Then war broke out, and she went to work in the ammunition factory on Aycliffe Trading Estate, where she made dangerous ammunition pieces. There were lots of ladies working there and they have become known as the 'Aycliffe Angels'. Later, she, and some



of the other ladies, were transferred to a factory in Stoke on Trent, where they stayed at a hostel. She then came back to Newton Aycliffe to work in Alexanders in Darlington, where she worked as a sewing machinist for 25 years, receiving a gold watch - soon after the factory closed.

Amelia Rickaly sourced a job at Aycliffe Approved School, where she started working in the laundry department, but progressed very well in the school. Muriel worked there for six years.

She retired at 62 years old, to take care of her mother whose eye sight was bad. Muriel can still be seen getting on and off buses, going into Darlington for shopping, to get something nice for Saturday's tea and a good roast for Sunday dinner. Muriel is a member of the Women's Institute

in Aycliffe Village and the social club, where

she loves a game of bingo.

To celebrate her 100th birthday a party was held by her friends and family in Aycliffe Village Hall, the Mayor attended and brought her flowers, she received a birthday card from the Queen and The Royal Telegraph gave two Afternoon Teas and The County presented her with a £25 gift voucher. "Always smiling, cheerful and positive (one of the first on the dance floor), and with an amazing memory and interesting stories, she is a much cherished member of our WI. Asked about her secret for a long life she said it was the 'Aycliffe air'." said an Aycliffe Village WI representative.





Chance to Apply for Floral Treats to Spruce up Area

Community groups across County Durham have the opportunity of winning 2,000 bulbs to brighten up their area.

Green-fingered champions across each of Durham County Council's 14 Area Action Partnerships (AAPs) are in with a chance of securing the floral treats for their community open spaces. Groups entering will need to provide the



postcode and details of the area to be planted, together with details of the AAP they are in. The area must be a public space that will brighten up the village or town.

Once areas nominated to receive the bulbs are checked for suitability and ownership, they will be placed on the relevant AAP Facebook page, where they will be voted for by members of the public. The AAPs will use the feedback received to gauge which of their sites they wish to put forward to be given the bulbs. Planting will take place in October and November with the community group supported by the council's Clean and Green, Find and Fix and Civic Pride teams. The funding for the bulbs is a direct result of proceeds from the sale of vehicles used in fly-tipping incidents in County Durham.

Cllr Mark Wilkes, the council's Cabinet member for neighbourhoods and climate change, said: "This is a fantastic opportunity for community groups to win bulbs which can then be used to brighten up their area.

"We know how much our residents like to see their communities looking their best so I'd urge any of those interested to nominate themselves to be in with a chance of winning. Best of luck to those entering.

Nominations can be sent to civicpride@durham.gov.uk and will close at midnight on Friday 24 September. Voting will open on Facebook pages from 5pm on Monday 27 September. Voting will close at 5pm on Friday 1 October.



MP Launches Five Acres Community Garden

Thursday 19th August was an auspicious day for Five Acres Community Garden as MP, Paul Howell, officially launched the project.

The day centre was the brainchild of Debbie and Gavin Iceton and offers 16-30 year olds, with learning difficulties, the opportunity to create crafts, get involved in agriculture and horticulture, enjoy day trips and many other activities. Covid caused a minor disruption to the initial plans of converting a 'five acre' field at Brafferton to accommodate the attendees, but, temporary premises were offered at ROF59 by John Finley, which allowed the project to move forward. Future plans are to combine both sites with indoor and outdoor activities for the 'Champions' to enjoy.

Activities at ROF59 currently offer arts and crafts, drama, music, sports and gardening. Brafferton will offer agriculture, horticulture, a community garden and small animal husbandry. There will also be respite lodges at the Brafferton site for champions and community use.

Pioneering Care Partnership have donated an amazing £5000 towards a garden shed and poly-tunnel, while Crafters Companion donated most of the contents of their shop, which closed last year and was converted into a TV studio and Flymo/Husqvarna have also donated gardening equipment to enable the Champions to go out into the community and tend to gardens for those who are unable to. Howdens Joinery have kindly donated kitchen units and worktops for the modular building which will be located at the Brafferton site. 'The Champions', the name given to the young adults who attend Five Acres, was initially for 16 to 25 year olds, but now some of them are over 25 and enjoying the activities just as much as the younger members.

Five Acres offer a bespoke day service that members are happy to access and make their own choices and express themselves.

MP Paul Howell said "I am delighted to have been invited to officially open the Five Acre project, I am sure this will inspire and enrich the lives of all those who come along to use the facilities that have been created for them."

"Husqvarna are very happy to support the Five Acres Community Garden Project. The team at Five Acres have done an amazing job to get this off the ground and up and running in such a short period of time. They are making a huge difference to the lives of young adults and their families and it has been a privilege to help in some small way. Five Acres is a great community project and we would encourage other local companies to get involved in any way they can", said Gary Blenkinsopp from Husqvarna.

"All the staff at Five Acres bring something remarkable to the project and we couldn't do this without them. Starting as a thought in 2019, and seeing it come to fruition, with all the help and donations we have received, is overwhelming and humbling. Saturday 21st August Emirates FA Cup Preliminary Round Tadcaster Albion 1 v Newton Aycliffe 2

Jake Petitjean's stoppage-time penalty
ensured Newton Aycliffe moved into the First
Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup
for just the second time in the clubs history
with victory over Tadcaster Albion. Petitjean
kept his cool to convert from the spot after
substitute Liam Jarvie was brought down
by Romario Vieira to seal an impressive
win over the Pitching In Northern Premier
Division East side in torrential conditions at
the Global Stadium.

Colin Stromsoy's side took the lead in Yorkshire through midfielder Joe Ferguson four minutes before the break and it looked as though it might have been enough until Donald Chimallio scored a superb individual equaliser for the home side 16 minutes from time.

The Newtonians arrived on the back of a disappointing display at Seaham Red Star in midweek and Head Coach, Stromsoy, made three changes to his starting XI with Ferguson replacing the injured Marc Costello, Lewis Walton returning in place of Alexander Walker and Andrei Ardelean being handed his first start of the campaign in place of Jarvie.

And Aycliffe had to withstand some early pressure from their superior opponents as Joe Wilkinson's 11th minute header was scrambled from the line following Corey Roper's corner.

That brought Aycliffe to life and it was

Ardelean causing problems for the Tadcaster defence, again, moments later when he latched onto a fumbled corner from Davison-Hale before Ferguson drove into the area from the right and saw his effort deflected over the bar.

Sonni Coleman came close to breaking the deadlock 10 minutes before the interval when he met Ben Dibb-Fuller's near-post cross from the right but steered the wrong side of Davison-Hale's post.

But Stromsoy's side didn't have to wait much longer for their breakthrough as Ferguson picked up the ball midway inside the Tadcaster half and drove at the heart of the defence before shifting it onto his left foot and driving low underneath the keeper. Junayo Cassius-Gill glanced a header just wide of the post from Kesi Omolokun's cross from the right before Basic stung the palms of Pickford as Aycliffe took their lead into the break.

Roper angled a dangerous freekick at Pickford just before the hour mark which fell to Wilkinson but the defender could only find the side netting with his rebound.

Roper dragged an effort wide of Pickford's post from range before the home side found their equaliser via a superb strike from Chimallio.

The winger picked up a loose ball on the left and was able to cut inside onto his right before curling a stunning strike into the top corner beyond the outstretched Pickford. Vieira's freekick was easily cleared to Wood who sent a pinpoint ball over the top for the fresh legs of Jarvie to chase and he was



able to cut inside and draw the foul from the retreating Vieira to leave referee Michael Trevethan little choice but to point to the spot.

With Coleman having been replaced by Ben Wood the responsibility was given to Petitjean who made no mistake in dispatching his spot kick low to the goalkeepers right.

But Stromsoy's side were able to manage the remainder of stoppage time in the Tadcaster half to book their spot in the First Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup for just the second time.

As you are probably aware, I did a column last week after previously saying I was not going to. This change was due to Parliament being recalled for the debate on Afghanistan and although I was able to provide initial comments last week the debate was still ongoing when the print deadline arrived. So, whilst I gave initial comments about the atmosphere in the chamber, I couldn't tell you about the speeches I had not heard. The most impressive of these was from Tom Tugendhat. Tom has been an MP since 2015, but before that he was a Lieutenant Colonel in the Territorial Army Intelligence Corps and served in both Iraq and Afghanistan. He talked with minimal notes and unbelievable emotion, he had everyone's full and complete attention and indeed he received a round of applause from some present, even though that is completely against protocols. I had the privilege of sitting close and was spellbound by what I was seeing. The difference between this and what we have had over the Covid period is stark, the anaemic, typically 3-5-minute speeches via TV screens can in no way compare with the gravitas of a communication delivered like this. I had anticipated that the biggest post Covid change would be what I had seen earlier in the debate when Members, and in particular the Prime Minister and Leader of the Opposition, were constantly asked to 'give way' and take challenges to what they were saying. I had not understood the way a speech like Tom's can have its words amplified in intensity through the manner they are spoken and the integrity of the speaker. His experience pre-Parliament is critical to this gravitas, and whilst I am sure it could be similar in other debates, for example, an ex-teacher contributing to education, the fact that we were debating the life and death issues of a war zone in which he had been deployed made it exceptional. I am sure these are the speeches which resonate most with ministers in their consideration of what should be done.

After the debate I returned north and over the following days I received many briefings from the three primary departments, MOD, Home Office, and Foreign Office. This meant that I was provided with details necessary for us to react to emails and calls from constituents as regards the events in Afghanistan. It was very reassuring to see the coordination happening between these different ministries. We were also able to get an understanding of the context in which events had unfolded so far and how they could be anticipated to play out in future, these briefings have continued for all MPs and, on occasion, even included people on the ground in Afghanistan. Back in the constituency life is heading back towards normality and it was an absolute pleasure and privilege to formally open

'Five Acres' at ROF59. Five Acres was originally conceived as being at a 5-acre field near Brafferton but due to some planning frustrations they were given some temporary hospitality by ROF59. This has evolved into a more permanent arrangement.

more permanent arrangement. I was accompanied by County Councillor David Sutton-Lloyd when I was able to take the Deputy Leader of Durham County Council, Richard Bell, on a trip around Newton Aycliffe. This was to show Councillor Bell some of the initiatives we want the Council to pursue, and we also caught up with the neighbourhood police inspector, Sarah Honeyman, who was able to share some of the policing priorities. We took Cllr Bell to the Town Centre to explain our Levelling Up bid and later to the Locomotion pub to explain its historic importance to the 2025 Darlington to Stockton railway celebrations. We also gave him a whistle stop tour of the industrial estate and the schools and colleges on the town I had a couple of meetings on NETPark regarding some exciting developments as well and on Saturday I went to Middleton St George Community Centre who had a 'Bouncing Back' event for the local community organisations before calling back at ROF59 to see the Five Acre event. I was also encouraged by John Finley to consider the Zip Wire and Drop Zone they have, maybe I will take a closer look another day! Sunday saw me back down to London to meet with my office manager on Monday to discuss our office move. As part of the renovations of the parliamentary estate Norman Shaw North, which is where my office is situated, is being emptied and we are being moved to Richmond House. I believe that I must now have the office that is furthest from the voting lobbies and, when we are back, I will certainly need to be quick off the mark to get to the lobbies in time when divisions are called.

After returning to the patch, I met with leaders of local Scout groups, they are delighted to be back and operating but, like all voluntary groups, are unsure how things will play out going forward. They have been unable to fundraise or get as much publicity as normal so if anyone wants to volunteer or has children they want to introduce to scouting, they start as young as 5, then please get in touch.

As with everyone else I am pleased we continue to lift restrictions, because I get to see many people, I am regularly testing myself and I would encourage you all to do likewise. This, along with vaccinations, is key to avoiding another wave. Please do your bit, stay safe and enjoy what's left of our summer.
