

## We're Off to See The Wizard

Residents rightly ask, why Labour Councillors are writing anonymous letters in Newton News. They promised in their newsletter to members, to look at why they lost so badly at County and Town Council, yet have since bluntly refused to do SO.

The Independents and the Liberal Democrats on the Town Council are working quietly, confidently and in perfect co-operation and harmony, just getting on with the job we were elected to do. On Car Parking Cllr Phil Hawkins (Ind) and



Cllr Neville Jones (Lib Dem) got the ball rolling by getting the Council to set up a small working group of 5 Councillors, it's remit, simply put

"To invite residents of Great Aycliffe, via Newton News, to identify and submit to the Working Group, areas of the parish they consider to have a parking problem, primarily due to lack of space etc and for these areas to be clearly identified, mapped and land ownership confirmed, then, where possible, to try to come up with solutions to each one. Then to liaise with the land owner e.g. DCC or Livin to see about getting a phased programme of work, over a period of years, to try to resolve and reduce these parking issues. The Working Group will not deal with parking enforcement issues."

There are No guarantees, No false promises, but the longest journey begins with the first step, to try to slowly but steadily improve the situation, which is likely to take many many years, and will not be able to satisfy everyone. Labour voted against this. This group will probably not start work until next year. The Town Council, like everyone else, is coming out of Covid restrictions, we have some staffing shortages to fill, the priority for existing staff is to be up to speed on existing services and facilities, then, only when time allows, to look into these things.

On the Town Centre, it is down to the County Council, and our MP when it comes to applying for Levelling Up funds and other sources of funding, Parish Councils cannot lead nor apply, but we can get interested parties together and have some input, so we set up another small working group which will probably only need to meet once or twice to complement the work of our MP Paul Howell and Durham County Council. The remit is:

"To look at all aspects and possibilities of regenerating and developing the Town Centre, in co-operation with Durham County Council, our Member of Parliament, and the Town Centre Owners, and the Government's Levelling Up Agenda."

Labour Councillors voted against this. Finally, Labour put forward a motion to set up yet another working group, proposing: "That this Council sets up a Special Working Group charged to propose new money saving opportunities relating to the Council's existing services, which can result in a reduction in Council Tax".

So Labour now want to slash your services and facilities. To cut your Council Tax (we won't). Labour members then refused to serve on what was their own proposal! It was the worst plan since Abraham Lincoln said "oh, I'm sick of kicking round the house tonight, let's go take in a show." At Full Council last week the Lib Dems and the Independents decided to refer Labour's crazy motion back to the Policy & Resources Committee. We don't need any more working groups, wasting staff and councillors time and resources, to look at doing what Councillors and Officers already do, every day, every week, as part of their job, ie: look for efficiencies and savings, which is always ongoing.

The Wizard of Oz, for all his vanity, was at least able to bestow upon his visitors a heart, a brain and some courage. Labour, in its moment of need, is having to make do without all three.

## Aycliffe Fell Walkers Get Set AVAILABLE



Aycliffe Fell Walking Club are set to resume club walking activities from mid-August. The club has planned five monthly walks, from Mallerstang to Hawes in August, Isaac's Tea Trail from Upper Weardale to Allendale in September, Tow Law to Stanhope in October, Masham to Middleham in November and Aysgarth to Leyburn in December.

The meetings are always on the second Saturday of each month and travel to each area via coach(es) which can drop walkers off along the route at convenient places so that nobody has to feel pressurised into walking beyond their capabilities. Suggested walks can be from 7-16 miles and offer low land, medium and tougher high peak options. Coaches pick up from Darlington, Newton Aycliffe, Middridge, Shildon, Bishop Auckland and, depending on the end destination, Barnard Castle and Scotch Corner. The cost per walker remains at £10/

There will be a requirement to wear face masks while on the coach but every effort has been made to limit the amount of time spent on the coach for the duration of this year. It is hoped that the club will be able to range further afield in 2022 as, indeed, it did before the lockdowns of 2020-21.

#### The GAMP Project Callout is now Open

The Great Aycliffe & Middridge Partnership (GAMP) Board has a budget of £244k available, and applications are invited for projects from community & voluntary or notfor-profit organisations and groups. Grant limits between £5,000 to £25,000 have been agreed, and projects must take place in the GAMP area.

Proposals are invited for projects which help to support positive outcomes for children, young people and families and/ or older people in the GAMP AAP area to live a happier, healthier and safer life. Our focus this year will be on an overarching 'Community Recovery' priority theme, and projects should aim to address at least one of the following key issues:

- **Employability initiatives**
- Advice and Guidance
- Mental Health & Wellbeing
- Organisational sustainability
- Food provision and support
- Social Isolation
- Support for the Voluntary and Community
- Support to small businesses (through a third party, not-for-profit organisation to complement existing DCC and external opportunities)
- **Emerging Community Issues**

Groups are permitted to apply for more than one grant, so long as one funding allocation is not reliant on another.

Applications can be submitted for either capital or revenue funding (or both), and projects which include a specific element of capital spend are encouraged. If you need advice on the specific definitions for capital/revenue, please get in touch. Project proposals must also include a minimum of 5% match funding (either cash or in-kind, or both).

The closing date for applications is 5:00pm on Monday 13 September 2021. All eligible applications will be assessed and

ranked by a panel of GAMP Board members, to determine which projects will be awarded funding. Prospective projects should have a planned start date no earlier than December 2021 to allow time for the appraisal process. The day promises to be a fantastic event and Five Acres Community Garden look forward to welcoming you on Saturday 21st August from 10.00am to 4.00pm.


## **Charity Golf Day Raises £500**

I decided, at the ripe age of 40, I wanted to set myself a challenge (or what you would call a midlife crisis)! I had recently got interested in Triathlons, I joined a local club, Aycliffe Tri Club, and decided I wanted to take on a challenge. So I started looking into it more and decided one of the toughest would be an Ironman. Now if you don't know what that is, it's an event consisting of a 2.4 mile swim, 112 mile bike ride and a 26.2 mile run. The one I fancied was based in Bolton, a gruelling hilly bike route in the countryside, all to be completed within 17 hours. So, I mentioned it to my wife Sarah, thinking she's either going to laugh at me or try to talk me out of it, but the next thing I knew, she's only gone and entered me, as a birthday present! Well that was the challenge set . . .

I started training at the beginning of January coinciding with a dry January. The prospect that it might not go ahead due to the Coronavirus Pandemic was looming, but I kept positive and kept

Training sessions were long and hard, sometimes they would have to be indoors on the treadmill and wattbike when the winter weather brought snow and ice.

My neighbour Dan, who is the Aycliffe Tri Club Chairman and a club coach, would keep me company on some of the longer rides on the weekend. We would often hit the hills around Weardale and Teesdale to replicate the elevation gain of an extremely hilly Ironman Bolton Course.

Swimming is my weakest discipline so I knew that when the swimming pools opened after the lockdown that was something I really needed to work hard at to improve. I dedicated a lot of training time to my swimming and it definitely paid off.

Overall my training went extremely well and I was pleased that I didn't suffer any injuries and could head into the race knowing I had done what was needed.

On the morning of 4th July 2021, I stood at Pennington Flash waiting for the swim start, the sound of Thunderstruck, AC/DC blasting out got my hairs stood on end and I felt I was ready! The swim went as I expected, slow and steady. I finished the swim about 920th place. I mounted my bike and started the ride, this went better than I expected, during the second lap of the route the heavens opened and the rain was relentless, the roads became quite dangerous and there were a few accidents on the course that day, thankfully I managed to complete the bike course in one piece.

Next came the run. I started off well but after just 15 mins I started to struggle, there was a section of the run which had a couple of hills that would instantly sap your energy. Halfway through the run I hit a wall, I arrived at the next feed station where I stuffed my face with a banana and crisps and guzzled some Red Bull and full fat Coke, food I would never normally eat during running, but it did the trick and gave me the energy boost I needed to carry on. With 5km to go on the run I checked my watch and realised if I could pick up my pace I could still get under the 12 hours I was aiming for. I just had to treat it like a 5km park run and go for it. The commentator on the red carpet shouted over the microphone for me to take my time and enjoy the moment. Not a chance! I was chasing that sub-12 hour

After the event I was absolutely over the moon with my finish time, and words of congratulations came in from my fellow club members, family and friends. Then two days later I received an email from Ironman informing me that I had qualified for KONA, the Ironman World Championships held in Hawaii. I had to read it a few times before it sank in, I then had 72 hours to make the decision to accept it. A hard decision to make, as much as I wanted to go I had to consider the financial cost, the entry fee alone was over £1000, as well as missing out on more family time due to the amount of training needed. So I asked them, and they were so supportive! I decided to go for it - I pressed the big 'yes' button and now have a place on the start line.

I am extremely grateful to Aycliffe Tri Club for all their support in my journey so far, what a cracking club they are to train with. They've even put £200 towards the entry fee for me. I am also grateful for all the ongoing support I'm receiving from the coaches and club

members too

Kona will throw up different challenges to Bolton. For a start, it's a sea swim without a wetsuit, which I have never done before and feels a bit daunting. It'll also be around 35 degrees during the race - really hot! But I'm up for the challenge and can't wait to start training. I'm going to Kona!

## **N.A.F.C. REPORT**

Saturday 31st July - Billingham Town 2-5 Newton Aycliffe
Newton Aycliffe opened their Ebac Northern League Division One
campaign in pulsating style with a dramatic win over Billingham
Town. Jake Petitjean and substitute Ben Dibb-Fuller both scored
twice as new signing Sonni Coleman scored on his debut from the
penalty spot to seal a 5-2 win at Bedford Terrace.

Harrison Webster had gotten the home side back into the game before half-time with former Aycliffe man Danny Earl adding a consolation nine minutes from time. Referee Alex Clark showed Adam Burnicle a red card 17 minutes from the end for a coming together with Daniel Boyle, which caused tensions to spill over somewhat between both sides, following a tackle involving Petitjean and Boyle.

There were three debutants in the Aycliffe XI with Coleman leading the line and Alex Walker and John Jury starting in defence. And it didn't take long for the visitors to find their stride as midfielder Petitjean picked up where he left off last season by opening his account for the new campaign in the 10th minute.

Lewis Walton's corner from the right was cleared as far as Boyle who was robbed by Marc Costello to find Walton once more and the fullback expertly picked out Petitjean who made no mistake from eight yards heading beyond Michael Roxburgh.

The lead lasted just 15 minutes though as Earl's quick freekick on the right caught out the Aycliffe defence finding Boyle who cutback to Ashley Lavan on the edge of the area and his effort was deflected onto the post only for Webster to stab in the rebound on the line. Webster came close to giving the hosts the advantage eight minutes later when he volleyed wide of Adam Pickford's angle from Joseph Taylor's cross, before Walker almost capped a dream debut for Colin Stromsoy's side when he headed narrowly over from Ethan Wood's freekick. But the visitors did take the lead through another summer signing in Coleman before the half was out as the striker, signed from Guisborough Town, confidently dispatched from the penalty spot after Petitjean was brought down by Taylor four minutes from the interval.

Roxburgh guessed the right way in the Billingham goal but there was no stopping Coleman's effort as Aycliffe took the lead into the break. It is a lead that could have been extended inside two minutes of the restart as Liam Jarvie latched onto Petitjean's header but Roxburgh was out quick to smother. Burnicle brought out an excellent save from the Town keeper just after the hour, before substitute Dibb-Fuller looked to have sealed the points by adding a superb third from range.

The midfielder picked up a loose ball from 25-yards and was able to skip past Boyle before unleashing a wicked strike with his left foot which arrowed into the corner. Two minutes later and Aycliffe's lead didn't look as commanding after Burnicle was given his marching orders after a coming together following Boyle and Petitjean's robust challenge.

But the disadvantage of being a man down didn't impact the Newtonians as Coleman almost added his second of the game from the resulting freekick when Costello's pressure saw the ball land at the feet of the striker, but Joseph Carter was on hand to make a crucial interception and divert behind for a corner. The clincher came from that corner, however, as Dibb-Fuller's cross was scrambled clear only as far as Petitjean who sent a rasping half volley into the top corner. The home side never gave up though and gave themselves a glimmer of hope nine minutes from time when Ryan Gooch slid the ball across for Earl to tap underneath Pickford to reduce the deficit to two.

But with Billingham pushing for a third it was Aycliffe who grabbed another goal when Dibb-Fuller's excellent pressing forced Lavan into a mistake and he exchanged passes with Coleman before cleverly



dinking the ball over the on-rushing Roxburgh to cap a remarkable opening afternoon.

Following a midweek trip to Bishop Auckland, Aycliffe's attention turns to the Emirates FA Cup. Thornaby are the visitors to the Beaumont Landscapes Stadium on Saturday 7 August (ko 3pm). Admission is £7 adults, £5 concessions, £3 under 16s. The winners of that game travel to Tadcaster Albion in the Preliminary Round on 21 August.

## Background Step at GATC

Dear Sir

The new leading group, recently voted in, took a backward step at the GATC Full Council meeting last week.

Forgetting their promise to engage with members of our community, they have closed the easily accessible Reception door to every member of the public who wishes to attend any GATC meeting.

Two years ago, when a member of the public was found wandering round the Council offices, it became clear that we needed to improve security, and a Standing Order was introduced that members of the public should not use the Reception door, but should use the public door at the rear (road side) of the building.

Parking and disability parking, however, is an awkward walk away and I, for example, would be unable to walk from my parked car right around to the permitted public entrance. In 2019, therefore, I proposed a motion, seconded by Cllr Fleming, that gave Council officers and councillors discretion to invite people through the Reception door if necessary. This motion was opposed by the opposition, but passed by the then Labour majority.

Last week, however, my motion was rescinded by the new ruling group, to be replaced by a rule which enforces that every member of the public MUST use the outer door at the front of the building, and allows only councillors and members of staff to use the Reception entrance.

By the new rule, visiting speakers to the Council, guests of the Mayor, members of the public coming to present cheques or invited to receive prizes – everybody but councillors and officers – will have to walk round the building and use the public entrance. For older and disabled people, this may effectively deny them access.

One councillor tried to assure members that the Town Clerk would be able to overrule in

One councillor tried to assure members that the Town Clerk would be able to overrule in such special circumstances. Yet, even when the Town Clerk informed him that the new ruling removed the Town Clerk's discretion to do so, he still voted for the recission. In fact all the Independents and Lib Dems, on a block vote, voted for the recission, including Cllr Fleming (who had seconded my motion in 2019).

I question and challenge the overruling of my original motion on the grounds of disability, age etc.

These councillors are taking a backward step, showing no care or concern or even common politeness towards others – as Cllr Jed Hillary stated at the meeting, GATC has passed a motion which positively discriminates against disabled people This ruling group has proved itself to be petty, revengeful, totally uncaring, and dismissive of anyone who would have difficulty in using the alternative entry. Along with Ben Houchen, Tees Valley Mayor, and Peter Gibson, MP for Darlington, we have reached into Government departments and talked to customers to help accelerate payments to assist in giving the administrators more time in which to try and save the business. 

## Free Tree Packs Scheme for Nowhere to Turn Congratulations **Schools and Communities**



Whether planting for The Queen's Platinum Jubilee, to help tackle climate change, or to improve local areas around the country, the Woodland Trust's popular free tree pack scheme is now open for applications.

Schools and community groups across the North East are now able to apply for the first 1 million trees, and into 2022 there are over 3 million trees in total available via free tree packs.

Packs are sent out twice a year with November packs now available for order. In Spring the uptake was high across the North East with 18,120 trees despatched for planting. These included:

- 3,345 to 46 schools and community groups in Cleveland\*;
- 6,030 to 51 organisations in Durham;
- 5,430 to 47 schools and community groups in Northumberland;
- 3,315 to 44 organisations in Tyne and Wear.

The Woodland Trust is delighted to be a leading delivery partner of The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) and is offering free trees as an amazing opportunity to help many thousands of schools and communities to plant trees to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022.

Applications are accepted on a first come, first served basis and the first million trees will be despatched in November during the planting season. The Trust welcomes applications from all types of community groups and people do not have to be part of a formal long-standing group, they just need to have a group name decided before they apply.

The packs, all generously funded by our corporate partners, are available in a range of themes; year-long colour, a wild harvest, or a haven for wildlife. Another contains hardy species which tolerate exposed sites and dry areas or where water collects easily, there is even a working wood mix which could provide wood fuel or willow

The packs also come in a range of sizes: 15 (perfect for urban areas and which can be split between neighbours where necessary), 30 (which will create a six-metre hedgerow or a tennis court-sized copse), 105 (enough to cover an area as big as four tennis courts) or 420 (to cover an area the size of a football pitch) and most can create fantastic hedgerows.

We ask that trees are planted on publicly accessible land where possible, with the landowner's permission, and that groups commit to caring for those trees as they establish and grow. Since 2004 the scheme has helped thousands of groups plant millions of trees and there is support for experienced and first-time tree planters! In Spring this year over 400,000 free trees were sent to keen planters across the country.

Woodland Trust tree packs are generously funded by lead partners Sainsbury's, Lloyds Bank, OVO Energy, DFS Furniture, players of People's Postcode Lottery, Joules, Bank of Scotland and Sofology. Packs contain a mix of UK sourced and grown native broadleaf species such as hazel, rowan, hawthorn, common oak, silver birch, wild cherry, elder, dogwood and holly.
