I have a large vehicle (car) in my garage, it is 15' 9" long, my garage door is an up and over outward door, which means it takes up 50 percent + 4 feet of the adopted highway, (extra) land outside of my garage, if people park opposite my garage it is dangerous for me to remove my vehicle from the garage. I also own a 21' motor home which is parked on my drive, it can only be removed if the pavement opposite is not obstructed, even if it is partial.

We have a lot of pensioners, including myself, (74), who have to go onto the grass to get past these cars, some get stuck in the mud, it is horrendous to witness and people should have more common sense with their parking. Unfortunately, not a lot do have any common sense, it is an offence to park on paths, so stop it now.

Remember, you will be old one day, then you will see what we are trying to stop. Please think before parking.

A Fair Challenge

Dear Sir,

When I became a town councillor in 1995, budget meetings consisted of powerful councillors trying to bully the Council to allocate money to the things they favoured. Meetings ran into the night, with bitter arguments over (e.g.) the 'right' price for a bowls session.

About 20 years ago, therefore, instead of the yearly wrangle, we instituted a system of Medium Term Financial Plans (MTFP) predicting spending and income over the coming four years, which allocated our spending according to our underlying principles, not personal politics. In 2007 we recruited Dan Austin as Finance Manager, who has steadily brought the Town Council's finances under expert control.

HOW TOWN COUNCIL FINANCES WORK

Now, section managers determine how much they will need for the next four years and justify its place in the MTFP; we can tell you, reasonably accurately, what the budget will look like in 2025. There is continuous pressure for savings, accuracy and probity. We have an internal auditor (who looks for discrepancies and unnecessary spending), and an external audit far more thorough than that required by the government; for democratic accountability, an Audit Committee of councillors scrutinises that work. Officers have predicted the maintenance and replacement needs of every building and item of machinery for the next 15 years; an Asset Management Group of councillors meets regularly to scrutinise their schodule.

Meanwhile, a Service Review Committee systematically examines each service area to see if our provision is appropriate, necessary, and value for money.

Each year the public is consulted for its views; every few months the MTFP is brought to the councillors for comment and update. And Town Council finance officers check every item of spending as it happens seeking savings ... EVERY YEAR they bring back savings to carry forward to reduce next year's council tax (e.g., last year, £187,500 genuine efficiency savings and increased income on the planned budget).

THIS YEAR'S BUDGET MEETING

On 27 January, the 2021-22 budget was brought to Full Council ... after three Council budget meetings (i.e. for Environment/ Recreation/ Policy & Resources) to consider the proposed final figures.

The only councillor who spoke on 27 January was Cllr Michael Stead. He (falsely) claimed credit for the decision to freeze Council Tax, (groundlessly) asserted there were savings to be made, and proposed setting up a council committee to wage a 'war on waste'. WHAT 'WASTE'!! We already have a slew of measures routinely seeking every possible saving, and such content-free allegations are a mendacious insult, not just to our hard-working finance department, but to the other opposition councillors – who had scrutinised the budget and declared it fit for task.

Cllr Stead had not spoken a word the week before, when we had actually discussed the proposed budget. And his suggested savings were: (1) cut the councillors' diary; (2) stop paying £20 a month on councillors' meeting papers. What would be at most £350-worth of suggestions would save just 5p A YEAR on your Council Tax (and, if he had asked, he would have known that when we looked at going paper-free we found it might cost the Council MORE).

A DANGEROUS FAILURE

Last March Cllr Stead was elected on a landslide, promising to cut council tax. Since then, he has failed to suggest one meaningful saving. I know 'every little helps', but the gross annual Town Council budget is about £3 million. And how much more paltry will that £350 look if he gets to County Hall, with its gross annual budget of £1.3 BILLION? I set Cllr Stead a fair challenge: to move past the sound bites and tell us HOW he would reduce Council Tax.

But it is worse than that. His demand for a councillors' 'Savings Committee' threatens to take us back to the dark days when Councillors dominated Council finances, e.g. telling grounds staff what kind of mower they needed, and office staff what kind of shredder they should buy. PLEASE let's not return ill-informed political meddling to replace the objective, expert-led, democratically-monitored SYSTEMS which Labour has put in place over the past 20 years to guide Town Council finances.

A Different Perspective on the Towns Parking Problems

Dear Sir

I think it's fair to say there is a parking problem in the town, or, more to the point, some motorists have a problem parking their cars, which then has a knock on effect for the rest of the community. Cars parked on pavements and grassed areas churned up to such an extent they are both unsightly and dangerous should anyone have the misfortune to slip on the mud smeared pavements and roads. It's also fair to say it's a community based problem, so common sense should tell us it requires a community based solution, which requires people in the community to take personal responsibility for the current situation.

Are some of the parking issues created by inconsiderate and lazy drivers? Yes, without doubt, but the real problem is you have more cars than you have parking places. If people can't park outside of their own home they will park in the nearest available space, regardless of whether it's a vacant piece of grass, the curbside or pavement. Factor into the mix households with more than one car and the situation is exacerbated even further. Young people have a tendency to see owning their own car as a sign of their independence, so the problem is only going to get worse with more cars on the roads and looking for a place to park. Everyone has the right to own their own car but with every right comes an underpinning responsibility in the way we exercise those rights.

Some would say it's the councils responsibility to sort the problem out, but the council don't own the cars, we do, and it's we who are causing the problem in the way we are parking our cars without thought or consideration to pedestrians or other road users.

Even if we chopped down every tree in the town and turned every piece of grassed area into parking spaces you would still have lazy and inconsiderate drivers causing problems. This drastic measure would still only temporarily alleviate the problem as the increase in cars would eventually surpass the parking spaces available, and who would pay for such drastic, if unacceptable, measures, everyone or just those with cars, and the more cars you have the more you have to pay? There are no easy solutions or quick fixes to this situation, but I think part of the problem lies in the unwillingness of some people in the community to hold themselves accountable for their actions. It's not my problem, is used as an excuse for what is, in effect, destructive anti-social behaviour. If teenagers caused the same kind of damage to grassed areas and caused the same level of disruption and obstruction there would be outrage, but because it's people and their cars causing the damage, we treat it as an acceptable and unavoidable fact of life. But as long as we see it as someone else's problem we will never be able to achieve a community based solution. Name and address supplied.

Would you put yourself at risk by getting behind the wheel drunk? No? Then why would anyone consider using a mobile phone whilst driving is OK?

The distraction caused by even looking at your phone whilst driving can cause similar risks to driving drunk and that's including the hands free!

It has been recognised for some time as a contributory factor in collisions and one of the Fatal 4 which can have devastating consequences.

Drivers are four times more likely to be involved in a collision as you are less likely to notice and react to hazards if distracted. Smart phones can increase the temptation to make and answer calls but also to select music or respond to social media alerts. Don't make that 'quick' glance the last thing you ever do! From 8th February, Cleveland and Durham Specialist Operations Unit (CDSOU) will be taking part in a two-week national campaign to make drivers aware of the dangers and help people make a change that could save a life.

Did you know:

It's illegal to hold a phone or sat nav while driving even when you're stopped at lights or stuck in traffic.

You must be in full control of your vehicle at all times. You can be stopped by officers and prosecuted if they think you're not in control and are distracted and face six penalty points and a £200

Be aware, there are other means of being caught and dealt with. More people than ever have dashcams fitted in their vehicles and are using the online reporting option to let police know about offences committed!

You can avoid these risks by simply putting your phone out of sight such as in the glove box or turning on an app which will block any calls or notifications for your journey. It will even send the person trying to get in touch a handy message to let them know you're on the road and will reply when it's safe.

Inspector Ian Leach, from CDSOU, said: "We cannot stress enough how serious an offence this is. It only takes seconds of being distracted at the wheel to have a serious collision which can have catastrophic consequences. Be in no doubt, you can kill someone. Our message is simple - put the phone away while driving!"

New Business Growth Despite Pandemic

Latest figures show that Durham saw a substantial increase in the number of new company formations during 2020 - despite the considerable economic challenges posed by the Coronavirus

The county registered 5,083 new businesses compared to 4,623 during 2019, representing an increase of 10%.

This brings the total number of companies in Durham to 31,943, up from 29,218 at the end of 2019, which equates to 9.3% growth. The statistics are taken from the Inform Direct Review of Company Formations using data from Companies House and the Office for National Statistics.

County Durham formed the highest number of new businesses (2,902), followed by Stockton-on-Tees (909) and Darlington (737). John Korchak, Operations Director at Inform Direct said: "It is excellent news to see that Durham has achieved a successful year for new company formations during 2020 despite the unprecedented uncertainties brought by COVID-19.

"Many of the new company formations are in the retail sector, with a large number of new businesses set up to sell goods online or locally, thereby taking advantage of customers' changing shopping habits. Secondly, the effect of the pandemic and national lockdowns means that sadly some existing businesses have folded and employees made redundant, and we see many of those people setting up new ventures on their own as an alternative way to earn a livina.

"2020 was a year like no other for UK businesses. Although we can look forward to a brighter future with the vaccination programme, there remain unknown factors such as how quickly the economy will recover and of course the impact of Brexit."

Alongside Durham's achievement, the UK as a whole saw a recordbreaking

780,766 new businesses formed, compared to 690,763 in 2019. The overall number of UK companies also continued to grow to 4,837,426, an 8.2% increase on the total of 4,471,008 at the end of

The number of company dissolutions across the UK - 418,427 during 2020 - was the lowest since 2015. It remains open to debate whether this positive trend will last, especially when Government support for businesses is withdrawn. New enterprises set up during the pandemic might also be short-lived, as people return to full-time employment or struggle to take the business to the next level. 

It was so sad to hear that Captain Sir Tom Moore passed away this week. He is someone who showed how doing something relatively small and simple can explode and make such a real difference to his and so many peoples lives. He had started wanting to raise £1000, which his family thought a stretch, but ended up raising over £32 million and inspiring many others with his positivity, it must have been an incredibly fulfilling last year. RIP Sir Tom.

I also had a good personal friend succumb to Covid this week. However stark the numbers are nationally it always strikes harder when it is someone you know, as a close friend or relative, and particularly when they are younger than you. So I reiterate once more my thanks to all of the key workers helping us through this and repeat my contempt for those denying Covid or not treating others with respect

Again, another interesting week. I had a couple of opportunities to speak in Parliament this week and thought it would be worth explaining the process we go through for this to happen.

There are essentially only two ways to speak in Parliament whilst we are working remotely. These are to ask a question to a minister or to contribute to a debate For questions, everyone is aware of Prime Ministers questions, but there is a rolling sequence of other ministers with one at the despatch box each day. For each of these, if you want to ask a question you submit it into a ballot which is drawn a few days before the event. There are two types of question, one where you submit the specific question and one called a topical, where you do not need to decide your question until the day. If you are successful you will be told and, if you had submitted a specific question, then you can also prepare a supplementary question. The Speaker will usually put around 35 specific and 20 topicals on the call list. Normally only around 25 and 15 respectively are actually asked, but if questions and answers are short then more get asked. Typically these are significantly oversubscribed and you are lucky to get a question every couple of weeks or so. For contributing to a debate, the process is much the same, in that you put your name into a ballot. The difference is that you do not need to give any details of what you are going to say. In times when the house is sitting normally you would be subject to interventions whilst speaking, as it is, part of a debate and your points are subject to robust challenges. In the virtual chamber this is not possible, so we are in effect providing a short speech and the only retort comes

when the minister sums up at the end. A further challenge here though is that the deadline for submitting to speak is normally the day before the debate, and again you are subject to a ballot. Whilst your chances of speaking are higher than for a question, because you don't know until the night before whether you have been selected, you have the choice of preparing a speech that may not be used or creating one at pace, once you know. The other dimension to consider is how long a speech. Again you do not know until very late how long you will be allowed, as the Speaker is at liberty to put a time limit on back bench contributions. This can mean that if you have prepared a six minute speech and a three minute limit is applied then some serious editing needs to be done if your key points are all to be made. So, this week I was drawn in two debates, I contributed to the opposition day debate re protecting tenants and leaseholders from unsafe cladding where I talked about the importance of building products standards being enforced, this was heavily oversubscribed meaning our contributions were restricted to three minutes. Later in the week I spoke in the air traffic management and unmanned aircraft bill - this was not as popular and as a result I could drone on a bit, speaking for around six minutes, and particularly referring to consideration of regional airports like Teesside. Back to our local priorities and we continue

to see good progress on vaccine roll outs and a number of the key metrics seem to be trending the right way. This hopefully means that we should start to see plans being made to consider how we relax some restrictions. Clearly we can expect this to be a slow and controlled process but whilst we wait for this it remains important that we all continue to follow the rules so please:

Stay Home, Protect the NHS and Save Lives Stay safe.



Stiller Recruitment Drive

Stiller Warehousing and Distribution, based on Aycliffe Business Park in Newton Aycliffe, is creating 25 new positions which it aims to fill by the end of March. Positions include HGV drivers, fork lift drivers, administrative roles in transport operations and customer service representatives.

The raft of new roles, which would boost Stiller's staff numbers to 180, come after the firm's sales grew to £16.1m last year, up from £15.2m in 2019. Stiller has leased two warehouses in Newton Aycliffe and Spennymoor, totalling 122,000 sq ft, to capitalise on the surge in demand for its services.

Managing director, Matthew Stiller, said: "Our increase in sales is down to the two additional warehouses and an upturn in our transport business. We have taken on new work for ecommerce packaging suppliers and additional transport business for clients that e-retail bulky products that require a full UK delivery service. We're forecasting the full-year effect of that increased activity to be £16.5m for 2021."

Stiller saw an initial drop in sales during the first lockdown, but saw a significant bounceback in the second half of the year. "We've had big operational challenges just like all businesses have had in 2020," added Matthew. "Dealing with a huge drop in work levels in April during the first lockdown, followed by a corresponding rebound, was challenging to manage. I also cannot overstate the huge influence Amazon's ecommerce market share has had on the third-party logistics sector. In most weeks, deliveries to their fulfilment centres is eclipsing all supermarket distribution centres combined."

Matthew added: "This latest recruitment campaign will help us to not only maintain our service standards but also to further improve on them. It's a somewhat challenging environment to be recruiting in at the moment, but it's very positive that we're increasing the size of our team and we expect to see further growth in 2021."
