

# Littering 'Stop the Drop'

Our litter picking group is growing from strength to strength and we are now getting noticed from other organisations, one in particular is the CPRE the Countryside charity, who have sent a congratulations to the group that was initially my own initiative, but, with the help of Great Aycliffe Town Council also several Councillors support. Cllr. Ian Gray, Vice Chair of the Environment Committee. We now have individuals, that because of other commitments, go out litter picking on their own. As a group we meet as planned, usually in high risk areas and have been in the area around St. Oswald's Park down to the Woodham Burn and Wolsey Close. We

have been in the area for the last three weeks in the hope that we can 'stop the drop'. Our countryside is littered with discarded, single-use drinks bottles and cans. Other items that we find are discarded prams and other fly

tipped products, these harm wildlife, pollute our waterways and spoil the beauty of nature.

And it's completely unnecessary.

The CPRE have been calling for a solution for over ten years. A simple system that prevents littering of drinks containers and ensures the recycling rates of over 90%: an all-in Deposit Return Scheme (DRS) [1]

In May 2018, the Government finally committed to putting a DRS in place. But almost three years later, the message seems to have been forgotten.

So now I am joining up to send a message in a bottle, signed by thousands of concerned people directly to the Prime Minister. An all-in DRS would see drinks producers paying for the collection and recycling of all the containers they make and sell. Even big drinks producers like Coca-Cola now agree it's the answer to our litter

But now the Government has released another worrying consultation. Not only are they delaying the scheme until the end of 2024 at the earliest, but they are also considering a made-up design that will set the system up to fail. # Are Lib Dems Preparing to Abolish the Town Council?

'Double Taxation' is the money we pay out of our County Council Tax to provide parish-level services in the unparished areas of the County .. on top of the Town Council Tax we pay to provide those parishlevel services in Great Aycliffe.

It is an emotive issue of principle, and the LibDems' latest leaflet decries "Aycliffe's Council Tax Scandal" - that "residents in Aycliffe pay up to £400 more in Council Tax than other places in County

How much does Double Taxation actually cost us?

We can estimate how much we pay for that 'double taxation'. Approximately a fifth of the county is unparished so - if those areas are typical of the rest of the county - the gross cost will be roughly £2.8 million ... i.e. £7.50 to each D-band council tax payer in the county. So it is an issue which needs resolving, but financially a relatively minor element within the £2,291 I am paying this year for my DCC, GATC, Fire and Police services.

So how might the LibDems save us £400?

The cost of the 'double taxation' is only £7.50. The £400 they mention is the whole cost of our Town Council Tax! So the only way the LibDems could save that kind of sum, would be by abolishing the Town Council altogether and becoming an unparished area ... so that we would not have to pay any Parish Council Tax at all. And even that would save £400 only for G-band householders. Since Council Tax bands are graded, it would only save £250 for a D-band house; just £166 for an A-Band house ... and nothing at all for people on relevant benefits who do not pay Council Tax at all.

What would we lose if we abolished the Town Council? 'Double Taxation' is not an evil County Council plot to steal your money! It is the money the Town Council charges to allow it to provide better-quality services. If we were to become an unparished area, spending on parish-level services in Great Aycliffe would halve, because DCC would treat us like every other unparished area in the county. We would certainly lose the Santa Tours, the Fireworks Display, the Senior Citizens' trips and half our play areas. The LibDems never told you that, did they?

Are the LibDems "REALLY" preparing to abolish the Town Council? It seems an amazing suggestion, doesn't it, especially when the LibDems are not saying so explicitly. But they are caught in their own trap - that abolishing the Town Council is the only way they could save us anything near the sum of £400 they are touting. The other explanation would be that they are scamming us mentioning "£400" just to win votes, in the full knowledge that the very best they can give us without abolishing the Town Council is £7.50 ... but that is an explanation which I have to trust is not true.

They still have a week, of course, to clarify whether they intend to abolish the Town Council, or whether they are never going to be able to deliver anywhere near £400 in savings ... though all this is too late for most postal voters (which I hope is also not intentional). John D Clare

# **Extreme Beekeeping**



Dear Sir

Getting stung occasionally by a bee is usually the extent of the hazards beekeepers expect to face. Last week builders working in Shildon encountered a large colony of bees nesting in the top of a chimney. The builders were tasked with removing the chimney but clearly didn't want to get too close and didn't want to kill the bees either. They called the local pest control officer who in turn called Aycliffe Beekeepers Association. Working on scaffolding, beekeepers Roger Chappel, Stuart Fawcett and Steve Jenkins found that the colony was indeed extremely large, well established and had probably been there for some time. After some effort the concrete cap of the chimney and four or five courses of bricks were removed exposing the top part of the colony. Large lengths of comb with bees were carefully removed and placed in three cardboard boxes. The following day the bees and their comb were transferred to a wooden, purpose built, hive. We hope the colony will become part of our apiary and have a healthy future.

Aycliffe Beekeepers Association have found the pandemic a challenge but have adopted technology such as Zoom to get us through. Our meetings have all been on-line and we have just completed our first training course via the internet. As social distancing rules relax we will be able to start practical training in our apiary at St Oswald's. At this time of year beekeepers are getting ready for the new season. The bees, who have been relatively dormant over the winter, have

started foraging for nectar and pollen. Soon we will be inspecting our hives and helping our bees build up and ready themselves for the new season. During the cold winter months we feed the bees with fondant (where necessary) and the association has been fortunate to receive a helpful supply of sugar from Tesco and Aldi.

Around May/June honey bees have a tendency to swarm. This is part of their natural reproduction cycle - about half of the bees in the hive leave with the Queen bee and look for a new place to colonise. This is probably how the bees in Shildon ended up in the chimney. As an Association one of the services we offer to the public is to collect swarms. A swarm of bees may contain tens of thousands of bees and can be quite an alarming sight but we don't want the bees killed or harmed so we are happy to save them and try and turn them into a productive colony. If you see a swarm this summer, which may have settled nearby, typically on the branch of a small tree and the size of a small rugby ball, please contact us. Contact: Secretary, Steve Jenkins



The Great Aycliffe and Middridge Area Action Partnership (GAMP) is responsible for spending a lot of County Council money on projects in this area. It is run by a Board comprising our local County Councillors, representatives from Partner Organisations (such as the local Police, NHS, Fire and Rescue Service, Livin and businesses), and volunteer Public Representatives. Local organisations apply for funding for projects to meet locally determined priorities, and the Board decides which to support. In addition, each County Councillor controls a budget to fund projects in their Ward, again subject to GAMP Board approval. As a result, over the years, a lot of public money has been spent on projects locally determined to best meet the local community's needs.

I may be wrong, but if Labour were to lose control of the County Council, I fear that GAMP funding may be cut in the interest of reducing the Council Tax paid by the better off. Moreover, given the Government's clear preference for central control, if the Tories win control of the County Council, I foresee decision-making being removed from local hands, and returned to Durham. Electors may care to consider this when deciding how to vote on 6th May. Alan Jordan.

Another week of working from home with on-line Select Committees etc. I, like many of you, look forward to a more normal workplace. Whilst there have been some good points about virtual meetings, there are many more values to actual engagement with people and whether this is

in Westminster or the constituency, I can't wait.

Parliament runs in legislative sessions, and this one will have ended when you read this. Parliament will be prorogued on Thursday 29 April and reconvenes with the Queen's Speech on Tuesday 11 May Prorogation is the term used to refer to when Parliament is suspended between sessions without being dissolved to cause an election. When I was elected in December 2019 there was a Queen's Speech in the first week to set out the Government's agenda for that session, on that occasion MPs were all crammed into the Chamber to be summoned to the Lords to hear the Queen. This time there will be a ballot to see which MPs can be present due to Covid restrictions, I await the result to see whether I will be able to be present.

Last week saw me at the BEIS select committee again, this time we were back in the discussions around decarbonising heat in homes. You'll see much more communication on this subject as the race to Net Zero continues. Everybody is aware of the changes to electric vehicles and the desire to get petrol and diesel cars off our roads, but we also need to decarbonise the way we heat our homes. This will involve either different technologies, like heat pumps, or different fuels, like hydrogen, or a combination of these. 95% of houses will need to decarbonise their

heating system to achieve Net Zero emissions by 2050.
I also jointly chaired a 'Big Tent' session led by Local Trust who are the secretariat for the Left Behind Communities APPG. This was entitled "Levelling Up 'left behind' Britain - the importance of a hyper local focus". This was a very interesting session with some very inspiring speakers. Like many politicians I have also spent time out leafleting and talking to people about the forthcoming elections. As part of this I met the Rail Minister, Chris Heaton-Harris, at Ferryhill Station to show him the potential offered by the proposals to reopen the station. I continue to be encouraged by the engagement by ministers in listening to me and my colleagues on agendas we see as important.

When it comes to important agendas for Newton Aycliffe my current focus is on attempting to apply the Levelling Up Fund opportunity on Aycliffe Town Centre. I'm working with Durham County Council who would have to submit the actual bid, with my support. They are looking at the technical opportunities given that the Town Centre was sold to a private business several years ago. Despite what you may have heard from other nay saying local Councillors it is certainly possible that a plan can be created. Before going much further though I want to be sure that I understand what the people of Aycliffe actually want. That's why I am delighted to work with the Newton News, who are also encouraging residents to 'Shop Local', on a questionnaire to help me get the right priorities. I would appreciate as many people as possible responding to help us get the best understanding. I have also started talking directly with a number of shopkeepers and will move forward with this over the coming wieks. As we continue to literature to the restrictions, and non-essential shopping is again available to us, please focus your support on local shops, they need, and will appreciate, your support.
Last month, the Government released details of the new Levelling Up

Fund. The £4.8 billion fund will support town centre and high street regeneration, local transport projects, cultural and heritage assets. I believe that the Levelling Up Fund gives us an excellent opportunity to accelerate discussions around what developments are needed in Newton Aycliffe Town Centre.

To start these discussions, here is a short survey that gives you an opportunity to let me know what changes and developments you would prefer to see in the Town Centre, if we are able. If you get an opportunity, please do complete the survey, preferably on-line, but if not, physically, as it will really help us formulate a plan for how we could potentially use the Levelling Up Fund and regenerate the Town Centre. The number of vaccinations continues at an incredible rate and take up continues to be amazing with over 95% of those offered the 2nd jab turning up. This is so important as I understand that whilst the first jab is indicated to give 60/70% protection the 2nd increases this to 80/90%. I am also told that the Novavax vaccine, manufactured in Billingham and filled in Barnard Castle, has had the first production level to be made and these are being evaluated. Please take up your offer of vaccination when you get it and remember, even then, you need to follow all the guidelines.

In particular Hands, Face, Space and Fresh Air. Stay Safe.

# **Aycliffe Cricket Club Scoreboard Report**



Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's 1st team. sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, lost a thrilling game at home to Norton 1st XI by just two wickets in the NYSD 2nd division. After being asked to bat first Aycliffe piled up the runs scoring a very respectable 209 for 7 in their allotted 50 overs. Chris Palmer top scored in the innings with a belligerent 59 off just 50 balls including 11 boundaries and a huge six. Jack Slatcher (sponsored by Dean and Tina Greaves) followed up last week's

excellent batting with an unbeaten 50 off 71 balls, his first half century for four seasons and opener Luke Telford also deserves praise, scoring 34 from 42 balls with eight boundaries.

In reply, Norton got off to a solid start and looked well set at 114 for 2, despite some tight bowling from all rounder Jack Slatcher (2 for 19). # An Open Campaign

Dear Sir,

Last week's Newton News threw up some interesting facts: Dorothy Bowman is standing for both Aycliffe North for Durham County Council, and Byerley Park, Horndale & Cobblers Hall Ward for the Town Council. Now her claim to what she has done is all about the Whinlatter Bridge, an area of the West Ward, which is being addressed by Eddy Adam and Kate Hopper, although sitting Councillors in the area and are seeking re-election. Dorothy Bowman lives in the West Ward and has no links with Byerley Park, The Chase, Greenfield and Horndale, let alone Cobblers Hall. I must congratulate Jed Hillary on the report he made in a recent edition of Newton News 'Perplexing Claims', this is exactly what people are saying, they know that they have to pay Council Tax to pay for services, but what do people expect the Council to cut? Without repeating Jed Hillary's comments. I visit the gym or other areas in the community that I go to, the comments are the same from the people, not the promises made by the opposition.

Over the last four years Durham County Council have made significant cuts, they made all the Youth workers redundant and closed down the centres or it was transferred under Community Asset Transfer.

# Neighbourhood Policing

PACT Meeting: 10th February, 6pm, on Police Facebook page

It's been a busy and productive week for officers on the Neighbourhood Policing Team at Newton Aycliffe. Residents may have noticed us out on our newly acquired e-Bikes, which were kindly funded by the Great Aycliffe & Middridge Partnership (GAMP). The bikes are allowing us to cover greater distances and we are finding that we are coming across incidents before they are reported. Whilst on bike patrols, Officers seized an illegal quad being driven along The Burn and then came across a 10 year old boy crossing the railway lines near to Middridge. The boy had got his bike stuck and was helped on to the right side of the lines by officers just minutes before a train passed.

In response to the spate of vehicles being damaged, we have been carrying out late night / early morning patrols on our bikes, hoping to deter and identify those responsible. I would like to appeal to residents for information on suspected drug activity in Newton Aycliffe. Information can be given confidentially to Police via Crimestoppers, either online or by telephone.

The more current and specific information we get, the faster we can act on it. We would, however, encourage people to report ongoing incidents in the usual way to ensure appropriate resources are

The last collaboration I know of for off road parking was carried out on Baliol Green and a culde-sac in the village, when there was a more pressing needs on Baliol Road and Clarence Chare main bus route and the person in question, who raised the point, was told to contact the bus company and have the bus route rerouted by one of the said councillors. Speaking of green areas, do the Council own Clarence Green? If so, have livin been sold part of it or have they acquired part of it by other means? Because it is much smaller in area now the road has moved, taking away the green and extending living property.
