips and activities. When the lockdown began, leaders were keen to keep the excitement of scouting alive and so applied for a grant through Durham County Council's AAP Covid-19 fund. They were thrilled when they received £2,000 to help them to provide activity packs to their members, who are aged from five to sixteen.

Aimed at helping the youngsters to remain engaged and inspired while following Government guidance, the packs are ageappropriate and tailored to each child. They provide a wealth of fun ideas and activities, as well as information to support children's emotional wellbeing.

Margaret Lenahan, leader of Acle Scouts, said: "This funding has provided much-needed activities for our scouts and their families, which they have been able to enjoy safely at home. The children have been kept busy making cookies, pizzas, chalk art and balloon art, as well as pebble painting, hula hooping, skipping and creating edible hanging baskets. The full group also walked 3,000 miles in one week for their daily exercise. We really have achieved all we wanted and more with this project and are looking forward to getting back to our weekly sessions once it is safe to do so and building on the skills the children have learned through the activity packs." Earlier this year, the council provided each of its 14 AAPs with an additional £100,000 to assist projects providing support during the pandemic at a grass roots level. The £1.4 million pounds was further boosted with an extra £100,000 for countywide projects, while local members have been given more flexibility with their neighbourhood budgets.

Acle Scouts Group is one of the many community organisations across the county to have benefited.

Brian Stephens, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for communities and local partnerships, said: "Keeping children entertained can be tricky at the best of times, but the lockdown and social distancing has made it even more challenging. It has been wonderful to hear about the fun and safe activities Acle Scout Group has been up to during this time. This is a fantastic example of a project that has made a big difference to the lives of County Durham families, and we are proud to have supported it."

INEOS Donates £5,000 Through Community Fund APPLICANTS UP!



This month, global firm INEOS' Newton Aycliffe site has donated £5,000 to The Sunderland Community Soup Kitchen through the international INEOS Community Fund. This grant will support the vital work of the community charity as it helps provide food and everyday necessities to hungry and homeless local people in these particularly challenging times.

The Sunderland Community Soup Kitchen is a volunteer led project set up in 2019 to keep local people most in need supported in cases of hunger poverty. Ordinarily, members from its team of 60 volunteers run a nightly food session to feed the city's hungry and homeless while food parcels and crucial everyday items are also handed out to families in need. Until the beginning of lockdown, the self-funded charity gave away an average of 8,300 portions a month to those most without food supplies.

To meet the government's social distancing guidelines the charity has made urgent changes to its relief effort in the local community. While normal service is now on hold, The Soup Kitchen is still busy preparing hot food, which is delivered four nights a week by volunteer drivers to those in need. Throughout the lockdown the charity has experienced increased demand from families in food poverty, in addition to greater challenges as food donations have dropped dramatically

Andrea Bell, Founder of The Sunderland Community Foodbank, said: "We are delighted to have been awarded this grant which will be put to the best possible use by our inspiring team of volunteers, working hard every week to bring essential supplies to those most in need across the city. We don't receive any institutional funding, so donations of this kind and support from the wider community are essential in keeping our crucial operation going in these tough

The £1M INEOS Community Fund was established by INEOS Chairman Sir Jim Ratcliffe in March 2020 in tandem with the company's COVID-19 "Hands On" campaign, which set up new production lines to provide millions of bottles of free hand sanitiser per month to hospitals and frontline healthcare. The fund enables INEOS sites across the world to support the charitable organisations doing vital work in their local communities at this particularly difficult

Janet Ward, UK Communications Manager at INEOS company INOVYN, said: "The Sunderland Community Soup Kitchen has been a lifeline charity for those struggling the most across the city. In just a year the volunteer led scheme has given away over 30,000 three course meals to the community and has been working tirelessly throughout the lockdown period to ensure the most in need get hold of food. We are delighted that we can help the organisation support the needs of local people in these difficult times through the INEOS Community Fund.

Day shifts varied but consisted of a 48 hour week and night duty covered 50 hours over five nights, though we did have a two hour break each night. After qualifying I spent many happy years working as a Theatre Sister before training as a Health

married and having three children. I was most fortunate to be able to work and train as what would be considered to be an apprenticeship. Happy days indeed. Unfortunately, with the introduction of Project 2,000 things

A North East IT service provider is continuing a period of growth, despite the coronavirus lockdown.

razorblue, which is based in Catterick, North Yorkshire, provides end-to-end solutions for businesses across the region and beyond, with offices in Newcastle, Wynyard, Leeds, Manchester and London. The firm has averaged 30 per cent year-on-year growth over the past six years meaning that, while many companies have found themselves scaling back over the course of continued restrictions, razorblue has expanded, moving into new headquarters and recruiting more staff.

Managing director Dan Kitchen, who also project managed the £600,000 office expansion, said: "At 5,000sq ft, our new headquarters give us twice as much space as we had before, allowing us to expand the team and host more customer events and demonstrations. I'm really pleased with the results, it looks fantastic, very professional and gives the business the space it needs. We've stayed in Catterick - in fact, we're only about 100 metres from our previous base - as we've always been here; we have access to a great pool of people and it's very convenient, being just off the A1." Dan said that razorblue was already well-equipped to adapt to the restrictions imposed during the lockdown, and has noticed a rise in demand for support with home-working solutions as businesses prepare for the future.

He said: "We were already quite a remote-based business so we haven't learned anything groundbreaking; I think some of our clients have though! Due to the nature of the restrictions, we had to do a lot of work very quickly to deliver home-working solutions for firms that weren't set up to run in that way. We're now seeing companies taking a more strategic approach to their tech investment, knowing that home-working will remain a big thing as time goes on. Tech in general allows businesses to gain efficiencies over their competitors and grow their market share, which is going to become ever more important in an economy that's contracting, rather than growing." - Ensure your dog has their own safe space to retreat to when you have visitors, remembering that they can find excitable human noises worrying (as, no doubt, you'll be excited to see your friends and family after lockdown).
- Make sure you actively supervise your dog's interactions with visiting children.
- Always remember to wash your hands regularly before and after interacting with your dog and ask your guests to do the same. A dog's coat, lead, toys etc, could carry coronavirus just like any other surface.

• Do not be afraid to ask people not to pet your dog if you don't feel comfortable or if your dog wants some alone time.

Getting out and about with your dog

- It is summertime so make sure you never leave your dog in a hot car and refresh their training around picnic food and ball games.
- Use our handy guide to teach your dog to feel comfortable with seeing people in facemasks, particularly if you are using public transport.
- Remember that social distancing is still in place, so you may want to continue to use a lead when out walking or polish up your recall training.
- Get your dog re-accustomed to travelling safely in the car using a harness or crate by using lots of tasty treats or their favourite toy to reward calm behaviour and make the experience a positive one. Dogs Trust's Chief Executive, Owen Sharp, said: "As the nation prepares for the next step in the lifting of lockdown, it's important that we factor in the impact this may have on our four-legged friends. Most Innovative Activity Building Charities' Brands Through Lockdown & Beyond



After supporting the region's charities during the coronavirus crisis, a North East PR agency has announced it will continue to donate a portion of profits to good causes as the country emerges from lockdown.

Business Durham Secures an Additional £2.34m for **Digital Programme**

Digital Drive County Durham has been awarded an additional £2,340,000 of funding to continue supporting small and medium enterprises across the county until June 2023

Sarah Slaven, Business Durham's interim Managing Director, said: "We're delighted to announce we have secured an additional £2.34million of funding for our Digital Drive Country Durham programme. We will now be able to support more businesses from across the county to develop their digital capabilities in order to grow and remain competitive. "It's fantastic to have been able to support over 400 businesses since the programme was established, both before and during the COVID-19 crisis, when we were able to be flexible enough to provide support quickly for business. With the additional funding there is scope for more businesses to tap into the project and find out how digital technology can help them to increase their productivity.. Leisure Centre Gyms & Fitness Classes to Reopen

People in County Durham will be able to resume their fitness regimes later this month as council-run services begin to reopen.

Durham County Council will begin a phased reopening of its indoor leisure facilities from Monday, 27 July, in line with the easing of lockdown restrictions across the country and in accordance with social distancing measures.

Initially, only gyms and fitness classes will return, with further services being reinstated when it is possible to ensure they are provided safely and in a way that fully complies with government guidance.

All sessions will need to be booked in advance.


Cllr Carl Marshall, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for economic regeneration, said: "We are delighted at the prospect of being able to welcome people back to our leisure centres.

"The current public health and social distancing measures, coupled with the challenge of reopening our centres after a lengthy closure, makes it difficult to reinstate all services straight away. However, I'm sure people will be pleased to see our gyms reopen and our fitness classes return, and we will be working to reopen other services as soon as we are able.

"We appreciate that some people may feel apprehensive about returning to leisure centres at the moment, but we are working incredibly hard to ensure they provide a safe environment for everyone, including visitors and staff, and that we minimise the risk of the spread of coronavirus.

"As well as taking steps to ensure people are able to social distance in all areas of the centre, we are introducing a strict cleaning regime and will have extra staff on hand to make sure everything runs smoothly."

Gym facilities and fitness classes will open in phases over the course of the week, beginning on Monday, 27 July with NEWTON AYCLIFFE, Freeman's Quay, the Louisa Centre in Stanley, Spennymoor and Abbey Leisure Centre, Durham. This will be followed by Woodhouse Close, Consett and



Meadowfield on Wednesday, 29 July.

Gyms at Chester-le-Street, Teesdale and Shildon leisure centres will also open on Wednesday, 29 July, with fitness classes restarting on Friday, 31 July.

All centres will then return to seven day opening, but with only gym and fitness classes available. It is hoped that swimming pools will be able to reopen during the coming weeks.

Safety measures at all sites will include the repositioning of gym equipment to accommodate social distancing, limited numbers and movement during classes and additional hand sanitiser stations. Signage has also been installed to help people move around the centres in a safe way.

All sessions will need to be booked in advance for the foreseeable future, either online or over the phone. Bookings will be taken from Thursday, 23 July onwards.

At long last the cricket season finally began on Saturday 18th July, albeit with Government Covid-19 rules and accompanying ECB guidelines being strictly adhered to. However with half of the season's league fixtures lost due to the pandemic, the NYSD league have scrapped promotion and relegation for this season, but teams still have plenty to play for as championship trophies and some cups are still up for grabs.

Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's 1st team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, began their season away at Barnard Castle 2nd XI in the NYSD 2nd division and, after a poor display, came away with a six wicket defeat. Aycliffe were asked to bat first and were bowled out for a below par 121 after 42.4 overs despite an outstanding innings from Adam Gittins, who showed what could be done as he hit a determined unbeaten 56 from 113 balls reaching the boundary on seven occasions. Jack Slatcher (18 runs off 31 balls) and Ben Nicholson (11 runs off 16 balls) were the only other batsmen to reach double figures. In reply Barnard Castle coasted to victory after only 29.3 overs with Jack Slatcher (3 for 21) and James Layfield-Carroll (1 for 22) taking the only four wickets to fall.

A young second team containing six juniors hosted Guisborough 2nd XI in their opening NYSD division four game and despite losing by 47 runs, put in a spirited performance. The visitors were asked to bat first and were restricted to 167 for 6 in their allotted 40 overs. Dan Weldon (3 for 50) was the pick of the bowlers and he was supported well by 14 year old Leo Mercy (1 for 16) and 17 year old Jak Kennedy (1 for 18). In reply Aycliffe were dismissed for 120 after 32.2 overs despite some good individual performances from Sean Morgan (38 runs off 61 balls), Kyle Robinson (24 runs off 57 balls) and Jak Kennedy (11 runs off 16 balls).

The u17's began their season with a tough home game against Darlington in the NYSD Junior league and put in a good performance despite losing by 26 runs. Darlington chose to bat first and scored 96 for 1 from their 20 overs with Will Varley taken the only wicket to fall. In reply, Aycliffe batted well thanks to a good innings from Owen Smith, who top scored with 25 and Matty Greaves who scored 11 runs as their side were dismissed for a respectable 70 runs after 15.2 overs.

The u15's hosted their Hartlepool counterparts in a pre-season friendly and it proved to be an excellent work-out for the youngsters as they ended up tying the match in a thrilling climax. Hartlepool batted first and scored a respectable 88 for 4 from their allotted 20 overs. In reply Matty Greaves batted superbly (30 runs and retired) and despite good innings from both Thomas Dearden (17 runs) and Owen Smith (11 runs), Aycliffe couldn't quite get over the winning line, but were happy to earn a tie against a typically strong Hartlepool team as they finished their 20 overs with the scoreboard showing 88 for 5.



Partnership Approach at Heart of Economic Recovery Strategy

Simon will be joined by 17 other representatives from a range of sectors, including officers from the council's public health and regeneration teams; its economic development arm, Business Durham; and its tourism destination management organisation Visit County Durham. There will also be representatives from local colleges, Durham University, Durham Community Action and the North East Chamber of Commerce.

Together, the taskforce will produce a COVID-19 recovery plan, addressing priorities such as coordinating the reopening of town centres, providing businesses with advice and guidance, engaging with major employers in the county and lobbying the government on gaps in its current support measures for businesses.

Simon said: "There's no doubting that County Durham will be at the heart of the recovery of the wider North East economy.

"Bringing together a wide range of partners will ensure that we're responding to the challenges that we face whilst grasping the opportunities to drive our economic growth.

"Our taskforce will pull together an ambitious plan that will ensure that we fulfil this and deliver right across the county. Getting this right will help us build on the significant strengths we have including a world leading university, globally ambitious businesses and a cando spirit in local communities."

Cllr Carl Marshall, the council's Cabinet member for regeneration and economic development, said: "In County Durham, the public and private sector has a history of working together to celebrate the people and businesses that make our county great. Our Powered by People campaign is a fantastic example of this and has really put County Durham on the map as a place to do business.

"This collaborative approach is more important than ever and is at the heart of CDEP and our new economic recovery taskforce. Our strategy will focus on the short and medium-term steps needed to support businesses during the release from lockdown and as we adapt to the 'new normal.' It will also look at the longer-term rebuilding of the county's economy, with partners working together to grow places, services and industries."

As well as offering direct support to businesses, such as workforce retention support and help to access markets, the group will also look at key recovery issues for individual sectors of the economy. These include the rural, manufacturing, tourism, retail, health, service, construction and distribution sectors. It will also explore cross-over themes such as transport links, logistics and spatial impact and liaise with national and regional partners to share best-practice. Aykley Heads Planning Application Submitted

Proposals to create a business park in Durham generating an initial 4,000 jobs worth up to £400m have taken a step forward with the submission of plans.

Durham County Council has submitted a 'hybrid' planning application for the redevelopment of a site at Aykley Heads, which includes land currently occupied by the local authority's headquarters.

The hybrid proposals consist of a detailed application for office use on 'Plot C' and an outline submission for the scheme's first two phases, which have the potential to create 4,000 jobs. It is estimated a further 1,800 jobs would be supported in the construction of the park.

The application follows the decision of the council's Cabinet in January 2018 to create a new headquarters to pave the way for its County Hall site and neighbouring land to be redeveloped as a business park. Aykley Heads, North of the city centre, is already home to Atom Bank, Waterstons, the North East England Chamber of Commerce, Salvus House and many other businesses.

It has been designated as a Strategic Employment Site, one of five across the county which are being delivered as part of the council's priority to deliver 'More and Better Jobs.'

Other strategic employment sites such as Jade Business Park near Seaham, NETPark at Sedgefield, Integra 61 at Bowburn, Forrest Park at Newton Aycliffe are now all delivering on the ground with some exciting announcements coming soon in terms of new opportunities coming to fruition.

Leader of the council, Cllr Simon Henig, said: "We are really excited to be in a position to submit these plans given the prospect of the park's potential to create 4,000 jobs in its first two phases and to provide a major boost to the economy of County Durham. The vision for the site is to create a new and unique business location for the North East that maximises economic growth in County Durham and delivers jobs in new and growing sectors with the aim of providing a high-quality employment location that contributes to the delivery of new and better

"We want Aykley Heads and this truly transformational project to help establish Durham as a jobs hub within the North East.

The business park is proposed to provide up to 38,468sqm of floorspace and to be divided into an initial two phases and six plots. Each plot proposes office buildings and car parking spaces, while the site is close to the East Coast Main Line and other public transport, as well as cycling routes.

Across the entire estate, 'character zoning' would be used to create distinctiveness, intended use and character, how an area functions in its own right and how it connects to adjacent zones. The site would be landscaped with green spaces which could be enjoyed by workers, residents and visitors alike.

Cllr Henig added: "We are looking to provide a modern central business location, in a mature parkland setting, within walking distance of the mainline train station and city centre, providing a unique work and lifestyle offering. We really believe Aykley Heads would create a future model for business parks in the post coronavirus world by creating accessible green working environments that enhance the wellbeing of staff and attract the best talent.'

The proposed park has the support of the chamber of commerce. Its chief executive James Ramsbotham said: "This exciting development at Aykley Heads provides a unique opportunity to establish a dynamic business park in the centre of the North East with superb access to the national road and rail network.

"Possessing a UNESCO World Heritage Site and an internationally renowned university, Durham offers so much to so many businesses. This site, chosen by the chamber for its headquarters 25 years ago, is exceptional and this planning application is such an important first step in delivering on the transformational vision for this location.' Should planning permission be granted, work on Plot C would begin

App Aims to Support Patients During and Following Cancer Treatment

The app, My Wellbeing Space, is a free digital service from NHS partnership Health Call and technology provider Inhealthcare and funded by the Northern Cancer Alliance. It will initially benefit patients receiving care from County **Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation** Trust. The content was developed by the Macmillan project team in collaboration with clinical teams and involving patients at all stages of its design and testing. Clare Doney, Macmillan lead cancer nurse, said: "Being diagnosed with cancer is a life-changing event affecting patients, families and friends, emotionally as well as physically. We want to provide holistic support as soon as possible and the app is one way that we can reach out to more people. It gives our patients tools and resources to support and empower them to contribute to their wellbeing and overall health."

The My Wellbeing Space app can benefit patients at any stage of their treatment by providing advice and links with content including advice and links to information about: physical activity, late effects of treatment, food and nutrition, financial concerns, fatigue, emotional wellbeing and treatments. It also includes short video clips delivered by a consultant, clinical nurse specialist, wellbeing practitioners, GP, oncologist, a patient and carer. Patients will be given access to the app during their treatment. Tina Murray, from Neasham, near Darlington, who completed two and a half years' of treatment for cancer earlier this

year, said, "Coming towards the end of cancer treatment, I felt fear rather than elation. My life had been consumed by appointments, tests, treatments and I feared the loss of that structure. This is when you can start to realise the enormity of what has happened, feel isolated and fear the future. This is where the App comes in. It helps crystallise and identify in your mind the issues you are facing. It provides all sorts of information and sources of support available to you to help you through your emergence from treatment. You can get help dealing with your emotional mental health, as well as physical issues such as fatigue and where to get support for financial concerns. The App is very simple to use and because the support information is tailored to your local area, very relevant." Bryn Sage, chief executive at technology provider Inhealthcare, said: "This is a great example of how health technology can support people living with longterm conditions, especially during the coronavirus pandemic. As well as providing reassurance to patients, My Wellbeing Space also promotes a healthy lifestyle which can help the body to recover after cancer treatment. Health Call plans to share the app more widely through Trusts across the North East and North Cumbria.

Newton Aycliffe FC is finally seeing light at the end of the Covid-19 tunnel with the FA's announcement that football activity can recommence. While there is still no absolute certainty the aim is that the 2020/2021 Ebac Northern League season will commence in early September. The Emirates FA Cup will begin on Tuesday 1st September, just four weeks after Arsenal and Chelsea contest this year's final.

Last Saturday the FA issued guidance to clubs on a potential timeline for a return to football in the National League System (NLS). The guidance also detailed the steps clubs need to take to ensure players, officials, volunteers and spectators are safe when they come to a game. Clubs must publish a risk assessment by 15th August.

Final details will not be confirmed until the government gives permission for games to go ahead in front of spectators. The FA has previously said that games in the NLS cannot be played without fans.

In the meantime, clubs now have permission to return to competitive training while friendlies can be played from 1st August. However, these games must be played behind closed doors. League games could be played from September, providing the government has agreed to spectators being present by then.

Newton Aycliffe FC played their last game on 7th March and were lying 5th in the Ebac Northern League Division One when the season was stopped and declared null and void. Since then a great deal of work has gone on at the Beaumont Landscapes Stadium with new drainage installed to improve the pitch. Thanks to a generous grant from GAMP the path to the ground has been resurfaced and a new turnstile is currently being installed.

The Club will publish further details when they have them but after 4 months' enforced absence it's good that things are starting to move again.
