The family business has been farming at Archdeacon Newton, near Darlington, since 1928 and in 1998 converted to an organic status before launching deliveries two years later. Now, the firm delivers to thousands of households through its own fleet of drivers and a nationwide network of distributors.

Director, Caroline Bell, said: "We introduced our direct delivery service to allow us to access a sustainable selling price for our milk as it costs a lot more per litre to produce milk organically to our standards. Illegal Cyclists on Pavements

Dear Sir.

Can I add another voice to the letter 'Cyclist Distancing' in the 21st August edition?

The matter of cyclists on pavements has persisted for years, and it's not merely a question of social distancing during the coronavirus pandemic, but the risk of injury to pedestrians; I've been struck from behind by cyclists on the pavement on two separate occasions, and had two near misses due to bicycles suddenly appearing at speed from concealed junctions.

In the latter cases, the cyclists shouted abuse at me, as if I were at fault. when they should not have been on the footpath in the first place! The consequences could have been a lot more serious if the victim had been frailer than I am.

Apart from being struck by bicycles, I've seen some remarkably careless conduct. A regular example is riding on the pavement, with no hands on the handlebars, whilst looking at a mobile phone. Equivalent behaviour by a car driver would result in a court case. Part of the problem is lack of enforcement of the law by the police. I've raised the issue several times in recent years, but no action seems to have been taken. If complaints were made by more people, there might be a response; contact information is available on the Durham Police website.

The bicycles problem seems to be

related to a general disregard of traffic regulations. There have been several letters in the Newton News about parking on pavements and greens; in these cases, driving across a pavement to park on a green will usually be illegal, as no access to property or emergency is involved, so again, the correct procedure is a complaint to the police, preferably with photographic evidence. In cases like this, I have found that action will often be taken, so it's worthwhile to draw attention to the problem.

With frequent enough complaints, perhaps we can eventually expect some general and spontaneous enforcement. Yours sincerely,

Bewick Crescent Surgery | Thriving Aycliffe Flu Vaccinations



The team at Bewick Crescent Surgery recognise that this year has been a particularly challenging year, both globally and nationally, for many of us due to the arrival of Covid-19. However, Influenza is also a viral disease which can cause severe acute respiratory illness and death for those at risk who develop the infection, and each year 300,000 to 600,000 people die from influenza across the globe. The most effective way to protect yourself from Influenza is to have the vaccination each year. The Influenza vaccination is proven to provide protection against the disease and this is provided free of charge to all those who meet the criteria set by the World Health Organisation. Dr Christopher Stephenson, GP Partner at Bewick Crescent Surgery, said "we would urge all of our patients who meet the criteria set to take up the offer of an Influenza vaccination in order to protect themselves as much as possible in these uncertain times caused by the continuing Covid-19 global pandemic".

As the number of NHS patients across the UK who are entitled to a free flu vaccination runs into hundreds of thousands, NHS England restricts and controls the number and type of vaccines available to individual surgeries. This year Bewick Crescent receive their first supply of vaccines for the over 65 years old age group in mid-September but will not get the first batch of vaccines for those in the under 65 years at risk groups until the beginning of October. This means that different patients will be offered the vaccine at different times. For anyone who is concerned about this remember that flu does not generally circulate until well into the winter (the 'flu season' officially starts in December) so waiting until October for your flu vaccination does not put you at increased risk.

Despite the extra controls on supplies this year we still intend to hold clinics on a Saturday as well as specified clinics every day during the week. All clinics will be held at the Bewick Crescent Surgery site. This year due to Covid-19 there are extra restrictions which need to be implemented such as social distancing measures and the need to wear PPE (face masks, etc.). We WILL NOT be holding any walk-in clinics and all vaccinations will be by appointment only. Initial clinics will be held outside in the grounds of the surgery itself, which will enable us to vaccinate more people in a shorter timespan to ensure those at risk are protected as soon as possible. We are very fortunate to have the help and support of our local REME Reserve Unit - 102 Battalion REME, whose headquarters are at Northfield Way here in Newton Aycliffe, who have provided the 'flu tent pods' for us to use to deliver the clinics from. We are very grateful to them for their help we couldn't have provided the clinics as quickly without them - a big thank you goes to them from all the team at Bewick.

Remember flu can be a debilitating and even life-threatening infection so although arrangements are a bit more complicated this year, PLEASE do still come and get your flu vaccination.

Beekeepers Association

I read with interest the letter sent to the Newton News (21st August) by Bill Gibson who reported the retrieval of 40,000 bees from a location close to the Blue Bridge.

As a beekeeper myself, it's always good news to hear a swarm has been collected by another beekeeper as we have the best chance, not only to collect them safely, but to give them a home to continue their natural reproduction cycle, which is what a swarm is - when roughly half the colony of bees leave their current hive with their queen to find a new home thus allowing the bees remaining in the previous hive to make a new queen and set off another colony. I noticed Mr Gibson chose to refer the swarm to Darlington Beekeepers, but I wanted to remind everyone that we have a perfectly well-run and efficient beekeeping association in Newton Aycliffe (AYCLIFFE BKA) based at the Eco Centre in Moore Lane and with an established apiary at the St. Oswalds allotment site in

Aycliffe Association members have been quietly and efficiently collecting swarms throughout the summer in the town and doing a great public service. On average we've collected about one swarm per week in the area during the main season and calculate that we've re-hived safely around 300,000 honeybees this year alone. Don't Lose Out On **Your Right To Vote**

As part of County Durham's electoral register update, canvassers will be visiting households that have not yet responded to the annual request for information. Last month, Durham County Council sent letters to all homes in the county asking residents to check the information currently held on the electoral register and follow the

The council needs to know the details it holds are correct to ensure residents are included on the electoral register. This enables people to vote in local and national elections.

instructions included.

From Wednesday 26th August until October, canvassers will be delivering forms to households who have not replied, asking the householder to complete the form and return it. Canvassers will all be wearing Durham County Council identification badges, which should be visible at all times.

David Collingwood, electoral services manager at Durham County Council, said: "It's extremely important to respond to the annual electoral register update form because if you don't, you won't be able to vote.

"This year's canvass, which we have to carry out by law, is taking place during a challenging public health situation. We are working to ensure that we take account of public health guidelines, including the continued importance of social distancing." To ensure distancing, staff will place the envelope on the doorstep and knock, before standing back around two metres where possible to wait for a response. If the knock isn't answered, the canvasser will try a second time at a later date. If that isn't answered, the form will be posted through the letterbox with a note explaining what it's for and how to complete and return it. DANGEROUS DRIVING AROUND AYCLIFFE

Dear Sir,

I am a retired professional driver of all road vehicles that has been produced for any road in Europe and beyond. It is with regret that I have to agree with the recent notice in the Newton News regarding the unnecessary dangerous drivers on our towns roads, and on grass fields such as Simpasture Park.

We pay for our roads to be in good order, we pay for our police to keep us safe from these morons on quad bikes, actually wheelying them on Pease Way and Williamfield Way. We see it nearly every day

WHERE ARE OUR POLICE?

We see it all on the TV and everywhere we go, the madmen and women who put our lives at risk, this part is for the carers who fly around in their cars up cul-de-sacs 100 yards long at horrendous speeds. It is 20 MPH on council estates, I make no apologies regarding these workers, it is the law to drive with caution in congested areas near children. I am one of these people who live in a cul-de-sac, with these "carers" flying about with "death traps" as most are not fit for the roads.

On several occasions I have made some drivers aware of the state of their tyres and inflation, they take no notice, which is a dangerous issue, where are our police who are supposed to keep us safe? It is a rare occasion to see a copper now on the beat, Pease Way and Stephenson Way are speed tracks (especially Pease Way) I have witnessed several cars racing up Pease Way at speeds of 80mph, yes it is true, and I believe one of them has been spoken to by police and has had his car exhaust cans taken off, as they were like a shotgun

going off several times, in one run.
Some years ago I complained about the speeding on Pease Way, there was a serious crash on this road due to a female driver being on her mobile phone traveling at around 70mph toward the mini roundabout, the junction at Pease Way and Emerson Way, a car was waiting to turn right into Cumby Road and this lady driver was too impatient to wait so she tried to overtake the turning driver and hit her full on, her car flipped and rolled several times hitting a tree outside of our house, which demolished the tree, then it hit the fire hydrant and

bounced back onto another tree then flipping it into the garden next door to me, there were two small children in the garden playing on the swing and the car landed literally inches from the girls, this is true, the "nip-points" on Pease Way were due to myself and the police getting these installed, it was on the TV actually.

The above "nip points" mentioned was not my idea, I wanted the police to back me up to get speed humps to slow the traffic, but as we now know they were not, the reason I got from the Chief Inspector was (the bus drivers would complain) about the damage to their backs when driving over them. I did mention that I was a professional driver of all heavy goods, coach and buses, and that these buses etc, had Bostrom seats installed to alleviate this issue, he took no notice at all, so we are no better of, we still have the speeders, joy riders and no safety on the town regarding speeding. The police did come to me and did a speed check in yellow vests, very visible to all, including the speeders, they caught three in ten minutes, but still no speed restriction in place other than the 30mph sign.

I have lost faith in our police; I do feel for the cops on the front line but the problem is as usual, we are in the north, and out of sight, out of mind and not cared about by Mr Johnson. He has made this country a laughing stock, the NHS and COVID is a calamity waiting to happen,

he may be intelligent but he has no common sense. I feel sick when I see him on TV, they are clueless, let's get back to Labour please. They will look after us, and no I am not into politics at all, I am just so upset about our country's future, if there will be one with this Covid-19. This is now the time to get wearing your masks in shops, buses and all places you go where there are people; do it for the kids and the elderly, have some common sense. "Walk For Mental Health Teesside To Benidorm" Is the vision of Tom Judge. During his working life Tom was a very successful businessman until he had a breakdown and was diagnosed with PTSD. Tom Judge and Darren Robinson will walk from The Riverside Stadium in Middlesbrough to Benidorm in 2021.

Tom and Darren will pass through some cities and towns in the UK and would love you to come along to encourage and support them, or maybe join them for a chat for 5 minutes, one hour, the choice is yours.



The aim is to raise awareness of Mental Health, especially among veterans and they will be producing daily video blogs starting with their preparation and training.

"We are not asking for money, we want people to know that it's OK not to be OK. However, if anybody would like to make a donation we will be nominating a specific charity in due course" said Tom. There are lots of plans going on in the build up, as you can imagine.

We are contacting nationwide hotel chains and are hoping to have a number of physiotherapists and counsellors along the way to take care of mental and physical health.

This is a vital part of the journey and unfortunately we cannot pay for their services so we are hoping to have volunteers from various towns or cities along the way.

We already have two fantastic UK companies that are providing suitable clothing and footwear, but we also require food, water, accommodation, physiotherapists and counsellors.

Over the course of the next few months we will be contacting lots of people to raise awareness and help, but if you can help us in a way please get in touch.

IN THEIR SHOES?



Dear Sir.

Last Sunday, Extinction Rebellion Durham held the most powerful and wonderful event on Palace Green.

The event was a display – an artwork – of 750 pairs of children's shoes. The resulting scene was apocalyptic, with the shoes-without-wearers representing the children who will be deprived of their futures (and maybe killed) by climate change ... unless we do something urgently.

It was a stunning display, and vital to get the Climate Action 'ball' rolling again after lockdown.

GUEST SPEAKERS

After the display was laid out, three speakers had been invited to address and thank the volunteers.

MARY FOY, MP for the City of Durham, spoke of the Labour Party's commitment to Climate Action and the need to lobby the government to put Climate Action at the forefront of the country's post-Covid recovery.

MARTIN GANNON, Leader of Gateshead Council, warned graphically of the international disruption and damage that unrestrained Climate Change is already causing, and explained that local councils are doing all they can to implement Climate Action. MY ADDRESS

I was honoured to be the third speaker. I praised the compelling message of the display, and thanked Extinction Rebellion for starting in this way their 'Month of Rebellion' to re-raise awareness.

Then I spoke about the absurdity of our current economic model. Much of our notional economic 'wealth' and 'growth' is based simply on an ever-increasing 'velocity of transactions' – the speed with which we buy goods and services from each other. As the lockdown has shown, we have now reached the point where, if we pause for a moment from our frantic consumer spending, the economy collapses. Our 'economic growth' – which the government is encouraging us to resume – has thus degenerated into going out and spending moneywe-do-not-have in order to shovel it into the pockets of people who have so much they could not possibly spend it in a million lifetimes. AN EXTINCTION-LEVEL ECONOMY

Our economy is consequently fragile and unstable, it creates gross inequality, and it does not make us lastingly happy ... and no wonder, because after all that so-called 'retail therapy', we go home to money worries and a life which too easily becomes all work-and-spend, and no rest-or-reflection.

Worst of all it is destroying the earth! It is a linear economy which strips Nature of its assets – produces, along with massive pollution, 'stuff', much of which is ephemeral and shoddy – and then chucks it into the sea so we can rush out and buy more of what we do not actually need. And we have to do this ever faster or we all lose our jobs.

It is illogical, unsustainable, and ultimately an extinction level event in itself.

Either we take action now to adjust the model or – inevitably – it will come crashing down on our grandchildren.

And hence those poignantly empty shoes.





Principal, Tom Dower, said: 'It has been an incredibly difficult time for young people across the country, and we are so proud of our students, not only for their results but for the professionalism and resilience they have shown over the past months. All of us at UTC South Durham would like to congratulate Year 11 on their results.' Ewan Cool, Elle Hare, Ralf Fotoohi, Alisha Khan, Mohib Khan, Alex Lidster, Amber Roberson, Leah Scott, Alycia Simpson, Rosie Stockdale, and Harry Wilson all achieved exceptional grades across the board.

Other students are starting apprenticeships (higher, advanced, or degree), including Kirsten Parr who is due to start a degree apprenticeship with accounting firm Ernst Young in Newcastle, and Felicity Nkomo who joins international design company Hanson as a degree level design apprentice. This year, as exams were cancelled because of the pandemic, students' grades were based on teacher assessments, supported with evidence of their work which was submitted to the exam boards.

Continue to Rise

The number of nurses in the NHS in England increased by 13,840 compared to last year, and the number of doctors has risen by 9,306, figures published last week up until the end of May show.

All professionally qualified clinical staff, doctors, paramedics and support to clinical staff are now at record levels.

Responding to today's NHS workforce statistics, Health and Social Care Secretary Matt Hancock said: "It is fantastic to see we have record numbers of staff working in our NHS, and as set out last month in the NHS People Plan, we must strive to make the NHS the best possible place to work for all. This will help us retain more of our hardworking staff and ensure the NHS can continue to protect us, as we protected it throughout the peak of this pandemic. "With the latest UCAS figures already showing a 14% rise in people accepting places on nursing courses in England, we are well on our way to delivering 50,000 more nurses by the end of this Parliament. "We have protected the NHS, and we are investing record sums into the NHS, hiring more doctors and nurses so that the NHS is always there for you and your family." Following A Level results last week, the latest UCAS statics revealed a 14% rise in acceptances for nursing and midwifery courses in England, with many more expected during clearing.

Last month the NHS People Plan set out how the NHS will put staff wellbeing at its heart with a new recruitment, retention and support package. It sets out practical support for wellbeing such as safe spaces to rest and recuperate, wellbeing guardians and support to keep staff physically safe and healthy. The figures for May include some former healthcare professionals who bravely volunteered to return to the frontline during the pandemic. May figures also show that 592 returners were identified, of which, there are 102 doctors and 157 nurses and health visitors. Not all returners are reflected in the monthly workforce stats as they could have been employed on Fixed Term, Honorary or Bank contracts, or via NHS Professionals.

(BURNHILL WAY, NEWTON AYCLIFFE) (TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE) ORDER 2020

The Council proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 as amended, Section 14 (1) to prohibit all vehicular traffic from proceeding on the following lengths of Burnhill Way, Newton Aycliffe 1. A 200m length from a point 25m west of the junc with Bluebell Way to the junc with Kestrel Crt 2. A 350m length between the junctions of Avon Crt and Burn Ln Roundabout to enable carriageway resurfacing works to be undertaken. An alt route will be available to vehicular traffic from the eastern side of the closure from Burn Ln north to Greenfield Way then westerly to the junction with Meadowfield Way which leads south onto Burnhill Way to the western side of the closure, and vice versa. The maximum duration of the Order is 18 months. The proposed works are to commence at $7\mathrm{am}$ on 19/9/2020 and are anticipated to be completed in 11 days. On occasions, alternative dates for closure may be necessary and these will be signed accordingly.
