New 'All Disabilities Matter' Group Launches

Dear Sir,

Our new group was started because my daughter, aged 22, who has special needs, was cyber bullied by a so called friend. I then found out, the same weekend, my friends daughter, who also has specialneeds, was bullied in a local park.

After these incidents, which were reported and are in the hands of the police - it really got us thinking about how to protect and help vulnerable people who don't have any self-confidence or low selfconfidence to stand up for themselves.

The hardest part, I found, was the actual waiting for the police to come out to take a statement, this is the time I found very frustrating, just waiting, while the whole time I wanted to go and sort it out myself, as any parent would. Luckily, I have a great friend, Anne West, who I was talking to all night, but a lot of people don't have that support in the early hours in the morning or at any time. Anyway, this is how the 'All Disabilities Matter' group came about, it gave us an insight to what people have to deal with through social media sites. We started by thinking what we want the group for, how we wanted the group to work. This was easy, the private group was so everybody with any disabilities, mental health issues or people who just wanted to talk to somebody could, without any criticism or negative comments. That's why all the help and support has to come from each member to make it work. There are a lot of helplines and charities out there, but sometimes people just need to talk to others that experienced the same or similar issues as themselves.

A lot don't want to contact organisations first, so this group was ideal because it was 24/7 round-the-clock. We contacted David Wilkin, from the Disability Hate Crime Network, for advice on how to set up a private group, which he was only too pleased to help and advise us - kindly giving us loads of great ideas.

We then designed a logo that was eye-catching and colourful to look at, Googled how to set up a Facebook private group and 'All Disabilities Matter' started.

We then sent out invitations to our friends to spread the word. designed our own posters, with a brief description of what the group was about, and put them up around town, in shop windows, posting it on different sites and spreading the word. Before we realised 'All Disabilities Matter' grew from strength to strength, day by day. Emma, from Customise It, now offered to sponsor us and produce



our T-Shirts for free, as she thought it was a great thing we were doing; we contacted Carol at the PCP for permission to have a photo taken outside the centre for a promotional picture; Keith from Able Novak Taxis was pleased to support the group, as well as help out with the admin side, as his company could transport wheelchairs. We have members from all over the country, we also have David Wilkin in our group. It has been promoted on Suicide Awareness, Aycliffe Anything Goes, Tees Durham Alert, Bishop Auckland area Covid-19 Community Support, local shops and businesses have also posted on their social media pages.

Donna Martin, from 5 Acres Community Gardens, very kindly offered to host our first get-together, which was held on Wednesday 9th June and was a great success. Some of our members came along to meet others, some local Councillors turned up and offered their support to what we are trying to do.

We now have 435 members, in only 5 weeks, which is fantastic, we have received brilliant feedback, it's already starting to help a lot of members and we are hoping to take it around the schools so everyone can get involved. The group have 14 fantastic admin, male and females, on board who are willing to help others through their own experiences. We also contacted other support groups and charities so we can support each other: The Hub of Wishes, Junction 7, RedforEvan, 5 Acres Community Gardens, Options, Red Balloons, plus others. We want to say a massive thank you to everyone who is supporting our group and all our members who are making 'All Disabilities Matter' group work.

The last thank you has to be to PC Julie Lamb, for the way she helped my daughter throughout this awful incident. Making her feel comfortable and understanding her condition.



Personally, I would be involved via the Newton Aycliffe Sports Club which includes, Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club; Newton Aycliffe FC; Newton Aycliffe Sports Club FC; Newton Aycliffe Archery Club and Newton Aycliffe Rugby Club.

Add a smattering of music from Aycliffe Radio and street entertainment and perhaps this would be a worthwhile occasion. If any representative of any sports in Aycliffe feel they could apply themselves to this proposal, please get in touch with me. Depending on interest collectively, we could make this work.

Some of these vehicles are road registered, however, they look like off-road bikes. I would encourage anyone with dash cam footage of these vehicles to pass it on to us. This can be sent to us via Facebook or handed in at the Police station, Monday to Friday 10am-2pm.

We are aware of a male who has/is targeting insecure vehicles in Newton Aycliffe and we are currently working with CID to identify the suspect. We have been sent some great images of the suspect but please can you check your own CCTV and RING door bells for any alerts which may have recorded of this male and send any footage to us.

Please ensure that your vehicles are locked at all times, especially overnight, to prevent this person taking your belongings.

By signing up to this service, for free, you can find out what's happening in your local area - receive regular crime updates, information on road closures and learn about what your local neighbourhood policing team is doing. You can decide what agencies you wish to receive messages off when you sign up to the service.

Woodham Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Awards



Woodham Academy are delighted to announce that 35 year 11 students have completed the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award. Through the Leadership Academy programme, students have shown great perseverance, resilience and determination to accomplish this award in unprecedented circumstances. Woodham Academy became a licence holder for the Duke of Edinburgh Award in 2019 and are indebted to GAMP for their funding contribution which made it possible for the school to offer the programme to Key Stage 4 students. Brian Riley, Great Aycliffe & Middridge Partnership Coordinator, said, "the GAMP Board are proud that the young people achieved their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Awards recently and their effort and dedication was outstanding. It is always a pleasure for the GAMP Board to support young people's projects such as this, well done to all the young people concerned and the staff at Woodham Academy." This award helps to encourage students to raise their aspirations, become leaders and have a prosperous future. Consequently, it is recognised nationally and internationally by universities and employers. We are extremely proud of our students' achievements, they have worked so hard as a team to gain this qualification.

There are three separate components to The Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award for which evidence is gained over a period of 3-6 months. These are, participating in a physical activity, developing a new skill and volunteering. Students select what they want to do for each section based on individual interests and complete each component within the local community. The physical section involves improving fitness through the completion of a physical activity and enhance performance within this. Students participated in a variety of activities such as football, running, water polo and horse riding. For the skill section, students selected an activity to broaden their understanding and expertise in a specific area. Woodham students developed languages, artistic skills and cookery skills.

As part of the volunteering section, students were required to take an active role in the local community and gain invaluable work experience too. Some students volunteered by working in Defoe Court Care Home where they participated in seasonal events and formed relationships with residents. Others took on the role of coaches for local sports groups and have continued with this since completing the award. Some elected to volunteer with younger children through Girl Guiding, working with 8th Newton Aycliffe Rainbows, helping support children aged 5-7 by organising crafts and games. Year 11 student Megan Ellwood stated, "since completing the volunteer section of the Duke of Edinburgh Award, I feel inspired to make a difference to the lives of other people in the community. This award has built my confidence and enriched my life skill set which will be beneficial to my future."

In addition to all the other components, to achieve the Bronze Award, students need to undertake an expedition section which was adapted to meet Covid regulations. Students worked in small groups to train, plan routes and use map skills to navigate in the local area. These were applied when leading their group. The expedition involved a 12 mile walk along the Great Aycliffe Way and concluded with students erecting tents and making meals on camping stoves. This section encouraged independence and inspired students to

develop initiative and a spirit of adventure. Students thoroughly enjoyed the challenges that the expedition presented and the many new experiences. The expedition encompasses leadership skills and all students showed great perseverance to complete the challenge. Congratulations to all Woodham Academy students for their commitment and dedication to complete this prestigious Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Mr Bell, Headteacher, added "The Duke of Edinburgh Award has been a brilliant experience for all involved. The students, staff and parents have all been superb. This is just one of many extracurricular opportunities available at Woodham Academy, which will continue to be a key feature of our expanding school."

Lib Dem Pledge to **Invest in County Communities**

Durham County Council's new Joint Administration Cabinet will next week vote on providing an extra £10,000 for every County Councillor to invest in their communities.

The £1.26 million boost will be able to be invested immediately, and will also help councillors bring in even more investment through matched funding.

Councillor Elizabeth Scott, Lib Dem cabinet member for Economic Development, says, "Putting more money direct into every heart of every community was one of our key manifesto pledges. By giving local councillors the ability to hit the ground running with extra funding we can make an immediate positive impact.

"For too long red tape and lack of resources has been holding back Councillors' ability to fix local problems. Now Councillors have a real chance to shape their areas."

Each County Councillor will have £29,400 to spend directly in their communities this year. Additional funding will also be available from local Area Action Partnerships for community improvements including regeneration projects.

Cllr Scott adds, "Councillors are best placed, working in their communities to get work done quickly. We will be looking at how to further speed up and streamline funding processes too. This is especially important as we come out of the pandemic.'


Andrew Firth Memorial Cup

Aycliffe Cricket Club **Scoreboard Report**



Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's 1st team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, produced arguably the result of the day in the NYSD 2nd division when they defeated runaway leaders Marton 2nd XI at home by seven wickets. Electing to change recent tactics and bowl first proved to be a wise decision by Aycliffe captain Adam Randall as his side proceeded to bowl out the visitors for just 152 after 37 overs. Jack Slatcher (sponsored by Tina and Dean Greaves) was the pick of the bowlers finishing with 3 for 19 and he was supported well by brother George (2 for 26) and James Layfield-Carroll (2 for 35). In reply, Aycliffe opener Joe Haines battled hard against two quality opening bowlers to carry his bat and score a seasonal best 49 not out from 111 balls and he hit nine boundaries. In-form Adam Randall also batted well scoring a robust 40 from 39 balls and his innings included seven boundaries and a six. Once Randall was dismissed, Jack Slatcher continued the good work finishing with 30 not out off 39 balls and his innings included seven boundaries as Aycliffe reached their winning target of 153 from 37.1 overs and with seven wickets in hand.

The Second team put in a decent performance away to Preston 1st XI in the NYSD 4th division, but still came away with a five wicket defeat. Aycliffe were asked to bat first on a tricky wicket and after a dreadful start, when they found themselves two wickets down without a run on the board, they recovered well to score a respectable 143 all out from 39.1 overs. 15 year old Leo Mercy (sponsored by Joint Design Direction) top scored with an excellent career best 35 from 37 balls and he hit five boundaries. Also amongst the runs was 15 year old Owen Smith, who scored 27 off 45 balls and Matty French (22 off 65 balls). In reply, a couple of wickets each for both Ryan Patrick (2 for 12) and Matty Greaves (2 for 32) were not quite enough to stop Preston reaching their

Another full week started with me catching up with Chris Heaton Harris, the Rail Minister, as I wanted updates on progress for some of our local projects. The Ferryhill Station project continues, and we saw this week the formal confirmation of the funds to Durham County Council for the feasibility study that has been commissioned. I also wanted updates on the Leamside line and Bishop line, we should hear more about these in the next month or so. I was drawn to ask an OQ (Oral Question) in Health OQs where I encouraged the minister to ensure that GPs were given full support to help the recovery of backlogs, particularly as regards cancer patients and I was able to give a shout out to the Great Aycliffe Cancer Support Group.

As I have told you before, I am part of the NRG (Northern Research Group) which is focused on making representations to ensure Government policy is fully cognisant of the needs of the north. The Prime Minister joined our meeting last week and took representations from our members I had a catch-up chairs briefing for the Left Behind Communities APPG, primarily looking at our future agenda, which is finally starting to include some visits where we will see some incredibly successful community initiatives. I also went for a meeting at the Department for International Trade and met with Secretary of State Liz Truss and some of her team. Whilst there I was able to visit the Churchill Room which overlooks Horse Guards Parade and has in it a map from the time of Churchill. I was in the Chamber for Prime Minister's Questions before then travelling back north later on Wednesday. Thursday started with a meeting with Simon from Crafter's Companion, we discussed their investment in studios to promote their products online, amongst other things, and I look forward to calling in to see them soon. I then spent a lot of the day working to arrange the sessions we were planning as regards the proposed incinerator. As I have already said, I have no more influence in the planning decisions than any other member of the public. Decisions are made by local councils. I have therefore been trying hard to make sure residents are as informed as possible on what is being proposed and I was pleased that we were able to facilitate these sessions. The sessions saw questions being answered about the proposed operations and I hope they were useful, as well as members of the public several local Councillors joined us. It is important to restate that these were just to inform, they play no part in the formal planning process, my hope is that any objections that need to be made are now done on a basis of more knowledge. Whilst investments like this need to be made somewhere, if we are to make the necessary reductions in carbon, they can only be considered if they are safe.

On Friday I was out and about, starting at a business on NetPark in Sedgefield, another

particularly innovative business that I am going back to next week as we identified some areas where I could possibly help them because of my work in BEIS. After this I was off to Wellfield School in Wingate, they really are an inspirational school with an interesting history. I then came back to Newton Aycliffe to see the Livin investment in Travellers Green, and in particular to take a look at the pilot properties they have built with air source heat pumps and solar panels. It was then off to Chilton for my final visit of the day where I joined some of the leaders of Durham County Council in welcoming Lord Callanan who had come to take a look at the external wall insulation being applied free to houses in West Chilton Terrace and Dean Bridge Row. His knowledge of the project and detailed understanding of other potential funding streams was impressive. We spoke to several residents who were delighted by both the thermal and aesthetic improvements to their homes.

Over the weekend I called in to see the Northern Bygones Society Car Show next to the Scout Hall on Bluebell Way. This gave me the opportunity to have a nose around some vehicles that are given an incredible amount of TLC. I also popped my head into the Scout Hall, as a scout at the time, I remember it being built in the mid-1970s and, if I recall, Lord Barnard came to officially open it. 16 June 2016 is a day we all remember Jo Cox, the MP who was murdered. In her maiden speech she said: "We have far more in common than that which divides us." There are a number of events around the UK to show that politicians can work together regardless of political party. On Friday 18th June I have invited the Newton Aycliffe Councillors, of all colours and none, to join me on a short walk along the Burn to reflect that we are all first and foremost interested in Aycliffe before politics.

Monday saw the Prime Minister update us on the release of lockdown, which I am sure you all know has seen a decision to hold off step 4 openings until July 19th, except for weddings that can still go ahead with more than 30 guests provided social distancing remains in place and the same will apply to wakes. Pilot events – such as Euro2020 and some theatrical performances will also be continued. The position will be monitored every day and if, after 2 weeks, it can be concluded that the risk has diminished then there is a possibility of proceeding to Step 4 and full opening sooner. It is therefore important we all continue to do the right thing, apply common sense in all you do and get tested regularly. The more negative tests that are submitted, the better confidence we all can have in the safety of releasing lockdown and the more chance of the decision happening sooner. Remember: Hands, Face, Space and Fresh Air - Stay Safe

Parliamentary Boundary Changes

Dear Sir.

The Boundary Commission for England (BCE) review on Constituency boundaries has proposed that our existing Constituency of Sedgefield, currently with an electorate of 64,581, should be replaced by a new constituency called Newton Aycliffe and Sedgefield, with an electorate of 70.149. The full details of the proposals can be viewed on this link:

www.bcereviews.org.uk - and just type in your post code, DL5

Here you can view the differences in the existing and proposed constituency. You can also submit your views and comments, either anonymously or publicly. The number of constituencies in the North East will decrease from 29 to 27 and The Boundary Commission says "These latest rules retain 650 constituencies for the UK Parliament as a whole, and require constituencies that we propose or recommend to comply with strict parameters, in particular as far as the number of electors in each constituency is concerned by law, every constituency must contain between 69,724 and 77,062 Parliamentary electors (as at 2nd March 2020). As far as possible, we try to have regard to local ties, geographic factors, local government boundaries (as they were known at 1st December 2020), existing constituencies, and minimising disruption caused by proposed change.
