secondary school age category (11-16) winner and Sofia McGregor from Hexham took home the primary school (0-11) prize. Leading build-to-rent developer Placefirst launched the inaugural awards, inviting artists of all ages and backgrounds in the North East to submit their favourite piece of artwork, with the aim of championing local talent.

Over 200 entries were whittled down to a top 20 shortlist for the three age categories by a public vote, before an expert panel judged the remaining artworks to decide the winners. The judges were local artists Stuart Jones from Middlesbrough and Emily Ward from North Shields, as well as Dr Solomon Lennox, head of Northumbria University Arts department.

In addition to the accolade, winners will have their artwork on show at Placefirst's new Hetton-le-Hole development throughout the summer and will be given a trophy and up to £100 in art vouchers.

Stuart Jones commented: "All of the artists selected showed great imagination, creativity and connected directly to a particular feeling and atmosphere for the viewer. I congratulate the artists in their ability to not only express their visual ideas in a striking way but also to use their chosen media in a way that fully explores it, clearly showing an attention to detail."

David Mawson, Chief Executive at Placefirst, commented: "We're proud that our North East Artist of the Year awards have championed fantastic local artists, inspiring many in what has been a difficult year. We were blown away by the volume and high standard of entries from all age groups, with paintings of animals through to sketches of picturesque skylines demonstrating the region's artistic talents. It was a tricky task for the judges to choose their favourites. "We'd like to congratulate all three winners for using their originality, hard work and artistic flair to win over the judges. We can't wait to showcase the winning pieces at our Hetton-le-Hole development for all of our residents to see and hopefully other hopeful artists are inspired to follow in their footsteps."

RUNNING CLUB NEWS

Miles, miles, miles were the order of the week, however we start our round up with the shortest race of the week, as several Members of the Club took on the Kirkleatham 5K on Wednesday, 23 June 2021. First home for the Club, and finishing 3rd overall on the night, was John Firby, in a time of 17:58. After getting lost in the woods, and somehow managing to add an additional half a mile to his run, Paul Dalton was next to cross the line in a time of 23:23. David Stothard was next in, finishing in a time of 27:03, with Eve Doe the last of the Aycliffe quartet, finishing in 33:45.

On Saturday, three Members took on the Race to the Castle, a 100km ultramarathon in Northumberland. The



route took runners across stunning moorland and through ancient woodland to the coast, where they were greeted by charming seaside towns on their way to Bamburgh Castle. First to reach the castle for Aycliffe Running Club was Dez Fielden, in a time of 13:38:16. He was followed by Lee Wren in 17:32:45, and Richie Johnson in 19:17:14. A fantastic effort from all three!

At the same time, Julie Nisbet was taking on her own ultramarathon challenge, the 33 miles Lakeland Five Passes Ultra, which included 10,000 feet of vertical elevation. Unfortunately, things didn't quite go to plan for Julie, and she retired from the race with eight miles to go, however such a sterling effort cannot pass without mention, and we're sure Julie will be back to conquer the race again next year. On Sunday, 27 June, Kelly Dickinson took on the Druridge Bav Beach Trail 10K, hosted by Wild Deer Events. Kelly completed her run in 1:04:22.

Also on Sunday, Andy Talbot took on the Rightmove Milton Keynes Marathon. Andy completed the marathon in 3:11:33, finishing first in his Age Category (VM60), and in doing so met the qualifying standard to secure selection for the England Masters Marathon team in 2022. Andy hopes to have the opportunity to represent his country in the 2022 Chester Marathon.

Responsible Dog Owners

Dear Si

Most dog owners are responsible and caring individuals who look upon their dogs as part of the family and not just pets, and many look after them better than they take care of themselves. Often they talk more to their dogs than they do their partners and wouldn't dream of leaving the house without giving them a little treat, an explanation of where they are going and assurances they won't be long. When they take their dog for a walk they do so in a responsible manner; the dog is on a lead and the owner is going equipped for the task in hand, pockets stuffed with doggie bags, possibly a pooper scooper and a larger carrier bag to put the used doggie bags into until they reach one of the many bins provided for the safe disposal of what is toxic waste. However, when out walking you don't have to go far before you come across dog faeces on the path and grassed areas or worse still, discarded doggie bags thrown down on the ground or into nearby trees and bushes.

The law is very clear. The Control of Dogs Ordinance (1992)

The law is very clear. The Control of Dogs Ordinance (1992) applies to all public places and states that an offence is committed if a person in charge of a dog fails to clean up his faeces. It is no defence to claim ignorance of the dog's actions, the law, or not to have a device available to remove the faeces. This could result in a

prosecution and fine.

Most people don't realise dog faeces is toxic due to toxocariasis. Toxocariasis is an infection of the round worm. There are two types of toxocariasis: visceral larva migrans (VLM) and ocular larva migrans (OLM). In VLM, the larvae reach the liver, causing inflammation and symptoms such as abdominal pain and pyrexia. Most people recover spontaneously. OLM occurs when a migrating larva reaches the eye. It causes a granuloma to form on the retina, causing significant visual impairment and in severe cases even blindness. There are about twelve new cases of OLM diagnosed annually in the UK. Twelve is not a lot but if it's you or a family member who loses their sight twelve a very significant number. Prevention is better than a cure and all it takes is a little thought, consideration and personal responsibility not only for your dog, your own actions as well.

Aycliffe Cricket Club Scoreboard Report

Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's 1st team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, made the long journey down to Bedale in North Yorkshire and beat both the weather and the homeside when they came out on top by eight wickets in the NYSD 2nd division. Aycliffe won the toss, chose to bowl first and duly dismissed Bedale for 191 after 42 overs with George Slatcher (3 for 25), Sean Morgan (2 for 33) and James Layfield Carroll (2 for



44) doing the damage with the ball for the visitors. In reply Aycliffe opener Joe Haines (19 runs) helped his side off to a steady start, but was dismissed with the score on 53 for 2. Adam Gittins was then joined at the crease by captain Adam Randall (sponsored by DTS Joinery) and the pair batted right through to the end, reaching their winning target and finishing on 193 from 41.3 overs and setting a new club record 3rd wicket partnership of 140 in the process. Adam Randall, who hit his fourth half century of the season, finished with 73 not out off just 65 balls faced and he smashed six boundaries and four sixes in his brilliant innings. Adam Gittins also batted superbly scoring an unbeaten 55 off 131 balls, hitting seven boundaries and this was his second half century this season. The first team lost away at Seaton Carew in the quarter final of the Collingwood cup by six wickets, but the bright point of the match was a sparkling innings by opener Sam Telford (sponsored by the Fairhurst Family) who smashed a season's best 54 off just 41 balls, including nine boundaries.

The second team hosted Bedale 2nds at home in the NYSD 4th division, but persistent drizzle brought proceedings to a premature end as the game was abandoned after 7.3 overs with the Aycliffe innings left on 31 for 2.

The U17's lost at home to top of the table Richmond by 42 runs in the NYSD junior league. Choosing to bowl first initially looked like an inspired decision as the visitors were quickly reduced to 9 for the loss of 4 wickets. Richmond recovered and were eventually dismissed for 92 after 18.1 overs thanks to some excellent bowling by Matty Greaves (4 for 10), Leo Mercy (2 for 6) and Owen Smith (2 for 9). Fraudsters Pretend to be Police Officers

Durham Constabulary are urging people to be vigilant following reports of fraudsters purporting to be police officers.

In recent weeks, officers have received several reports of fraudsters calling people on the phone pretending they are a police officer, or from the call taker's bank.

The conmen then go on to tell the person to withdraw money from their bank account which will then be collected by a courier. In some instances, they have even asked the victim to package the money up and send it by recorded delivery, or to send the money by bank transfer.

Some have also obtained the victim's debit card details and personal account details.

A Durham Constabulary spokeswoman said: "We want to remind people that the police or other reputable organisations will never ask you to withdraw cash, nor will they ever ask you for your bank account details. They will also never ask you to confirm personal details over the phone.

"If you are unsure whether a call is genuine, please end the call and contact a family member or a trusted individual or the police for advice. Sadly, these fraudsters can be very convincing and often target the elderly or the vulnerable. Therefore, we'd urge people to share this important message with their parents and grandparents – we all have a role to play in protecting the vulnerable."

Paul Howell MP Invites Local People to Meet Fornax

Paul Howell MP welcomed residents and councillors to two meetings so they could meet with Fornax Environmental Solutions to discuss the proposals for a specialist waste treatment facility at Merchant Park, south of Newton Aycliffe.

The meetings were convened further to Gresham House/Fornax submitting an application for the scheme to Durham County Council, on the Merchant Park site, which already has planning permission for

commercial and industrial uses in place.
The meetings on Monday 14 and Tuesday 15 June enabled a wide ranging and in-depth discussion to take a place directly between local people and councillors, and Gresham/Fornax plus members of its team. A range of detailed questions covering topics such as emissions, odour and vehicle movements were asked and answered during each hour and a half session.

Paul Howell, MP for Sedgefield, said: "I had received emails registering concerns and saw on social media that residents were frustrated by the level and timing of information they had received. As an MP I have no formal role in the planning process but working with Councillor Gerald Lee I was able to engage with Fornax to deliver these information sessions. I would thank the residents who engaged for their detailed questioning and Fornax for their clear answers. I hope this has put the residents in a well informed position as formal planning proceeds."

Gresham House/Fornax submitted the planning application for the facility to Durham County Council - the authority responsible for assessing proposals for waste treatment facilities - in April 2021 after detailed discussions had taken place with the County Council and

carrying out a programme of community consultation.

Mark Roberts, Founder & Chairman of Fornax Environmental
Solutions, said: "Since starting this project, we have been committed to being a good neighbour to the community. We understand that people will have questions about new development particularly when it involves unfamiliar or new technologies.

"I'd like to thank Paul Howell for facilitating these meetings, which has given our team the opportunity to answer people's questions and provide clarity on important issues. I would also like to thank local people and Councillors for taking the time to attend and for their ongoing interest in this important proposal.

Gresham House/Fornax has a proven track record of developing a wide range of sustainable infrastructure projects contributing to carbon offsetting throughout the country. All of this helps the UK achieve its net zero carbon goals, as well as adding to the creation of a sustainable low-carbon economy.

If the application is approved, the facility is expected to be operational in late 2022. The project will create up to 75 jobs during construction and 27 permanent jobs once the plant is fully operational. It will also provide a vital service to the NHS by treating the ever-increasing volumes of clinical waste.

The facility will be required to comply with the strict guidelines set out in law and via an environmental permit authorised and enforced by the Environment Agency, which mean there will be no harmful emissions from the site and strict monitoring will be in place. It is also anticipated that the facility will operate on a net zero carbon basis. Geoff Hunton, Director of Merchant Anglo, said: "We're looking forward to welcoming Gresham House/Fornax to Merchant Park as the next exciting phase of the development currently under

The big news last week was the resignation of the Secretary of State for Health after his indiscretions. There was clearly no option other than for him to resign, his role meant he had to be absolute in his adherence to the Covid rules. I have seen numerous emails asking why others should follow rules when he didn't, but I would ask you all to do what you know is right as we hopefully approach the end of the lockdowns. Please do not use his failure as an excuse to relax. I wish his replacement Sajid Javid all the best in his new role. We have progressed further questions regarding the proposed clinical waste incinerator following the webinars we facilitated, and we will continue to support concerned residents.

The BEIS select committee has started an inquiry into Liberty Steel and we had representatives from Liberty Steel and Tata Steel last week. The representatives from Liberty Steel were particularly disappointing, either deliberately or inadvertently they were unable to answer many of the questions and I am sure we will need more informed people to come before us. Next, we will have witnesses from Wyelands Bank and the British Business Bank as well as their auditors to discuss their financing.

I had a co-chair meeting of the Left Behind Communities APPG to plan the next session on Community Capacity. I was also able to meet virtually with Durham University to discuss the forthcoming Freedom of Speech Bill. I always enjoy engaging with the University, they are a fantastic asset for our area.

I had a number of discussions around the proposed changes to parliamentary boundaries that have now been published. The changes, if implemented, are particularly significant for Sedgefield and Newton Aycliffe. The name of the constituency would change to Newton Aycliffe & Sedgefield but locally Heighington, Redworth, and part of School Aycliffe move into the Darlington constituency and Brafferton will move into Stockton West. These are now open for consultation. It is at this stage that everyone, from political parties to individuals, have the opportunity to challenge anything they are unhappy about.

I was joined by Richard Holden, MP North West Durham, and Dehenna Davidson, MP for Bishop Auckland, as we met with Neil O'Brien who is leading the Levelling Up policy unit and we discussed the important needs of this area.

Concerns have also been raised with me about the possible closure of the CAB (Citizens Advice Bureau) as their office has been advertised as To Let. I had a call with the CAB to find out what is happening and I have been assured that whilst they may leave their current facility they will definitely remain in Newton Aycliffe. I have had a call with Joy Allen the new Police and Crime Commissioner and shared our priorities as she settles into the role. Anti-social behaviour and quad bikes being very high on the list. Around the rest of the constituency I have been to Station Town to meet some residents, I met with Fishburn Parish Council and

encourage some improvement plans. I had a surgery at Summerhouse where the highlight was discussions with the local NFU (National Farmers Union). Further surgeries are planned on 2nd July at Trimdon Station Community Centre and 9th July at Fishburn Youth and Community Centre. On Saturday I called at Trimdon Grange Community Centre where they


"I'm really looking forward to hearing about
