(MIDDRIDGE ROAD, NEWTON AYCLIFFE) (TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE) ORDER 2020

The Council proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 as amended, Section 14 (1) and pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Darlington Borough Council, to prohibit all vehicular traffic from proceeding on 715m of Middridge Rd between its junctions with Chestnut Way and the road leading to Middridge Farms, Newton Aycliffe to enable new roundabout resurfacing works to be undertaken. Alt route from the eastern side of the closure from Greenfield Way generally southwards and continuing south on Horndale Ave turning south west on School Aycliffe Ln then north westerly on A6072 through Redworth to Shildon and northwards on Spout Ln to Middridge Ln to the western side of the closure and vice versa. A diversion route for vehicles over 7.5t will be signed from School Aycliffe Ln south via Preston Rd and continuing south on Spring Rd then westerly on B6444 Heighington Lane to A6072. The maximum duration of the Order is 18 months. The proposed works are to commence from 8am on 28/11/20 and are anticipated to be completed in 2 days. On occasions, alternative dates for closure may be necessary and these will be signed accordingly.

HEIGHINGTON MATTERS

Ask any Councillor for the biggest complaints in their Ward and a pound to a penny speeding and parking will be high on their list. In my Heighington and Coniscliffe Ward, most of the roads are narrow with blind summits and lots of tight corners to negotiate, which should make drivers drive with due care, but from complaints received few do. Recently I received the following letter sent to me by pupils from Heighington Primary School prompted by their concerns about speeding vehicles:

NO NEED FOR SPEED!

We are reporters at Heighington CE Primary School and, today, we are representing our whole school in asking for your help.

Recently we have noticed that some people are driving much too fast in Heighington, particularly coming into the village on Redworth Road. This is extremely concerning because we need to get in and out of school safely every day. We are very worried that somebody, including yourself, could be injured. Even our friendly pets and wildlife are at risk. We know that nobody wants to cause an accident, so we are asking you to think about your speed and slow down whilst driving in our village and anywhere else. Please remember to 'Think, slow down and keep everyone safe!" Many thanks from the Children of

MILLBANK BARRIERS

Because of Covid-19 social distancing restrictions, our school has introduced a 'one way' system for parents taking or picking their children up from school, whereby parents assemble at the main school gates and leave using the Redworth Road gate. Exiting onto Redworth Road leaves some parents and children having to walk down the topside of Millbank, which does not have a footpath, putting them in danger as they cannot see oncoming traffic round the blind corner. Having watched parents having to walk as close to the tall stone wall until they could see if the road was clear, I felt that something had to be done to ensure the parents and their children could walk down Millbank safely. Having consulted with DBC Highways, the

school, and more recently residents living in the Orchard, barriers are to be installed in the next week or two. The barriers will be 1500mm from the stone wall and will create a safe walkway for pedestrians using Millbank.

Traffic leaving Hopelands from the school junction will turn right down the hill and leave via Water Lane, South View or Walworth Road. Access from Redworth Road/Hall Lane junction into Millbank will be for The Orchard residents only and new road signage will be installed accordingly. The introduction of the pedestrian barriers will cause some disruption in the village, so I ask for your acceptance that it is imperative that we keep our little ones safe and for your patience. The Barriers are

temporary and will be removed when the dangers from Coronavirus has gone. SILENT SANTA APPEAL

Covid-19 is a very real disease with very serious consequences, be they permanent mobility problems, vascular issues or death. Chief Constable at Rotary Meeting

Dear Sir,

At our Rotary Zoom meeting on Tuesday evening, 17th November, we were delighted to welcome Jo Farrell, Chief Constable of Durham Constabulary. Our thanks must go to one of our members, Marjory Elliott, who issued the invitation, and we were honoured that Mrs. Farrell accepted.

Jo informed us that she has been in the Police service for 29 years, firstly in Cambridgeshire then Northumbria force and 4 years ago joined Durham as Deputy Chief and last year was selected as Chief Constable on the retirement of Mike Barton. The first woman to be appointed to the top job in the force's history, she heads a staff of over 2000, 1300 officers and 800 civilian staff and it is clear, as she talks, that she is completely engaged with all aspects of her work.

Jo explained, "Policing has changed immeasurably since I joined 29 years ago. Our primary concern is still to protect and serve the public, but the focus has shifted to such as cyber crime, safeguarding and organised crime which involves drug dealing on a massive scale".

She mentioned that we may have heard the phrase 'county lines' which has been in the news recently. The drug dealers identify a young and vulnerable person and use them to deliver drugs into areas where they are not known. Jo went on to say, "We are much more accountable and subject to scrutiny, transparency and the Freedom of Information Act, and we are inspected regularly by HM Inspectorate. We aim to be inclusive and embrace diversity, and to this end our leadership is based on values, positivity, wellbeing and support for our officers, particularly psychological support, where there may be concerns with PTSD, and, of course, the pandemic has, and continues to be, a huge challenge as we make every effort to keep our officers and the public safe".

The Chief Constable made special mention of the neighbourhood policing teams including the PCSOs and how proud she is of the work they do in striving to keep communities together and forming partnerships with organisations such as Rotary, schools and charities. Jo talked for over half an hour and it flew by. It was then followed by a short Q & A session



zinc supplements could keep him healthy, are endangering every one of us. Only by taking the proper precautions and actually respecting the gravity of the situation where our current Government will not, can we overcome this disease. Wearing a mask when you go to the shops is crucial, because every person working at the shop does not have a say in whether they go to work or not - they are putting themselves at risk every day for people to then turn around and demonstrate that they don't care about their safety or well-being. On this point, I would ask that those concerned for their grandchildren or grandparents, think in these times of hardship how much worse it would be if in your "one little visit" you passed the disease to them or someone like them nearby who then died. It is easier to miss a family member when you know that you can see them again after all of this is over, trust me.

We have to work as a community, like the Britain of the 1940s. When we went into a blackout, you didn't keep your curtains open because "you hadn't seen any planes", no, you closed your curtains and entered a shelter to protect yourself, your loved ones and those around you. And frankly, I would not want a Councillor who would knowingly endanger their neighbours just to have a look out the window.

Open Letter to the Department for Education

I write from UTC South Durham, a STEM-based school in the North East, in response to Ofqual's recent announcement on assessment requirements. We have been told that students are expected to complete all units as in a normal year.

I spoke to a Year 11 student about this yesterday. Here are his thoughts:

Generation on mute

Two hundred and thirty-one days we have had reducing hope and no voice. Our generation is on mute. Nothing is dearer to us than our future; a future that is now unstable. We have been given something of a life-line – a three-week delay to exams. But does anyone really think that's enough to steady our course? Who is the head that decides our fate, my fate and the fate of many others? As far as I know, they are not just about to take the exams that are set to determine their future.

Who is the head that will listen to a generation who are drowning in anxiety? As far as I know, they have not felt the confusion and fear of missing six months of work only to be told you will sit in front of invigilators and take the exams with no regard to the trauma of this pandemic.

So please hear US, the generation who feel forgotten, our mouths taped shut as our future slips through our fingers. Please listen, because we are the future of this country, please listen because we are truly dealing with the toxic fallout of the choices of our education system.

You know me as Arron, but I am confident these are the words of an entire generation.

So, please do not tell me that a three-week delay is enough. Students are working hard, but, they have already lost so much education.

Please do not tell me that education continues just as well remotely. Students lack the opportunity to learn from their peers. My staff are brilliant, but they are stretched and exhausted.

Please do not tell me that it is affordable. I have a choice between breaking our budget on supply staff and imposing more remote education.

Please work with us to create a plan which will meet the needs of our young people, as they work through this extraordinary time in their lives.

Our Archived New Towns!

Dear Sir, Archive collections. with the correct engagement, as well as simply providing an historical record, have a living value proven to create a sense of place and promote the health and wellbeing of residents. The Association of New Towns Archives and Museums (ANTAM) network has been set up to share knowledge between members about activities relating to new town archives. **Durham County** Council Archives

is involved and



it was my great honour to be asked to be on the Steering Group, which had its first meeting this week.

The project facilitator is a built environment and climate change academic. One of the four members is a Sector Development Manager for the National Archives; another a university researcher in Human Geography; and the third - formerly an Open University Regional Director - is Cabinet Member for Economy, Culture and Regeneration on Milton Keynes Council.

An awesome group of people indeed - but only I come from the town that was Beveridge's flagship and once labelled 'Perfecto'!

SETTING THE PROJECT PARAMETERS

The steering group's task, in this first meeting, was to suggest the project's four topics for research:

- 'Health and Wellbeing' came top of our list; Newton Aycliffe, for example, was built to provide a better place to live than the depressed pit villages of the area, and this topic fits perfectly with the preoccupations of our present times.
- Close on its heels came: 'Environment and Sustainable Living' Newton Aycliffe was built around its 'greens' and designed to bring
 the countryside right into the town. We commented how poor are the
 health outcomes in many new towns, and how the open spaces that
 were hoped to engender a healthier lifestyle seem not to have done
 so it is going to be a fascinating piece of research to understand
 why.
- We considered 'Diversity' a strong change-through-time topic trying to observe how the original rootless 'pioneer' migrants have morphed into established multi-generational families, and what effect that has had upon the communities, their culture and their attitudes.
- A fourth key area seemed to be: 'Heritage to shape the future' (including collecting oral histories) ... but strong arguments were advanced for the 'Role of Women in shaping new towns' (cf Miss Hamilton!!) and 'Young People & Families' (another change-through time topic; Newton Aycliffe has changed from a town "awash with children" to a town desperately trying to build more bungalows for its ageing population).

OUTCOMES

The project facilitator will now construct four topics-for-investigation out of our discussions. These will then be shaped into project proposals by working groups of experts, funding will be sought, and the research will be undertaken. I promised the Steering Group that Newtonians are proud of their past, with strong history and historic photograph groups ... so you may well shortly find yourself being asked for your memories.

I will keep you in touch with progress.

Max Takes Maiden Mini Challenge Pole Position Vermin Around Shops

Yorkshire based racing driver Max Coates was back in action at Brands Hatch in Kent for the final rounds of the 2020 MINI CHALLENGE UK, taking a maiden pole position amongst strong top five race results.

The drivers were met with mixed conditions in Friday testing with Coates in the top 6 in both practice sessions. The rain came for Qualifying and Max, in his Primex Plastics sponsored car, put in the fastest lap of the session with five minutes remaining to take his maiden pole position in the series. With teammate Max Bird in second, and also pole positions in the Ginetta Junior and Supercup series for the Elite Motorsport team, the atmosphere was very positive heading into the weekends first set of races.

Surprisingly it was to be the first wet race of the season, the JiC Transport sponsored car didn't make the best start. Coates dropped behind his teammate into turn one and then had a huge slide which nearly put him into the gravel. He fell back to 6th place on the opening lap but battled back through to 4th after a third tour of the Brands Hatch Indy circuit. He then began to apply pressure on the podium positions but couldn't find a way through. His pace fell as the race progressed and he came under pressure from behind, eventually losing a position back to 5th where he remained to the chequered flag.

Race two was shown live on ITV4 as part of the BTCC programme and its title showdown. Coates started 6th in his NGK Spark Plugs and 1BR sponsored car immediately set about gaining positions from the start. Over the first two laps he battled with other drivers and sat in 5th place as the race entered a lengthy safety car period. With just a lap to go after the safety car, Max battled for the final podium spot but came out in 4th position.

After, he commented, "It was great to take our first pole position of the season at Brands Hatch and it felt like we were going to end on a real high. Unfortunately, it didn't go that way in race one and that was all my own doing. I'm pleased with our solid results this weekend and we round out the championship 6th overall. It's been a pleasure to be part of the Elite Motorsport team this year and I look forward to developing my relationship with them."

"This season has been an odd one, the events have lacked the atmosphere I am familiar with at the BTCC and I am hopeful that we can welcome my partners and the fans of the sport back trackside in 2021. I'm hugely grateful to Primex Plastics Ltd, JiC Transport, NGK Spark Plugs, Cirrus Research, CTL Dental, Jackson and Graham Accountants, Teesside Karting and all my sponsors who allow me to continue to pursue my racing career. I'll take some time to consider some options for 2021 and make a decision on what racing we plan to do next year alongside my partners."

Dear Steve.

RE: Durham & Darlington Constabulary - The Police Estate and **Custody Suites**

I am writing to you on behalf of the MPs for Bishop Auckland, Darlington, North West Durham, and Sedgefield, as well as myself in my capacity as a candidate for the elections initially scheduled for May 2020, but due to the global Coronavirus pandemic have been delayed until at least May 2021.

We are all deeply concerned about the proposal to close the custody suites at: Bishop Auckland, Durham City, Peterlee, and Darlington police stations and to move this to a new central £21,000,000 facility in Spennymoor.

We have several major issues of concern:

- 1.) This proposal is taking place separately from the broader review of police stations across Co. Durham and Darlington. It is deeply concerning that custody is being treated separately when custody is an integral part of the broader police estate.
- 2.) This plan for a new central custody facility is taking place without public consultation.
- 3.) There is a significant democratic deficit in the decision-making process. As Labour's Acting PCVC you replaced Ron Hogg, who had been elected as Labour's candidate for PCVC in 2016. His sad death meant that you took over from your previously appointed role as Chief Exec to the Labour PCVC for what was meant to be 6 months but will now be 18 months without any democratic mandate for decisions of this scale.

As such, we have two clear requests. Firstly, that any formal decision or approval on the way forward regarding the custody facility proposal is delayed until after the PCVC elections. Secondly, that no decision is taken until a review of the whole police estate has been undertaken, in the interests of local policing, this should start now.

Finally, it appears that the monies for this proposed £21,000,000 spend have come from savings in not spending money on front line community policing and have been squirrelled away over several years. As Labour's Acting PCVC and as the appointed Chief Executive to the late Labour PCVC, what has the justification been for withholding this money from the front line in our communities for years to build up this funding pot for Labour's proposal? This just looks like another Labour vanity project not fully thought through, a bit like the new £50,000,000 County Hall spend by the Labour administration of Durham County Council.

Beekeepers Wanted

In these strange times we all find ourselves in, due to the Covid-19 restrictions and with no end in sight, now is the time when we should all be thinking about how to spend our time more constructively and see what we can do to help make the world a better place to live in. Look no further . . . beekeeping is surely a no-brainer.

Everyone in Newton Aycliffe is now fully aware of our new Beekeeping Association: AYCLIFFE or ABKA. We are now fully established with nearly 100 members, a teaching apiary at the St. Oswald's allotments and HQ at the Moore Lane Eco-Centre. We also have the full backing of the Great Aycliffe Town Council, headed by Lee Williams and Steven Cooper, both of whom have been extremely supportive of our new venture. When we feel like a little more luxury we occasionally use the Oak Leaf Leisure Complex where we can even get a meal and a pint. Our watchwords are "friendly, informal and helpful", so we are always ready to welcome new faces with open arms.

How do people get into beekeeping?

The first stage is to join a nice, friendly association. We are affiliated to Durham BKA, a well-established and successful association, based in Durham city, through them we are affiliated to the British Beekeepers' Association (the BBKA) which is the national governing body. Once enrolled, members can take advantage of a wide range of amenities including a full training programme leading to a qualification which enables you to keep bees. Strangely, there are few restrictions to looking after bees, which can be located virtually anywhere, provided your neighbours don't object and children and pets can be controlled safely.

Urban beekeeping is certainly on the rise, often we find that honey bees have better foraging options than their country cousins, who often find food difficult to come by and it is very often seasonal. Just about anybody can keep bees provided they are serious, conscientious and well prepared.

Our association routinely provides two courses for beginners each year, in the spring (usually over a weekend), and in the Autumn. This is a course based on facts recommended by the BBKA and involves a mixture of classroom-based tuition/seminars and practical work with the bees at the apiary. The course normally would take place at the Eco-Centre but because of the current restrictions this isn't possible at the moment, so we plan to deliver the course remotely online, using Zoom technology, starting in the New Year. The course will take place in short sharp 30-minute bursts over about 5/6 weekends with the first session on Saturday 9th January at 10.30am. We expect to be able to get through all the theory in about 10 sessions.

Be Watchful of Scams and Fraud During Lockdown

A North East council is reminding its residents to be watchful for scams and fraud designed to target people during the coronavirus pandemic.

As part of International Fraud Awareness Week, 15 November to 21 November 2020, Durham County Council is highlighting the dangers of people taking advantage of the second national lockdown to indulge in fraudulent activity.

From sending fake government emails, designed to look like an offer of a support grant, council tax reduction, or Universal Credit; to imitating NHS Track and Trace or TV Licensing and subscription services, scammers have been using the uncertainty of the pandemic to acquire personal details.

With the urgency to support people and the billions of pounds being spent from government, fraudsters are also taking advantage of this uncertain time for financial gain.

The council's corporate fraud team has been verifying that money is being paid out to genuine people and businesses which need financial support during the pandemic.

For example, a large-scale organised fraud on the covid business grants was uncovered which had been targeted at multiple local authorities nationally, including Durham County Council.

The corporate fraud team assisted the business rates team in identifying that the council had been affected and worked quickly on a national alert to prevent payments of £695,000 following fraudulent applications by the same organised criminals.

The team has also prevented 58 attempted frauds, with a value of circa £785,000, and is pursuing 17 known fraudulent grants in partnership with Durham Constabulary and the National Investigation Service (NATIS).

Fraud and corruption have been also added to the council's Covid-19 Risks list, and these are monitored with other frauds that the council's corporate fraud team investigate, including adult social care, blue badge, business rates, council tax, insurance, procurement, schools and tenancy frauds.

Since the corporate fraud team was set up in June 2015 it has recovered or intercepted over £9.5million.

Other scams residents are being warned to look out for include fraudulent messages alleging to be from NHS Track and Trace in which alerts are being sent to members of the public claiming that the recipient has been in contact with someone diagnosed with coronavirus.

These messages will include links to fake websites that are used to steal personal and financial information or infect devices with malware.

In order to spot a scam, particularly when related to coronavirus, people should be on high alert if:

- The website address is inconsistent with that of the legitimate organisation
- The phone call, text or emails asks for financial information such as PINs or passwords
- A call or email appears out of the blue with an urgent request for personal or financial information, or to make an immediate payment
- An offer of a heavily discounted or considerably cheaper product compared to the original price
- There are spelling and grammar mistakes or inconsistencies in the story given

Clir Andrea Patterson, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for corporate services and rural issues, said: "As we are currently in a second national lockdown and grants have been extended, there are scammers who have been using public anxiety as an opportunity to take advantage and commit fraudulent crimes.

"While there is a great deal of uncertainty at the moment, it is important that we all remain vigilant and make ourselves aware of potential scams we could be targeted with and the signs to look out for. Our corporate fraud team is working tirelessly to identify and prevent attempted frauds."

Last week I was forever on Zoom or Teams, most of the meetings I describe below were virtual and whilst on one level there is an efficiency, it is an intense way to meet but I much prefer physically meeting people.

I started with discussing broadband with the Darlington Borough Council team before one of my regular catch up calls with Hitachi, and later joining a meeting of the Northern Research Group (NRG). On Tuesday we had a full day, starting with discussions on a gigabyte capable north-east that included representatives from BT, OpenReach and Virgin, where we challenged them on progress for places like Redworth, amongst others. Then it was onto a call with Livin to discuss their operations and approach throughout Sedgefield before joining the APPG for levelling up. The afternoon saw our third session of the APPG for Left Behind Communities, that I jointly chair. This time we were looking at employment, skills and education. Afterwards I joined an update session on digital data with the Minister of State for Trade Policy, Greg Hands. My final session of the day was speaking at another APPG, this time housing in the North.

Wednesday started with Age UK team briefing me, before speaking at a virtual discussion on the politics of community power, discussing how the government can support community power. After this a meeting of the NRG executive before an evening virtually joining Bishop Middleham & Mainsforth Parish Council. Thursday was BEIS select committee, this time the subject was the UK Emissions trading system common framework, which deals with price controls in the energy networks, joined by Ofgem, National Grid, Citizens Advice and the Minister, Rt Hon Kwasi Kwarteng MP, Minister for Business, Energy and Clean Growth. The big question was around the need to price consumers fairly, whilst allowing generators the capacity to invest and deliver a carbon neutral future.

Then it was a briefing on the NSI Bill before joining Fishburn Parish Council virtually.

I finished last week with a briefing from Darlington Borough Council leadership and then another from Sue Jacques, who leads the local NHS efforts. I was reassured by her that our local NHS is well positioned, in that although they have more people in hospital with Covid-19 now than they did at the peak of the first wave, they are in a better place. This is because they know so much more about what they are dealing with and have systems and processes in place, so, despite Covid-19 pressures, they can continue with elective surgeries safely.

I am sure you will all have seen the changes taking place over the weekend with the special advisers in number 10, notably the departure of Dominic Cummings. I only see the operations of the team in number 10 from a distance but special advisors come and go and my early sense is that the new team will communicate better with us backbenchers. Whilst he was obviously very influential in the campaign that got me elected, in terms of recent politics, I will not miss the distraction.

Monday saw the Prime Minister coming to the NRG meeting where he was very impressive and committed to supporting the levelling up agendas. Tuesday, I met the Home Secretary, Priti Patel, along with the other Durham MP's and another BEIS session which has moved from Thursday, but more about these next week.

We have seen more optimistic news on vaccines, but please remember that once these are ready to go it will be a major planning and logistical operation to get them to people. It is therefore imperative that we all continue to do all we can to frustrate the spread of the virus by doing the basics right.

So please remember: **HANDS - FACE - SPACE**, wash your **Hands** regularly, wear a mask on your **Face** where required and give people **Space -** continue to follow the new regulations for November, that will hopefully put us in a better place for December.

Middridge Road Speed **Limit Consultation**



I have received a letter from DCC Traffic Assets proposing an extension to the existing 40mph speed limit to cover the new access roundabout. Whilst this is clearly essential, I have replied making two points:

(1) The Extension of the Proposed 40mph Zone

It strikes me that, at just c. 25 metres, the new zone starts far too close to the roundabout. At Highway Code figures, this would require vehicles to be already travelling at 30 MPH when they meet the 40mph sign. Someone travelling at 60mph requires three times that distance - 73 metres - to come to a stop.

(2) The Extension of the Proposed 40mph

I have asked that they consider extending the 40mph zone all the way to Middridge, which is only 750 metres further. This has been the request of Middridge Parish Council for many years and I note that this stretch of Middridge Road:

- passes a settlement of six houses at a particularly narrow point where there is a bus stop;
- includes three access/egress points for vehicular traffic;
- lacks verges, includes a blind brow and is subject to frequent Respondong

The construction of the roundabout and the necessary amendment of the 40mph zone presents a real opportunity to extend the 40mph zone right through to Middridge, which will make this whole stretch of road safer, and will help to reduce speeding through Middridge Village. progressed to coaching and managing teams before becoming Chairman, and it was important to me that the new strip had our traditional royal blue colours".

A team of designers at Farrelly's offered 14 strips with various designs, making it very difficult to narrow the choice down, but eventually the final two were chosen. This then went to a vote of managers and coaches across all our teams who made the final decision. As well as the outfield strip the designers produced two unique goalkeeper designs which were offered to all our goal keepers with a choice of colours.

All the decisions were now made, but the first lockdown prevented the manufacture of our kit to progress, as the factory staff were furloughed alongside the suspension of football.

Club Secretary, Berni Borsberry, remarked "this was a frustrating time for everyone at the club, we knew that eventually lockdown would be lifted and football would restart, but only then could manufacturing commence. However, the result was a unique strip that all our players would be proud to wear". As the strips started to come off the production line, each team started immediately to wear their new bespoke kit and all received excellent comments from players, parents and opposing teams. The official launch of the strip was set for the weekend of 31st October 2020, just as the second lockdown was announced, and once again football would be suspended, but we are all hopeful that we can proudly wear our new strip as soon as possible.

A final comment from Jamie Nee, MD at Farrelly's, "we are delighted to be the chosen partner for Newton Aycliffe Youth Football Club and delighted that we could provide a strip, built on the royal blue tradition of the football club. Hopefully this is a partnership between Farrelly's and the club for many years to come".
