

# SIX COUNTY DURHAM SWIMMING **POOLS TO REOPEN**

Six Durham County Council-run facilities welcomed swimmers back from Monday (10 August), for the first time since being forced to close in March due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Sessions at the Louisa Centre, in Stanley; Freeman's Quay, in Durham; and leisure centres in Chester-le-Street, Newton Aycliffe, Woodhouse Close and Teesdale; must be booked in advance.

Swimmers are also being advised to expect a number of changes to allow for social distancing and to reflect public health advice.

Activity will be limited to lane swimming throughout the week, with some family fun sessions at weekends and aqua fit classes. All children under 16 must be accompanied

In order to limit the risk of spreading coronavirus, usual shower, changing and locker facilities will not be available. Instead. swimmers will be asked to wear their costumes under their clothes when arriving for their swim session. They will then be allocated a chair at the side of the pool where they can leave their clothes and any other belongings. Changing facilities will be available when exiting the pool. Cllr Carl Marshall, Cabinet member for

able to reopen our pools as well. "Going for a swim is going to be a little different for the time being, but the changes we have made are extremely important in order to protect customers and staff and help prevent the spread of coronavirus. Without them we would not be able to reopen our pools. That said, I'm sure many people will be so pleased to get back in the pool that they will get used to the changes. "It's vital that we work to reinstate services wherever possible in order to support the county's recovery from the pandemic."

Ongoing maintenance work at Consett Pool means it will also remain closed for the time being. It is also not possible to reopen the pool at Spennymoor leisure centre at this time. The pool is not suitable for lane swimming, meaning effective social distancing measures cannot be introduced. The council is in discussions with the contractor responsible for operating Peterlee Leisure Centre with regard to an opening date.

# Police Launch New Road Safety Scheme This Month

As covid-19 lockdown restrictions ease, officers have seen an increase in the levels of traffic on the roads and have been listening to residents who say speeding is a concern in their communities.

The new bureau will be able to conduct safety camera deployments at nominated sites across County Durham and Darlington and also look to educate drivers on other road safety offences such as the use of seatbelts and using mobile phones.

Bureau manager, Terri Raine, for Durham Constabulary said: "This is an important area of activity which we know helps make communities safer and will therefore always be a priority for the constabulary.

"As well as targeting speeding motorists, the force will also be targeting uninsured drivers who put other road users in danger especially as they are often involved in other crimes such as drugs offences or driving without a licence.

"Bad driving can have devastating consequences for everyone involved so we would always encourage drivers to think twice and just slow down."

Acting Police Victims' Commissioner, Steve White, added: "This is a local priority in the Police and Crime plan and is something I take seriously.

"Speeding is an issue that is regularly highlighted to us by communities across Durham and Darlington and we are determined to take action and support of local residents."

In preparation for its launch, the new unit has already identified dangerous drivers who flaunt speed limits across County Durham and Darlington.

For example, on a 30mph road in Sherburn Hill, 59 vehicles were speeding within just one hour with the highest recorded speed being 51mph.

After a visit to Maiden Law near Lanchester, 47 vehicles were speeding with the worst offenders travelling at 52mph in a 30mph limit and in Geneva Road in Darlington, a vehicle was also clocked doing 52mph in the 30mph zone.

# N.A.F.C. REPORT



### Saturday 8 August - Pre-season friendly Newton Aycliffe 5 v Tow Law 1

Newton Aycliffe returned to action on Saturday for the first time in five months, coming from behind to kick-start their pre-season with a comprehensive victory over Tow Law Town. The game was played behind closed doors due to current government and FA guidance which prohibits spectators at matches involving National League System clubs.

Ben Reay scored the pick of the bunch along with goals from Adam Burnicle, Ryan Redford and a double from Arran Wearmouth helping to seal a comfortable win at the Beaumont Landscapes Stadium. Former Aycliffe man, Mattie Moffat, opened the scoring for the Lawyers in the early stages striking from distance to catch out goalkeeper Adam Pickford who could only parry the ball into the side of the net.

The visitors looked sharper in the opening 10 minutes having played their first game of pre-season against Consett in mid-week. Colin Stromsoy's men began to shake off the cobwebs after conceding with Burnicle looking a threat to the Tow Law back line. The striker saw one effort cleared off the line after going around the goalkeeper before his far post strike was deflected into the side netting.

Eventually the hosts did get back on terms after Liam Walters was brought down in the area. Burnicle stepped up and sent the keeper the wrong way to level the scores. The water break allowed Stromsoy to shuffle his pack a little, bringing on Arran Wearmouth who put the hosts in front 10 minutes before the break. Liam Jarvie found space on the right and his cross eventually made its way to Wearmouth who converted from close range.

Wearmouth doubled his tally moments later as Aycliffe were awarded another penalty after an excellent passage of play was brought to an abrupt end by the Tow Law goalkeeper.

Jarvie almost added a fourth before the half time whistle as Aycliffe really began to find their stride.

A string of changes at the break from Stromsoy was rewarded inside three minutes of the second half with the goal of the game from Reay. After a neat interchange down the left-hand-side, Reay found space on the edge of the penalty area before expertly curling into the top corner beyond the outstretched hand of the goalkeeper.

Six minutes later and Aycliffe had their fifth following a lapse in concentration in the Lawayers back line which allowed Wearmouth to run clear. Despite being on a hat-trick, Wearmouth unselfishly rolled the ball to Redford who tapped into an empty net.

Aycliffe could have scored more in the second half and had a sixth ruled out for offside as the Northern League Division Two outfit tired in the blistering Aycliffe sunshine.

There was still time for a third penalty of the game however as Connor Phelan was adjudged to have impeded Moffat.

Moffat stepped up to take the spot kick but was unable to add a consolation as his penalty was saved by Pickford down to his right. It proved to be the end of the goalmouth action as Aycliffe ran out comfortable winners in what was a pleasing first performance back from Stromsoy's men.



# **Aycliffe Cricket Club Scoreboard Report**



Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's 1st team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, had a disappointing six wicket defeat away at fast improving Norton 1st team in the NYSD 2nd division. Electing to bat first Aycliffe were dismissed for 149 after 48.2 overs thanks to a good innings from captain Adam Randall (sponsored by DTS Joinery), who top scored with 37 and he received good support from Jack Slatcher (29 runs) and his younger brother George chipped in with 15 runs. 

# ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR AND OFF ROAD BIKES

As many of our residents know only too well, there are a number of off-road bikes being ridden illegally around the town. This is an issue that affects all parts of County Durham and is difficult to resolve as the tactics available to us have to avoid putting the safety of the public at risk.

Therefore we rely heavily on information from the public so that we can take action against those responsible. This is not a quick process and we have procedures we must follow. However, the team are keen to work with our community to reduce this dangerous nuisance.

We have our Operation Endurance (motorbike) team to support us, but they are a small team covering the whole of Co Durham and Cleveland. Hopefully the information we are providing below will assist residents and we encourage you all to help us and provide the information we need. We have already acted upon information provided over the past two weeks and have issued 3 warnings as a direct result.

The next step will be to seize these bikes. Please report these incidents by phoning 101 and if you have any pictures or footage then you can private message our Newton Aycliffe Police Facebook page.

Grants Available to Support Independent Living

County Durham residents with disabilities are being reminded to take advantage of home improvement grants of up to £30,000. Durham County Council's Home Improvement Agency helps disabled and vulnerable residents access grants to adapt their homes to meet their needs.

Disabled Facilities Grants can help to fund improvements that will enhance disabled people's quality of life, enabling them to live in their own homes for longer.

Typical adaptations include:

- ramps
- stairlifts
- through floor lifts
- extensions (for ground floor living) •
- level access showers
- external lifts
- internal alterations
- external alterations

Owner-occupiers, private rental tenants and housing association tenants are all eligible.

As well as the grants, home improvement loans are available to anyone who owns their own home. Repayment, equity and interest free loans are on offer and can fund works including roof renewal and repairs, window and door renewal, damp proofing, electrical and heating improvements and structural work.

There is also a project management service for anyone planning adaptions in their own homes. For a small fee, a housing surveyor can design to an individual's brief, tender, appoint contractors and project manage the work through to completion. This can be anything from small scale internal work to larger extensions, along with adaptations for disabled clients who do not qualify for grant assistance.

The Home Improvement Agency also provides advice and guidance to help people who are older and/or disabled find out about adaptions that could benefit them.

Riding a motorbike in an antisocial manner can result in prosecution for the rider, or the parents who are held accountable for the actions of their children.

It is illegal to ride any motorbike in public open spaces such as parks, play areas and on pavements.

You can only ride an off road motorbike legally if it's on private land, and you have the land owners permission. Land owned by the local council is not classed as private land.

Illegally used off road bikes can be seized and crushed.

A rider must:

- Be aged 17 or over (or 16 if the bike is a moped)
- Hold a valid driving license
- Have valid motor insurance
- Wear suitable safety equipment

Failure to comply is a criminal offence and may result in prosecution under the Road Traffic Act 1988 and Police Reform Act 2002. Off road bikes are regarded as motor vehicles they must be constructed to a specific standard in order to be ridden on a public highway.

They must also have:

- DVLA registration (Log book)
- A valid MOT
- Road Tax
- Fitted with lights
- Fitted with registration plates

Helpful information would include:

- . The name and address of the owner of the off road bike
- Where the bike is stored
- When and where the bike is used (e.g days, times, and routes)
- Any other useful information such as description of those who use the bike, its make/model/ colour.



# NEW BUSINESS PARK MOVES ANOTHER STEP FORWARD WITH GOVERNMENT SUPPORT

Plans for a major new business park in Durham City are progressing thanks to £6 million of government funding.

Durham County Council has secured the money from the government's Getting Building Fund, which aims to deliver jobs, skills and infrastructure across the country.

The funding will cover half the cost of the first building on the proposed Aykley Heads Business Park, enabling the creation of office space on 'Plot C', which has been identified as Phase 1 of the development for the new business park. The council will contribute the other half of the cost, with the building totalling £12 million.

The three-storey building will offer 3,500 sqm of office space, providing flexible accommodation to either single or multiple employers in an accessible and sought-after location close to the East Coast Main Line and other public transport, as well as cycling routes. It will also offer more than 60 car parking spaces.

Once completed, this project will create up to 300 jobs whilst acting as a catalyst for the wider masterplan and stimulating over £150 million of private sector investment.

Cllr Simon Henig, Leader of Durham County Council, said: "I am delighted that we have secured government funding to cover half of the cost of the first new building at the proposed Aykley Heads Business Park. It's just three weeks since we announced that a planning application had been submitted, marking the start of the process that will see up to 4,000 new, high quality jobs coming to Durham.

see up to 4,000 new, high quality jobs coming to Durham. "Today marks an important next step in bringing forward the first building and turning our vision into a reality. It is clear that the government has seen the potential of the site and its excellent locational advantages and the tremendous environment that already exists.

"This development, providing high quality offices in a mature parkland



setting, meets the demands of business and the office market. It also promotes sustainable travel as well as employee wellbeing, suitable for modern methods of working and digitally enabled to promote excellent work for now and in the future. That's one of the reasons why we believe it will create a future model for business parks.

"Moreover, with an uncertain business market as a result of the coronavirus pandemic, we believe these plans will stimulate private investment, secure job opportunities and support businesses, helping to transform the county and establish Durham as a jobs hub

within the North East."


Aykley Heads, north of the city centre, is already home to Atom Bank, Waterstons, the North East England Chamber of Commerce, Salvus House and many other businesses.

Once fully completed, the entire business park is proposed to provide up to 38,468sqm of floorspace and to be divided into an initial two phases and six plots. Each plot proposes office buildings and car parking spaces.

James Ramsbotham, chief executive of the North East Chamber of Commerce, which is supporting the proposed park, said: "It is fantastic that the government has agreed to provide funding towards this exciting development at Aykley Heads. It's a big step in the vision to establish a dynamic business park in the north east becoming a reality. "With superb access to the national road and rail network, an

internationally renowned university and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, this site is exceptional and will no doubt help to strengthen the North East's position in commerce."

On a more serious note, we have seen a lot of hogs who have been so traumatised by various things, dogs etc. It has proved sometimes fatal, hedgehogs are now on the at risk list of extinction which puts more pressure on us to act and get them into rescue centres as soon as they are discovered, that alone gives us a better chance to save them. For anyone who wants more information the hedgehog street app shows what we can do to help the population recover. Joan's hoglets are still doing very nicely, very small and their eyes have just opened, quite adorable characters. All rescue hedgehogs are doing very well and responding well to medication, too small for release, but time is on their side still.

Tip of the week: Make a hedgehog highway, cut a small hole about the size of a CD on the bottom of your garden fence, this will enable hedgehogs to pass through your gardens.

# **Extra Boost to Support Working Families Affected by Coronavirus**

Families who benefit from government funded childcare support were given a boost today as the Government announced that they would not lose out due to COVID-19.

Working parents or carers, who are eligible for Tax-Free Childcare or 30 Hours Free Childcare but have temporarily fallen below the minimum income requirement as a result of the pandemic, will continue to receive financial support until 31 October.

Critical workers who may exceed the income threshold for the 2020-21 tax year, as a result of working more to play a vital role in tackling the coronavirus pandemic, will continue to receive support this tax vear.

Through Tax-Free Childcare, delivered by HMRC, families will receive a £2 government top-up for every £8 they pay into their child's account, up to the value of £2,000 per child, or £4,000 per disabled child in financial support. The money can be used towards the cost of qualifying childcare for a child up to the age of 11 or 17 for a disabled child.

HMRC's Deputy Chief Executive and Second Permanent Secretary, Angela MacDonald, said:

"HMRC has been providing vital financial support to families during a time when it has been needed most and we will continue to help them as they gradually transition back to a normal life.

"We want to make sure families will not be adversely affected by any abrupt change in circumstances, which is why we have extended available support through Tax-Free Childcare to give families that

The Department for Education (DfE) provides 30 Hours Free Childcare to eligible three to four year olds in England with more than 600,000 three and four year olds benefitting from this offer in the first two years of delivery, and nearly 350,000 children benefitted from 30 hours in January 2020 alone. DfE has seen more than 55,000 parents applying for 30 hours places since the start of lockdown restrictions which demonstrates how essential this support is and why parents' eligibility must be protected.

DfE's Children's Minister, Vicky Ford, said: "Our 30 Hours childcare offer has always been about supporting parents back into work, and in these times, this ambition is now more important than ever. That is why we are again extending eligibility for the government's childcare offers so that no parent loses out because of a fall in income due to coronavirus.

"This builds on our significant financial support for the early years sector – who are so integral to the UK's recovery from this pandemic. We are continuing to provide longer term reassurance to nurseries and childminders that are open by 'block-buying' childcare places for the rest of this year at the level we would have funded before coronavirus, regardless of how many children are attending." To continue receiving the financial support for Tax-Free Childcare and 30 Hours Free Childcare, parents need to reconfirm their eligibility every three months.

HMRC has continued to help Working Tax Credit claimants with the cost of childcare throughout the pandemic. Parents and carers in receipt of the childcare element of Working Tax Credits who have continued to pay childcare fees they have incurred, despite their children being unable to access childcare because of COVID-19, must notify HMRC if they expect this to continue beyond 7 September. After this date HMRC will no longer pay the childcare element for those in this position.

Claimants should update HMRC as soon as possible if their childcare stops or if the costs for their childcare decrease or end. Parents and carers can report such changes by calling the tax credits helpline.




# **Baghdaddies Bring Brass and Cheer**



# Eat Out to Help Out Scheme First Week Figures

HMRC has published figures for the first week of the Eat Out to Help Out scheme: **Up to midnight on 9 August** 

- Total number of registered individual restaurant premises 83,000
- Total number of claims made by businesses 14,000
- Total number of individual restaurant premises claimed for 22,000
- Total amount claimed £53.7m
- Number of covers claimed for 10.5m

Chancellor of the Exchequer, Rishi Sunak, said: "Britons are eating out to help out in big numbers. And they aren't just getting a great deal – they're supporting the almost 2 million people employed in this sector. These amazing figures show that our plan for jobs is delivering."





Last week started with a busy Wednesday morning where I first joined Ben Houchen in launching the new flights from Teesside to Heathrow. Not everyone realises but Teesside Airport is predominately in the Sedgefield constituency. It was great to see this reintroduction as this now means we have excellent connectivity from here to the rest of the world via both Heathrow and Amsterdam allowing both business and leisure options.

I then went straight to Ferryhill where the local Councillors have started a petition supporting efforts to reopen Ferryhill Railway Station. I am also working with the Labour MP's to the north of me in reworking an application to reinstate the Leamside Line which would significantly improve connections and rail capacity into Tyneside and Wearside.

After a couple of days away with Mrs H, I then joined Cleveland Bridge on the M42 where they were installing the first steel bridge on the HS2 project. This bridge has been fabricated from weathering steel (same as the Angel of the North) at their site in Darlington, which is within the Sedgefield constituency. It was then transported in 16 sections, the largest of which was 50 tonnes, before being assembled next to the junction to create a structure weighing 2,750 tonnes. This structure was then moved into place whilst I was there on Saturday, to see a man driving a bridge is a new experience for me! The important message for me from this is that when people ask what HS2 does for the North East, the answer is twofold, it is the increased capacity on our national rail network but additionally the jobs it supports for local industry.

Monday saw me back at Play Cafe, probably the last time for a while due to other commitments and then Westminster reopening. Tuesday has seen a number of constituents meeting me in our offices.

To give you a flavour of our emails for the week, we have the usual personal ones from constituents that we try to prioritise and then we have campaign emails that are from a coordinated source and are an identical email sent from numerous people, we will answer these but after the more personal ones. The greatest quantity of these this week were Newcastle United and Super Trawlers, I have supported both the need for more transparency from the Premier League and the need for us to increase control of our waters.

Stay safe, wash your hands, cover your face and give people space.



# House Special is Vicar's

For one Church of England Diocese of Durham Vicar, applying her Chinese cultural heritage to the task of keeping parishioners safe during COVID is proving to be something of a house speciality. Reopening churches for public worship within Covid-19 safety protocols has challenged clergy to adopt innovative ways to deliver

One such vicar, the Revd Eileen Harrop Vicar of St Mary's in Gainford and St Andrew's in Winston, decided that the best way to administer the bread at the Eucharist (Holy Communion) was to use extra-long serving Chopsticks. Eileen's confidence in using them coming from her upbringing and love of Asian cooking learnt from her childhood in Singapore.

Revd Eileen said: "Many of my parishioners were quite anxious at the thought of taking communion, even though we are only permitted to do so under strict guidelines to ensure that there is no chance of transmission of the virus. I thought, why can't I use a long pair of Chopsticks, real bread rather than wafers and drop it into the communicants' hands? Administering the communion in this way ensures that there is no cross-contamination and my parishioners feel reassured and confident to take part.

"It's rather special that the long chopsticks I use are normally used for the festive occasion 'Lo Hei' meaning 'stir the uplifted breath of life'. They take on an even greater meaning used in this context. "This is a first for both churches, and perhaps a first in any parish church in the diocese. My congregation at St Andrew's, Winston, received Communion this way for their first service, following on from testing the idea at St Mary's, Gainford the previous week." Revd Eileen is Singaporean Chinese and spent her early years there during the country's transition to Independence from Britain. Eileen came to the UK to study at Keele University in 1979.

She met Brian, her husband of 35 years, while completing her teaching placement in her final year of university, returning to Singapore for a period before once again coming back to the UK, for postgraduate study and finally marrying Brian. The couple lived in Singapore for a period where Eileen worked and travelled as an organisational change consultant to multinational conglomerates, and Brian was a University lecturer. Eileen and Brian returned to the UK in 1996 and Eileen prepared for Ordination at Ridley Hall and Wolfston College, Cambridge before being ordained in Canterbury Cathedral in 2012.



# **Planning Permission Approved for New Durham Bus Station**

An outdated County Durham bus station is to be replaced with a brand-new building as part of plans to support the county's economic recovery.

Planning permission has been approved by Durham County Council for preparations to begin in autumn which will see the existing Durham Bus Station, on North Road, demolished and in its place have a modern and spacious transport hub built.

The new bus station has been designed to increase the overall

space for passengers in a light and airy setting. There will also be improved facilities, such as increased toilet provision, including parent and child and a changing facility, as well as increased seating and space in the passenger circulation and waiting areas.

The design will provide increased visibility and safety for buses entering and leaving the station. This includes increasing the reversing area for buses leaving bays and improved visibility when exiting onto North Road.

Investment in the new station is part of the council's plans to support the county in its economic recovery following the impact of the coronavirus outbreak. The bus station has been designed to provide residents with a safe and attractive space while ensuring visitors to the city are welcomed with the best first impression possible. It will help support businesses in their recovery from the pandemic by improving transport links, attracting visitors to Durham via the station, and increase footfall into the city centre to support the city's independent retailers, hospitality sector, and its indoor and outdoor

In advance of the demolition, temporary bus stops will be built on North Road and Milburngate, with the stops being available for passengers to use from early 2021 while work is ongoing. During this period, all bus services will be moved on-street with stop locations and timetables advertised in advance.

Demolition of the building is expected to begin early next year with construction to start in Spring 2021 with the completed building open to the public by Summer 2022.

Cllr Carl Marshall, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for economic regeneration, said: "We're delighted to be moving on to the next stage of the regeneration of North Road, with the investment in a brand new, state-of-the-art bus station for our residents, visitors, and businesses.

"The new station has been designed to create a modern transport hub that fits the historic nature of Durham but also is a safe and welcoming space for those who are coming and going from the city. We would like to thank the residents of the city and the surrounding villages who took part in the consultation and helped to inform the design.
