Sixth Form students at UTC South Durham celebrated their A-level results on Thursday 20th August 2020. All students passed their A-levels and equivalent qualifications, and every student has secured or is in the process of securing employment, an apprenticeship (higher or degree), or a place of university. Principal Tom Dower said: 'We are delighted for all our students and wish to congratulate them on their results. The results are testimony to the hard work of our exceptional students and commitment of our teaching

This year has been difficult for many of us, but particularly for students in Year 13 who have faced a great deal of uncertainty with regards to their education and future. We are incredibly proud of their academic achievements, but also of them as the confident and driven young professionals we have seen them become."

A number of students have secured apprenticeships with companies based in the North East, including Joe Allen and Oliver Trowell who are joining civil engineering company Costain, Stephen Henry is now working with BTS Fabrications, and Will Barker has joining Teescraft Engineering as an engineer in quality.

Kirsten Parr, who studied Maths, Further Maths, and Physics, is due to start a degree apprenticeship with accounting firm Ernst Young in Newcastle, and Felicity Nkomo is due to start with international design company Hanson as a degree level design apprentice. Other students have secured employment further afield, including Finn Trewhitt who is working as an Installation Engineer in Italy. All students who applied to university were successful and all are going to study



STEM degrees: Jack Clarke is going to study Engineering at York University, Tom Shepherd is heading to Loughborough to study Product Design Engineering, Ben Miller and Sam Hall have secured places at Northumbria to study Mechanical Engineering and Foundation Engineering respectively. This year, as exams were cancelled because of the pandemic, students' grades were based on teacher assessments, supported with evidence of their work which was submitted to the exam boards.

Based in Newton Aycliffe Business Park, UTC South Durham is a STEM focused Sixth Form and school for 14-19 year olds. Sixth Form at UTC offers a range of STEM A-levels and equivalent Level 3 courses, in addition to a pre-apprenticeship Engineering Technician course.

Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's 1st team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, won an exciting game at home to second in the table Hartlepool 2nd XI by four wickets in their NYSD second division clash. The visitors were asked to bat first and scored a very challenging 186 for 9 in their allotted 50 overs. George Slatcher (sponsored by Dean and Tina Greaves) was the pick of the Aycliffe bowlers taking 4 for 28 from his marathon 12 over spell. He was given good support from acting captain Michael Howe (2 for 30) and also both James Layfield-Carroll and Matty Greaves, who each chipped in with a wicket.



In reply opener Luke Telford (sponsored by Subhan Christudas) top scored with an impressive 43 from 65 balls and his fellow opener Sam Telford also batted well hitting a typically belligerent 38 from 36 balls as the pair recorded a first wicket partnership of 61 to put Aycliffe firmly in the driving seat. However, the dogged Hartlepool attack chipped away at the Aycliffe batting and took wickets at regular intervals leaving Aycliffe wobbling at 135 for 5. Jack Slatcher (23 runs) batted with energy before he was dismissed with the score at 171 for 6 leaving Chris Palmer to use all his experience to help see his side safely home to their victory target after 46.5 overs, finishing unbeaten with a vital 25 runs from 28 balls faced. The club's u15's had a terrific result when they beat Richmond for the first time in their history when they came out on top in their home game by 16 runs in the NYACC. After being asked to bat first, Aycliffe totalled an above par 100 for 5 in their allotted 18 overs. Owen Smith continued his excellent form with a superb innings of 42 runs off just 40 balls and he hit five boundaries and opener Leo Mercy also deserves praise for scoring 23 runs, his best score of the season. In reply Richmond were restricted to 84 for 8 from their 18 overs thanks to some brilliant bowling by the talented spin pair Matty Greaves (4 for 4) and Tom Dearden (2 for 26).



IS YOUR CHILD ROAD SAFETY AWARE?

Survey of Parents Reveals Road Safety Fears

Most parents do not think their children understand road dangers or concentrate properly when near roads, a new survey reveals as pupils prepare to set off back to school from next week. Safety campaigners have urged parents to help children learn the Green Cross Code "as they would"



their spellings or times tables". In a survey by YouGov, commissioned for Injury Prevention Week (17-21 August) almost two-thirds of parents did not think their children had a good understanding of the dangers or concentrate near roads.

"One in eight parents went as far as to say they are very concerned about their children's safety," said Sam Elsby, president of APIL - a not-for-profit group for injured people, which hosts Injury Prevention Week.

"The Highway Code states that children should not be allowed out alone until they can understand and use the Green Cross Code properly. So it is particularly important for those children who may be walking to school without a parent or guardian for the first time this term," said Mr Elsby.

"I urge parents to be proactive this Injury Prevention Week. Support children in their knowledge and understanding as it is their best tool for avoiding harm on the roads," he went on.

"Test your children this week on crossing between parked cars and on bends. And ask them if they know to look out for reverse lights so they know if a car is about to move backwards. Test them in the same way you would test them on their spellings or times tables," said Mr Elsby.





Member Wins National Award

A woman who started life as a police staff apprentice has seen her career take a phenomenal path culminating in a national award. Sheena Urwin, who heads up the **Criminal Justice Department** at Durham Constabulary, has been awarded **Police Staff Member** of the Year by the **British Association** for Women in Policing. Mrs Urwin has spent her whole career working for the police service and most recently has collaborated with Cambridge



University as part of her most recent studies which concentrated on artificial intelligence within the policing

She concentrated specifically on the independent validation and development of Durham Constabulary's Harm Assessment Risk Tool (HART).

HART is an algorithmic forecast of an offender's potential to offend. The artificial intelligence (AI) approach helps forecast the risk in terms of seriousness and can be used in custody to support the custody sergeant's decision making. This helps ensure that any support or diversionary action is appropriate to the risk the individual poses.

HART has received national and international attention with Mrs Urwin frequently travelling across the globe to share this technology within policing.

Temporary Superintendent, Vicki Martin, of Durham Constabulary, who is also chair of Star – a support network to ensure women in the force reach their potential, said:

"The area of IT and AI is predominantly male. To have a woman working at this level and with such success is exceptional. Sheena is the first to point out she started her journey as an apprentice with limited ambition.

Her journey has been phenomenal and everyone who knows her is proud of the work she is leading – particularly over the last 12 months where the benefit of this work is really being seen.

'This work is truly ground-breaking, and she deserves formal recognition from her peers.

Mrs Urwin said: "When the organisers got in touch I was thrilled. I really didn't expect it, it's fantastic.

"Police staff play a pivotal role in policing with the work they do, and I am proud to say I have worked in policing for 32 years. To be noticed and recognised by peers makes me very proud indeed."

The award ceremony, which was due to take place in June, has been postponed until November.

Warning Against Phishing Emails

A warning has been issued to County Durham residents following a series of scam emails, trying to obtain personal and financial information.

The trading standards team at Durham County Council is urging residents to be on their guard after it has received reports of hoax emails being sent, claiming to be from the council.

Each email uses a made-up name and claims to be from a council officer, with the letters MBL and a number on the bottom of the text.

The emails contain fake Bacs receipts and encourage the recipients to click through to a fraudulent website, which appears to be of a phishing nature and attempts to take personal and financial information.

One way to identify the hoax is that it isn't sent from a durham.gov.uk email address. Joanne Waller, Durham County Council's head of community protection services, said: "We would like to urge the public to take extra care when they are being contacted by email. We would never ask for personal information or financial information and we would ask that people take the time to check who the email is from, and stop to think before they click on an unknown link in order to protect their information.

"I would also encourage anyone who has received one of these emails, or has any other concerns regarding fraud or scams, to contact us. We will always take this information seriously and investigate the matter."

Saturday 15 August Pre Season Friendly Newton Aycliffe 3 v Abbey Hey 3

Match report by Joe Ramage

Newton Aycliffe surrendered a two goal lead in the final 10 minutes on Saturday as Abbey Hey came from behind to snatch a 3-3 draw at The Beaumont Landscapes Stadium in an entertaining pre-season friendly.

Aycliffe went behind early in the game but captain Aaron Brown's close range equaliser meant the sides were level at the break. There were a number of changes at half-time and Aycliffe raced out of the traps as Matthew Pennal scored just 23 seconds into the second half to give the hosts the lead before Adam Burnicle looked to have secured the win in the 70th minute.

Aycliffe missed a number of chances to extend their lead and were made to pay as Abbey Hey scored twice in the final 10 minutes to secure a draw.

It was Aycliffe's second pre-season game of the campaign following last week's 5-1 victory over Tow Law Town and Head Coach Colin Stromsoy gave game time to his entire squad once more as players continue to try and impress ahead of the new season. Arran Wearmouth, who scored twice in that win last week, almost opened the scoring inside four minutes after an inviting cross from Liam Jarvie. But the forward couldn't quite divert it home.

Instead it was visitors Abbey Hey, from the North West Counties Division South, who made the breakthrough in the 12th minute after a stroke of misfortune saw Brown's defensive challenge ricochet off his teammate back into the path of the Abbey striker.

He was able to lift the ball over the onrushing Connor Phelan and poke the ball beyond Adam Pickford to give the visitors the lead.

Aycliffe threatened an immediate response with Jarvie and Phelan causing problems down the right with Phelan's pullback cleared from the line.

The home side were soon level however as Brown capped off an excellent Aycliffe



attack. Ben Reay picked up the ball just inside the Abbey half and drove towards goal playing a delightful one-two with Ben Dibb-Fuller whose back heel found Reay at the byline.

The midfielder pulled the ball back to Brown, who had stayed forward from an earlier set piece, and the skipper tapped home. Aycliffe thought they might have had a chance to take the lead from the spot on the half hour mark after Wearmouth was brought down but the referee decided against it. Minutes later Pickford had to be alert as he got down to his right to parry an effort wide. Reay should have given Aycliffe the lead, this time linking up with Wearmouth whose reverse pass found Reay inside the penalty area unmarked but the goalkeeper pushed his effort around the post.

The end of the first half saw a number of meaty challenges as this pre-season friendly became a feisty encounter with the referee diffusing a number of comings together. The second half saw almost an entirely different Aycliffe XI take to the field and they staked their claim inside just 23 seconds when Ethan Wood's clever through ball found Andrei Ardelean whose cross was misjudged by the keeper and gifted Pennal an easy finish.

There was an improved vigour to Aycliffe in the early stages of the second half and Burnicle would have backed himself to have extended the lead in the 55th minute when

he had time and space in the area but his strike was palmed over the bar.

Burnicle again found himself unmarked in the area on the hour mark after Ardelean put it on a plate, but his effort went narrowly wide of the post, much to his frustration. It was a case of 'third time lucky' for Burnicle who finally converted in the 70th minute after yet more smart play from Ardelean. Burnicle, with the more difficult of his three opportunities, slid the ball past the goalkeeper in off the post to give Aycliffe a 3-1 lead.

That should have been enough for the hosts but a long range strike which took a number of deflections to wrong-foot the substitute goalkeeper made for an interesting final 10 minutes.

The decisive moment came just three minutes later from an Abbey corner as a late runner escaped the defence and his diving header found the back of the net to level the scores

Neither side was able to find a winner in a frantic final five minutes as the referee blew for full time

It was another good workout for Aycliffe, who continue their preparations next week, again playing behind closed doors due to govt / FA restrictions.

We are now well on the way through recess, Westminster starts to sit again on the 1st of September, but I will also be in London for a couple of days next week to catch up with my London staff. We need to prepare for the bills to be presented in the first week back. Last week ended with a zoom call with



ministers to discuss the problems facing the coach industry, this is an industry that creates a lot of glue in the country in the way that it connects people and places. Due to Covid 19 the industry is effectively mothballed and it is a very difficult time for operators. The zoom discussion with ministers was to lobby for support for them and I believe the ministers on the call fully understood the gravity of the situation and will take the representations to the Chancellor and his team. I also had a visit to Wheatley Hill to meet residents who have some significant challenges with antisocial behaviour and environmental issues, I am working on their behalf with both the police and the council.

A major issue this week has of course been the exam results. This was always going to be a difficult process with students not actually sitting any exams but the failure of the standardisation model has been particularly disappointing as it has made a difficult year for students even harder. The concept of standardising results was laudable and appropriate in my opinion, but the process failed, despite being widely consulted on and having several of the major teaching unions supporting it. The need to change, due to the outcomes for significant minorities, looks correct but it will now introduce many other pressures ranging from over subscribed universities to comparators against future years, these will need to be addressed as we go forward. At a local level I have worked with those students that contacted us to try and get the outcomes they deserve and as I write we appear to have largely succeeded.

On other issues, I have been able to talk with a team based at Durham University who are working on developing the use of heat from underground sources like old mine workings, I have met them before as a Durham Councillor and their efforts continue to make progress and I will look to support their agendas.

I was able to join Simon and Jane at Junction 7 in preparing some packed lunches before I also had the opportunity to visit Sedgefield Community Hospital. There I met Sue Jacques (Chief Executive), Professor Paul Keane OBE (Chairman) and Louise West (Head Matron) as well as other members of the team. This gave me the opportunity to learn more about the structure of their services and see the excellent provision they offer whilst, of course, I was able to thank them for their outstanding efforts through this pandemic.

On a lighter note, during the week I have joined many of you in "eating out to help out" which has another couple of weeks to run yet, so please take the opportunity to support these businesses and get a great value meal.

As always, please remember to continue to respect the virus and not waste all the efforts that have been made, in particular by our key workers.

We need to wash our hands more regularly and robustly; wear face masks whenever necessary and give each other as much space as possible and we will give everyone the best opportunity to head to a more normal environment.

Funding for More Affordable Accommodation in County Durham

A charity's funding boost will see more affordable accommodation created across County Durham.

Durham Action on Single Housing (DASH) has received £175,000 from Durham County Council to convert part of its Gilesgate office into self-contained flats.

DASH has provided accommodation and support for homeless people and those at risk of homelessness for a number of years, but having become a Registered Provider of Social Housing in March this year, the charity is now providing affordable homes for local people to rent.

The council awarded the money from its Commuted Sums fund, which it receives from housing developers to help support local communities.

The funding will see DASH convert the first floor and part of the ground floor of its offices, on the ground floor of Hudson House in Gilesgate, into four, one-bedroom self-contained flats which will be let at affordable rent.

The council's housing solutions team will also work alongside DASH in referring local residents to the flats, which are expected to be available from spring next year. Cllr Kevin Shaw, Cabinet member for strategic housing and assets, said: "We are delighted to further develop our working relationship with DASH and this will provide access for a greater number of our most vulnerable people into affordable accommodation. We know that the part funding we have provided will help to address housing needs within local communities and by working together with our partners, we can continue to ensure that the services offered can be best delivered to those in greatest need.

"The accommodation that will be provided at Hudson House will have a strong emphasis on local connections. I will therefore look forward to the refurbishment being completed so that we can start welcoming local residents to apply for the flats, or use the referral process to support them into housing." Les Punton, chair of DASH, said: "We are delighted to have secured part funding from Durham County Council and Homes England to develop our headquarters at Hudson House to provide four more self-contained flats which are much needed in the area. We look forward to developing more affordable accommodation in the future."

Praise for County Durham Students on A Level Results

As young people across the UK receive their A level results, a council has praised students, schools and colleges for their dedication during challenging and unprecedented times.

Durham County Council recognises that



Rotary Newton Aycliffe 'Trish Pemberton'



Every couple of weeks we are hoping to highlight one of our Rotary club members and we begin this new feature with our President, Trish.

My name is Trish Pemberton and I became involved with Rotary because I taught Syd Howarth's granddaughter, Carrie. She wanted to set up an Interact Club at our school and asked me to be the club's mentor. After a presentation from the Howarths, I was hooked and the club we set up about 15 years ago is still going strong it really fitted with the school's original Quaker ethos. I did not join Rotary until I retired - not because I did not want to, but because, as a teacher, my evenings were not my own. I was also heavily involved with the Duke of Edinburgh Scheme at my school as my other great love is the outdoors and outdoor pursuits.

I retired five years ago, and I have been a member of Rotary ever since. I love the emphasis on community, both at home and internationally, and enjoy taking part in fundraising events like the Santa Sleigh. This year I am President. It is not quite how I imagined it would be because of the pandemic, but we are meeting up online regularly. We usually invite a speaker - I have just invited Chris Lloyd from the Northern Echo to speak at our next meeting, and we are still doing our best to support the community during the pandemic with our recommendations coming from people like local health visitors and funds partly from GAMP. Like everyone else, I am looking forward to a new normality as soon as possible, whatever that normality will be.

this year's A level results are born out of a unique set of circumstances and many students cannot mark the day as they would have liked.

With students unable to sit their final exams due to the coronavirus pandemic, teachers in England submitted predicted grades to exam boards. The boards then took into account data from previous years to adjust the marks, with the aim of ensuring consistency. However, the process has resulted in some young people not achieving the grades they had hoped for.

In County Durham, A level results are in line with last year, when the average grade was a B minus. Applied General and Tech Level results have improved slightly, with the average grade now a Distinction compared to Distinction minus.

This is encouraging but disguises discrepancies between schools and individual pupils, and the council understands some headteachers will be appealing results on behalf of pupils where there is evidence of their grades being moderated down for no apparent reason. Cllr Olwyn Gunn, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for children and young people's services said: "On behalf of the council I would like to let everyone who has received their A level results know how incredibly proud we are of you all.
