

# 1146 Teams in Durham County FA to Score £39,500 of Club Preparation Funding

Football in Durham County FA was given a boost this week with £39,500 worth of investment from the Premier League, The FA and Government's Football Foundation.

The funding is being awarded as grants from the Foundation's Club Preparation Fund. This has been created to help clubs prepare their buildings to safely reopen in line with Government guidance around hygiene and social distancing, and The FA's plans for a 'phased return' that were announced on 18 July.

79 grants were awarded to clubs across Durham County FA totalling £39,500. This will benefit 1146 local football teams across the

These Club Preparation Fund grants will go towards football sites to satisfy the extra hygiene measures that Government guidance requires. This includes:

- Installing hygiene facilities, such as hand sanitiser dispensers, soap dispensers, paper towel dispensers and waste bins
- Modifications, such as safety screening, contactless payment systems and signage
- Facility maintenance work, such as repairing hand basins and hot water provision
- Professional inspections that may be necessary due to the prolonged period of closure resulting from the pandemic - including inspections of water quality, gas and ventilation.

John Topping, Company Secretary, said: 'This fund has helped so many of our clubs provide and prepare for what is required to ensure safety for buildings to be opened and have the required sanitising and cleaning products in place. We are very thankful to the Premier League, The FA and Government's Football Foundation for their support during these unprecedented times'.

The investment follows the Foundation's Pitch Preparation Fund that awarded £7m to 2,902 organisations across the country. This is enabling over 9,000 football pitches to be made match-fit, and is benefiting more than 33,000 football teams.

The Football Foundation is a charity funded by the Premier League, The FA and the Government, through Sport England.

Boro's online Art of Ayresome exhibition featuring works by a number of celebrated artists has inspired Boro fans to get creative and share their own artworks.

# Ayresome Art Club GOVERNMENT **PAYING HALF ON** RESTAURANT BILLS



Diners in the North East will see their restaurant bills slashed by as much as 50% from today as the government's landmark Eat Out to Help Out scheme officially opened for business on Monday 3rd August. Anyone visiting a participating restaurant, café or pub on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays throughout August will receive the half price discount - keeping more money in hardworking families' pockets and giving a vital boost to the UK's hospitality sector. The scheme - part of the government's Plan for Jobs that will spur the country's economic recovery from coronavirus applies to all food and non-alcoholic drinks. with a maximum discount per person of £10. It could save a family of four up to £40 per

More than 72,000 establishments are participating, including independent eateries and family favourites such as Pizza Express, Costa Coffee and Nando's.

There have already been over 3.3 million hits on the Eat Out to Help Out restaurant finder since it launched last week, which shows what businesses are participating in local areas, and many restaurants have since seen a boost in bookings. Apps like Opentable, Fork and Bookatable are all planning pages to support the scheme. Chancellor of the Exchequer, Rishi Sunak, said: "Our Eat Out to Help Out scheme's number one aim is to help protect the jobs of 1.8 million chefs, waiters and restaurateurs by boosting demand and getting customers through the door.

"More than 72,000 establishments will be serving discounted meals across the country. with the government paying half the bill. The industry is a vital ingredient to our economy and it's been hit hard by coronavirus, so enjoy summer safely by showing your favourite places your support - we'll pay half."

The scheme will help protect the jobs of the hospitality industry's 1.8 million employees by encouraging people to safely return to their local restaurants, cafes and pubs where social-distancing rules allow.

Around 80% of hospitality firms stopped trading in April, with 1.4 million workers furloughed, the highest of any sector. Many participating restaurants offer healthy and low-calorie options, and the scheme should be enjoyed as part of a healthy and balanced lifestyle. No vouchers are needed, with the participating establishment deducting 50% from the bill.

People may be worried about returning to eat out. To address these concerns, businesses

have prepared to become Covid-secure through, for example, protective screens, contactless payments, social distancing, one way walking systems, online bookings and reduced capacity.

The Eat Out to Help Out scheme is one part of the Chancellor's £30 billion Plan for Jobs, announced last month. Other measures announced to protect, support and create jobs include cutting VAT for tourism and hospitality by 15%, a £2 billion Kickstart Scheme and an £8.8 billion investment in new infrastructure, decarbonisation and maintenance projects.

# Pick and Collect Library Coates Wins on Mini **Service Rolled Out**

A collection service introduced to help people in County Durham access library books is to be extended.

**Durham County Council** introduced its 'pick and collect' service earlier this month to enable people to borrow books for the first time since lockdown restrictions were introduced. Although anyone can use the service regardless of where in the county they live or which library



they normally visit, collection points were initially located at only nine libraries - Barnard Castle; Chester-le-Street; Consett; Crook; Newton Aycliffe; Peterlee; Seaham; Woodhouse Close, in Bishop Auckland; and Belmont, in Durham.

However, from Monday, 3rd August, this has been extended to include Bishop Auckland Town Hall; Easington; Sedgefield; Shildon; Spennymoor; Stanley; Thornley; Wolsingham; and Clayport and Newton Hall, in Durham.

The pick and collect service enables members of the public to order up to three books online or over the phone. They are then contacted by the library service, using their registered number, to arrange a collection day when they will be able to pick up their chosen titles from a participating library.

The libraries chosen for the first two phases of the scheme have been selected because they are busy libraries, which also offer sufficient space to provide the essential elements of the pick and collect service. This includes space for visitors to queue safely prior to entry and for a quarantine area to be created for returned books. The chosen sites also offer a good geographical spread of locations around the county.

None of the libraries will be open for browsing. All other library services, including access to public computers, will remain suspended for the time being although the council is currently looking at how these services can be reinstated over the coming weeks.

Libraries across the country were forced to close in March in response to Government guidance on preventing the spread of coronavirus. Since then, library users in County Durham have been able to access online services, with an extended digital offer including more eBooks, eMagazines and eAudiobook titles and free access to research tool Ancestry.

These services will continue alongside a temporary Doorstep Book Delivery service, which was introduced during the lockdown period to provide books for isolated and vulnerable Books on Wheels library users.

During the summer, younger readers are being encouraged to take part in the national Summer Reading Challenge, which is has this year gone online. The Silly Squad-themed event offers youngsters the chance to play games, earn badges and receive rewards as they discover new a host of new books. More information is available at https://api.readingagency.org.uk. Participating pick and collect sites will also be offering giveaway prizes.

Pick and collect is available via Library Online service or by calling one of the participating libraries.

Library collections and telephone assistance times may differ at each library and will not be in line with their former opening hours. Anyone can become a member of the library service by visiting Library Online or calling one of the participating libraries. Before the end of the lap he claimed another position to move into 4th. As they entered the second lap, he pounced up the inside of James MacIntyre into 3rd. He then set about catching the leaders and before the end of the lap made the most of a scuffle between the pair to claim the lead. From there he tried to pull a gap but was kept honest by Kyle Reid who closed in the final stages. Coates was able to hold on though to take his maiden victory in the series on his debut weekend. After he commented, "That was a bit hairy at times, I had to make up ground in the first two laps and I took some risks. Fortunately, they paid off. We made a set-up change for the last race and it seemed to work, we've been learning with the car and race distances all weekend and I think we went some way to cracking the secrets of the car in the


# The Great British Redworth House Bake Off

# GREENFIELD SUMMER | Durham Town Hall to Reopen With Extended Hours

An historic town hall will reopen to the public this week after being closed due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Durham Town Hall will also be extending its opening hours from one day a week to four days a week.

The venue, in the city's Market Place, had been open every Saturday until being forced to close in March due to government restrictions.

However, Durham County Council, which runs the venue, has introduced measures to enable the town hall to reopen. As well as a one-way system to support social distancing, additional cleaning is taking place.

Opening hours over the summer have also been extended to include Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Admission is free and there is no need to book.

Cllr Joy Allen, Cabinet member for transformation, culture and tourism, said: "We understand that after weeks of lockdown, people are keen to get out and about. We also know that many families will be looking for ways to entertain their children during the school

"By reopening the town hall, we're able to offer them a fascinating place to visit where they can also feel confident that everything possible has been done to keep them safe.

"Furthermore, we hope the reopening of the town hall will offer another reason for people to spend time in our beautiful city at a time when the visitor economy is crucial to the county's recovery from the coronavirus pandemic.'

The town hall began opening to the public in November 2018 and welcomed more than 11,000 visitors in just a year.

Visitors can learn about the powerful Prince Bishops who ruled the county from the 11th Century, the evolution of local government, and how the town hall developed from the first timber structure of 1356 to the building it is today.

They can also find out about the role of the Mayor and the Mayor's Bodyguard, who have been based at the site since 1602, and the ancient trade guilds and freemen of the city, who for centuries held political and economic power in the city and who continue to meet in the building's Guildhall.

# NEWTON AYCLIFFE

A Long History of a New Town

Stephen Creaney





Our Town is only 72 years old yet has progressed from farmland to a vibrant community that has shown significant jobs and population growth in that short time. The history of this evolution has begun to be documented. Author Stephen Creaney is publishing a book entitled "Newton Aycliffe - A Long History of a New Town" which is to be printed by Newton Press.

After two years of research, former resident Stephen Creaney, describes how the town was established from raw farmland, a Church was created in a farmhouse, and pubs and shops were gradually opened. He describes how certain local individuals inspired the community to build something from nothing, creating over 40 local clubs within 5 years, and how the decades that followed brought significant growth as well as challenges including anti-social behaviour, vandalism, industrial accidents, pollution and bad press. The book attempts to describe the Great Aycliffe area from before the advent of the railways through the Second World War to the present-day. The early history of Newton Aycliffe itself is described on a year-by-year basis as the Town grew quickly and then decadeby-decade in the later years.

The book was an outgrowth of participation on the Photographic History of Newton Aycliffe Facebook Group where many former residents shared their memories and photographs of their 'artifacts'. Research was helped by discussions with Vivien and David Ellis who have been collecting Great Aycliffe data for many years, Great Aycliffe Town Council, Durham County Council, English Heritage, the London School of Economics (the Beveridge Archive) and many others. The archive maintained by the Newton News is also an extremely valuable reference set. The book is available through a number of local retailers including Newton Press.

My parents, Jim and Eva Creaney, were pioneers on the New Town, moving into a prefabricated bungalow in late 1948. I owe my upbringing to them, as well as my early life in Newton Aycliffe and this book is a way of 'giving something back' to this great Town. The book costs £12.99 with all proceeds going to a Newton Aycliffe charity.

# Supporting Hepatitis C **Action Plan**

County Durham Drug and Alcohol Recovery Services signed up to a new Hepatitis C Action Plan to mark World Hepatitis Day on 28th July. The action plan aims to further increase testing for Hepatitis C, ensuring specialist pathways and onsite treatment for the virus. Phil Ransome, Area Manager for the County Durham drug and alcohol recovery service, said: "We know that Hepatitis C is most commonly spread through blood-to-blood contact, such as sharing needles.

We are fully behind this plan because it will be of real benefit for the lives of the people who use our service across the county. The plan by Humankind, which is the lead partner in County Durham Drug and Alcohol Recovery Services, is in response to a recent government report, which stated that across the country, people are

not getting access to needle and syringe services as they should. The charity has said there should be "no closed doors" in any of its services.

Among a list of pledges set out in the plan, the organisation states it Invest in staff to increase testing rates and re-testing rates of people

at risk invest in training for staff to ensure we have a skilled workforce

· allow time for data inputting

ensure testing provision is across the whole treatment system

reach out to people not registered with its services

 commit to listening to what people who use its services say on how best to tackle the issue.

Meanwhile, County Durham Drug and Alcohol Recovery Services is joining a national campaign to raise awareness of Hepatitis C and the fact it can now be cured by a simple course of tablets.

On World Hepatitis Day, the organisation, along with a range of other charities, NHS Trusts and the Hep C Trust are backing the Hep C U Later campaign online and within its services.

Phil said: "Our message is that this virus can be treated and can actually be cured easily!

"It's not like the old treatment which lasted for months and sometimes had side effects. The success rate for this short course of tablets is much higher and it's unlikely you'll feel ill.'



# New Look Café to Open at Bishop Auckland Town Hall

The opening of a new look café will offer people a taster of a £1.5 million revamp of a historic town hall.

Bishop Auckland Town Hall was due to reopen to the public earlier this year following a major refurbishment programme, but this has been



delayed due to the coronavirus pandemic.

However, Durham County Council, which owns the building, has introduced a number of measures which mean the venue's revamped café opened on Monday 3 August.

The improvement work has included relocating the café to the ground floor in order to provide a much larger, brighter and more welcoming space. A new menu featuring locally sourced produce has also been introduced.

The café also provides the new home to Norman Cornish's Miners' Gala mural, which has been relocated from County Hall, in Durham. The piece is on display alongside a stunning stained-glass feature by fellow local artist Tom McGuinness. New interpretation panels have been created for the pieces, but will not be installed until the building is able to open in full.

In order to reduce the risk of the spread of coronavirus, extra space has been created between tables in the café, while additional signage has been introduced to support social distancing. Cllr Joy Allen, Cabinet member for transformation, culture and tourism, said: "We are delighted to be able to open the café at Bishop Auckland Town Hall, particularly after such a lengthy closure. "It is disappointing that we were not able to go ahead with our plans to reopen the whole building in the spring and show off all of the improvements that have been carried out, but at least we are able to finally welcome people back with the opening of the café. Customers will even be able to enjoy our exclusive, locally sourced 'Bishop Auckland Town Hall' brand of coffee.

"Since the easing of lockdown restrictions, the town's market place has seen a real boost in visitors and I am sure the additional outdoor seating will attract even more people, boosting the local economy. "I very much look forward to the time when people are able to see all of the improvements we have made but, in the meantime, I hope they will take advantage of the opportunity to have a first look at our newly refurbished town hall."

The café is open Monday to Saturday, from 10am to 4pm, and there is no need to book in advance. It is hoped that an evening supper menu will be introduced when the theatre programme returns. The town hall's new-look library is also one of 10 new locations where bookworms will be able to access Pick and Collect services from Monday (3 August). The service, which was launched earlier this month, enables members of the public to order up to three books online or over the phone. They can then collect their chosen titles from a participating library from an allocated day onwards. The library will remain closed for browsing and PC access. Bishop Auckland Town Hall closed last August to enable the refurbishment scheme to be carried out. As well as significant improvements to the café and library, work has included the

creation of a new gallery space and significant improvements to the auditorium.

# Free Training Hub to Improve Mental Health and Wellbeing in the Workplace

A free training hub is raising the standard of mental health support for employees across County Durham.

Small and mediumsized enterprises (SME) and voluntary and community sector (VCS) organisations with fewer than 250 employees based in County Durham, are being offered free training and support to raise awareness of the importance of good mental health, reduce stigma and foster a supportive environment for employees.



Commissioned by Durham County Council and delivered by Hartlepool and East Durham MIND (HEDM), the hub can be accessed free of charge by SME and VCS organisations. This programme is funded for two years.

The programmes will comprise of eLearning and traditional delivery formats, although face to face training is currently on hold due to the coronavirus pandemic. Methods of delivery will however be reviewed regularly in line with local and national guidance on this matter. Business owners, managers and employees are all welcome to join the hub. All organisations, irrespective of sector, will benefit from the training provided.

Cllr Lucy Hovvels, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for adult and health services said: "We know that good mental health is

important in every aspect of our lives. This hub is designed to make good quality mental health support available to as many individuals as possible. We spend a lot of time in our workplace, so making sure the environment in which we work, and the people we work with, are all educated on mental health is a major positive for businesses and for the people who work there.

"As a result of their size, SME and VCS organisations may well have fewer resources to commit to this type of training, but size doesn't make these issues any less important. Indeed, the impact of mental health and wellbeing issues, for example from staff absence due to ill-health, is likely to be bigger and more strongly felt in smaller workplaces."

Sarah Slaven, interim managing director Business Durham, said: "Business Durham recognises the importance of good workforce health and wellbeing, and this has been particularly important recently where we have seen first-hand the pressures faced by people working in businesses across the county.

"Small and medium sized businesses make up the majority of our businesses, and this resource will support them to develop the skills required to build resilience to meet the challenges of the coming months."

Subjects included in the hub training include mental health awareness, managing stress and improving personal resilience, certificated Mental Health First Aid and recognising and combating mental health stigma and discrimination.

Again, the support that they continue to provide to our community is just brilliant, including children's activities on Tuesdays and Wednesdays for the next 3 weeks during the summer holiday period.

Last Friday I took part in a Question and Answer session with some members of the Aycliffe Business Community. It never ceases to amaze me the diversity of businesses that exist. The questions were led by Martin Walker, but the best part for me was listening to the businesses give their own good news stories, in challenging times like we are in, these were really encouraging. It is good to see the connections that are made between the businesses within Aycliffe Business Park and the surrounding area and I will be a regular attender.

On Monday I joined Cllr Dorothy Bowman at the relaunch of the Men Talking Together Group that she has set up, the group is located in Unit 14a, The I.E.S. Centre, DL5 6DR. # Business Support Scheme Extended Ahead of Government Deadline

More businesses are set to benefit from a financial support scheme set up to help them deal with the impact of the coronavirus pandemic. Durham County Council is widening the eligibility criteria for its local Discretionary Grants Fund so that hundreds more businesses can benefit.

The authority is making the changes to ensure that as much of the £5 million funding pot provided by the Government is allocated before the scheme closes on Friday, 28 August.

Up until now, the funding has been focussed on businesses in the retail, hospitality and leisure sectors and has prioritised support for small businesses in shared offices or other flexible workspaces; regular market traders with fixed building costs; B&Bs that pay council tax instead of business rates; charity properties in receipt of charitable business rates relief; private nurseries; small manufacturing businesses with retail outlets within the property and which sell to the public; and businesses involved in the supply chain to the retail hospitality and leisure industries.

The scheme has been extended to include:

- Any local small or micro business operating from a recognised rated business premises with a rateable value less than £51,000; and
- Businesses in the science and technology sector which occupy office or other flexible workspace with equivalent rent or property costs of £51,000.

The council is planning on contacting all businesses it believes will be eligible to benefit from the revised scheme to encourage them to make an application and ensure they are able to access they money they are entitled to. Each business will be entitled to claim one grant. Cllr Carl Marshall, Cabinet member for economic regeneration, said: "The county's economic recovery from the coronavirus pandemic is very much dependent on the survival of our business community. It is vitally important that we do all we can to help them through this financially difficult time.

"We have carefully considered how to extend the scheme and open it up to support local businesses with the resources we have. We know there are many businesses that desperately need support but there is only limited funding available and we are determined to spend all of it if we can.

"We were recognised at a national level for our success towards the beginning of the pandemic in quickly and efficiently passing on funding that has provided a lifeline to many County Durham businesses.

The Government announced in July that its Small Business Grant Fund (SBGF), Retail, Hospitality and Leisure Grant Fund (RHLGF) and the Local Discretionary Grants Funds, which were all set up to support businesses during the pandemic, will close on Friday, 28 August. This means that the money made available to County Durham must be allocated by this date and any funding that is not claimed will be lost.

In order to ensure that all paperwork can be processed and money paid before the cut off date, the council will not be able to accept applications received after Sunday, 16 August.

Durham County Council has already issued almost all the funding it is responsible for allocating through the SBGF and RHLGF, with 8,791 businesses receiving a share of more than £98 million.

It has also allocated 54 per cent of the cash it has available through the Discretionary Grants Fund, which was introduced at a later date, with more than £2.6 million being distributed among 407 businesses to date.

Some additional eligibility criteria will apply to the extended scheme but the council is doing all it can to ensure as many businesses as possible receive a share of the funding.

County Durham's newest adult social care workers are settling into their posts following a recruitment drive prompted by the coronavirus pandemic. County Durham Care Academy launched the fast-track recruitment and training programme in April in response to pressures being placed on the

sector by the crisis.



More than 200 people expressed an interest in care worker, domestic assistant and kitchen assistant roles, with 24 progressing into work.

The Care Academy was launched by Durham County Council last year to support the development of a skilled and valued adult social care workforce in the county.

Its latest recruitment drive, matching applicants to opportunities in their local area, reached more than one million people via social media. The academy also offers remote training and development to provide potential new staff with the skills they will need to access opportunities in the sector.

There are more than 100 independent sector care providers in County Durham, supporting adults with social and physical activities including household tasks, personal care and attending appointments.

Devonshire House in West Auckland was one of the first care homes to make an appointment through the campaign, taking on new care worker, Billy Coyle, from Bishop Auckland.

Billy was forced to look for a change of a career during the coronavirus pandemic and is enjoying his new career so much he has now enrolled on a level 2 diploma in adult social care with the Care Academy. He said: "I was unemployed, I decided to give it a go and looked it up on the link through to the Care Academy website and filled in my details. There were 12 to 15 units to complete online before my details were circulated to local residential care homes and other companies in the private care sector.

"It took about two weeks to complete all the training. I'm dyslexic so the support I was given through the Care Academy to help me through certain parts of my modules was brilliant. Around a week later I had my interview at Devonshire House then my induction and shadow shifts.

"The transition from my previous roles to this was fantastic – I couldn't ask for a better team. If it wasn't for the Care Academy, I wouldn't have had the specific training online and the basic knowledge to get me started in the care system."




