

## Onerous and Stressful Job

Dear Sir,

I was guite saddened to read John Clare's letter in last week's edition. Although I very often disagree with his views and political stance, I must say Councillor Clare, and also Councillor Bob Fleming, have been the most prominent and influential local politicians for many years, and I hold them both in high regard. These are tremendously diligent and knowledgeable councillors with vast experience, and I thought it was sad that neither were elected to the County council on this occasion.

Councillor Clare was absolutely right in saying that being a County Councillor is a very onerous and stressful job if you do it properly. I see it as massively more onerous than serving as a town councillor. The briefest review of the papers for Council meetings on the durham.gov.uk website is enough to appreciate just how much documentation a diligent County Councillor needs to read, understand and make decisions on.

I suspect John Clare is one of the few who did this, not just on the Council, but on major committees. He wrote informative reports for us in the local press. He always responded promptly and honestly whenever I contacted him (and I am not even in his ward). His work ethic is phenomenal, he is articulate, erudite, caring and principled (though his principles often aren't the same as my own!). As I see it, if you build vast numbers of executive houses in the wealthiest ward in town, eventually it has to become a Conservative ward, especially when coupled with a disjointed Labour Party obsessed with political correctness and devoid of common sense. Even a distinguished individual like John Clare was bound to struggle

Although I unhesitatingly voted for Councillor Fleming, I suspect too many considered him too old to be a County Councillor, and perhaps the electorate has taken the view that the public has asked and taken enough pounds of flesh from him over the years and he doesn't deserve the stress which would be placed upon him in the role. Bob Fleming stood head and shoulders above all the other candidates in my ward, despite his age. I knew he was a smart guy and that he had encyclopaedic knowledge of local politics, having seen this first hand as a public rep on the neighbourhood plan, but I did not realise he had had such a distinguished military career before becoming a head teacher. Bob has achieved success in three separate fields. Very few people could do this.

Time will tell whether the new batch of Councillors prove as worthy of the trust placed in them. John Snowball







This Bank Holiday Monday, 31st May at 11:00-12:00, we will be holding a second Bee Bombing Event.





## **Helping Junior Football**

Newton Aycliffe Youth Football Club continue to support teams in Africa by sending them old strips from our teams and football boots from our players. The latest donation is to a team in Kenya, following on from a strip we donated at the end of last year to the same club. We are an FA Charter Standard Community Club and now our



footballing community extends to Kenya.

Sunderland AFC Keroche, began in the village of Karai, on the outskirts of the town of Naivasha, Kenya in 2012. Karai village is a very poor area, where only 1 in 28 of the adults have a full-time job. It all began as a way of trying to give the youth of the area a focus in life, to keep them away from life's darker temptations such as drugs, crime and alcohol etc.

It started quite simply as a group of football loving young men forming a football team, but they had no kit, no boots, and no pitch, but they give themselves the name of Sunderland AFC Keroche for 2 reasons: (1) The then manager elect was a Sunderland fan, (2) The village sits in the shadow of the huge KEROCHE BREWERY (Kenya's second largest brewery).

The boys played friendly games against other local villages, but soon realised that they were quite a good team and wanted to join a league. The then manager, Paul Kimani, approached a Sunderland fan Gary Lamb, (via Facebook) to ask if there was a possibility of trying to donate kits and boots etc. After checking out the team, and satisfied everything was genuine, Gary put out an appeal for shirts, plus boots, shorts and socks etc. and was overwhelmed by the response, So SUNDERLAND AFC KEROCHE, the school and their village of Karai, became a whole new place. This week it was my pleasure to be able to thank and compliment the vaccination team at Cobblers Hall for their efforts and I was delighted that the Secretary of State for Health, Matt Hancock, was able to take time out of his busy schedule to record a video recognising their efforts. For my constituency I also have a surgery based in Spennymoor that vaccinates into Ferryhill and the Trimdons etc and I was pleased to be able to call and see them this week too. These teams have been outstanding in their commitment and we continue to see that vaccination of the population is the way out of this crisis. As we see increased confidence in the effectiveness of vaccines this makes it even more important that we all get vaccinated as soon as we get the chance. I was delighted to get the offer of my second jab accelerated last week and have now had both and I obviously encourage everyone to do the same.

Last week we had a meeting between Baroness Vere and the team from my APPG on 'left behind' communities to discuss the latest APPG report on connecting communities. This report identified the need to help local authorities respond to local transport needs; to provide clear commitments for future local bus funding and to ensure that rail services, operating at reduced capacity because of the pandemic, can be restored and examine how rail reopening and investment in new capacity and community rail lines can be expedited, particularly in those neighbourhoods 'left behind' as a result of the Beeching cuts. It also covered investment in social infrastructure (community groups, etc) at a neighbourhood level to give 'left behind' communities a voice to boost their capacity and confidence to advocate for local needs.

With the increased freedom we have I was able to visit the Neighbourhood Policing team based in Peterlee who cover the villages in the north of my constituency. This team complements the Aycliffe based team but have substantially more significant antisocial behaviour to deal with. I have also joined sessions with the Weddings APPG and Durham University APPG, both of which help me to better understand their issues and where I can engage and help. BEIS select committees continued. In the session on levelling up we interviewed Paul Scully, Minister for Small Business, Luke Hall, Minister for Regional Growth and Local Government, and Kate O'Neill, who is the director of policy for the Cities and Local Growth Unit. We examined what can be done to improve the everyday life and life chances for people in underperforming places around the country. In the session on Industrial Decarbonisation we talked about ensuring we are pursuing the right technological strategies to get the correct infrastructure in place and find practical solutions to reduce carbon emissions.

On Monday, for the first time in a few weeks, I came out of the draw for an OQ (Oral Question) this time to Ben Wallace, the Secretary of State for Defence. I asked him to make sure innovative businesses like Kromek in Sedgefield were fully considered in the MOD procurement processes and I invited him to come for a visit to see them for himself.

I was able to join the team at Maguires Holiday Homes at Newbus Grange Country Park, between Neasham and Hurworth, to promote the start of English Tourism Week (22-31 May 2021). The Country Park is stunning and attracts a surprising number of local people who have a home there for weekend breaks.

The lockdown continues to ease and all indications are that it will continue to stay on course, but we all need to do our part. Please understand, as we move forward, it is all about increasing our own personal responsibility and using our common sense. The rules will become less prescriptive as we recover the personal freedoms we all crave which is why it's up to us all to be sensible and follow the Hands, Face, Space and Fresh Air guidance. Even though you can go back into pubs etc it just makes sense to be cautious and take your time getting back to normal - Stay Safe.

# Neighbourhood Policing By PCSO Steven Kipling



Hi everyone, PCSO Steven Kipling here.

This week, on the Neighbourhood team at Newton Aycliffe, has been really busy and productive. We have had a meeting with all of the newly elected Councillors to discuss new initiatives to bring to the communities in Newton Aycliffe. Some really exciting ideas came from this and we hope that we're able to share these with you in the coming months.

Our new E-Bikes have been a big hit again this week with engaging with members of the community and speaking to a wider range of people about their issues and positive stories.

This week I have completed a Herbert Protocol with a family to assist them in the future, should they need it. If you have a family member who is at risk of going missing and has Dementia/ Alzheimer's, get in touch with me and I'll arrange to complete a Herbert Protocol form where we keep the details and can assist with getting them home safely and as quickly as possible.

An incentive has been agreed, which will be offered through Crimestoppers, for information leading to the seizure of off-road bikes and/or apprehension of the rider where criminal damage has been caused, they have been ridden whilst the rider was under the influence of alcohol or drugs or there has been driving offences. The appeal for information must be specific, relating to a certain bike in a certain area at a certain time and is not an appeal for general info regarding off road bikes. If this information proves to be beneficial to the police, and results in seizures, the public will receive a small monetary award.

We are working with partner agencies to secure funding and are always looking at new and innovative ways to tackle the problem. Have you heard of our online messaging service 'Keep in the Know'? By signing up to this service for free you can find out what's happening in your local area - receive regular crime updates, information on road closures and learn about what your local neighbourhood policing team is doing. You can decide what agencies you wish to receive messages off when you sign up to the service. Head over to www.keepintheknow.co.uk and click 'Sign up'. It doesn't take long and you can be kept up to date with many different things.
