## PCVC to Hold First Ever BUS | Shine Choir Children **Scrutiny Panel Next Week**

A new independent scrutiny panel is being launched next week to ensure members of the public have a voice in analysing police procedures in County Durham and Darlington.

The first ever BUS panel, which stands for BAME Arrest, Use of Force and Stop and Search will be introduced on the 21st January by the Office of the Durham Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner (ODPCVC).

Every year Durham Constabulary stop and search thousands of individuals and, if required, during arrests, officers may use proportionately applied force.

As such, the ODPCVC has set up their first BUS panel to allow members of the public to independently scrutinise the use of powers applied by officers.

The panel is made up of members of the public who are asked to analyse records and review body worn video to ensure that correct procedure is being followed appropriately by the Force.

The aim is to ensure there is full transparency, improve confidence in policing and encourage best practice.

The panel will be conducted every three months and a representative from the panel will make viable recommendations to the ODPCVC as to how processes are being applied by officers. Steve White, Acting Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner, said "I am very pleased to announce the launch of the BUS panel and look forward to seeing how the analysis from independent members will influence policing procedures. The purpose of the panel is so that members of the public can independently scrutinise the police use of powers, ensuring greater transparency and community involvement. Panels like this one will allow for community concerns to be raised, which in turn can influence police actions."

## First Kickstart Employees Have Joined the Ranks

Learning Curve Group (LCG) are playing a vital role in supporting young people into roles through the Government's Kickstart scheme. The £2billion Kickstart scheme, announced by the Chancellor, Rishi Sunak, as part of his 'Plan for Jobs' enables employers to offer six-month job placements for 16-24-year-olds at risk of long-term unemployment, with their wages paid by Government for up to 25 hours per week.

This year has seen the most people out of work since 1994 and as the pandemic gained momentum, lots of young people saw themselves unemployed, in particular those leaving education. The minimum number of positions per application, as set out by Government, is a barrier for smaller to medium sized enterprises when it comes to taking advantage of the scheme. Government recognise this and to aid in administrative output, select approved Gateway organisations are able to combine positions from multiple organisations to meet the minimum numbers required.

Learning Curve Group apply for placements and funding on behalf of a business, regardless of the number of opportunities they have within their organisation, significantly reducing the administrative pressure on your business, too. Once DWP approves the application, Job Centre Plus (JCP) advertise the placement referring any suitable applicants to LCG to sift. Once the recruitment and interview process has been completed, the business gets to make the final decision – saving essential time.

One of the first applications LCG have submitted, for a business



seeking warehousing and customer service staff in the North West of England, has been approved. They hope this will be the first of many cohorts they wish to recruit, giving unemployed people a fantastic opportunity.

Since receiving gateway approval, LCG has over 40 employers offering a significant amount of roles, with a further 200 employers finalising plans to utilise the scheme to recruit across England and Scotland in roles such as Care, Admin, Warehousing and Teaching Assistant roles.

## **Durham Safeguarding Children Partnership Appoints New Chair**

A former assistant chief constable has been appointed as the new independent chair and scrutineer of Durham Safeguarding Children Partnership (DSCP).

# Filtronic Secures £150,000 Capital Grant to Support Expansion Plans

Filtronic has received a grant of £150,000 to contribute towards its expansion project which will accelerate growth and increase its workforce.

The firm, which operates from NETPark in Sedgefield, was awarded the capital grant from the County Durham Growth Fund and is using the money to help bolster the company's manufacturing and testing facilities as well as create up to 36 new jobs.

Filtronic, which designs and manufactures advanced RF products and solutions for critical communications markets, has invested £1m in its expansion project. The investment, supported by the County Durham Growth Fund, will allow the company to increase its capacity significantly and win contracts with other customers, leading to accelerated growth.

Filtronic Chief Financial Officer, Michael Tyerman, said: "The way we communicate is changing dramatically and with the increased growth in traffic expected from 5G, network capacity has to be improved. In order to address this challenge, we have invested significant R&D activity in developing a number of E-band products which can deliver high performance at a competitive cost, which have understandably attracted interest from a number of potential new customers."

"Now, thanks to our own capital investment and the fantastic support we've had from the County Durham Growth Fund, we have been able to expand our manufacturing and testing facilities, allowing us to produce in larger quantities which will enable us to win work with other companies, accelerating our plans for growth."

The County Durham Growth Fund, overseen by Business Durham, the economic development arm of Durham County Council, is a £8.9m investment scheme providing funding to small and medium sized businesses in County Durham to accelerate their growth. Sarah Slaven, Interim Managing Director of Business Durham, said: "The support we have given to Filtronic has not only led to the creation of new jobs and significant expansion at the company's NETPark facility, but also demonstrates the diversity of the fund to support companies across a broad range of sectors in our area." Cllr. Carl Marshall, Durham County Council's cabinet member for economic regeneration, said: "We are pleased to be able to support Filtronic in expanding its enterprises, allowing it to accelerate its plans for growth, keep business in County Durham, and create new jobs for the region's people. This investment also supports our long-term ambition as a council, which is to preserve a thriving environment for businesses to grow while creating and safeguarding more and better jobs."

The fund is being delivered in partnership with UMi, which has a dedicated team of advisors ready to help with initial eligibility checks and funding applications. All successful grants applications are appraised by UNW LLP, an independent firm of chartered accountants and business advisers. The funding has been secured from the England European Regional Development Fund as part of the European Structural and Investment Funds Growth Programme 2014-2020.

Simon Allen, Investment Centre Director at UMi, said: "Filtronic is a fast-growing, hugely ambitious company which, thanks to the investment committed by the County Durham Growth Fund, has been able to roll out expansion plans which will cement its continued growth in County Durham for many years to come."

John Healey, Corporate Finance Partner at UNW LLP, said: "It is encouraging to see an innovative technology company be supported by the County Durham Growth Fund to create new jobs and increase its capacity."

## Sign up for 2021 Garden Waste Collections



Residents in County Durham can now sign up for the Garden Waste Collection scheme for 2021.

The first collection from the Durham County Council service takes place in late March or early April, followed by fortnightly collections until November when the season ends.

Those who sign up before Sunday 14 February will receive all 17 collections during the year, dependent on Government advice on coronavirus.

Residents can sign up for a fee of £35. Those who subscribed to the scheme in 2020 will be charged £30.90 per existing bin subscription for 2021 due to coronavirus causing a late start in 2020.

Collection calendars and stickers will be provided to residents in advance of the scheme starting following subscription. Once the scheme has started, residents who sign up to the service will receive the remaining collections before the season ends.

John Shannon, Durham County Council's strategic waste manager, said: "We would like to take this opportunity to thank customers who signed up to the 2020 scheme for their patience as there were interruptions to the service due to the ongoing pandemic.

"Over 65,000 residents signed up to the 2020 service which resulted in us collecting over 16,000 tonnes of garden waste".

To sign up to the service or find out if a property is eligible, call 03000 260 000 or visit www.durham.gov.uk/gardenwaste When residents subscribe to the service they are reminded to fix their bin sticker to the garden waste bin and put the bin out for collection by 7am on their allocated collection day.

Collection information will be available before the scheme starts and can be found by visiting www.durham.gov.uk/MyDurham and entering the postcode and property number.

Residents are reminded that the following items can go in the garden waste bin for composting and should not be used for any other waste:

- · Grass cuttings
- Leaves
- Flowers and bedding plants
- Prunings

- Shrubs
  - Weeds
- Hedge clippings
- Small branches

Durham County Council provides garden waste collections to eligible properties in County Durham.

For residents in the Teesdale area, garden waste collections are carried out by Rotters, working in partnership with the county council. Residents in this area should call 01833 690 022 or visit www.rotters.org

## to Aid Business Recovery View on Police Budget



Durham County Council looks set to roll out a grant scheme which would provide up to £40,000 in financial assistance to companies, to help them implement recovery plans to overcome the impacts of the virus. The Durham Business Recovery Grant Scheme would support more than 880 firms and have the potential to safeguard over 1,760 jobs, across the county. The scheme went before the council's Cabinet for approval last week.

A report to the meeting on Wednesday 13th January set out how £3 million would come from the council's own General Fund resources, with £2 million being made available from the authority's allocation from the government's Additional Restrictions Support Grant. The grant scheme would be open to companies across County Durham, in all sectors and varying in size from micro-businesses to those employing up to 250 people in the county.

It would aim to provide financial support for the implementation of business recovery plans; helping firms that have a credible plan to adapt and recover but require additional financial support to be able to implement it. The scheme would offer grants from £1,000 up to a maximum of £40,000 and would contribute 75 per cent towards the recovery plan costs, with the business expected to meet a quarter of the project cost. It is estimated that the £5 million budget would allow at least 880 businesses to be supported.

Cabinet is also being asked to note support already being offered to micro businesses (those employing less than 10 people) in the county through the Durham Business Opportunities Programme. Launched in October, this involves businesses being given one-toone marketing support to help them increase their sales post-COVID and grants of up to £500 to help implement advice received.

The programme aims to support 110 businesses, with a grant pot of £55,000 which is being met from the reserve of Business Durham, the council's economic development arm.

Cabinet is also being asked to note that a review is being carried out of funding available to support business start-up in the county. Members will be told that subject to the outcome, council may need to consider additional funding support for start-ups in the form of a grant or voucher scheme. A further report will be brought to Cabinet once the review has been completed.

Cabinet will also be told of further efforts by the council to support the county's economy and its recovery from coronavirus, through the Social Value and Local Wealth Building (The County Durham Pound) project. Members will receive an update on the project which sees the council working with developers and suppliers to identify social value and wealth building opportunities. It also looks to ensure that social value and community wealth building are part of both the council's response to Covid-19, and the delivery of the four priorities within the Council Plan 2020 - 2023.

## Council Set to Invest £5m | Consultation Open for your

Residents of County Durham and Darlington are being asked how much they are willing to pay for policing in their council tax. The government has recently confirmed that Police and Crime Commissioners can increase the precept by £15 annually. The Office of Durham Police, Crime & Victims' Commissioner is recommending the precept (council tax) is increased by the maximum amount of £15 per year in Band D properties. In County Durham and Darlington such increase will help deliver the policing uplift to enable more police officers on the streets and in the communities, provide support to those suffering mental health crises in order to keep them and our communities safe, as well as ensuring the force control room is sufficiently resourced to meet demand from 999 and 101 calls.

The increase in precept will also enable the force to invest in technology infrastructure, increasing the effectiveness and efficiency of police procedures so that officers can continue to deliver support to communities and businesses.

The Force will also benefit from precept funding, using its resources to work on crime issues such as county lines in partnership with neighbouring forces to ensure they try and interrupt organised crime and drug gangs.

The force would like to continue to invest and educate residents regarding the emerging and growing types of crime, including cybercrime which is becoming more prevalent.

Over recent years the precept has been increased to help continue to invest in victim support services, such as to victims who need assistance to recover from domestic and/or sexual abuse, and ensure the force are able to maintain a strong PCSO presence within the community.

Steve White, Acting Durham Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner, said, "Durham Constabulary is one of the most efficient police forces in the country according to HM Inspectorate of Constabulary and Fire and Rescue Services. That's a consequence of the force's commitment to innovation and making the very best use of the money available.

"I recognise how tough this year has been on everyone within the community and how difficult individuals' financial circumstances have become, however policing is an essential service that will help us keep our communities safe.

"Our police force has faced their own challenges and worked extremely hard to set new regulations this year in order to keep people safe during the pandemic.

The proposed increase will help meet the rising demand from people who suffer from mental health crisis in our communities, in order to keep them and the public safe. An increase will also mean we can continue to deliver an effective and efficient police force and maintain the highest standard of policing with more officers on the streets protecting the community".

Residents will be asked what services they think would benefit from extra investment including victim support, rural crime and anti-social behaviour.

Last year's precept increase of £10 per Band D household helped support the employment of over 68 additional police officers plus additional police staff to support these officers, to Durham Police during 2020/21.

Durham Constabulary has recently submitted a planning application to build a £21m centralised custody facility, these funds have come from reserves and will not be funded from a rise in the precept. Steve White, Acting Durham Police, Crime and Victims Commissioner will make a precept recommendation to Durham

Police and Crime Panel in the New Year, once the consultation has



## **Record Number of Nursing Students**

The latest data on university admissions published by UCAS shows record numbers of students accepted places to study nursing and midwifery in England this vear.

The final figures from this year's admission cycle show there were 29,740 acceptances to nursing and midwifery courses in England, 6,110 more than last year and an increase of over a quarter (26%). This year, 23% (6,770) of acceptances were from students aged 35 years and older, a 43% increase on last vear.

The number of new nursing applicants to English providers between 15 January and 30 June was 68% (4,600) higher than the same period last year. The lockdown period (23 March - 30 June deadline) itself saw nearly double the number of applications to nursing relative to the same period in the year previously. In September the Government introduced training grants for eligible nursing, midwifery and many allied health profession students of at least £5,000 a year, which does not need to be paid back. Additional payments of up to £3,000 will be available for specialisms struggling to recruit including learning disability and mental health nursing and to help students cover childcare costs. Figures to the end of August show the number of nurses in the NHS in England increased by 14,813 compared to last year.

We are all doing our best to adapt to another lockdown, albeit one that this time has a light at the end of it. How bright that light shines and how quickly we get back to daylight depends on us all. The roll out of vaccines is critical but it is our actions in the meantime that will also be critical. We need to follow the spirit of the rules as well as the letter. There has been some debate this week about what is local and whether specific distances should be given. I can't see how that would work, for me this is about following the spirit of the law and taking personal responsibility for our actions. For most of us in our area there is little need to travel to exercise as we are blessed with a green town but for some it is appropriate. All I would say is if you do need to travel for exercise, if, when you get there, it's busy, go somewhere else.

This is all about stopping transmission between households. When I talk to the Police about where they see problems their biggest concern is those inviting friends or family into their houses. This is the biggest risk of transmission and I fully support the Police in giving little latitude to these people and progressing fines, etc, as robustly as they can. These idiots are putting themselves and the rest of us at risk. As a Conservative politician I am all for personal freedoms but in the current environment I have no time for those denying the existence of the virus and propagating ridiculous conspiracy theories. I have been to our local hospitals and these people only undermine the efforts of our fabulous NHS teams. I can assure you that as soon as it is safe to do so I will be wanting our freedoms back, but only when it is safe to do so.

Anyway, as regards what I have been doing this week, like a lot of people I have largely been working from home. Also, like many, I am going zoom or teams crazy with days where it is one virtual meeting after another

so the occasional need to meet a constituent is a real treat.

I have had virtual meetings on many subjects including vaccinations, with minister Zahawi who is leading the roll out, and I have been very impressed by him. I am sure his background in logistics will help enormously. I have had updates with Durham County Council (DCC) and the MP for Bishop Auckland, Dehenna Davison, on Greenfield School; also with DCC on selective licensing; I also had several conversations with both ministers and local MP's (Red and Blue) about Ferryhill Station and the Leamside line proposals. I was also able to actually visit one of the nursery providers to discuss their concerns around remaining open when schools are closed to all but essential workers and I am writing to the minister to share their concerns. The select committee work on BEIS continues and this week it was all about the energy white paper where it was good to see organisations like the Climate Change Committee and the Renewable Energy Association welcoming it. There is work to do on delivery but they were happy with the white paper. Next week we are due to discuss COP26 which, as I have mentioned before, is the big Climate Change conference taking place in Glasgow later this year. Other interesting meetings during the week included the PM coming to the 1922 committee and a briefing with the new Press Secretary for No 10, Allegra Stratton, as well as a meeting of the Northern Research Group of MP's whose focus is to shout up for the North. I was also able to speak in a debate virtually, for the first time. I spoke in the Global Britain debate on Monday about the need to invest in the North East so we can grow our businesses and start to build back better. It is strange speaking in a debate to a laptop screen when no-one can intervene or question you, more like a short speech really.

A final comment on vaccinations, the roll out has a number of approaches to it. These range from the large vaccination centres like the Centre For Life at Newcastle to local pharmacies. These are being developed in parallel with each other and everyone will soon have an option for one within 10 miles of where they live. You may get the option to go to one of the bigger centres and feel free to take this if you wish but if it is too far to travel you can wait and you will get a more local option.

## Parliament Commissioner **Visits Aycliffe**

I had the pleasure of visiting Newton Aycliffe Neighbourhood Policing Team this month and found out how they have been tackling anti-social behaviour in the area. I met with Inspector Sarah Honeyman and Sergeant Andy Boyd who showed me the hotspot areas for anti-social behaviour around the town and how they are looking at measures to prevent this behaviour. New initiatives are being explored in Newton Aycliffe in collaboration with the council and local services. Newton Aycliffe Neighbourhood Policing Team are working to establish a community hub like PACT House, Stanley, which would become a safe space for local people looking for practical and emotional support, all in a relaxed cafétype environment.

I also had the pleasure of meeting PC Mike

Welch who has been in the police force for

over fourteen years. It was great to see the

relationships he has built within the community

and listening to those who need help or have

concerns. He has a strong passion for policing

and delivers an exceptional level of service for

Durham Police. I learned about other initiatives

that have been on-going over recent months to

tackle anti-social behaviour including officers spending time with young people who have previously caused anti-social behaviour, who are now working on projects giving back to the community. A young person who previously caused anti-social behaviour in the community led a project to create Christmas wreaths to give to families, vulnerable persons and nursing homes within the Western Area. Over 50 wreaths were created and delivered to families within the community in partnership with the local garden centre and funding from the Western Partnership. The local McDonald's has also partnered with the neighbourhood policing team to award young people that have shown fantastic community spirit in Newton Aycliffe through the ACE programme, as well as looking at ways to further support teenagers in the future through work experience and mentoring. Newton Aycliffe Neighbourhood Policing Team has also been supported by partners in obtaining funding to assist in the safer homes initiative whereby victims of crime will be offered additional security measures free of charge. It was great to meet more of the Newton Aycliffe Neighbourhood Policing Team this month and discuss ways they are preventing anti-social behaviour and working with young people. Anti-social behaviour is a blight for many, and I have seen first-hand the comprehensive response which Durham police are driving. Policing has no magic wand to stop anti-social behaviour, but they do have the innovation, ideas and partnerships to make long term sustainable changes to prevent rather than react to the behaviour. 


