Grant Funding Provides Sustainability for Local Farm

A local business has completed the build of its new rapeseed oil press and bottling facility with the support of an RDPE grant. The grant enabled Lovesome Oil, based in Brafferton, to build a cold pressing facility, housed in two 20ft shipping containers. The pressing, filtering, bottling, capping and labelling equipment was installed and commissioned over the last two months. Seed from oilseed rape grown on the farm is turned into bottles and catering cans of oil without leaving the site, using the specialist equipment imported from Germany and Italy. Lovesome Oil co-founder, Olly Lawson, said: "My family has grown oilseed rape for 40 years, this is a big step towards making the farm sustainable for the next 40 years. Consumers are becoming much more aware of the provenance of their food, however it's all very well being 'local' but if the price isn't right then you won't be competitive. "The new press enables us to sell the

byproduct of the oil as cattle feed, while also reducing food miles, meaning we can pass on the savings."

The grant has created a job on the farm, now more time can be dedicated to supplying new customers. Lovesome Oil currently supplies a range of local shops and delis, it has recently started supplying the Fenwick Food Hall in Newcastle upon Tyne. The investment has increased production capacity creating opportunities for the farm to supply restaurants and pubs.

Francesca, co-founder of Lovesome Oil, said: "The press means we can now press larger volumes of oil while remaining in control of our production and not being

restricted by a contractor's capacity." She went on to say: "We want to thank our customers and stockists for the continued support over the last year, it's been especially tough for everyone but we feel we've come out stronger and appreciate all the support shown for independent food producers such as ourselves.'

The facility has been named 'David's Press' in honour of Olly's late father, David Lawson, who prepared the container site before he died in September 2020 following a seven year battle with cancer.

The gift came at a difficult time for the charity, which has seen a major drop in revenue after cancelling fundraising events and closing charity shops because of Covid. The donation also supported the charity's community response team, which offers patients end-of-life care in their own homes, and helped develop a new online resource tool kit for patients and their families. The donation is the latest gesture of support

Weekly Hog Blog

It's quite rare for us to be the bearers of bad news but we appealed in last weeks blog for some help with Marley's vet bill, we were hoping to remove a back leg that had a compound fracture but unfortunately, he had broken two back legs, he would never cope in the wild and he had to be put to sleep. Alicia, his finder, has been informed and thanked us for keeping him safe and pain free in his last days at home, here with us. Rescuing hedgehogs is very difficult, there



is a certain amount of knowledge that you have to work hard to get, all of us rehabbers help each other with the very poorly ones that come in and only consult with a vet when absolutely essential. We sell donated items, at car boot sales, to make sure we are equipped for any problem, pain relief, antibiotics and wormers, specifically for our prickly pals, tick removal whilst safe for any domestic pet is OK, but difficult and dangerous for a poorly stressed hedgehog that won't uncurl, tick infections can kill a small baby or juvenile. Rehabbers are trained and experienced at fly strike and tick removal so please don't try at home, get help.

We spend a lot of time caring for these creatures and it's 24/7, 365 days of the year living with them, we take full responsibility and they only leave us to go back home for release.

We are doing very well at the moment, so far, in this last few weeks, Tara and myself have released twenty of these precious mammals, we will be releasing more but there are some that will take longer like Freddie, he may need an amputation soon, little Barry who has two poorly legs and we don't know if you remember little Teddy, he was scalped by a strimmer then attacked by magpies, he will need more spines on his forehead, but he is making a full recovery. We would like to take this opportunity to thank our neighbours Alison and John for their donation of lovely things to sell to raise funds for our rescue, also June, Val, Bev, Angie and Lorraine for some wonderful items too.

Also, finally, Jackie, another of our neighbours, was walking out last Thursday and found a little hog on the footpath, also another lady helped protect this little one, she had some spines missing and a particularly nasty intestinal problem. These people got in touch with me, pet carrier in hand I brought her home to begin treatment. Thank

Tip of the Week: It is baby season now, if mums haven't had their hoglets they are going to shortly, please make sure your gardens are checked before using any gardening equipment, netting 6 inches above the ground and ponds are also safe, even a piece of wood will help a hog get out of a pond, adult hedgehogs can and do swim, but if they can't leave the pond of course they drown, babies don't stand a chance.

Incineration Plant Proposed for Heighington

I would like to draw readers' attention to a planning application made to Durham County Council on 27/4/21 for an Incineration Plant on land at Heighington Lane, opposite Heighington railway station. Although DCC notified residents and businesses in the immediate vicinity, many others living in Newton Aycliffe, School Aycliffe and Heighington, who may be affected by the plant, were not made aware and found out by accident. There may still be people who are not aware of it.

Given that the plant will process clinical and hazardous waste, many residents naturally have concerns and questions. DCC has decided that the application will go before a planning committee which the public can attend but will be allowed little time to speak. Some of us are hoping that a public consultation meeting will be held, to give people the chance to hear about the proposals (the documents run to hundreds of pages) and ask questions. The Council can take into account comments and objections made up until it sits to consider the application (scheduled for 24/8/21), but these should be made as soon as possible.

Grant Scheme Extended to Include Mobile and Home-Based Businesses

Mobile and home-based businesses in County Durham are now able to apply for financial support during the coronavirus pandemic after a scheme was extended by a council.

Limited fixed funding has been made available by the Government through the Additional Restrictions Grant (ARG) which can be used to fund a discretionary policy that supports businesses in the hospitality, leisure, accommodation and personal care sectors which have not had any previous support, do not have their own business rates account but still incur monthly fixed business-related costs and have been significantly impacted by the restrictions imposed by the pandemic.

Durham County Council has previously extended the scheme to offer support to those businesses in shared commercial spaces, taxi drivers, registered childcare providers and childminders, as well as driving instructors.

Last year, the council administered the first round of Government grants during the pandemic, with more than £104 million paid to more than 9,500 businesses across the county. A number of businesses praised the council for working with them through the claims process.

Under this new extended scheme, eligible businesses with monthly fixed costs of between £100 and £200 will receive a one off payment of £500, those with monthly fixed costs of £200 to £400 will be given a one off payment of £1,000 and those with a monthly fixed cost of over £400 will receive a payment of £2,500.

To be eligible for this scheme, businesses must be in the hospitality, leisure, accommodation and personal care sectors which have not had any previous support and be able to:

- Demonstrate fixed business-related costs of at least £100 a month, these must be integral to the running of the business and not include personal salary costs or rent/ mortgage costs
- Evidence that the business provides the majority of the applicant's income (over 50 per cent)
- Demonstrate that the business is within the hospitality, accommodation or leisure (HAL) sector, is in the HAL supply chain or provides in-person, face to face services
- Demonstrate that the business has been severely impacted by local and/or national restrictions
- Evidence that the business was trading on 18 September 2020
- Demonstrate that the business has not received or is eligible for support under

the Local Restrictions Support Grant or the current ARG funding.

Driving instructors are also encouraged to make their application for support using this online process.

Paul Darby, Durham County Council's corporate director of resources, said: "We understand that this continues to be a hugely challenging time for businesses across the county and that in line with the government guidance which points to supporting those businesses with commercial property costs, previous schemes have not provided support to home-based and mobile business.

"This is why we are announcing this latest package of support.

"Our aim is to help as many businesses as possible as we continue to respond to the pandemic and as we, hopefully, slowly return to normality later this year as restrictions are lifted."

I was in Westminster last week, for a couple of days, which just reminded me of the importance of being there physically. I was able to discuss so many different subjects with other colleagues. I had a question in Defence Orals to the Minister of State, Ben Wallace, where I pushed the need for smaller innovative companies to get a piece of the Defence spending. Later Ben attended the Northern Research Group where I also invited him to come and see some of our fabulous businesses. I also spoke with Michelle Donelan, the Minister for Universities, where I raised both Durham University and the importance of UTCs.

I would like to thank everyone who took the time to complete my recent survey on the town centre. It was great to see how much people really care about Newton Aycliffe and revitalising the town centre. The survey produced some very interesting results and there will be a review of these results in next week's Newton News. If you haven't had a chance to complete the survey, please do not hesitate to contact me and let me know what changes you think need to be made to our town centre.

I had a good virtual meeting with the owners of the town centre to discuss their engagement in any future proposals as well as one with those proposing the NHS incinerator project, where questions need to be answered, but also there is some inaccurate scaremongering on Facebook that is not helpful. Local people need good information and input to both of these projects and my team and I will do what we can to deliver

Last week saw the ballot for Private Members Bills (PMBs). Most Bills that are brought to Parliament come from the Government but a small number are those are brought by individual members of Parliament. The PMBs are brought to the House on sitting Fridays and there are typically around 7 in a session of Parliament. Therefore it is only the first 7 in the ballot that are guaranteed to be debated and have the chance to become law, but they select 20 names in the ballot as for each sitting Friday there is always the potential for more than one to be heard. Around 400 of the 650 MPs put their names in this ballot and I was not successful this time. My colleague Peter Gibson in Darlington drew at number 9 which means he may have an opportunity depending on other Bills. This is a ballot open to all MPs regardless of party and it is always interesting to see what Bills they propose.

Later in the week I had a meeting with the Minister for Digital, Matt Warman, and expressed our concerns around broadband delivery, particularly to the villages in the west of my constituency. On Friday I had the pleasure of calling at the vaccination centre in Cobblers Hall to thank the Jubilee team there for their efforts and they asked me to remind everyone how important it is that everyone has their vaccinations. These are critical in helping the route out of lockdown to be irreversible. They also said to remind people that once they have booked a jab they need to turn up for it or cancel if you can't make it. A DNA (Did Not Attend) is the worst case for them, this means they have a vaccine available but no patient so have to scramble to find others to be jabbed. Please don't let this incredible team down and, once booked, make sure you attend.

I joined the meeting of Ferryhill Town Council on Thursday and met with both the Councillors and some fabulous community groups sharing their endeavours. I popped into Barclays to meet the team and discuss the branch closure, disappointing as this closure is, the way we are all using less cash makes it difficult to sustain branches but I am impressed with the way the team are trying to make sure their customers are helped. I finished the week with a visit to Lovesome Farm in Brafferton to see how they are developing a Rapeseed Oil manufacturing capability before joining Play Cafe on Saturday afternoon.

We continue the steps out of lockdown but, as always, can I please encourage you all to be sensible and not push the boundaries of what we are allowed. Heighington Development to be Completed this Summer

Building work at a 75-home development, which is delivering more than £300,000 of investment in Heighington, has now reached the final stages.

Bellway is building 60 homes for private sale - alongside 15 affordable homes for local people through shared ownership or rent - at Meadow Rise, off Walworth Road. Building work at the site began in early 2019,

after planning approval was granted in 2018, and is due to finish this summer. Around two-thirds of the private homes have already been sold.

As part of the planning agreement for the development, the house builder is providing more than £300,000 towards local infrastructure and facilities.

Payments include £229,125 towards local education, £78,900 for enhancing walking and cycling routes and £15,000 towards creating 10 new car parking spaces in the village. Further contributions include £6,762 towards improving sports facilities and £5,000 for improving bus stops.

Darren Pelusi, Sales Manager for Bellway Durham, said: "Construction at Meadow Rise is progressing well ahead of completion on site this summer. Demand has been high for the development, which enjoys an attractive



location in this picturesque village, less than three miles from Newton Aycliffe and six miles from Darlington town centre.'

"The selection of three and four-bedroom detached houses at Meadow Rise will appeal to families, as well as people commuting to nearby towns, with Heighington train station less than two miles away and several wellregarded schools in the area, the closest being Heighington Primary School only a short walk from the site."

There's currently a choice of three and four-bedroom houses remaining for sale at Meadow Rise, with prices starting from £249,995. There are also two show homes at the development- the three-bedroom Argan and four-bedroom Acacia.

Council Tax Discounts

As the new financial year gets underway, County Durham residents - especially those with certain health conditions - are being reminded to take advantage of the council tax discounts available.

Durham County Council is advising residents to check to see if they are eligible for a reduction or even an exemption on their council tax bill.

This includes people who have been diagnosed by their doctor as suffering from a condition or illness classed as a severe mental impairment such as Alzheimer's disease, Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's disease and severe learning difficulties. Those who are eligible and live alone, do not pay any council tax, while those living with another person qualify for a 25 per cent reduction.

People can find out more including how to claim at www.durham.gov.uk/smi - or by calling 03000 264 000 and selecting the 'council tax' option.

Council tax discounts are also available for:

- anyone who lives alone
- residents with severe disabilities where the properties have been adapted
- students
- student nurses

If someone has moved out of their home permanently to receive care in a hospital, residential care home or a supported housing scheme or hostel, they may also be entitled to a discount or exemption on their property.
