BOOK SALE RAISES £3000 FOR LOCAL CHARITY

Ex-Newtonian, Stephen Creaney, compiled an interesting and informative book entitled "Newton Aycliffe, A Long History of a New Town". The book took many months of research and records the town from before its inception into the new millennium. Stephen wanted to keep everything as local to Newton Aycliffe as possible and contracted Newton Press to print and sell the books on his behalf. From which the proceeds would all go to a local charity. Stephen was born in 1952 and lived in Clarence Green and later moved to Clarence Chare. He attended Sugar Hill Primary School and then Ferryhill Grammar Technical before Durham and Newcastle

Stephen was employed in the oil industry, which took him all around the world, but always returning to Newton Aycliffe to visit family.

"I compiled this book as a way of 'giving back' to the town I grew up in and will never forget. I'd like to thank everyone that bought the book and to Rotary Newton Aycliffe for helping those in need at Christmas. I'd also like to thank Newton Press and Mandy Bloom for making the publication happen," said Stephen.

The book demonstrates early maps of the area as well as illustrations, photographs, early records, first residents and businesses on the industrial estate, there is even a record of the 1951 census.



has been a difficult year for the community of Great Aycliffe with the ongoing Coronavirus pandemic affecting the lives of us all. The lockdown periods, social distancing measures and other restrictions have meant the Town Council has not been able to provide some of its services to the usual standards this year and has unfortunately led to the cancellation of a number of much loved community events including the senior citizens' trips, fun in the parks and fireworks display.

The Town Council wishes to recognise the impact of the pandemic on local services and the community of Great Aycliffe in two ways next year.

Firstly, we have prepared our budget for next year on the basis of a freeze in the Town Council proportion of the Council Tax bill. Despite this proposed council tax freeze, thanks to the prudent financial management of the Council over many years and the ongoing identification and delivery of efficiency savings, the proposed 2021/22 Revenue Budget will enable all current Council services, facilities and events to be provided to the usual high standards next year, whilst allowing the Council to continue to make investment in community assets via our Capital Programme Budget, funded from Council reserves.

Secondly, the Council wishes to pass back to the community the savings it has made in the current year as a result of reduced services and cancelled events, by setting up a COVID-19 Recovery Fund and using this to make a number of one-off investments next year to help make 2021 a better year for the Parish.

Initial ideas for investment include the setup of a community grants fund, additional or improved events and environmental improvements such as tree planting.

Have Your Say

Clearly the budget that we set is important to our local community, both in terms of how our spending plans may impact on the provision of local services and investment in assets for the benefit of the town, and in terms of the level of Council Tax that we need to raise from local taxpayers in order to fund these plans.

The Council would therefore very much welcome the views of the local community on our 2021/22 budget proposals via our recently published Budget Survey which can be accessed electronically via the links on the Council website and social media channels.

There is much more information on the Council's draft 2021/22 budget proposals, should you wish to read this, on the finance section of the Council's website.

Dear Sir,

This petition is to enable the deaf community to be heard and not to feel isolated. As my close friends may already know my Mam, Brenda Roberta Johnson, has had a horrendous time from 22nd August to 3rd December 2020, when she sadly passed away.

Within this time she had multiple hospital admissions where communication was a barrier. No hospital staff, excluding one doctor, were able to communicate in BSL (British Sign Language), to put her at ease and to allow my Mam to know what was happening to her. Darlington hospital allowed myself and my family to be by her bedside 24 hours a day to ensure communication needs were met. Following discharge from hospital my Mam had to go into a care home where, again, no one could communicate to her, she deteriorated greatly within days, which resulted in us caring for her at home. We are asking for this petition to be signed, we believe all medical and care staff should be trained in basic BSL. The wider deaf community need to be heard. When we reach 10,000 signatures, it will go to government and with 100,000 the government will debate it.

It takes two minutes of your time, but it will make an impact on the deaf community within the UK.

Following such a lovely afternoon in school the children all took home their Christmas mug or beaker as a memento of this 'Sugar Hill first!'



New Headteacher Thank You to Great Aycliffe Cancer **Support Group**

About two years ago my Mum had a cancerous tumour in her bowel, which was removed and went on to having a three monthly blood test. In January 2020, they came back and weren't right, so from then until July she underwent a CT scan, PET CT and then an MRI.

My husband took her to the RVI, where she was told they had found another tumour, however, an operation would be too dangerous for her so suggested chemotherapy.

In August we saw the chemotherapy specialist who informed us that chemotherapy was too dangerous and suggested she go and live her life. Mum was pleased about this, as she didn't want to have surgery or chemotherapy. However, due to Covid-19, she couldn't really go out, or do anything - so living her life was limited. Through all of this I got in touch with Alison White (Great Aycliffe Cancer Support Group), who met Mum, sent flowers, food parcels and even got in touch with Livin to sort out adaptations at Mums home to help her get about.

During Mums illness I decided I would conduct a raffle with family and friends to



help the charity and managed to raise £150. Mum also wanted to contribute, but passed away before she could, she also did not see how much I managed to raise.

I also placed a collection plate at her funeral, where we raised another £80, so



I was able to give Alison £230 for the Great Aycliffe Cancer Support Group.

I feel that local charities need local support and the likes of Cancer Research etc., are just such big institutions that £230 is just lost, whereas you can see straight away how this local charity are using their funds. The charity are also continuing to support me and my Dad, so they just don't stop when the family member passes, and I wanted to be able to say thank you to them for the support they give.

In May 2020 the Durham Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner received an additional £400,000 from the Ministry of Justice (MOJ) to help services for victims of domestic abuse and sexual violence continue to deliver support across County Durham and Darlington through the difficult circumstances created by the COVID 19

Twelve voluntary and community sector organisations who applied and met the specified criteria have benefited from the funding which enabled them to continue their invaluable work until October 2020 by introducing different and innovative ways of working throughout the Covid-19 lockdown period.

An additional £124,000 has now been made available by the MOJ which will enable the Office of the Durham Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner (ODPCVC) to provide further funding to these 12 services to ensure they can continue to deliver crucial services until March 2021. Last week started with a meeting with the permanent secretary for BEIS (Business Energy and Industrial Strategy) and her team. In this we had a comprehensive briefing to the BEIS select committee by all of the senior officials. This is a particularly important year for this conference in that it is five years since the Paris agreement and countries are expected to commit to improving their NDC targets. NDC's are nationally determined contributions and are at the heart of the Paris agreement and the achievement of long-term goals, they embody efforts by each country to reduce national emissions and adapt to the impact of climate change. The BEIS select committee session on Tuesday was a one

off session to look at the preparedness of the department for Cop26 and, considering the disruption of Covid-19, things are progressing well. Later we had an MP's briefing with the PM in anticipation of the tier restrictions vote. Last week I also had the pleasure of separate catch ups with the Bishop of Durham and the North of Tyne Mayor. Each had different incites to share and proved again that every day is a school day. Friday saw a virtual catch up with the Dean Bank Regeneration team at Ferryhill and the Chief Executive of the local NHS trust. In the latter we were reassured that trends are positive but of course we need to continue good practice.

The weekend included Small Business Saturday so I went to promote a number around our villages and would remind you all that many of them have had a very challenging year so please support them whenever you can. One of the best local small businesses, is of course our outstanding Newton Press, and like so many small businesses, they are great supporters of our community. Newton Press are also, through the pages of the Newton News, a great source of other local businesses you can support.

Unbelievably it is now a year since I was elected as your MP and I must say that, despite all that this year has thrown at us, I continue to believe I have the best job in the world and remain as proud and delighted to be your representative as I was on election night. The virus has frustrated, in particular, our efforts at direct engagement, but as the vaccine is deployed and the lockdowns get lifted next year we will double down on our efforts and support the Prime Minister as we deliver on levelling up and build back better.

We are seeing infection rates reducing but please continue to respect the rules and we can hope for a reduction to tier 2 at the earliest opportunity.

So please, everyone do your bit and remember **HANDS-FACE-SPACE**

Wash your Hands regularly, wear a mask on your Face where required and give people Space, follow the new regulations that will hopefully put us in a better place for Christmas and beyond.

Council Praised for its Climate Action Plan

A North East council has been praised for having one of the top climate change action plans in the country.

Durham County Council is among 13 local authorities that have the best climate change action plans for addressing food emissions, according to a new study.

The council has been named following research by Sustain, which looked into 92 local government plans and measures to tackle food-related emissions at the level needed to meet international commitments to keep global warming within 1.5 degrees and achieve net zero.

Sustain's research found that only 13 out of the 92 local authorities which have developed climate action plans had proposals to tackle food emissions at an adequate scale.

After declaring a climate emergency in 2019, Durham County Council pledged to reduce carbon emissions from the council's operations by 80 per cent by 2030, and to take necessary action to make County Durham carbon neutral by 2050.

To ensure this, the council developed its Climate Emergency Action Response Plan (CERP) outlining the measures it will take to meet this pledge, including actions to reduce food-related emissions.

The council has been working with organisations such as Durham Food Group and has been supported by its environment and climate change partnership stakeholder, Durham Community Action, to address carbon-producing factors such as food waste disposal, food sustainability, and agriculture.

By 2030, it aims to improve food sustainability by having significantly increased the proportion of local produce sold and grown in the county. The CERP also aims to reduce food-related emissions by working with local farmers and landowners to promote soil conservation, regenerative farming and agro-ecology.

The plan also seeks to reduce the amount of food waste produced by the county by promoting and encouraging residents to home-compost with carbon management guidance.

Agriculture, fishing, transport, food processing and waste is

responsible for 20 to 30 per cent of greenhouse gas emissions globally.
Cllr. John Clare, Durham County Council's Climate Change

Cllr. John Clare, Durham County Council's Climate Change Champion, said: "Our Climate Emergency Response Plan identifies significant steps we have pledged to take to help reduce the county's production of carbon and help tackle climate change. Local authorities have the opportunity to radically reduce the impact our food systems have on the climate, and this is something we have pledged to tackle in our plan. We are incredibly pleased that our plan has been acknowledged in this new research and that we are performing as one of the top UK authorities in our steps to address this global issue." Replacing EU Funding

Dear Sir.

Last Friday, in my role as Durham County Council Climate Champion, I attended the concluding (virtual) conference of LOCARBO, a high-level EU cooperation initiative for improving low-carbon economy policies, in which DCC has been involved. Three weeks ago, I attended a similar event for an EU buildings efficiency project called REBUS, and these two conferences signal the end of our EU climate collaborations. This is a setback.

UNCERTAIN FUNDING

Even more worryingly also, of course, EU funding will come to an end at the end of this month, and - although we have been promised that its UK successor, the 'Shared Prosperity Fund' (UKSPF), will at least match EU funding - we still have not been told when or how this money will be made available, what exactly it will replace or how it will be distributed.

We DO know that there will be a one-year gap, in 2021, before UKSPF funding becomes operational. So, although the EU has promised that EU money for existing projects will continue until they come to an end, we will therefore have a year when no NEW projects can be bid for.

FUTURE CONCERNS

As a 'transition' area within the EU, County Durham got preferential funding. We were due, in 2021, to be declared a 'less developed' area and get even more. That EU funding has paid, not only for much of the County Council's nationally-applauded Climate Change/Energy Efficiency work, but also for a number of other social and economic projects (for examples, our nationally-recognised DurhamWorks scheme to help young people into employment).

EU rules allowed us to cite deprivation as an argument for funding. By contrast, current UK government funding tends to be competitive, and measured by economic benefit ... and there is a concern that the UKSPF may gravitate to economically-stronger parts of the country.

So we go into the new year financially in the dark. We know that the government has promised £200million for 'pilot' projects during 2021, which might give us some idea of how the UKSPF will be allocated, but currently - again typically - we do not have any idea when or how this pilot money will be made available, what exactly it will address, or how it will be distributed!

All this not only threatens Durham County Council's financial ability to maintain our climate budget, but makes it impossible to plan for whatever future climate budget we may be going to get.
