# **Bishop of Durham Partners with Christian Aid**

The Diocese of Durham has partnered with aid and development charity Christian Aid to give people an opportunity to give thanks for their Covid-19 vaccine and help others in crisis across the world.

Recognising the deep sense of relief and gratitude experienced by many people after being vaccinated, the two organisations have come together to enable people to pass the blessing on by making a donation to Christian Aid's Coronavirus Appeal. Funds from the appeal are helping vulnerable communities around the world access soap, water, food and vital health information in the face of the pandemic. Many communities around the world face an uncertain wait for a vaccine as questions remain around the cost and timing of a global vaccine programme.

The Rt Revd Paul Butler, Bishop of Durham, who received his first vaccination at the newly opened centre in Durham said: "The vaccine is bringing with it a deep sense of relief and hope for families across the UK and increasingly we see that many people want to express their gratitude by reaching out to others. While the pandemic affects all of us, it has highlighted the deep disparities in how communities and families are able to protect themselves both within our country and around the world.

"My hope is that people will give generously to the work of Christian Aid from a place of thanksgiving and a desire to see all people being able to live safely. Whether people can give just a few pounds or a much larger sum, it will be an opportunity to share hope and love with our brothers and sisters across the world who do not have the benefits we have.

Christian Aid partners have so far directly helped over half a million people in 27 countries including distributing food packages to nearly 60,000 people struggling to feed their families after losing work during the lockdown and the economic downturn. Going forwards, Christian Aid will support vaccination programmes in communities by providing data on hard-to-reach populations to local health services and by working with trusted community figures to challenge misleading information about the virus and vaccination as well as any stigma faced by those who contract Covid-19.

Christian Aid's Head of Community Fundraising and Public Engagement, Chine McDonald, said: "The coronavirus pandemic has shown us that none of us is safe until all of us are safe. It has been amazing to see the speed at which the vaccines have been rolled out in the UK - every jab in someone's arm brings us closer to the end of Covid-19. But the reality is that richer countries like ours are getting more access to vaccines, while the poorer countries in which Christian Aid works are left at the back of the queue. As a Christian organisation, we believe that every person is equal in the sight of God and worthy of living lives with dignity, equality and justice.

"We're delighted to work together with the Diocese of Durham to give people an opportunity to say thanks and help protect our global neighbours while the vaccine is

# **Council Candidates Claims and Promises**

Dear Sir

As I write this letter, Spring is in the air, snowdrops and crocuses are in bloom - Reading recent editions of the Newton News, so are local elections.

Please make every effort to vote in these elections - you will be voting for the future of our town. When you vote, think carefully of the claims and promises being made by candidates. Beware of those making impossible claims.

In 2007, certain Independent candidates claimed that they would reduce Council Tax by 50%. This was impossible, but 15 Independents were elected to the Town Council and over the four following years contributed nothing of note to either the Medium-Term Financial Plan or the four successive budgets.

One candidate, this year is claiming he will reduce the number of councillors on the Town Council from 30 to 22. He cannot do that! The number of members who serve on the Town Council is decided by the Boundary Commission, who meet infrequently.

Some candidates will be promising to do things which they know full well are projects in hand. I will give you two examples:

Clean the West Park lakes. In the Town Council's Medium-Term Financial Plan, the lakes are due to be cleaned in September to October 2022. There will be complaints expressed by the public over the disruption to wildlife. There will be a very obnoxious smell (the silt in the lake has come from open drains in the Beechfield/Elmfield area and from waterfowl droppings over a period of at least 17 years). The cost of the cleaning and repairs will be horrendous. ii) Elmfield School Site - the Council has been in negotiation with Durham County Council for about four years over the possible transfer of part of the site (this is the part which is subject to flooding). At the moment, the site is out to tender. Before the pandemic, Councillor Malcolm Iveson and myself met with interested developers to visit the site. I must say, the potential developers were not impressed. The access to the site is difficult and is very like an urban Hampton Court Maze. The site is surrounded by a high metal fence, nevertheless, the area has been subject to extensive vandalism. The outlook over the lakes could be a real selling point, apart from the local convenience store, which is so highly barricaded that it would not look out of place in Iraq or Beirut.

We are already seeing candidates exaggerating their input to improvements which have taken place. Recently it was claimed that three County Councillors in the past had obtained £150,000 to develop the Cobblers Hall Play Area. The facts behind the improvement of the area are worth mentioning.

- On the demise of Sedgefield Borough Council, Durham County Council received approximately £95 million more assets than liabilities on the transfer. Most of this was in the form of cash in bank. The largest proportion of the money had been raised from the sale of the land in the northern area of Newton Aycliffe. For example, plot J in the Cobblers Hall area (J being the tenth letter in the alphabet) was sold for £12.6 million.
- Cobblers Hall Play Area was part of the liabilities transferred to Durham County Council.
- The site was totally neglected, equipment was broken, the site was overgrown and heavily littered. It was a total disgrace and unfit for purpose.
- Local councillors, including one County Councillor, contacted the Town Council to see if we would take over the site. The County Council would pay £75,000 and the Town Council £75,000. The Town Council agreed to the proposal because we believe that every area in our town should have a park or suitable play area near at hand.

# Our Heroic Comms Staff are Never Off-Duty!

Emergency 999 call dispatcher Angela Walton leapt into action last week when she apprehended a shoplifter in Newton Aycliffe. Angela had just escorted her 81-year-old mum to the opticians when the pair decided to nip into one of her favourite shops.

"It was the first time mam had been out in nearly a year because of Covid so she was really excited," Angela said. "We decided to pop into her favourite shop to get a few bits.

But as the pair perused through the biscuit aisle,

Angela noticed a man acting suspiciously. He went on to take dozens of packets of Kit Kats off the shelf and stuff them into carrier bags before doing the same with meat from the store's fridges.

Suspecting the man would try to steal the goods, Angela made her way to the front of the store and blocked the exit.

"I stood at the doors and closed them and he looked at me and bolted to the other side of the shop," she said. "I shouted to the cashier but he was already through the till so I just instinctively ran

"I grabbed hold of him and he kept trying to pull away, saying I was just making my job harder but then he threw the bags down so I picked them up and took them back to the shop."
The suspect has now been reported to the police and enquiries are

Despite her brave actions, Angela said she did not think twice when she realised what was happening.

The 51-year-old, who works in the control room at HQ, said: "I love being a dispatcher and although instinct just kicked in, I won't be making a habit of chasing after suspects. I'll leave that to our dedicated cops.

"It's actually funny because when I went back to my mam she was still looking at the biscuits and didn't seem to bat an evelid." Force Incident Manager, Dave Clarke, praised Angela for the actions and has nominated her for a staff WOW award which recognises employees who have gone above and beyond to serve the public. "We are really proud of Angela and her actions show how integrated the force's vision and values are into every single one of our staff members who always go above and beyond to protect the public,

both on and off duty.
"People sometimes think it's only cops who work for the police but we have a wide range of people in different roles who have that strong sense of right and wrong and moral values. Well done Angela!"

# **Update on Newton Aycliffe Defibrillators Units**

Dear Sir

When I first started this project to provide potential life saving Defibrillator equipment into our community I realised that I needed to make people aware of:-

#### Why they were needed:

Each year hundreds of thousand cardiac arrests and over half are fatal.

#### What they do:

Early access could dramatically increase survival rates from 5% to nearly 70%.

#### When:

Public access 24 hours a day via 999 system. Where:

A wide network positioned throughout our community.

#### How:

Provide basic CPR and Defibrillator awareness talks and training to assist funding. The initial response, especially from the public at Woodham Village, Middridge and Greenfield, was fantastic, with over £3,000 being raised within weeks. This was swiftly followed by backing from our GAMP Area Action Partnership, GATC, Middridge Parish Council, Alisdair and Louise McConnel from the Village Pharmacy. As did the first five unit venues at Woodham Community Centre, PCP Centre, Middridge Bay Horse, Greenfield Shop and Woodham College.

This start was built on, and awareness and training in the community was used to promote and raise more funding to extend the project further.

At the start we did not have any 24 hour public access units anywhere in our Aycliffe area. We now have Woodham Community Centre, PCP, Bay Horse, Navy Club, Silverdale Place, School Aycliffe Community Centre, OakLeaf sports field, Aycliffe Village Community Centre, Simpasture Court, Neville Community Centre, St Clare's, St Mary's, 75 Washington Crescent.

A new unit slap bang in the middle of the Town Centre shopping precinct was fitted last week. When we add in the numerous defib units that are also now available only during venue opening times, and the nearly 600 people who have completed the awareness course, it is not a bad result so far.

We are not finished, three areas have gaps, but plans and negotiation are already well advanced in two of them. I have again worked with Newton News so that they can print in this week's issue a local map showing the position of all units. I would like to mention particularly all the Community Centre and Residents Committees.

A personal thanks especially to Phil Clark who has supported me from the very start, and our equipment suppliers Martek Lifecare for their continued support.

Whilst Covid-19 has slowed us down, we still achieved a lot in the last year, particularly satisfying to me, is the level of commitment from Livin Housing and individuals such as Stephen Patterson and the anonymous donor at School Aycliffe, who both fully funded public units



This community spirit is clearly shown again by the support for the latest unit now in the shopping precinct.

Landlords Daejan (Durham) Ltd who will now also maintain the defibrillator, our MP Paul Howell, the Taylor family, in memory of Daughter Seonaid Taylor-Hill, GATC Youth Committee, and residents of Newton Aycliffe, have all contributed including many friends and recipients of donations from 'Honest John' Hilton, who sadly passed away on 28th February 2020. These included the Rugby Club, Boxing Club, Acorn and Horndale Residents Groups, MAD Community Choir, Roger Pounder and Valerie Wright. I had decided on the location of the new Town Centre unit simply by its need to be central and link up with the chain of existing units. However, it was pointed out to me by Paul Thompson, of Acorn Residents, that it was the exact place where 'Honest John' Hilton had his original market stall.

This becomes more poignant when you understand we had already decided to recognise the value of all grass roots community support, by dedicating it with a simple message, the new Town Centre unit in recognition of John's unique fundraising commitment to his community.

The Town Centre unit was fitted outside the Salvation Army shop on Thursday 25th February and will be registered on to the 999 Emergency call system.

With lockdown restrictions hopefully easing, I hope to be able to restart CPR and Defibrillator demonstration again soon in the Town Centre, watch Newton News for future announcements.

Our project got a mention in Parliament recently, Jim Shannon, DUP, MP, had a successful Private Members Bill first reading with the aim to make it a Law for all Public buildings, Sporting facilities and Schools to have a defibrillator (fantastic). After a prior conversation with Paul Howell MP, he mentioned us in his Motion, citing it as a great achievement but suggesting that it should not be left up to individuals to provide this vital potential lifesaving equipment.

Again a wonderful example of Newton Aycliffe leading the way! A big thanks also to the support by our dedicated NHS Ambulance Service. They are using our network of units and even deploying them early if they consider a medical situation could quickly lead to a possible cardiac arrest.

If such an occasion happens, it means a defibrillator is instantly available to give the best possible odds of recovery.

All of this is down to our community working together to move forward to which I am totally committed.



# Students STEAM Ahead

Students at Greenfield Community College are being given opportunities to learn through an exciting STEAM programme of events and activities. STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) involves a method of inquiry based interdisciplinary learning that aligns with real life experience, encouraging awareness and a practical sense of how Science,



Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics can impact upon

our learning and our lives. STEAM has played an important part throughout the global pandemic - from the role of Science, Technology and Engineering in analysing the virus and its mechanisms and subsequently developing a number of vaccines as well as the Mathematicians and Statisticians who analyse all of the data relating to the pandemic, right through to the roles of the Arts in helping us to explore ideas, reflect, be creative, entertain and stay connected with each other. One aspect of the STEAM programme is the Future Medics project. Recently a group of Year 10 Future Medics students took part in two socially distanced lunchtime workshops where they learned handson skills. They were shown and then carried out their own heart dissections; they familiarised themselves with the major structures of the heart and the blood vessels leading to and away from the heart. Then in the second workshop, the group were introduced to the importance of vital signs as well as how to look for and measure them. Once they were aware of body temperature (and its normal range), pulse rate, rate of breathing and blood pressure, our students were given the opportunity to correctly use stethoscopes, thermometers, sphygmomanometers, as well as being shown how to calculate BMI. A valuable experience that gave an insight into the work of medics as students make their career choices. The school are now looking forward to extended learning opportunities through STEAM as they celebrate British Science Week (05.03.2021 - 14.03.2021). This year's theme focuses upon 'innovating the future' and celebrating the amazing diversity we see across the world. Staff and students are looking forward to sharing the quality resources available that can bring Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics to life in the classroom. 

Sorry to be boring but it's the same opening message again that if you get the opportunity for a vaccine please take it. If for whatever reason you have missed your initial invite remember that invitation remains open and I would encourage you to make contact and catch up. If you need help please let us know and we will try to help. The take up rate of the vaccine continues to be exceptional and I hope to get mine soon too. At the time of writing we had just passed 20,000,000 doses and the latest mass vaccination centre opened in Darlington this week. Many thanks to both the workers and volunteers making this happen. Vaccine availability slowed a little nationally in late February but is now back to higher levels and I am told that as we go through March the rate of acceleration will be significant. This combines with information confirming that there is a positive link between hospitalisation, death rates and the vaccine and we are seeing an acceleration in the fall of death rates and particularly in the over 80's who of course have been vaccinated longer. These together is fantastic news and give us real hope the end is in sight.

It is really important to remember though that vaccination takes a couple of weeks to become really effective and that even then you still need to continue to follow the rules as you may still be a carrier and transmit the virus to others. We start to see the release of this lockdown with the schools back next week, which will start to relieve some of the pressures on parents. From the messages I get, anyone who has had to do home schooling will appreciate even more the value of our teachers. I must also thank all teachers for the effort they have put in simultaneously teaching those at school and those at home, I am sure they are all really ready for the Easter break when it comes. The week has had a number of really interesting sessions, unfortunately all virtual. These included time with businesses like Ebac, 3M and Hitachi, as well as discussions with Anne Marie Trevelyan, the Minister of State for Business, Energy and Clean Growth, we talked about renewable energy sources. I also took part in a forum hosted by the TUC for key workers to listen to their concerns and share my perspectives. I also spoke to some local school leaders and engaged further in the efforts to reopen the Leamside rail line and was able to facilitate a meeting between the Air Minister, Robert Courts, and Teesside

Airport. I took the time to join Middridge Parish Council on Monday for part of their meeting, as I have said before local councils are a very important part of local democracy.

The challenge in writing this column this week is that the big news of the week will happen after this goes to print but before you read it. I am referring to the Budget which the Chancellor will have delivered on Wednesday. This will have many important issues to cover, ranging from the immediate to those to support the longer term. In the short term I hope and expect him to extend some of the Covid support ranging from the £20 UC uplift through to Business Rates etc., but I am also very interested in some, potentially, very significant announcements for our area. Particularly significant amongst these are the possibility of a Freeport for Teesside and the creation of a Treasury North being based in Darlington. Either, or both, could be a major benefit to the economy of the North East but the Treasury would also be a step change on different agendas. Moving the Treasury decision makers into a town like Darlington means that on the one hand we have good jobs that can help keep our young people in the North East but also if the decision makers are based outside of metropolitan centres then they should be more aware of life outside city centres. I will not speculate further on these but rather will save that for next week.

For now though, please continue to respect the virus, say thank you to all our key workers and have as good a week as you can. Stay Home, Protect the NHS and Save Lives - Stay Safe.
